

BIOGRAPHICAL INDEXING

We have learned that Genealogical Indexing Associates has completed the task of indexing all persons appearing in biographical sketches in various histories and other sources in the state of Indiana which was considered the crossroads to the west. For this purpose, biographical sketch has been loosely defined to include any source which gives date of birth or insights into the life of a person has been indexed.

Their promotional material claims over 247,000 entries identified for Indiana alone.

A similar work is in progress for Illinois, and are planned for Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, New York, Kentucky, Iowa, Missouri, and other states as time and resources allow.

Two services are offered for Indiana at present. First, they offer a surname search at \$7.50 for the surname and \$6.00 for each variant.

Secondly, they offer a complete set of the Indiana Biographical Index on microfiche (16 fiche) with the first containing a list of references used for the index arranged numerically by source; the second containing the same references by county; and the remaining fiche containing the names of individuals arranged alphabetically for the entire state. Microfiche is \$120.00 for the set.

For example, to have a search of the surname TERRELL, and variants: TERREL, TEREL, TERRIL, TERRAL, TERALL, TIRRELL, TURRELL, & TYRRELL would cost us \$55.50, but could save hundreds or even thousands of hours of individual research for our present and future members. If you would like to contribute part or all of this cost, to see what data such searches will produce, the donation will be welcomed.

If you would care to donate a set of the microfiche to our archive, that would be welcomed also, however, we do not have equipment to read it and would have to take it to a library to read it.

STONE AGE

To avoid redundancy [rehashing previously published information], we are devoting this issue's column to recent developments in preserving Tyrrell-Terreill artifacts in England. Specifically, a project of The All Saints Society in England and its American Branch headed up by Mr. John Stuart of Dallas, TX.


In June, 1970, Mr. Stuart and his wife made a trip to England. At that time, they discovered the ancestral church of ALL SAINTS, set on a hill at East Horndon about 21 miles northeast of London.

The church was damaged and had been out of service for many months. With a desire to help restore this ancestral shrine, he met with some other descendants in England and the All Saints Society was formed with Mr. Stuart as Appeals Secretary.

Other officers of the All Saints Society included: President, Sir John Betjeman, C.B.E.--Poet Laureate of England; Chairman, William Grosvenor; Vice-Chairman, Ralph L. Peters (USA) England Rep. Ford Motor Company; Vice-Chairman, Peter Blacklock; & Secretary, John Bohling.

The Essex Weekly News, July 31, 1970 carried an article about the 'American business[man] who has started a personal campaign to save a historic Essex church from ruin.' The article continued to emphasize the damage by vandals and the speed with which correspondence began to flow between England and America. The Chelmsford Diocese office and Herongate and Ingrave Preservation Society were quick to contact Mr. Stuart. Miss Jenny Humphrey, a Brentwood freelance journalist who had researched the history of the church was also forwarding information.

Other articles stressed 'the ruinous state--bricks zigzagged in crazy decay, doors hung perilously on rusty hinges, the interior suffered from vandalism and pilfering (even the bells had been stolen!)' Journalist, Peter Brench preceded John Bohling in the early stages. The intensive publicity campaign he ran with the help of his friends was the catalyst for the restoration.

History of the church indicated it was completed in 1480 on the site of an

earlier church. It was used by the Tyrells who claimed descent from the knight who slew William Rufus in the New Forest and also served as their burial place.

A public meeting was held on All Saints Day 1970 with over 180 present even though the church only had 90 seats. A collection on that day helped to start the initial fighting fund. Volunteers began immediate urgent repairs.

Parties met at weekends despite appalling weather and draped the roof with polythene sheeting, boarded up the windows and removed much of the rubble. A team of volunteers, called the All Saints Patrol, was organized to visit the church by car every two hours from early morning to midnight and kept up the vigil for 8 months until the work was taken over by regular visitors on foot. Regular vandalism of 1969 and

1970 was reduced to one isolated incident during 1971 and had ceased totally by 1972. Negotiations to turn the church into an arts center fell through due to financial difficulties.

By June 1971, a survey, helped by a local resident and well known architect, Mr. Laurence King who generously lent his services, showed that 5,500 pounds would be required for the roofs, internal walls, and windows. Within 2 months, 2,000 pounds had been donated. These included grants from the county, local authority, the Ford Motor Company and sources on

both sides of the Atlantic. Mr. Stuart swelled that amount to 3,100 pounds by the end of October 1971.

