PROPOSED CHANGE IN BYLAWS

ARTICLE V of the By-Laws printed in this issue carries the original suggested minimum donation for annual dues which is more complicated than necessary. It was anticipated that members might want extra copies of Terrell Trails for their children and grandchildren; except for one or two, this has not proven to be the case. Instead, we have had a lot of confusion on the part of potential members as to exactly what constitutes the minimum annual dues. Also there was an age breakdown giving those age 61 and over a \$2.00 per year reduction in the hope that these senior citizens would have more 'history' and would share it with us. Except for three or four families, this has also proven to be a false assumption.

Therefore, based upon the first year experience with Terrell Trails which has shown that there is little if any postage savings in mailing multiple copies to the same address and that there has been very little reciprocation of information in return for the senior citizen discount, it is proposed that Article ⊻ of the By-Laws be amended to set the SUGGESTED MINIMUM ANNUAL DONATION & follows: Individual \$8.00 per year; Each Additional copy of Terrell Trails to same address \$7.00; Non-Member \$12.00 per year; and that institutions such as <u>libraries</u> and <u>genealogical</u> <u>societies</u> <u>be</u> allowed to join at the Individual member rate of \$8.00 per year due to the publicity to be gained from those sources. These proposed changes to become effective for calendar year 1987.

This proposal will also be voted upon at the annual reunion in California on the third Saturday in July 1986. If you have any objections, suggestions, or other proposals regarding annual dues, please write the Secretary now. Silence will be construed as approval.

JOHN MC TERRELL 1790-1870

SETTLING PAINS The Colonial years.

PHILEMON TERRELL 1750-1816

Born NC, c1750; lived along with his brother Richmond Terrell in Bladen Co. NC during the Revolutionary War in which both fought; cut out into Robeson Co. NC on formation c1786; c1790's both moved to Liberty Co. GA; md. Elizabeth ? in NC c1770's; children (from Liberty County GA. Courthouse records): Malcolm b. c1778; Pierce b. c1780; dau. b. c1782, md. James Williams of Jefferson Co. GA; dau. b. c1875 md. Edward Currie, Jr; Mary b. 1790, md. Reason F. John b. 1790 (see WAGONS Swilley; WEST); Josiah b. c1792 md. Lucena Swilley 08/11/1814; Nancy b. c1793 md. Richard Thomas Stanaland of Bulloch Co. GA 01/21/1812; dau. b. c 1794, md. William Willcox; Lucy b. c 1795 md Arthur Dees 01/08/1817.

Philemon Terrell granted 100 acres Bladen Co. NC 11/12/1779 and owned other lands there; from Joseph Wood, Sheriff, 10/15/1792, 150 acres; (Deed book C. p. 202 Robeson Co NC Records); from Thomas Ivy, 10/03/1794 100 acres (Book D, p. 384); at death owned 250 acres of 400 acre tract granted him 11/13/1802; 200 acres granted Elijah Anderson in 1793; 100 acres granted Eliezer Brack in 1798; & 100 acres granted Johnathan Robinson, all in Liberty Co. GA; 12/09/1816, children, all of age, deeded these lands to their mother who on 12/26/1816 sold same to John Daniel (Deed Book H, pp 104 & 107, Liberty Co. GA); lands located in western part of the county.

NC Archive records show that he was paid for service in 1782-3 in the NC militia in the Revolutionary War; Mrs. Loyce Coleman of MacClenney, FL., became first descendant of Philemon Terrell to become DAR member on his service record 10/13/1955; her national number 437210; Philemon died intestate; probably buried on family farm. (Pioneers of Wiregrass Georiga; Vol 6, pp 259-60)

No your eyes are not deceiving you. The above is another of the Terrell variations found in the record books of this country. This item is on another of the numerous 'John Terrells' who shared the same era as our John and Marian, thus eliminating one Terrell couple as possible parents of our John.

