GENEALOGY? ASK DAN!

Q. WHERE DID CORNELIUS D. TERRELL COME FROM? I am attempting to trace the geographical origins of the first 1000 individuals who bought land from the Springfield, MO land office. Unfortunately, 498 are still missing. I am sure you can understand why I cannot subscribe to all the surname newsletters, journals, and quarterlies that have those surnames. One of the most difficult of my missing pioneers is a man called Cornelius D. TERRILL. I hope that you will run at least part of the enclosed information in your quarterly. Thank you very much for Consideration.

Cornelius D. TERRELL was b. ca 1800. He d. after the 1840 census of Taney County and before 12/01/1840 when bond was taken on his estate. He. m. in Greene County 04/21/1835 to Elizabeth, widow of James WILSON.

C. D. TERRELL first appeared in Greene Co. MO on the 1834 tax list with 1 horse. On 07/17/1837, he mortgaged a lot in Springfield to Samuel GRIGSBY and no relase indicated, so he was not able to pay the debt.

He was listed in the Taney Co. 1840 Census, p. 117 with 1 male under 5, 2 males 5-10, 1 male 10-15, 1 male 20-30, and 1 male 30-40; I female 10-15, 1 female 20-30. He was the administrator of the estate of Joseph CROW in 1836,

Peter APPERSON, Jr. (who lived in Overton County TN and Cooper Co. MO before moving to Green Co.) was appointed Administrator of C. D. TERRILL's estate with John ED-WARDS, Sr. (who may have been a relation of Peter APPER-SON, Jr.'s wife, Melinda EDWARDS, whose ancestry is unknown) and John BURDEN as surieties \$2,000. When John Edwards became insolvent, Peter APPERSON, Sr. placed security. Part of his probate case seems to be missing and was probably settled in Tancy County, but those records are burned. The part in Greene County contains no listing of heirs, no letters of administration, and no distribution. Many people in Greene County owed Dr. TERRELL money and there was an estate sale held which named many individuals from Greene County. Joseph BURDEN came to court in 1845 and wished to make the court aware that John EDWARDS, Senior had become insolvent and he was now the only security. Therefore, Peter APPERSON. Sr was made security at an amount of \$2,000 (Greene Co. Probate #9745). The estate was appraised by John W. HAN-COCK, Eli JESSUP, and William P. COX.

A negro girl, Addy [Adaline], valued at \$400 was sold 07/18/1842 for \$651.00 along with two wolf scalps for a total of \$653.00. On 03/11/1843, the estate was charged for attending the sale of **Stephen BOONE** property for the benefit of estate.

A list of notes belonging to the estate of Cornelius TERRELL included: Daniel BROWN, 1839; James BURROW, 1839; John

W. DANFORTH; John DIXON; James DANFORTH; John C. FARMER; John L. FULBRIGHT, 1839; D. O. GEORGE; Caleb HORN; Thos. R. HUNT; A. W. MAUPIN, given by William T. MILLER; Harris G. JOPLIN, 1839; James JONES; Esq. MORTON; Kindred ROSE; Henry COLLIER; N. R. SMITH, etc.

At the sale held on 01/01/1841, Samuel THOMAS bought the Bible and a Thomas TERRELL was mentioned. [One Thomas TERRELL was enumerated in Greene Co. in 1850 #433 as 34 years of age, b. NC, all his children b. MO.]

TERRELL appeared to be in partnership with John W. BALL and later with Benjamin JEWETT.

Suit of Joseph HALL vs. estate of C. D. TERRELL. Those summoned in February 1842 included: John W. BALL; Rebecca CROW; L. D. HALAY; A. YOUNG; & Charles W. YOUNG. Executed by Thomas HORN, sheriff.

Milton APPERSON was paid for driving cattle and horses in December 1840.

In 1850, one Cornelius TERRELL (probably C. D.'s son) was living in Newton County, MO in Neosho Twp. p. 331: Cornelius TERRELL, age 11, b. MO. He was living with J. J. SNEAD, age 40, physician, b. VA \$2,000; Ann, age 40 b. TN; also in the family was Susan MATHIS, age 8 b. MO. [Nothing was found in Greene Co. records on J. J. SNEAD.]

On 04/24/1860 Cornelius D. TERRELL, as son and heir of C. D. TERRELL, deceased by his attorney, John M. RICHARDSON, filed a bill of complaint against Peter APPERSON and asked that the court revoke letters of administration of Peter APPERSON and issue them to someone else. C. D. TERRELL complained that Peter APPERSON has become so much addicted to drunkness that he is "unsuitable to execute the business reposed in him." The outcome cannot be determined from the probate packet. In August 1860, the probate court reported that the defendant had been notified, but stated that he would not appear. It appeared to the satisfaction of the court that Peter APPERSON was unfit to administer the estate, that he failed to discharge his duties and he was released. The Public Administration was appointed to continue the administration (Greene County Probate Book C, p. 573.)