The Rudundant Churches Fund had donated 1,500 pounds for immediate roof repairs. By May 1972, All Saints was vested in this fund, with the campaign acting as local agent. Restoration proper then began.

Builders began their massive engineering job in October 1972. The restoration required digging three feet below the Norman Foundations of 1100 AD which turned up a few archaeological finds, while supporting the roof and walls from inside, then lowering the building onto its new foundation.

Mr. Stuart managed to raise \$2,600 in less than five months and has since raised that total to \$17,000.00. He was able to attend the annual meeting in England in November 1972 and was praised by the local member of Parliament for his support.

Over 60 persons from 9 states have participated in this effort.

Plans include adding electricity and heat to modernize the building.


Those who contribute will have their names placed upon a plaque at the church and in the Archives.

The church does have several religious functions each year. These include concerts, etc.

Mr. Stuart laments that only a few of the origi-

Your editor and Society secretary gets letters at the approximate rate of 250-300 per year from descendants of the various surname lines, all wanting information on their specific ancestors. 'I read about the Terrell Society of America, Inc. in George Miller's column in the *Madison Weekly Herald*. I am descended from Robert Terrell. Robert's dau. Jane md Robert Ford in Henry Co. KY and her sister Elizabeth married Robert's brother Jarrett Ford 04/29/1798 in Bourbon Co. KY. Robert was from Orange Co. VA and evidently a friend of Warner Ford, father of Robert & Jarrett.' 'My search ends with Haste Homer Terrell. I know he md. a Lyk(e,i)ns woman and there it ends. Have death cert. pf an E. L. Terrell with the father listed as F. O. Terrell and mother M. J. Lykins, but also have word from Magoffin Co. KY of marriage of M. F. Terrell & Martha J. Lykins, [do not know which is mine]. My grandfather used an alias to elude my grandmother (maiden name Mary

Dikes); kidnapped my father and used his mother's maiden name which he spelled Lykens along with his nickname Acey, therefore Acey Lykens, also used A. (probably for Acey) H. Terrell for his name on my uncle's record 4 years after my father was born; rumored he was head of a "Terrell Gang" or "Terrell Raiders" and run out of several states before he reached TX. Somewhere he was crippled and in a wheelchair and was a traveling evangelistic minister of the Penecostal faith in Brisbee AZ. He did not tell my father he had a living mother & full brother. This was told to dad by Hasten's common law wife after Hasten's death. When my father met his real mother she answered all his questions with the same answer, "It's best you not know." NY. where he died 08/24/1860; feel Salista died in New Milford as he md. again after 1830; when we were in New Milford it was Sunday and nothing was open but on their historical building a placard of Captain Terrell or Terrill landed there in the 1600's; would appreciate any info.' SETTLING PAINS *The Colonial years.*

We have several members and many prospective members who trace their ancestry back to Elizabeth 'Betsy' Terrell of Culpeper County VA. We devote this column of this issue to some of her line.

Elizabeth 'Betsy' Terrell (06/10/1756--12/12/1830); born in Culpeper County VA; daughter of William 'Edmond' and Mary MALORY T.; she married about 1768 at Richland Plantation in Culpeper County VA, apparently only 12 or 13 years old; William WILKINS [later revolutionary Captain] (05/19/1746--04/02/1807); son of John (1720--1796, md. 1745) and Elizabeth HAYMIE OR HAYNE Wilkins; born Northhampton County, VA; and after marriage, they moved to original Spartanburg County South Carolina and settled in the vicinity of Goucher Creek, one of the tributaries of Thicketty Creek where they raised a large and highly respectable family; the WILKINS children:

1. Mary b. 11/11/1769 md. 08/05/1794 to Thomas GILLENTWATER;
2. Elizabeth (08/11/1771-01/09/1833) md. William CANTRELL;
3. Mildred 'Millie' (03/05/1773--12/04/1855; md. 12/08/1791 Davis GOODELOCK (12/25/1764--09/21/1828);
4. Terrell b. 02/21/1775 md. Sallie HARDIN? HAYDEN?;