John Terrell was born in Robeson Co. NC in 1790; son of Philemon and Elizabeth Terrell; moved with parents to GA; reared in Liberty Co. GA before 1800; md. 12/03/1815 to Miss Lydia Ellis; children: James Terrell b. 1822 md. Nancy Gutherie, dau. Samuel; moved to Alachua Co. FL by 1840; John M. Terrell Jr. b. 1822; md. first Jane ? who d. 02/10/1854; md. 2nd. Mrs. Sarah 'Sallie' Sauls, wid. of James Sauls & dau. of John Carter in Echols Cn. 03/01/1872; Reason Terrell b. 1825 md. Cinderella?; Lydia died by 1827 and John md. second: Miss Nancy Overstreet, Irwin Co. GA 08/16/1827; children: Lydia Terrell b. 1828 md. George C. Carter, son of John; David W. Terrell b. 1830 d. Civil War; Andrew J. Terrell b. 1832 md. Mary Carter, dau. of Richard; Cynthia C. Terrell b. 1833, never md.; Mariah Terrell b. 1836 md. James Setliff Swilley; Lucy Jane Terrell b. 1837 md. John H. Carter; Calvin Swilley Terrell b. 1838 never md, d. aprx. age 25; & Rachel M. Terrell b. 1842 md. 1st. Frank Colson; md. 2nd Jim Lige Carter.

John and John Jr. served as privates in the Indian War; Capt. Samuel E. Swilley's Co. Lowndes Co. militia June 16--Dec. 16, 1837; second service was in Capt. David R. Bryan's Co. Lowndes Co. militia 1838; they enrolled as John McTerrell and John McTerrell Jr.

John Terrell granted 100 acres land on Doctor's Creek Liberty Co. GA being surveyed for him 01/14/1815; 200 acres on 06/23/1816; sold out moved to Irwin Co. GA 1825; aprx. 10 years later moved to what was then Lowndes Co. GA; in 1858 was cut out into new Echols Co. GA until his death c1870; buried Carter graveyard Echols Co GA.

John and other heirs of Philemon Ter-

rell made a deed to their mother Mrs. Elizabeth Terrell 12/09/1916 for four tracts of land totalling 650 acres in Liberty Co. GA owned by the elder Terrell at his death (Deed Book H, p. 107, Liberty Co. GA.)

John and second wife Nancy Overstreet (b. SC 1799--d. 1870+) were among the organizing members of Antioch Primitive Baptist Church in present Echols Co. GA on 02/10/1838 as an arm of Union Church in present Lanier Co. GA. (Pioneers of Wiregrass Georgia, Vol 1, p.274; V2, p 319; V4 p. 36,312,386; V7 p. 482)

DAVID W. TERRELL 1834-CIVIL WAR

Son of John and Nancy Overstreet Terrell above; enlisted Co. I, 12th GA Vol. Inf. Regmt. 06/14/1861 at Valdosta GA; wounded at Gambrier VA; died of wounds; charter member of Alapaha Lodge No 209 F. & A.M. at Statenville, GA; died a member while in service; single. (Pioneers of Wiregrass Georgia, Vol 1 p. 274)

DAVID W. TERRELL

One David W. Terrell md. Sarah Sellers, b. GA 1856; dau of John [first coroner of Echols Co. GA] and Mahala Sellers. (Pioneers of Wiregrass Georgia, Vol 6 p. 231)

FRANKLIN J. TERRELL

One Franklin J. Terrell of Echols Co. GA. md. 03/05/1883 Beady Malisie McMillian, dau. of Archibald M. Jr. and Narcissus Lott McMillian. (*Pioneers of Wiregrass Georgia*, Vol 7 p. 291)

RICHARD TERRELL

One Richard Terrell md. Missouri Sellers, b. GA 1862; dau of John [first coroner of Echols Co. GA1 and Mahala Sellers. (Pioneers of Wiregrass Georgia, Vol 6 p. 231)

TERRELL, DURVA ANN (01/17/1883--06/16/1884) born Coosa Co. AL; daughter of James Ignatious & Rebecca Ann Pittman T.; lived only 17 months; died Coosa Co. AL; probably buried Olive Branch Cemetery.

TERRELL, EDMUND mentioned in letter from John Calhoun Terrell as one of three uncles named Terrell. The other two, Absalom and John along with his father Ignatious were named in the will of John Terrell; therefore it is likely that Edmund was a great uncle of John C. and a brother of John. Some of the following bits of data may be about our Edmund.

11/08/1816, one Edmund Terrell gave surety bond in the marriage of William Terrell to Mary Blankenship Campbell County, VA. (Ency of American Quaker Geneaology, Vol VI, p 858)

CENSUS; NEWTON CO. GA: 1830: Edmon Terrell, 1 m. 30-40; 1 f. under 5; 1 f. 5-10; 1 f. 30-40; no slaves; total 4. One Edmund Terrell married Nancy Grant 12/02/1830, Pike Co., GA.

One Edmund Terrell married Lucy Wade 01/01/1835, Henry Co., GA.