In the 426 indexed pages of TERRELL TRAILS, there is only one TERRELL/CORNELIUS family connection.

Edmund TERRILL, b. 03/21/1740 Orange Co. VA, d. c11/15/1784 Culpeper Co. VA (made will 01/06/1784); md.

11/26/1760 Orange Co. VA to Margaret 'Peggy' WILLIS, b. 02/25/1741, d. c1812 in either KY or VA.

Their third child, John TERRILL, b. 08/13/1768 probably in Orange Co. VA, d. 10/11/1850 in Howard Co. MO; md. (1) Rebecca CORNELIUS in Culpeper Co. VA on 04/20/1789. He md. (2) Mary LACY but date and place not published. The children of these unions were not published in TRAILS. The compiler of the published family group sheet was: Mrs. Nancy Offield; 1896 Wornall Rd; Excelsior Springs, MO 64024; 816-637-7661.

John TERRILL, above, would have been the right age to have named a son Cornelius by ca1800. It is believed that he migrated through KY to MO.

HENRY TERRELL WILL

from Book 3, page 129 Clark Co. KY

In the name of God, Amen, I, Henry TERRELL, of the County of Clark and the State of Kentucky, being of disposing memory do hereby constitute and ordain this my last Will and Testament and hereby revoking all others by me before made.

First, I give all my estte of every kind whatsoever to my beloved wife Mary TERRELL for and during her natural life.

Secondly, at the death of my said wife, I give and bequeath to my daughter Betsy one good bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Thirdly, all the rest of my estate at the death of my said wife, I give and bequeath to my son George to him and his heirs forever. Fourthly, I do hereby Constitute and appoint my said son George my sole Executor of this my last will.

Fifthly, my desire is that there be no appraisement of my estate. In testimony of this, my lst Will and Testament, I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal this 29th day of January in the year of our Lord 1812.

GEORGE TERRELL WILL

I, George TERRELL, formerly of Clark County, but now of Spencer County, being low in body, but sound in mind, make this my last will (to wit)

I give my bed and furniture to my niece Polly T. TERRELL.
2nd Give my trunk and all my clothing to my two nephews Henry
C. TERRELL and John L. TERRELL.

I want that money when collected that Eli JONES owes me \$5.00 paid to James PRICE of Clark County.

I want the doctor paid and other burial expenses paid out of it

and the balance I give to my three nieces that is Duquincy A. TERRELL, Elizabeth H. TERRELL, and Amanda H. TERRELL. I hold a note on Daniel MORGAN for twelve dollars due the 15th day of December next that note is for the benefit of Elizabeth C. POOL what money I have by me I give to my three last named nieces. All the above named persons that I make my lawful devises the children of my brother Zachariah and Polly TERRELL. I give my silver rimmed spectacles to my nephew Richard Coleman TERRELL and I give my gold ring to my niece Duquincy A. TERRELL. I give my saddle and bridle and all my books and papers to Henry C. TERRELL and John L. TERRELL

Whereunto I set my hand this 20th day of January, 1837 George x TERRELL (his mark)

At a county court held for Spencer County on Monday the first day of April, 1839, this writing purporting to be the last will and testament of George TERRELL, deceased, was approved according to law by the oaths of Marthy RICHARDSON and William DILLON, witnesses thereto and is ordered to be recorded and there being no executor named in the same will on the motion of Zachariah TERRELL who made, and together with John MORGAN his security entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$500.00 conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted to said Zachariah for obtaining letters of administration on the said decedent's estate with his will aforesaid annexed in due form.

ZACHERIAH TERRELL WILL

May 25, 1828. I make this my will first, that all my just debts be paid and debts owing me to be collected and all sutes that I may have in cort carried on and defended to the extent of the law. I give my wife Polly TERRELL one third part of my estate during her present life to help her raise her children so that she is not to charge them for their raising & at her death to be divided between my children that is hear made my heirs. I want all the balance of my property at my death to be divided equally between Rebecca MILLER, daughter of Betsy MILLER, & the children that I have at home by my wife and may hereafter have & if any of the above heirs die without leaving a living child their part of the estate shall be equally divided between the surviving ones. I make and ordain Jesse FLOYD my executor. I want the court to take good security for the well and true performance of my will to prevent contentions. I hereby acknowledge Polly TERRELL late [nee?] Polly FLOYD, daugher of Levi FLOYD my lawful wife & to heir the property. I have hear will her according to this will. Whereas I have given Rebecca MILLER \$100 I want that sum deducted from her part of my estate so as to make them all as equal as possible.

