A. Page 405 of TRAILS contains a query from Miss. Elizabeth L. Browning; 1220 Tahiti Dr.; Crestwood, MO 63126. She stated that she is 3rd. great granddaughter of Anna TERRELL LAY. She gives part of her line in that query, but no ancestry prior to Anna. She would be your cousin in some degree. I do not know if the address is still valid.

No one else mentioned Anna TERRELL LAY in the 426 indexed pages of TRAILS. Vols VI-VIII are not indexed and cannot be checked without scanning every page.

Of the books in the Lending Library, *TERRELL GENEALOGY*, by Emma DICKEN, is the most comprehensive. I do not have a copy so I cannot check the index for you. However, Pat can. There will be very few LAY entries in the index.

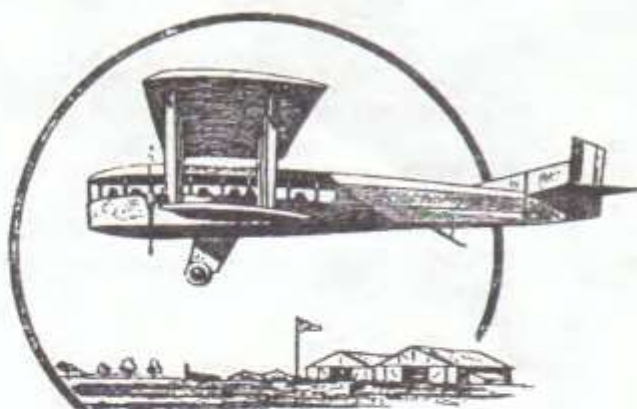

On the other hand, researchers don't have time to read every word of your book to see if their ancestor is included. Some of us look for an index, and if none is found, immediately return the book to the shelf.

I had a chance to visit **Prospect Hill Inn** during August 1992 with my son. We were so impressed and honored to be able to visit such a beautiful place that had once belonged to **Richmond TERRELL**.

The young couple who were running the inn were children of the owner, **Mr. SHEEHAN** of New York state.

He has lovingly and quite expensively restored the plantation that dates back to 1732.

It is the oldest working plantation in America, and won the "Best Inn of the Year" Award in 1990. It is the most beautiful place and the minute you drive into the driveway, you are transported back into time.

It would be nice to have a TERRELL Reunion in the Charlottesville area and maybe gather there for lunch or a special event. I don't believe there would be sufficient space for everyone to stay at the Inn.

They do have parties and weddings there.

Charlottesville is where many of the TERRELLs moved as the frontiers opened up.

My ancestor, **Joel TERRELL**, and his brother-in-law, **David LEWIS**, were huge land holders in Albemarle County. Joel TERRELL's home was where the present day City Hall stands. He helped with the forming of the University of Virginia, and I believe I read somewhere that he donated land to the University.

When one mentions the TERRELL name in the Charlottesville vicinity, everyone seems familiar with the name. Several streets in Charlottesville are named TERRELL.

The young innkeeper, **Michael SHEEHAN**, has some of the history of the plantation and is eager for any further information anyone has on the TERRELL/OVERTON families.

TERRELL/COURTER DESCENDANTS

The COURTERS are of Scotch & Dutch ancestry several generations back. The solid qualities of that combination are apparent in the generations represented here.

Henry M. COURTER was born in Essex Co. New Jersey, son of **Henry** and **Charlotte TERRELL COURTER**. He learned the shoemaking trade, which he followed until he came to Ohio in 1857 and bought a home in Berkshire Township. He brought his family here the following year and remained until his death. He spent the closing three years of his life in the home of his son, **Pell T. COURTER**.

Henry M. COURTER md. **Desire C. E. TEED** (daughter of **Pell TEED**; a member of one of the oldest families of Essex Co. NJ; she md. 1. **John JONES** who d. in Columbiana Co. OH a few days before the birth of their son, **John F. JONES**); children who reached maturity: **George H. COURTER** (died before 1908); **Pell Teed COURTER**; **Josiah COURTER** (died before 1908); **Amzi COURTER** who resided at Galena OH in 1908; **Charlotte COURTER** who m. **L. W. MILLER** & resided at Bellafontaine in 1908; & **Wesley COURTER** who resided at Mt. Pleasant MI in 1908. The parents were of the Baptist faith.

