- 9th Sir James (Walter) Terrill, son of Sir Hugh Terrill. Wife, Margaret, daughter and heiress of Sir William Heron of Essex, Kt.
- 10th Sir Walter Terrill, son of Sir James Terrill. Wife, Joane, daughter and heiress of Sir John Swynford, of Essex, Kt.
- 11th Sir Thomas Terrill of Heron, son of Sir Walter Terrill. First wife, Alice, daughter of Daneleghe; second wife, Alenor, daughter of Flambert of Essex.
- 12th Sir John Terrill of Heron, son of Sir Thomas Terrill, Sheriff of Essex, 1422, Treasurer of Household of Henry VI. Present at Agincourt in retinue of Sir Walter Hungerford. A Speaker in the House of Commons. Married Eleanor, daughter and heiress of Sir William Cogeshul.
- 13th Sir Thomas Terrill of Heron, son of Sir John Terrill, Sheriff of Essex and Heris, 1460, Chamberlain of Exchequer. Wife, Anne, daughter of Sir John Marney of Layer-Marney, Essex.
- 14th Sir Thomas Terrill, of South Okendon, son of Sir Thomas Terrill of Heron. Wife, Elizabeth, daughter and heiress of Sir Henry Brun of Bruyn in South Okendon, sister to Lady Brandon.
- 15th William Terrill of Okendon, son of Sir Thomas Terrill of Okendon. Wife, Elizabeth, daughter and heiress of Sir Thomas Bodley and his wife, the daughter and heiress of Dennis Luch of Willingborough.

- 16th Humphrey Terrill of Thornton and South Okendon, son of William Terrill of Okendon. Held Manor of Bruyn and 500 acres, 1548, L. P. M. 3 Ed. VI. Wife, Jane, daughter and heiress of Robert Ingleton, of Thornton Hall, 1519.
- 17th George Terrill of Thornton, South Okendon and Bruyn, son of Humphrey Terrill of Thornton Hall, Lord of the Manor of Bruyn and Tobbings, Essex (Inquisition of Elizabeth). First wife, Helen, daughter of Sir Edward Mountague of Boughton, L. C. J. Second wife, Margary, daughter of Cook of Cheshire.
- 18th Sir Edward Terrill of Thornton, son of George Terrill. First wife, Mary, daughter of Benedict Lee. Second wife, Margaret, daughter of Thomas Ashton of Ashton, Cheshire.
- 19th Sir Edward Terrill, Thornton, son of Sir Edward Terrill and wife, Mary Lee. First wife, Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Edward Watson. Second wife, daughter of Sir William Kingsmill of Sidemonten. (A baronet).
- 20th Robert Terrill (eldest son of Sir Edward Terrill, the Baronet, and wife, Elizabeth Watson, and Lord of the Manor of Bruyn, Essex) was disinherited by Sir Edward from the strict religious orthodoxy Robert would not adhere to at this time prevailing in England. Robert located at Reading, Councilor of Reading Borough, Guardian 1616, St. Giles Ward, 1619. Married Jane, daughter of Robert Baldwin, at St. Giles Parish, Reading, June 29, 1617.