At a county court held for Spencer County on Monday the 3rd day of June 1861, this writing pruporting to be the last will and testament of Zachariah TERRELL, dec'd was this day produced in court and it satisfactorily appearing to the court that the subscribing witnesses to said will have departed this life; Jos B. COX and John S. HOWARD being sworn testifed that said writing and signature hereunto is wholly in the handwriting of the testator. Whereupon it is ordered that said writing be admitted to record and on motion of Henry C. TERRELL who made oath thereto and together with James HARRISON and John HOWSER his sureties, entered into and acknowledge covenant as required by law. Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of said Zachariah TERRELL, dec'd, with the will aforesaid annexed in proper form.

HENRY CLAY TERRELL

Henry Clay TERRELL was born 08/24/1821 in Spencer County KY; son of Zacheriah and Polly FLOYD TERRELL; died 1868 at unlisted location; married (1) Polly GRAY at an unknown date, who died before 1852; children not listed; as a widower, married (2) Elizabeth McDONALD Sullivan, a widow, (10/18/1827-1898) on 03/01/1852 in Spencer County KY by Robt. HINER, minister of the Gospel in the M. E. Church South.

He served in the Union army during the Civil War. Two of his letters to his wife survived.

Mrs. Franklin wrote this about the first letter: "No date is given on this letter. Must have been written after he left Nashville and on their way to Shiloh, or just before coming into Nashville. His reference to the whereabouts of Robert GRAY, very interesting, for he must have been his first wife's (Polly GRAY) father, my grandmother's (Mary TERRELL Horp) grandfather.



Eliza I must tell you some good new, Capt. SNIDERS Company is in camp within one mile and one half of our camp. William HARRISON was the first to find us. We got here on the 25th of the month and Capt. SNIDERS on the 26th day. James HARDESTY came in that night and staid in our tent. He had his canteen full of molasses and we had a fine breakfast. John SULLIVAN came down here and is well and harty. Will COOK came into se us. The boys is generly well but they have to sleep without their

tents in the wagons and has not got tents yeat. I have not saw Dick PUGH yeat but will see him this evening. Richard FOSTER and William HARRISON come to see us last night. James HARRISON come to see us. He is well. Tell all their connections where they are and most of them is well. All that I have named is well and all that I [know] of being sick is Wesley GRAY and Bushy. Bushy was in Elizabethtown as we pass through there on the 15th of Feb. He was well then. The boys says he has not come up yeat.

I sent you the Proven Act on father's real estate in my letter from Evansville. Write to me and let me know whether you got it or not. Write to me at Camp Andrew Jackson near Nashville, Tenn. NELSON 19 Brigade and 4 Division Col WHITAKERS reg. 6 KY Vol, Company D in care of Capt. E. HADDEN.

If we get paid before I start this letter, I will send you all of the money but some little so that if I new anything that I can do with out that I may get it. Tell Gilbert that I want him to settle with John HARRISON and let you have my part if I have not got it and tell John to pay for the five hogs that I fattened from the time I tuck his hay. (Line folded and illigible) that I get from John from his father-in-law will get \$8.65 cts from John to pay my dues in the Masonic over \$3.00 and you got \$1.00 or and 1 [side?] Bacon 16 lbs. \$1.60 To vinegar to molases or ad sted and 25 cts at Shelbyville then for driving hogs to Louisville \$7.00. I think he owes me for some work. He knows we have not been drilling yeat today. There is now some 75 or 80 thousan men hear. General BEWEL is hear. He is geathering all his forces hear. I cant tell you all only Capten SNIDERS men found Judge BARNETT's haversack and some of his clothing at Bollinggreen and he had to leave in such a hurry that he could not have time to geather all his things. The boys says there was some fifteen hundred Cesich [Cecessionists] died at Bollingreen and a lot of other things. If I can keep my health, I don't fear anything else. The only thing is a man must take leave (?) of himself and that is a thing I try not to do (?) [A man cannot get authorization to

leave, he must go AWOL?]

Elisha BROWN is very sick with the Pheumoney. Sam DOWNEY (?) is sick but is better. Harry CHOAT is sick this morning, the ballance of the boys is well. I want [you] to rite to me if you can find out how Ben READ is. He was sent to Louisville and the morning we left Camp Wickliffe and we have not heard from him. Dr. A. C. COON was sent to Louisville or home. Let me know how he is if you can and tell me if there was any candy and reasons [raisens?] and nuts in my coat pocket when it came home. I sent some to the children. Kiss Anny, Cap and Nancy for me. Tell Anny and Cap that paw wants to see them and to be good children until I come home and I will bring them something pretty.