February 6,1836, one Edmon Terrel, private, served under Capt. Thomas W. Harris. This Company was formed for the Indian War of 1836. (Henry Co. Mother of Counties, p.52).

CENSUS; CARROLL CO GA; 1840: Edmon Terrell; 1 m. 30-40; 1 f. 30-40; 1 person employed in agriculture. Name not found in 1850 census for GA.

One Edmond Terrell, b.c1770/1780's (based upon calculations from WINGFIELD FAMILY TREE for which one or two birthdates for older members are known), was born to Joel Terrell and Fanny Butler who was daughter of Edward Butler and Elizabeth Wingfield.

The following Edmund Terrell cannot be the father of our John if recently discovered (1985) DAR information is correct, however heirs usually did not witness wills, therefore the John who witnessed this may have been our John. One Edmund Terrell (signed Terrill) will 06/01/1784, proven Culpeper Co. VA; named 11/15/1784; children: Elisabeth, Mary, JOHN, ED-MUND, Sarah, Jean, Robert, James, Nancy, Fanny, & Lucy; did not name wife. but will was witnessed by ANN TERRILL; "my friend John Terrell" (possibly indicating a cousin or even unrelated John Terrell, but quite possibly the one for whom son John was named). Robert Garnett, & William Willis, Executors; John was present at proving of the will, but refused to accept the burden of executorship, William Willis was appointed instead. (Will Book " \mathcal{C} " page 91, Culpeper Co. VA).

JOSIAH TERRELL

Born SC, 1792; son of Philemon & Elizabeth? Terrell; md. 08/11/1814 Lucena Swilley, sister of Reason F. Swilley. (Pioneers of Wiregrass Georgia Vol 6, p.260; V 7 p. 403)

All descendents of the preceding Terrells are just as eligible for membership in the Terrell Society of America as are the descendents of John and Marian of Henry Co. GA, or any of the other Terrells/Terrills/or Tyrrells who migrated here from England or elseware in Europe.

PIKE CO GA TERRELL RELATIVES & THE CIVIL WAR

A tip of the editor's hat is due Mr. & Mrs. H. L. Wilkerson of Palestine, TX for the following information on their related families and the Civil War. (Records, Pike Co. GA)

ALLEN, D. S.: enlisted Co. H., 44th GA Rgmt. Dole's Brigade; Army of Northern VA 03//1863; pvt.; discharged at close of war; died at home 1887.

ALLEN, J. C.: enlisted Co. A, 13 Rgmt, GA Confederate Guards 07//1861; 4th. Sgt. promoted to 2nd. Lt.; wounded in 1863 at Gettysburg and in 1865 at Hatchers Run VA; saw much service; discharged at close of war; died at home of pneumonia 1870.

ALLEN, JOHN A.: enlisted Co. A, 13 Rgmt, GA Confederate Guards 07//1861; pvt.; discharged close of war.

ALLEN, S. Y.: Enlisted Co. H, 44 GA Rgmt., Doles Brigade, Army of Northern VA 03//1862; 4th. Cpl; promoted to 1st. Sgt.; wounded at Winchester; discharged at close of war.

COOK, BENJAMIN F: enlisted 1862; pvt.; Co. A, Georgia Guards 13 GA Rgmt, Gordon's Brigade, Army of Northern VA; discharged on account of eyesight.

COOK, H. C.: enlisted 1861; Co. A, Georgia Guards 13 GA Rgmt, Gordon's Brigade, Army of Northern VA; wounded in Battle of Wilderness VA 1864; discharged at close of war; died at home.

COOK, ELIJAH; JNO. A.; & WILLIAM A: enlisted 06/29/1861; pvts; Barnesville

Blues, Co. D, 3rd. GA Bat. James E. Rains Brigade; Army of TN; in 1863 3rd. GA Bat. & 9th. GA Bat. were consolidated forming the GA regmt. and Co. B of the 4th GA Bat. of Sharpshooters; in addition to major battles, were engaged private skirmishing and picket fighting almost continously; William A. drew pension for infirmity & poverty, died 05/06/1878; Mrs. W. M. Cook drew pension from 1916 to 1920; Mrs. S. I. Cook, wife of William Cook drew pension for 1920--22; paid funeral expense 01/01/1922, probably her death date; D. I. Cook shows died 06//1922.

COOK, J. C.: enlisted 08//1861; 2nd. Cpl.; Alexander Rifles, Co G 27 Rgmt. GA Colquitts Brigade, Army of northern VA; died Richmond VA 1861 of measles.