Pell Teed COURTER, who bears his maternal grandfather's name, was born 08/25/1840 in Essex Co. NJ. He was eighteen years old when the family came to Delaware County Ohio. It cost \$2.00 per month to send a child to school so he was not afforded many months of schooling past age eight. When he was eleven years old, he went to work at the shoe bench and learned shoemaking. By the time he was 12 years old, he went to a journeyman shoe shop and took a job on his own. It was customary for the shoemaker to take his work home with him. The proprietor of the shop had some misgivings when he gave him his first two dozen shoe order. When a rigid inspection of those well-made shoes failed to show any defect, he had no trouble getting all the work he could do. The thoroughness demonstrated in his boyish efforts continued in all his enterprises and probably has been one of the factors of his business success.

Until 1883, he followed the shoemaking trade. At that time, he became foreman in a shoe store for about three years. He worked as a clerk after that.

In 1881, he took charge of his father-in-law's farm on the east side of the river. His thoroughness and attention to detail brought success.

In the spring of 1894, he purchased a farm containing 60 acres. He operated mainly a stock farm, senior proprietor of Pleasant Hill stock farm in Delaware Township. He operated under the name of P. T. Courter & Sons. He specialized in thorough-bred swine and sheep, mainly raising registered Chester White hogs and Shropshire Sheep. He also raised choice poultry including Rose Comb Brown Leghorns. Feed crops included corn, oats, wheat, and hay.

In April, 1861, he put his personal plans aside and enlisted in Company I, Fourth Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry. He was sent to Camp Dennison through his first enlistment. In October, 1861, he reenlisted in Company E, Sixty-sixth Ohio Volunteer Infantry and was soon sent across the river into Virginia. From Wheeling, the regiment followed down the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad to Martinsburg, to Winchester, and on to Frederickburg. On 06/09/1862, he participated with Gen. JACKSON's troops at Port Republic and was taken prisoner. He was incarcerated at Lynchburg VA, Fair Grounds, and then Belle Isle where he was kept until 09/13/1862. He was paroled and sent to Annapolis MD and Alexandria VA. He was detained there until 11/20/1862 when he joined his regiment at Bolivar Heights. He was honorably discharged because of disability in November 1862. He was a member of the George B. Torrence Post, Grand Army of the Republic.

He was a republican, but never actively sought an office. He did serve as township trustee.

Pell Teed COURTER md. **Eliza KRUCK** (Daughter of Mathias KRUCK; she was born in Delaware Township, Delaware Co. OH, where her father settled in 1842.) They had three children: **Harry COURTER**; **Clara COURTER**; and **Walter COURTER**.

Harry COURTER married **Emma SALISBURY** and had one son, **Earl H. COURTER**. Harry assisted his father in operating the farm. He was reported to be very enterprising, intelligent, and successful as a businessman.

Clara COURTER md. **John H. MAXTON** and resided in Van Wert, OH. They had four children: **Ruth MAXTON**; **Jean Marguerite MAXTON**; **Reid MAXTON**; & **Vesta MAXTON**.

Walter COURTER preceded his parents and siblings in death prior to 1908. He left an unnamed widow and children: **Ralph COURTER**; and **Perry COURTER**.

Pell T. COURTER and family belonged to St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church. He was active for a long time. He served for years as a trustee and as superintendent of the Sunday School. He was a practical and enthusiastic supporter of the congregation for many years. He also supported public spirited enterprises in his community. He was one of the first to recognize the importance of good roads to insure speedy and safe

transportation. He was one of the first to introduce improved machinery on his own farm and to encourage others to do so. His efforts to raise the grade of livestock to a high standard was of great value to those who lived in that section.

He was still alive in 1908 when the 20th Century History of Delaware County, Ohio was compiled and published.

BAD ED TERRELL

He contended that the Historical Highway Marker located where the Armstrong Hotel used to be was incorrect and should be replaced during the Bicentennial year. We do not have current information to indicate whether the marker was changed.

BAD ED

When a famous son is thought of by a county's people, the thought is of one who has achieved notoriety because of some act, gift, or service which would tend to improve the lifestyle of his fellow man.