This rebellion cant last long for the Rebles is leaving every place and all their heavy guns. There was near twenty five thousan guns burnt up in the Depo in Bolingreen so William HARRISON said. I will not write any more this morning until I can see Dick PUGH. The old Stars and Stripes floats over the Capital at Nashville. The Rebels when they left burned the railroad bridge across the river. See Wash McCLAIN and tell him to find out where Robert GRAY — down hear I may find him or some of his boys.

(across the margin) I could fill a book riting all I have seen. I dreamed this morning of seeing you all and kissing my little ones and Mary WILLIAMS (?)

January 1862

This is the Sabbath morning, the 2 day of March and I am tending on Elizha BROWN and Harrison CHOAT. They are both sick and are in Capt. HADDENS tent. BROWN is bad and CHOAT is not much better. They have the Pheumonia. Sam DOWADY (?) is still sick and gets no better. This is a fine spring morning. The bluebirds is singing this morning. I had an invitation to take supper with my two cosens William G. TERRELL and Charley TERRELL. Andrew Jackson TERRELL was born 1824 in Lawrence Co. IN and died in Cleone March 23, 1911. His mother died when he was small and he lived with his grandmother until 9 years old. Then with his uncle, Wm. TERREL, a pioneer of 1833 they moved to Clark County. Andy lived with his uncle Josiah CON-NELLY until of age. Without money or property, he went to live with his cousin, Mrs. Mary JOHNSTON whose husband was a member of the Isaac & Jordon JOHNSTON farming and livestock company. He worked for them and with Ceph PATTEE helped drive milk cows etc. to Chicago and Kankakee to sell to settlers. June 1849, he married Amanda Jane DARNELL of Westfield township and to them were born two daughters, Lucinda and America Bishop, and sons John, Newton, and A. J.

Jr. All except Lucinda survive. In 1859, they moved overland to Kansas, but soon returned and operated a farm in Parker township where his wife died March 26, 1865. In 1879, he and son Jasper went out to Fort Scott, Kansas, returning in a year and had resided in Clark county ever since.

inspirations, Andy was pre successful, serving his township as assessor, road commissioner, constable, school trustee, etc. Mr. TERRELL was a gentleman of the old school, possessing great natural ability, but no education except self and being a great reader was sociable, generous, kind, influential, and forgiving and a good neighbor and citizen. All his pioneer associates in the days of long ago have passed over the great divide except three: Sarah Bean Ulrey, Clark Hammon, and Barney Collier. Wm. Ulrey, an old neighbor stayed with Mr. TERRELL every night during his last sickness.



Know all mey by these presents that I, William TERRELL, of Hanover County in Virginia, Planter, do hereby give, grant and make over to my son David TERRELL, of the said county, a certain parcel of land lying and being in King William County, in St. Margaret Parish, containing four hundred acres more or less, bounded as follows, to wit; beginning at two Red Oaks, thence West four hundred and forty poles to a Willow Oak, Sweetgum and White Oak on the south side, - the north fork of the south fork of Polecat Swamp above the mouth of the branch, thence south eighty-five degrees east, four hundred and forty-two poles to a stake standing between two White Oaks and a Red Oak on the west side of a branch and on the south of the run, thence north three hundred and fifty poles to the place it first began.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said four hundred acres of land unto him, the said David TERRELL, his heirs and assigns forever; together with all woods, underwood privileges, tenaments, hereditenants and appertenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining with warrenty gainst all person or persons laying any claim to the same or to any part or parcel thereof by from or under me or my heirs. He, the said David, or they shall become due, and I hereby oblige myself, my heirs, executors, and admininistrators to acknowledge this deed together with Susanna, my wife, in King William County upon demand.

HENRY TERRELL I

Son of William and Susanna TERRELL, Henry was born in Hanover County Virginia, about 1703, but lived most of his life in Caroline County, VA. He was a Quaker lawyer and transacted business only for Quakers. He was also a general merchant, importing goods directly from Bristol and Liverpool, and became a wealthy man for his time.

Recently, his will has been found, also an inventory of his estate. In his will, he provides liberally for all of his children, besides a number of bequests for others.

The inventory of his estate contains a list and date of the births of his children, now in possession of the writer, from which it appears that he is designated as "Henry the First," the "oldest" and that he died after March 1760.

He married his second wife, Sarah WOODSON, daughter of Tarlton WOODSON of Henrico County, Virginia, in 1743.

By his fist marriage, he had four children:

Henry TERRELL, born March 29, 1735, died in Clark County, KY in 4th month 1812

Thomas TERRELL born 8th month, 20th day 1736, died 11th

month 1804

Betty TERRELL, born 9th month, 7th day 1738, married Zacheriah MOOREMAN, died in VA

Anna TERRELL, born 9th month 16th day, 1740. Married Col. Charles LYNCH, Jr.