5. Robert 'Robin' (12/05/1776--09/27/1848) md. Sarah 'Sallie' LITTLEJOHN (03/12/ 1777--10/10/1829);
6. Jane b. 08/14/1778 md. William AUSTELL; their two sons: Alfred Austell who later became a prominent banker in Atlanta, GA and has been well chronicled in publications in the Georgia State Archives, however, I have not seen any which put forth his deep religious convictions; Mrs. Grace Terrell Brown, daughter of Joseph Jefferson 'Bud' and Letitica June CAMP Terrell has a Bible which he gave to his niece Maraude Austell Camp that contains the following message: 'For the love and affection which I have for my niece, Elizabeth Maraude Camp, daughter of my only and beloved brother, William W. Austell, I present her with [this] sacred book trusting that she will read it and practice its teachings and impart the same to her children,' he then continued with a brief family history, part of which is incorporated into his brother's info which follows, and signed it Your Uncle Alfred Austell, Atlanta Georgia May 25, 1873; & William W. Austell (06/25/1812 -- 10/??/1842) born Jefferson County east Tennessee, died Campbellton, Campbell County GA; name of his wife is not known to your editor, but he had at least three daughters who became wards of his brother, Alfred Austell, after the death of William W; the were: Elizabeth Maraude who md. ? ? Camp; and one of their daughters, Letitica June CAMP married Joseph Jefferson 'Bud' Terrell, descendant of John & Marian T.; family tradition states that John Calhoun Terrell, father of 'Bud' Terrell objected to their marriage because 'they were kin,' however, the reasons for that belief have been lost to subsequent generations, we do not know if he knew of a direct blood relationship between his father John Terrell and Letitica Camp's ancestor 'Betsey' TERRELL Wilkins, or if he was basing his conviction on another connection of which he had positive knowledge; Letitica J. Austell on whom I have no further information; and Ophelia Maude Austell who married James W. Gorman, probably in Campbell County GA, and moved to Alabama, [See NEWSMAKERS]; 1855 Tax Digest, Campbell County GA, dist 733 Alfred Austell, guardian for Elizabeth M, Letitica J, & Ophelia M.
- Austell returned taxes for them; the daughters of William and Jane WILKINS Austell included: Jane Austell md. John SWAIN; Melissa Austell md. Netz HEATH; 'Betsey' Austell md. ? ? KIMBROUGH; & Nancy Austell md. Hill-E. S. FLOYD; if the Bible record has been correctly interpreted by your editor.

MINIMUM DUES RATE CHANGE IN 1987

On page 44, we proposed changing Article V of the By-Laws to set the following minimum annual donation. You were advised at that time that your silence would be considered approval. No one registered a written objection to the changes. No one at the reunion in CA expressed any objection to these changes. The general consensus seemed to be that the membership present would go along with whatever the officers felt had become necessary.

There was some suggestion for raising the minimum to \$10.00 per year, however, it was pointed out that our membership does not consist of persons who have only TERRELL ancestors and some belong to other family organizations as well. Due to that, we feel

that minimum dues should be held as low as possible in order to make our membership base as broad as possible.

It was also pointed out that the proposed changes only involved minimum donations required to get Terrell Trails. There is nothing to prevent a financially well endowed member, foundation, or other benefactor from making larger donations toward the exempt objectives of the Society if they so desire. Whatever is received will be greatly appreciated and used as wisely as possible.

So much for background; now the facts--Effective January 1, 1987, the minimum donation will be as follows:

[provides full choice (2,3,4,5,6,etc)
not limited to either 2 copies as

NON-MEMBER RATE \$12.00

[Applies only to private researchers
and others not eligible under MEMBER
Rate]

The renewal notices mailed with Vol II, #4 will reflect these changes and we will simplify our membership applications accordingly. These changes should eliminate some of the present confusion about our minimum donation rate structure. #####



**At 95, Mrs. Gorman Recalls The Time When She Was A
Belle Of The Old South; But She Lost Her Pretty
Dresses When Sherman Came Through**

'Ophelia Austell was the belle of many a ball in Georgia in the days when frothy masses of hoop skirts bobbed and whirled through a new dance, the Virginia Reel, and candlelight smoothed a soft sheen over bare shoulders and dancing clusters of curly Southern society was at its gayest when blond, coquettish Ophelia was a favorite of circling men.

And now, in the shadow of James Gorman and three times a great-grandmother, she celebrated her 85th birthday Jan. 12.