Shelby County's **Ed TERRELL** was such a man. He fought the Confederate guerrilla bands that roamed the Kentucky countryside. He let the attack which resulted in the mortal wounding of the infamous **William Clarke QUANTRILL**. **Ed TERRELL** could have become a tremendously popular folk hero, but he instead became an outlaw.

Edwin TERRELL was born in Harrisonville in 1845. The month and day are not known. The year is confirmed by the 1850 census of Shelby County which shows **R. C. (Richard Coleman) TERRELL**, age 30, Martha (his wife, **Martha BAKER**) age 23 and their children: 7 year old **Robert**, 5 year old **Edwin**, 3 year old **Margaret**, and one year old **John**.

Before Martha TERRELL's death 04/26/1853, she had two more children named **Richard** and **Alice**. **Richard Coleman TERRELL** was a storekeeper in Harrisonville. It appears he went on a buying trip not long after Martha's death. The family legend is that he was murdered by "road agents." Genealogical

records refer to Alton, Illinois as the place of burial of Edwin's father.

With his parents dead, young Edwin, his brothers and sisters moved into the home of their grandfather, **Robert John Robert (R. J. R.) BAKER** near Harrisonville. The will of John R. BAKER, Edwin's great-uncle, reveals the residue of money or property from Richard Coleman TERRELL's estate was to be applied to the cost of educating the girls Margaret and Alice. The will, dated 01/13/1856, also says, "The same to be paid to their guardian whoever he may be." This may indicate Richard Coleman TERRELL had only recently been confirmed dead because his estate had not been settled. The will also tends to indicate he had been dead for such a short time, legal guardians had not yet been named for the children.

R. J. R. BAKER was declared legal guardian of his grandchildren. Edwin continued to live in the home of the moderately wealthy hog farmer until he became a young man.

About 1861, when the Civil War was just beginning, Edwin was seen. **Ed D. SHINNICK** wrote about TERRELL:

"Young TERRELL was known as a dare-devil from the time he was old enough to go to school, and an invitation to fight, no matter how much larger the boy who made it was always accepted without hesitation. Before he was grown, he became a bareback rider in **Dan COSTELLO's** circus, and while thus engaged he killed his first man in Baltimore, Maryland, where the circus was giving a series of exhibitions. The man was a saloon-keeper, who took offense at what TERRELL said in reference to the liquor that was furnished, and drawing a gun, shot TERRELL in the arm. The latter jumped over the bar, after being wounded, and knocked the saloon-keeper down, took the gun away from him and blew out his opponent's brains with the charge in the other barrel of the gun. He was arrested and put in jail, but at his trial was acquitted. He then returned to Kentucky and joined the Confederate army."

The Maryland Historical Society conducted a newspaper search and the county's only source of circus history, Ringling Brothers Museum in Florida, hunted for TERRELL's record with the big top. Both organizations reported they found nothing on Edwin TERRELL even though extensive searches were made.

Ed SHINNICK made this report on **Ed TERRELL** in an early newspaper account (Concerning TERRELL's reported service with the Confederacy).

"On one occasion he and another soldier were sent to a farm house to arrest two Union Soldiers, who were said to be hiding there. Upon demanding admittance to the house one of the soldiers, who was the upstairs window, shot him, making a serious wound, from which he suffered at all times thereafter. After being shot, he went into the house and, with his own hand, killed both of the soldiers. Later he was cursed and struck by a superior officer in the Confederate army, and he deliberately shot and killed him. He was tried by a drum head court martial and sentenced to be shot. While under sentence he succeeded in burrowing out of his prison and escaping to Louisville, was given a commission by the Federal General **John M. PALMER**, as captain of independent scouts."

Mr. SHINNICK may have been rushing **Ed** a bit. **Forest E. DUDLEY**, Chief of the War Records Section of the Department of Military Affairs in Frankfort made this report on Edwin TERRELL's enlistment in the Union Army.

"**Edwin TERRELL** was 19 years old when he joined for service. One of the original Muster rolls from Company "D", 37th Kentucky Infantry, shows that he joined for service 7 October 1863 at Lebanon, Kentucky, and the other muster roll shows he joined at Campbellsville, Kentucky."