By second marriage to Sarah WOODSON:

Ursulla TERRELL, born 3rd month, 11th day 1746; married John RAGLAND of VA

WILL

In the name of God, Amen, I, Henry TERRELL, Senior, of Caroline County, Virginia do make and leave these following lines, my last Will and Testament as follows, vix.:

I lend my well beloved wife (Sarah WOODSON Terrell) during her natural life, for the support of her, my children and the rest of my family under her care, five Negroes, names as follows: Goliath, Daniel, and Jacob, men. Bess and Fannie, women; and twenty five head of cattle; her choice of all my horses, mares, and colts; twenty five sheep; thirty head of hogs, and as much of my household goods and furniture and plantation tools as shall be thought needful for the support of her and my family, under her care, by my executors, and others, as the Court shall appoint. And after her decease, the Negroes Bess and Increase, and Goliath to be equally divided among my children by her; and the negroes lent, and what lent her, to be equally divided among my children by her, their heirs, etc. I lend to my wife during her natural life my household plantation and three hundred acres of land with and adjoining the same; and further my desire is that my wife have under her care, and for her assistance toward the upbringing and schooling of her children until they become of lawful age, or marry, the negores and land hereafter mentioned to them, etc. she not misusing nor abusing any part or parcel thereof or suffering it to be done.

SECOND: I give my son, George TERRELL, his heirs and assigns forever, at the age of twenty-one or marry, ll the land I had of my father and all the land I had of Joel TERRELL, and all the land I had of Roger QUARELS, that lies on the west side of a line to be rune due north from mine and Jos. WOLFORD's corner, white oak sapling, by a gret pine, the East side of a small branch or slash of Crooked creek to mine and Francis BURRETT'S line. All the above said land is in Caroline County. And two negroes and their increase, to wit: Wheeler, a man, and Margaret, a girl, and twenty five pounds current money (he not mislisting nor suffering it to be done by any under law.) His mother, in her privileges above mentioned, and I give George and his heirs forever, all the land I had of Carr McGEE.

THIRD: I leave to be sold by my executors, my watermill and the two acres of land thereto belonging; my smith's tools, box of files, seven hogshead of tobacco, three in Hanover (County) in the hands of Joel TERRELL's son, Henry, and four at Company's; all the superfluous parts of my estate as they think proper, and the money to be put at interest until the legacies become due.

FOURTH: I give to my son, Charles TERRELL, his heirs and assigns forever at the age of twenty-one years, all the remains of the land I had of Roger QUARELS, and my toping-Castle Plantation, and all my lands there to belonging, and two negroes, Mancer and Nell, a girl and her increase, and twenty five pounds of current money.

FIFTH: I give to my daughter, Ursula TERRELL, her heirs and assigns forever, three negroes and their increase, Beckah, a woman, Simon, a boy, and Lymus a boy, and twenty five pounds current money, of the day of her marriage or lawful age.

SIXTH: I give to my daughter, Judith TERRELL, her heirs and assigns forever, when of lawful age or married, three negroes and their increase; Patts, a woman, Hannah a girl, and Ned a boy, and twenty five pounds of current money.

SEVENTH: I give unto my daughter, Abigail, her heirs and assigns forever, when of lawful age or married, three negroes and their increase, Polle, woman, Tamar, a girl, and London, a boy nd twenty five pounds of current money, and my desire is that if any of the before mentioned children die under age or not married, their part of the estate, as well land as other estate, be equally divided among my living children by my last wife....

NOTE: This will continues to twenty bequests of land, slaves, and money, to daughter Anna LYNCH, daughter Betty MOOR-MAN, to Manoah CHILES, Sr., John CHILES, Micajah CHILES, Jonathan TERRELL, son Thomas TERRELL, son Henry TERRELL...

And lastly, I do hereby appoint Samuel HARGRAVE, Henry TERRELL, son of Joel TERRELL, deceased of Hanover County Virginia, and my son Thomas TERRELL, my executors of this my last will and testament.

HENRY COCKE WILL, 1766

Note: This Henry COCKE md. Katherine HOLT. They were parents of Henry COCKE who md. Lucy TERRELL, daugher of Solomon TERRELL.