Today the waxy transparency of age has supplanted the rosy bloom of her teens, but Mrs. Gorman is still fondness and affectionate.

She has lost much interest in the arrangement of her little black piano as she used to pay to voluminous-haired florals and beaded parasols.

When Sherman Marched

She has lived for 10 years with her daughter, Mrs. S. J. Stuckey, at 3000 Mitchell St., the same house where she was the belle of her family estate near Atlanta.

Largely isolated from the world by failing sight and a most uneventful life, she finds comfort in memories.

She was 18 when the war began, she began her voice quivering but her words unaffected.

"I was just out of a very fine teacher's school and had the biggest ambition to play for you all," she said.

"But when Sherman came through Georgia and we all had to flee, I lost a trunkload of them. I've always wondered what became

of all my pretty dresses."

She has lost her right hand, which she had to amputate after a bullet wound.

Yankee Died On Lawns

But she does this seldom now, and when she does she is often moved, remembering Sherman's handsome young Yankee soldier mortally wounded died on the front lawn of her family estate, and when she left 200 miles from the Yankees, under a spade in the ground, she took his coat top for a pillow, to make the invaders think they'd exhausted the cache.

Memories and dreams are with her constantly. Family affairs sometimes tire her, and age makes her impervious to unpleasant weather, but she steadily looks forward to reaching a century of living.





I give to Daniel a mare named Young Rose, bridale, and saddle and I give him a bed and furniture and a cow and calf 260 acres of land lying East in Rowan County and I leave to be sold at Vendum likewise I leave 320 acres of land known by the name of Terrell Richard land to be sold at vendum. Likewise I leave my son Richard my great wagon. Likewise I lend the remainder of my estate unto my beloved wife during her widowhood, for the support of her and her children and in case she marries to enjoy it no longer and after her decease or marriage for it to be divided into lots and the lots drawn for betwixt son Solomon, son Nimrod my son Simon, my son Ation and my son Moses - I do appoint my friend John Pills and my wife two executors of this my last will and testament of this my earthly state. Likewise I give my wife leave to give to any of the children that now lives with us, when they marry or comes of age, if there is any stock, as she can spare, to give them any part as she shall think fit or longing.

The Orange county (Virginia) court record of 1815 show that John Terrell and Mary Elizabeth Harrison were ordered to appear at the next session of the court, being charged with fornication and copulation without benefit of wedlock. The same records also show that the next session of the court John Terrell and Mary Elizabeth Harrison did not appear as ordered. It also states that they were reported to have left the county.

Family lore relates that they did indeed, leave Orange county (Va.) and moved across the mountains into Rockingham county bringing with them their son, Reuben. Whether they were ever legally married cannot be determined.

Note 1. I have not determined the exact date of Reuben Terrell's birth nor death. We have assumed that he would have been born in approximately 1815 and was dead before the 1860 census.

Note 2. Calvin and St. Clair Terrell served in the Civil War, with the 10th Virginia Infantry, Company D, organized in Bridgewater, Virginia, in January, 1862.

No further records of Calvin or Jackson. It is assumed that they were both killed or died in the Civil War. No record of their burial place.

Also, no record of Jane Terrell. It is assumed that she died young and unmarried.

Note 3. No further record of this couple. Judging from his age at marriage St. Clair Terrell must have remained in Rockingham county after the Civil War. I have looked for information on his family, if any, in Louisa county, but found nothing. It is interesting that he married a girl from that county, which is not close by, in Rockingham county.

Note 4. No further record of this couple.

Note 5. This is my grandmother. She was unmarried when my father was born and he was raised by another family. She married three years later and is buried in the Flick family cemetery near Linville, Virginia.

Note 6. Margaret Terrell had children by Madison Huffman but I have no record of them.

Note 7. This is Elizabeth Terrell, wife of Reuben. Solomon Flick was her son-in-law. (Also her friend.)

Note 8. According to my father's obituary, which is attached, Elizabeth and Solomon Flick had other children. David Flick, a half brother, is listed as a survivor. I have no knowledge of these people.

Note 9. I have no record of John William Terrell. If he survived he apparently was adopted by Madison Huffman (Note 6) and his name changed.

Note 10. It is hard to justify these dates. The 5 year old child could have not been their son.