The October 7, 1863 date and site -- Lebanon, Kentucky are confirmed in a Company Muster -- in Roll from the National Archives. It shows Private Edwin TERRILL of Captain **MIDDLETON's** Company, 37th Regiment, Kentucky Infantry.

If **Ed TERRELL** had as much trouble when a Confederate as indicated by **SHINNICK**, his tenure in his early days as a Federal was no less plagued with difficulty.

Company Muster Roll records from the National Archives show **Ed TERRELL** under arrest from about November 30, 1863 until March, 1864.

It seems the Union Command found **Ed TERRELL** to be particularly effective as a Federal Guerrilla and they allowed him to roam about with a group of men of his choosing and to do battle with his rebel counterparts.

Ed had his share of run-ins with the butternut-clad irregulars in 1864, but the rebel guerrillas he would collide head-long with in 1865 would prove to be his toughest challenges. **COLLIN'S HISTORY OF KENTUCKY** notes that on January 18, 1865, Captain **Edwin TERRELL** and thirteen of his men had a

"desperate fight" with guerrillas near New Have in Nelson County. This may have been a group of QUANTRILL's men.

On January 28, 1865, now "Captain" Ed TERRELL led a group of eighteen "Home Guardsmen" into Bloomfield. Reports say they were plundering the stores when Sue MUNDY and Henry MAGRUDER rode into town at the head of sixty men. MUNDY (actually Marcellus Jerome CLARKE of the Franklin, Kentucky area) and MAGRUDER (from Bullitt County) led a charge of blazing guns. One report says all of TERRELL's men were killed and TERRELL was left critically wounded. A doctor was summoned when the fight was over. A Dr. DUNLAP told TERRELL he was going to die. TERRELL called the good doctor "a damned liar." TERRELL recovered from the wound.

TERRELL's genealogy at a glance shows why he was such a warrior. Ed was a direct descendant of William the Conqueror. His grandfather, Zach fought in the War of 1812 and was a Captain of Kentucky troops under Andrew JACKSON at New Orleans. Ed's great-uncle George fought in the Revolutionary War and his uncle Henry Clay TERRELL was a Union Soldier.

When Ed TERRELL was mustered out of the regular Union Army December 29, 1864, he received the best wishes of the army to continue his harassment of the Confederate guerrillas. He continued to lead his band of Shelby and Spencer countians against the various groups of "silent riders" operating in north-central Kentucky.

Perhaps TERRELL became a bit overzealous when he and his scouts killed young John BUTTS on the Candy Branch of the Salt River in Spencer County. It was January 5, 1865. TERRELL claimed he and his men ran upon three or more guerrillas at the BUTTS place. After the skirmish, TERRELL and his men were jailed at Springfield. In a letter TERRELL wrote to Colonel FARLEIGH in Louisville, he stated:

"Today (January 6, 1865) we started and had us a prisoner, making our way to the nearest place where was Union Soldiers and when within (9) miles from Bloomfield we was fired upon by a party of MARION's or MAGRUDER's men and we skedadled till we got a good place to fight them, but they had the best of us, being armed with Carbines and we having only revolvers and (2) only navys. And in the brush we lost the prisoner and a horse we took from BUTTS farm, him we killed. When within 8 or 10 miles from Springfield we say they had reinforced and I thought my poor little band would not cope with them. And when we arrived here the citizens which I think are all most Union men could not believe we was Union men. But we allowed them to place us under arrest until they was perfectly satisfied."

Relatives of the slain John BUTTS said the twenty year old Confederate was not a guerrilla but was simply home on leave. They said he had been skating with his brothers and sisters and had come inside to eat dinner. The family story is that TERRELL called John BUTTS out and gunned him down.

Still another source, the diary of newspaper columnist William Thomas LOVE ("Salt River Tom") indicates BUTTS may have indeed become a Confederate guerrilla. If so, TERRELL had every right to kill him.

On January 30, 1865, Ed TERRELL and William Clarke QUANTRILL locked horns for the first time. QUANTRILL and his men were riding into Chaplin. TERRELL and about sixty men were heading the opposite way. Once the fight broke out, it continued for five miles up and down the road. Surprisingly, there were few casualties and both TERRELL and QUANTRILL lived to fight another day.