In the name of God, Amen. I, Henry COCKE, of the county of Surry & parish of [Southwark?], being of perfect mind do make & ordain this, my last Will & Testament in manner following, to wit: I give the use of my plantation I now live upon consisting of the lands I purchased of John COCKE, junr., Charles HAR-RISON, Thomas EMBRY, John EMBRY, & the land I have bargained with Thomas EMBRY unto my wife Katherine COCKE during her natural life or widowhood & after death or widowhood, to my son, David COCKE. Also the use of the following Negroes, to wit: Old Frank, young Frank, Daniel, Ben, Rose, Wilson, Nelson, old Phillis, Lucy, & Joe. Also the use during her life or widowhood of my silver spoons, silver tankard, Burch and Cherry tables, chairs, candle stand, desk & bookcase, chest of drawes. Also for ever two horses, ten head of cattle, ten sheep, three feather beds and furniture, one riding chair and harness.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son David COCKE, his heirs and assigns forever, after the death or marriage of my wife, Katherine COCKE the lands I purchased of John COCKE, Junr., Charles HARRISON, Thomas EMBRY, John EMBRY, & the land I have bargained with Thomas EMBRY, also after the death or marrige of my wife, one dozen of table silver spoons marked 'TH', a silver hilted sword, all my Burch tables & chairs, Cherry desk and bookcase, chest of drawers, & candle stand.

Item: I give & bequeath unto my son Henry COCKE, his heirs and assigns forever, to be delivered him at the time of dividing my personal estate, the remaining part of the tracts of land I purchased from Henry BEDDINGFIELD, Charles & Philip REEKES lying upon the [Otterdam?] Swamp. Also to him, his heirs and assigns forever, one-fourth part of an acre of land in the town of Guilford which I purchased from William SIM-MONS to be delivered to him at the time of dividing my pesonal estate. Also after the death or marriage of my wife, eight old silver spoons or the new ones that is made of them & twelve silver teaspoons. The amount of the value of the lands I have now sold John SAUNDERS lying upon the west side of the Huntington road adjoining the land of Samuel COCKE, John AVORICE, & Starling HILL, the amount of said lands to be paid him, the said Henry COCKE by my son David COCKE at the time of dividing my estate.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel COCKE, his heirs and assigns forever, a lot or half acre of land lying in the town of Guilford descended to me from my father Samuel COCKE, to be delivered to my son Samuel COCKE at the time of dividing my estate also at the time of dividing the sum of two hundrend pounds current money of Virginia to be paid to him before a division is made also forever. After the death or marriage of my wife, one large [divoting?] silver spoon, one silver punch ladle, one silver tankard.

Item: my will and desire is that my Extrix., Extor., or Admin., make unto John SAUNDERS a good and lawful right Title to a parcel of land I have sold unto him providing he gives bond according to bargain on tract done before my death. My further will is that my son David COCKE pay unto my son Henry

COCKE at the time of dividing my estate the amount of the sum the land sold John SAUNDERS as above. I desire that my Exor. or Admin, in case of the death or marriage of my wife before my sons comes of age or married that they keep the furniture for them until they do come of age or married. My further will is that my Extrix, or Extor, hereafter mentioned or my Admin, may have a fee simple right in all my lands (not devised away) to dispose of with my personal estate not also devised away toward discharging of my debts & cash legacies. I desire that my Extrix, Extor, or Admin. may if they think proper keep Negores upon the plantation at the Otterdams & the rest hired out toward the support and education of my children until a division is made & also the rent of my lots in Guilford for the same purpose & in order to make a division of my Negroes & their increase (not given the use of to my wife) among my children: David, Henry, Elizabeth, Katherine, & Samuel. I desire that three of my neighbors may be made choice of to allot & divide my Negroes among my Children or those that are alive at the time of the eldest coming of age or either is married & should my wife not be dead at that time, I desire those Negroes given to her the use of during her life be divided among my children or their heirs after her death should my wife die before a division of my estate is made. I desire the plantation she has use of may be kept with such Negroes my Extor or Admin may think proper until a division is made for the further support of my children. My further will is that if either my sons David or Henry die before they come of age or married, the lands given the one that died do go and descend to my son Samuel COCKE, his heis or assigns forever instead of the two hundred pounds given him which sum I desire may be divided among all my children that may be alive when the division is made. I desire in case either of my children is married before they come of lawful age that they then have possession of their estate. I further desire that part of Capt. Thomas HOLT'S estate shall be my share that it shall be equally divided among my childen with my other estate.



ALTERNATIVE TERRELL ORIGINS

History, taditions and genealogy have been compiled by General W. H. H. TERRELL, 1883, of Indianapolis, IN, with notes by Hon. Robert W. CARROLL, and Lynch M. TERRELL, 1890.

The following are a few high lights, copied from this history, a copy of which is in the possession of some of the TERRELLS in the state of Texas, to wit, Ms. Maude JONES of Greenville, TX.