COOK, T. J.: enlisted 08//1861; Pvt.; Alexander Rifles, Co G 27 Rgmt. GA Colquitts Brigade, Army of northern VA; discharged 1861 due to inability.

COOK, G. D.: enlisted 1862; Cpl.; Co. H, 44th. Rgmt. GA, Dole's Brigade, Army of Northern VA; discharged at close of war.

COOK, J. J: enlisted 1862; 1st. Sgt.; Co. H, 44th. Rgmt. GA, Dole's Brigade, Army of Northern VA; promoted to Lt. & Capt.; wounded in 1862 at Sharpsburg; captured at Petersburg 1865; discharged at close of war.

COOK, J. M.: enlisted 1862; Pvt.; Co. H, 44th. Rgmt. GA, Dole's Brigade, Army of Northern VA; promoted to Sgt.; discharged at close of war.

COOK, WILEY E.: enlisted 1864; Pvt.; Co. G. First Reserves, GA State Troops; fought 2 battles at Cooswhatchie SC; discharged at close of war.

TERRELL, T(HOMAS) J(EFFERSON1: enlisted 1861; pvt.; Confederate Guards; Co. A., 13th Regmt. GA; Gordon's Brigade; Army of Northern VA; discharged at close of war.

TERRELL, WILLIAM HIENRY: enlisted 1862; pvt.; Confederate Guards; Co. A., 13th Regmt. GA; Gordon's Brigade; Army of Northern VA; discharged at close of war.

TERRELL, G[ENERAL] H[ARRISON]: enlisted 1862; pvt.; Confederate Guards; Co. A., 13th Regmt. GA; Gordon's Brigade; Army of Northern VA; discharged at close of war; died in Pike Co. GA 1896; Mrs. M. A. Terrell, widow of G. H. Terrell received \$60.00 a year pension from 1911 to 1917; pension increased; drew until her death 06/26/1934; moved to Concord, Pike Co. GA C/O Mrs. Bertha Marshall c1929.

TERRELL, AINDREWI DIAVIDI: enlisted 1862; pvt.; Confederate Guards; Co. A., 13th Regmt. GA; Gordon's Brigade; Army of Northern VA; promoted to Cpl. for saving john C. Allen's life; discharged at close of war; Bruce Todd has newspaper account of battle in Andrew David Terrell Bible.

TERRELL, FRANCIS [MARION]: enlisted 1862; Pvt.; Co. H, 53rd. GA Rgmt. Simms Brigade, Army of Northern VA; Longstreets Corp; died at home 1862.

WILLIAMS, D. C.: Co. G, First GA; enlisted 04/20/1864; drew pension for blindness & poverty from 1896 to 1920; died 03/17/1920.

WILLIAMS, H.: enlisted Co. K, 3rd. GA. 06//1964; drew \$60.00 per year pension for age and poverty in 1896 & 1897.

WILLIAMS, J. C.: enlisted 05//1862; Co H. 55th GA; drew \$60.00 per year pension 1901--1916, transferred to Spalding Co. GA. 1917.

WILLIAMS, J. S.: enlisted 08//1961; Pvt.; Alexlander Rifles; Co. G. 27 Rgmt. GA, Colquitt's Brigade, Army of Northern VA; wounded at Ocean Pond (Olustee) FL & died of wounds 1864.

WILLIAMS, JAMES M.: enlisted 06/29/1861; Barnesville Blues, Co. D, 3rd. GA Bat. James E. Rains Brigade; Army of TN; first Cpl; wounded & captured at Hoover's Gap; discharged at close of war.

WILLIAMS, JOHN W.: enlisted //1862; Pvt.; Co. A, 13th. GA Rgmt. Gordon's Brigade, Army of Northern VA; discharged on account of bad health.

WILLIAMS, Mrs. M. A.: Widow of J. A. Wiliams; enlisted 02/09/1863; Co. B., 4th. GA Bat.

WILLIAMS, THEO: enlisted 08//1861; Pvt.; Alexander Rifles; Co. G; wounded at Petersburg VA 1864; discharged at end of war; drew \$60.00 per year pension from 1904--1915; died 03/23/1915.

WILLIAMS, W. M.: enlisted 06/29/1861; Pvt.; Barnesville Blues, Co. D, 3rd. GA Bat. James E. Rains Brigade; Army of TN; wounded at Cumberland Gap; discharged at close of war.