While Ed fought the southern irregulars on a hit-or-miss basis, the Union Command decided it wanted more action from the Shelby Countian they considered "Kentucky's fastest gun." They summoned him to Louisville and told him to pick his men and rid the countryside of the roving guerrillas. He chose thirtymen and on April 1, 1865, they were all placed on a special U. S. Army payroll. Ed would get fifty dollars a month. His First Lieutenant, John THOMPSON would receive thirty dollars and Horace ALLEN, third in command would get the same. The other twenty-eight men were paid twenty dollars a month to hunt guerrillas. They were: Scott ANSHUTZ, William BLOOM, Albert BOWMAN, Gilbert M. BROOKS, Andrew COOK, Joseph COOK, William COOK, Lev COTTON, Sylvester CHEATHAM, Franklin DOUGHTERTY, Robert EDWARDS, Talton EMBRY, Warren HACKER, Thomas JOHNSON, John JOHNSON, Benjamin KIRKPATRICK, John LANGFORD, John MIDDLETON, Albert ROSS, John ROGERS, Benjamin STEVENS, Henry SMITH, Elias STOHL, Charles TAYLOR, Joseph TAYLOR, George TRUMBO, Anderson TERRELL, and Thomas WILSON.

On April 16, 1865, the Confederate guerrilla Bill MARION was killed. Ed TERRELL attempted to take credit for the "kill" and apparently was so recognized. This however is a report of Lt. Col. John G. ROGERS of the Fifty-fourth Kentucky Infantry dated April 17, 1865 and filed from Lebanon. It is addressed to Major General PALMER, Headquarters, Louisville.

"MARION, the guerrilla was killed yesterday by Captain PENN's company of Kentucky State Troops. Captain TERRELL is on his way to Louisville with the body and may claim the honor. He took the body while PENN and his men were pursuing the balance of the guerrillas. He had only two men in the fight and they had pistols only. MARION was killed by a carbine cartridge. I send this in justice to Captain PENN. Particulars by mail."

It was May 10, 1865 when Ed TERRELL bagged his biggest game. TERRELL and his men were following a fresh calvary trail north out of Bloomfield, Kentucky. As the scouts moved past a small junction called Smileytown, they ran into a steady rain. Just above Smileytown, the column halted in front of Almsted JACOBS' Blacksmith Shop. TERRELL asked the Negro blacksmith if he had seen any riders come by his shop.

JACOBS pointed to the barn of James Heady WAKEFIELD over the rise to the southwest. TERRELL had the message.

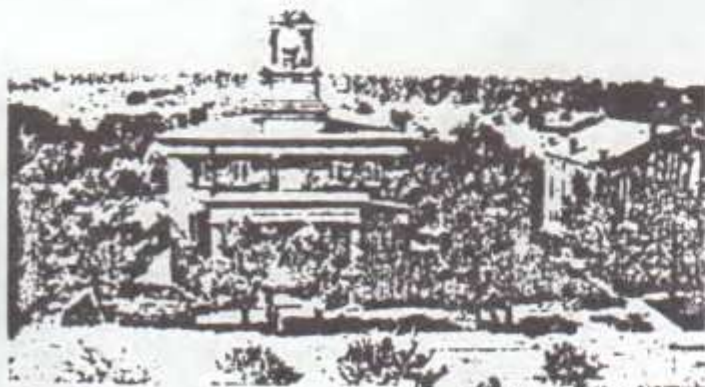
As TERRELL's men rode down on the barn shooting and shouting, Ed pulled up and watched from the ridge. He had recently wrenched his right shoulder, inflaming an old wound and making it difficult to handle a gun. Nevertheless, TERRELL added vocal encouragement such as "give em' hell boys!"

There were few casualties in the short foray. Two of the guerrillas were killed and one wounded. The dead were Clark HOCKENSMITH and Dick GLASSCOCK. There was speculation that the wounded man was William Clarke QUANTRILL but he told TERRELL he was "Captain CLARKE of the Fourth Missouri Cavalry."