NAME ORIGIN

The family first gained a foothold in England during the conquest of William the Conquorer, A. D. 1066, through Sir Walter TYRRELL (TERRELL), the "Red Knight of Normandie," whose name is first mentioned in the history of King William RUFUS, son and successor of the Conquorer, in connection with the tagic death of the monarch.

The King and Sir Walter were hunting one day in the New Forest, the royl game preserve of the Crown. Suddenly a stag sprang up. Sir Walter shot at it hastily, but his arrow glanced from a tree, struck and killed the King. The horor stricken Knight, overwhelmed with grief, protested that the death of his royal sovereign was accidental, but a clamor to the contrary was raised by the populace to such an extent that Sir Walter deemed it prudent to return to Normandy, from whence in due course of time, according to the law of that day, he made 'monied compensation' for his unfortunate shot and was permitted to return to England and resume his title and estate. From that period, the family existed in England, "Valient and noble," and is still represented in the Peerage of that country.

THREE BROTHERS

From this old Anglo-Norman stock sprang three brothers, named William, James, and John TERRELL, who, according to tradition during the protectorate of Cromwell, being Quakers and grievously persecuted on account of their religion, left England and took up their abode in the "English Pale" in that part of Ireland in which the protector had previously confiscated and set apart for the occupancy of English colonists. Thus the three brothers were temporarily domiciled in Ireland, and from thence, they emigrated to Virginia in the latter half of the 17th century. William TERRELL located in Virginia, another TERRELL located in North Carolina, and the third brother in New England.

How long they remained in Ireland is not known, but it is probable that the were looked upon as intruders, their religion condemned and their general treatment made so uncomfortable by social ostracism that a second move became necessary. Prior to their coming to Virginia, none bearing their name had preceded them, as has been verified by a careful examination of the old lists of colonists who came over under the auspices of the Virginia Company and its governmental successor. They are, therefore, supposed to be the first of the TERRELL family to come to this country, the date being probably not earlier than 1665, nor later than 1700.

One of the corporators or grantees of the Virginia Company, which was chartered by James the First, was Francis TERRELL of London. The charter included several hundred grantees, and provided that "The grantees and their successors to be known and incorporated by the name of the "Treasurer and Company of Adventurers and Planters" of the City of London, for the first colony of Virginia, whether they go in their persons to be planters there in the plantation, or "Whether they go not, but adventure their monies, goods, and chattels. That they shall be one body or Commonalty Perpetual," etc. (SMITH's, HISTORY OF VIRGINIA, Appendix "p" 11)

TERRELL COUNTY NO

Near the Virginia Coast line in North Carolina lies the county of TERRELL, one of the oldest counties in the Province and one of the original precints of the Lord Proprietors, it forms the first part of the mainland of this continent discovered by Sir Walter RALEIGH on his first voyage in 1564. It derived its name from Sir John TYRRELL who owned that part of the province which

had been originally granted in 1663, by Charles II to his Chancellor of the Exchecquer, Anthony Lord ASHLEY. (See WHEELER'S, HISTORY OF NORTH CAROLINA) It is presumed that one of the three brothers who located in North Carolina was drawn thither by some family connection with, or overture of an advantageous nature made by the said Sir John.

It is a well established fact that William TERRELL, one of the three brothers located in Virginia and that another settled near there in North Carolina. Of the New England brother, we have no trace or record. The southern branches of the family are widely represented by descendants still living in nearly all of the southern and western states. It is a natural thing for members of an adventurous and enterprising family in their migration to follow in the footsteps of their relative who have advanced before them, as well as to scatter into new fields.

Therefore, it is reasonable to conclude that the large landed interests of Francis TYRRELL in Virginia, and of Sir John TYRRELL in North Carolina, may have had great weight in the immigration and location of two of the three brothers in the south.

HEREDITARY TITLES IN THE NOBILITY

The writer of these notes makes no special pretension that the family from which he is descended if of noble ancestry, although this claim has been maintained with such plausibility and pride by many of the TERRELLS of the early American generations and much reliable dta to sustain the claim has been adduced. From historical gleaning, it appeas that the old family name of TYRRELL was first enrolled among the nobility in the honor of Sir Walter TYRRELL, at or about the time of the invasion and the conquest of England by William of Normandy, as heretofore noted.

In the CHRONICLES OF FRANCE AND ENGLAND, by Sir John FROISSART, we find that Edward, the Black Prince, in A. D. 1367, went to reinstate Don Pedro of Spain, who had been dethroned by Henry, the Bastard, speaking of the members of the order of good and true knights who accompanied that victorious expedition, the names of Sir John and Sir James TYRRELL are mentioned with approbation. Sir John TYR-RELL, who had been knighted on the field for valorous conduct, is also mentioned by the same author as of the English expedition sent, about 1367, under the Earl of Buckingham to succeed the Duke of Britany in France.