TERRELL rode off in search of those who escaped, apparently thinking One-Arm Sam BERRY might have been in the group, but he held land-owner James Heady WAKEFIELD responsible for his prisoner. Early the next morning, Frank JAMES and others slipped into the WAKEFIELD house and talked to QUANTRILL, but they could not persuade him to make an escape attempt. QUANTRILL was certain he would die. He was wounded in the spine and paralyzed from the waist down. Frank JAMES had narrowly escaped being in the fight. He was just a few miles away at the home of Alexander and Finetta SAYERS.

TERRELL returned Friday, May 11, apparently convinced it was indeed the infamous QUANTRILL he had captured.

John LANGFORD is credited with firing the bullet that left QUANTRILL helpless, but TERRELL is said to have entered the fight when it was about over and is noted as having shot off one of QUANTRILL's fingers after QUANTRILL was already down. In later years, LANGFORD and Sylvester CHEATHAM would both claim they had shot QUANTRILL. TERRELL and his men took QUANTRILL to Louisville. He died June 6, 1865.

Now TERRELL's reputation had improved. In fact, the people of Shelbyville cheered loudly when TERRELL and his band rode into town May 18, 1865. Some black soldiers had been breaking up patent farm machinery made of wood to use as kindling. When shop owner, Thomas C. McGRATH attempted to stop them, one of the black soldiers shot and killed him. The soldier's superior officers quickly arrested him and the entire group of black soldiers rushed to the court house. The citizens were arming themselves and roaming the streets as TERRELL and some of his men arrived.

Ed and the boys were "feel'n their oats." They stormed the court house, put a rope around the neck of the soldier accused of killing McGRATH and were about to toss him from the third floor balcony when a troop of Union soldiers rode in and stopped it.

"TERRELL's Scouts" were disbanded and paid off on May 24, 1865.

From that day, Edwin TERRELL would earn the nickname, "Bad Ed." TERRELL went on a rampage of murder. Hearing that General PALMER wanted to hang him, he fled to Mexico in the summer of 65 but was back in Kentucky in late August.

TERRELL and his Lieutenant, John H. "Harry" THOMPSON heard that a stock trader named William R. JOHNSON was in Shelbyville with a large sum of money on his person. The two robbed him, shot him, and dumped his body into the creek. JOHNSON, from Sangamon County, Illinois, was carrying sixteen hundred dollars in gold and a big wad of greenbacks.

On a Sunday morning following the murder, Irishman, Tommie FOX went fishing in the creek and "caught" Mr. JOHNSON.

TERRELL and THOMPSON were arrested.

On September 21, 1865, THOMPSON played the banjo all night as TERRELL dug. The jail break was unsuccessful. On March 12, 1866, TERRELL and THOMPSON were tried for the JOHNSON murder. The jury could not or would not decide.

TERRELL and John L. WETHERS, who had also recently been incarcerated, were transferred to the Taylorsville jail where they would await trial for the murder of blacksmith, Ennis WOOTEN. TERRELL had stopped at WOOTEN's shop not long before and asked that his horse be shod. When WOOTEN finished he said to TERRELL, "Now will you pay me all that you owe me?" TERRELL replied by shooting WOOTEN and declaring over his dead body, "Another damn rebel gone to hell."

While awaiting trial at Taylorsville, TERRELL and WETHERS whittled away at the ceiling of the jail. TERRELL's men slipped into town. A gun was at the jailer's head as TERRELL and WETHERS were freed, just about the same time they succeeded in breaking through the roof. The jail-break was April 13, 1866.

TERRELL remained a free man until May, 1866. It has been reported that he killed seventeen men after the Civil War ended. May 26, 1866, his killing days ended.

Ed, his 25 year old uncle, **John R. BAKER**, and **WETHERS** rode into Shelbyville. They'd been drinking at **Jack EADE's** place in Clayvillage. **David J. THOMPSON** argued with TERRELL when "Bad Ed" said he was going to ride into Shelbyville and "bluff the town." Ed threatened to kill THOMPSON, but didn't.

TERRELL, BAKER, and WETHERS stopped at the Armstrong Hotel and "carried on" some. Marshall **George W. CAPLINGER** heard that Ed was in town and quietly organized a posse. His organizing wasn't quiet enough. WETHERS heard what was going on and slipped out of town through back alleys.

TERRELL and BAKER were riding eastward when TERRELL noticed **Merritt REDDING** in front of his hotel and pulled up to talk. Just as the conversation got underway, someone in the shadows across the street yelled, -- "Halt!" A shower of bullets came from all direction. TERRELL wheeled and fired into the darkness. BAKER was hit nine times. He rode as far as **John SHANNON's** place and fell from his horse -- dead. Ed had ridden only about fifty feet when a bullet struck him in the spine. He crawled onto the pavement in front of **R. A. CAMPBELL's** store (where **LAWSON's** was in 1974) and tried to pull his pistol again. A man named **J. Q. JOHNSON** stuck his thumb under the hammer and prevented TERRELL from firing. JOHNSON had to have the thumb amputated. **Merritt REDDING** was accidentally wounded. He died of the wounds August 23, 1866. A young man named **Will RANDOLPH** suffered a graze wound in he neck. He was "just watching" but stuck his neck out too far.

TERRELL and WETHERS were placed in the Jefferson County Jail for safekeeping. TERRELL was so badly wounded however he could not be tried and on October 3, 1866, his grandfather, **R. J. R. BAKER** paid \$5,000 bail and took Ed home to Harrisonville.

TERRELL's buddy and former comrade-in-arms, **Harry THOMPSON**, **John BAKER**, and **Kenny** (probably relations of Ed as 1850 census shows **R. J. R. BAKER** had a nine year old son named John) broke out of the Shelby County Jail October 23, 1866. This is the famous break in which the "Fat Dutchman," **Tobias WESTERMAN** attempted to follow but was "caught in the hole."

Ed lay in the old BAKER house at Harrisonville suffering from his back wound. At times, old sources say, he felt better and one day felt well enough to take a shot at his brother-in-law. The old sources don't say how he was able to get hold of a pistol.

Finally, unable to stand the suffering any longer, Ed posted \$3,000 for his own bond to leave the county and have an operation. Dr. **Thomas YENOWINE** of Mt. Eden would take him to City Hospital in Louisville and there, with other doctors, try to remove the bullet from his spine.

The date of Ed TERRELL's death, the place of his death, and the site of his burial are among Shelby County's most mystifying historical puzzles.

There are clues to the answers. My cousin, **Ottis GOODWIN** who married Ed's sister's daughter (**Alice TERRELL's** daughter, **Catherine**) told me, "Alice said she would never get married until Ed was dead." **Alice TERRELL** married **Ab GRAY** on December 5, 1867. I have followed the murder indictment against Ed for the slaying of **Here WALKER** in Jefferson County and the case is continued in the big books on the top floor of the court house until November 18, 1867 -- then the case no longer appears.

Here WALKER was a desperado himself according to legend and it is reported that Ed was "invited" to kill him by Jefferson County authorities. Ed must have been surprised when they indicted him for murder.

Nowhere in all the books on the Civil War History, guerrillas, irregulars, etc., and nowhere in the microfilms, the stacks, the files or genealogies can the date, place, and site be found.

Local history buff, **Rufus HARROD** says he has always heard Ed TERRELL died in the yard of the house now occupied by **Nolan WALLS** in Mount Eden.

In **William Elsey CONNELLEY's** book, **QUANTRILL AND THE BORDER WARS**, CONNELLEY says Dr. **YENOWINE** reported TERRELL died in Louisville while undergoing spinal surgery. The late **Scott MCCLAIN**, a very worthy historian, says he "read in a rare book somewhere that TERRELL died in a wagon while being taken from the hospital in Louisville back to his home."

If TERRELL died in Mt. Eden, he may have been buried next to his grandparents in the old **SNIDER Graveyard** outside Mt.

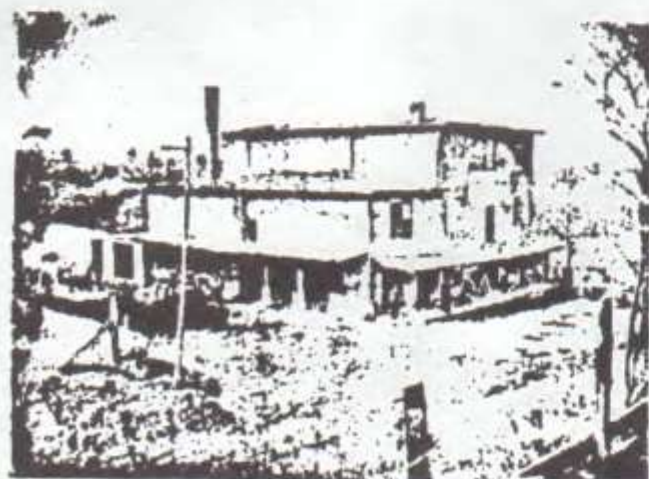
Eden. His mother is buried in the Pigeon Fork cemetery. There is no stone for Ed in either of these.