In the time of Richard III, Sir James TYRRELL was Master of the Horse, a position of high honor and only held by men of great ability and progress. He was accused (whether justly or not is still disputed among historians) of the murder of the young Princes in the Tower, for which he was beheaded.

In the fourth year of the reign of Henry II of England, (1489) the Earl of Dixeavre in Flanders, held by the English was besieged by the French, who were repulsed with great slaughter. Among the English Noblemen who were hurt was Sir James TYRRELL, "sore wounded in the legge with a quarrel." In another place in

the same report the name of Sir James is spelled "TERRELL."
(Old English Chronicle of 1489, reprinted in DODSLEY's AN-NUAL REGISTER for 1771.

In the fifteenth century, Pierre Du TERRAIL of France, of an ancient family, was enobled in the recognition of his high chival-rous bearing and splendid valor at arms in tournaments and upon the field of honor. When the order of the Knighthood was conferred, he abandoned his original name of Peter TERRIAL, and in accordance with the customs of chivalry, assumed the Knightly title of the Chivalier Bayard. He is known in history as the "Good Knight," Sans Paur et sans Reprocher" (without fear and without reproach), and is renowned as the most superb representative of chivalry of any age or country.

In giving the linege and history of the TYRRELL family of England, now or recently represented in the peerage by Sir John Tyssen TYRRELL, Baronet of Borehan House, County Essex, Debratts BARONETAGE OF ENGLAND says: "The family is descended from Sir Walter TYRRELL, who slew King William Rufus, and who appears in the DOOMSDAY BOOK as "Siezed of the Manor of Logham in Essex." He is the common ancestor of "several families of the name seated in the various parts of England, but chiefly in Essex and Suffolk." For fifteen generations from this Sir Walter, the head of the family appears to have been constantly knighted. Among them, Sir James TYRRELL, eighth in descent from Sir Walter, married Margaret, daughter of Sir William Heron, "Knight of Heron," and thereby acquired the Manor of Heron, which was subsequently for many generations the seat of his descendants. Sir John TYRRELL, of Heron, the great grandson of Sir James, was treasurer of the household of King Henry VI. Sixth in descent from him, eighteenth from Sir. Walter TYRRELL, was Thomas TYRRELL of Heron, whose eldest son, Sir John, died without issue, and his second son, Thomas TYRRELL, was seated at Ramsey's TYRRELL, county Essex, and had issue Sir John TYRRELL, Knt., whose son Sir Charles, second Baronet (who died July 1735) and Sir John, Fifth Baronet, on whose death, without issue, in 1756, the title became extent." Debritt continues the family lineage down in regular succession to the year 1809 when, under royal favor of George III, the Baronetage was revived and Sir John TYRRELL. was invested with the order of Knighthood, and from it descended to Sir John Tyssen TYRRELL, of Boreham House, County Essex, by whom it was held as late as 1874.

COAT OF ARMS

The ancient Heraldic Arms of the TYRRELLS are engraved in Debritt's Baronetage (plate 41) and there described as follows: Arms; - Argent, with bordeur engrailed, Gules, two chevrons, azure

Crest; - A peacock's tail issuing from the mouth of a boar's head, couped erect

Supporters; - Two tigers, regardant Motto; - "Sans Crainte" (Without fear).

[In our language, that translates into a white shield with a red border containing reversed scollops on the inside, with two blue chevrons (bars pointing upward like the Chevron Oil Co. Logo). The helmet was topped with a hog's head cut off at the neck, mounted erect, with a peacock's tail sticking upright out of the hog's mouth. The shield was supported by two tigers standing on their hind legs with one paw on top of hte shield and each looking backward away from the shield. The "motto" was actually not firm part of the arms and could be changed at any time by the knight or his heirs. This explains why several different mottos are floating around. The numerous members of the family also account for several minor variations in the shield itself, but that is beyond the scope of this article.]

TYRRELLS OF IRELAND

In a book entitled GENEALOGICAL HISTORY OF MILESAIN FAMILIES OF IRELAND, TYRRELLS are listed as of English Origin, Immigrated AD 1172, reside in Dublin, Donnegal, and Londonerry.

TERRELLS OF AMERICA

In the latter part of the 17th Century, between the years of 1665 & 1700, three brothers, William, John, and James TERRELL (Originally TYRRELL) of English birth and parentage and of Anglo-Norman descent, immigrated to America since they had lived sometime as colonists in Ireland. They came to America as huntsmen for King James II, of England, and settled in Glouchester Co., Virginia. For their dexterity in hunting they were awarded by the King, fifteen hundred acres of land each, to be settled by themselves.