The old tale that Ed "had a lot of gold" and that it might have been buried somewhere on the BAKER place -- may survive the generations but no one has ever found even a whiff of the gold -- we don't think. Metal detector experts have combed the farm. There is the tale about an old fellow who used to visit the house near Harrisonville and spend "long hours" upstairs

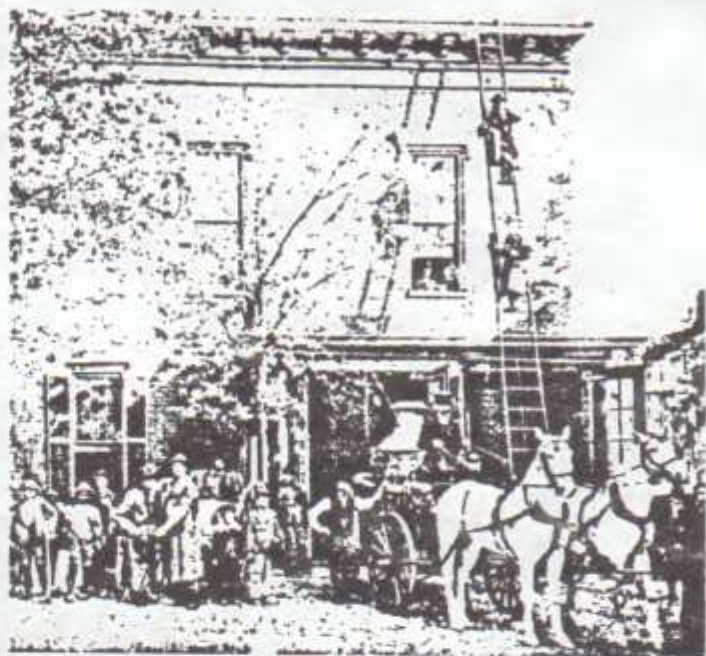
"looking around." One day the fellow stopped coming and it was said he had come into "sudden wealth."

Ed TERRELL has sure left Shelby County -- A Name in History.

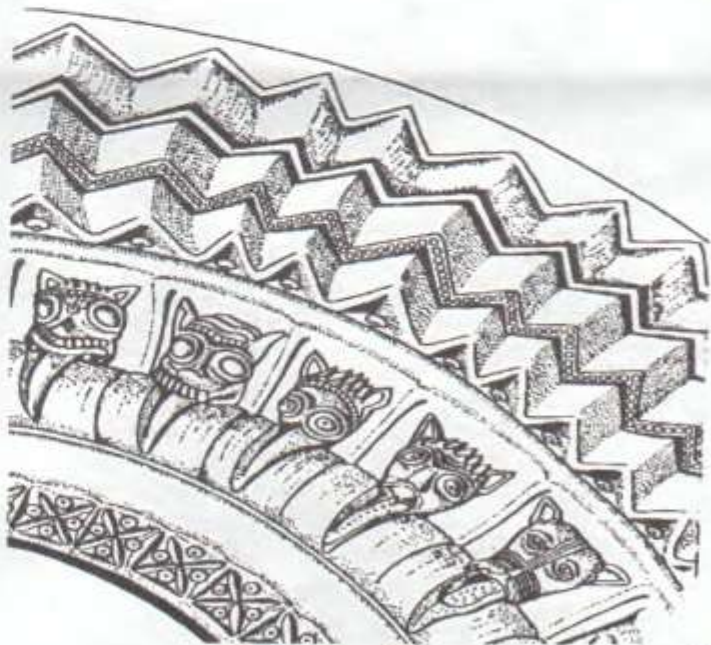
