before commissioner reports that on the 20th day of May 1884, Jeremiah TERRELL administrator of the estate of Jane TERRELL, deceased, exhibited before him the foregoing statement of the money and estate which he, the said administrator had

received, became chargeable with as distributed together with vouchers for such disbursements....etc.

The following notes are added to help place some of the family in context; full genealogical research has been done only on my direct line.

**Daniel TERRILL**, the father of **Jane TERRILL** was b. in Cumberland county NJ on 05/05/1768, son of **Adam TERRILL & Mary THOMPSON**. He left NJ about the time of his father's death in 1790. The first notice we have of him in [now West] Virginia is when he applied for a marriage license in Wheeling on 12/01/1794 to marry **Jane GIFFIN**, daughter of **Robert GIFFIN & Mary BANE**. They lived a long and useful life on the family farm. He died 03/18/1847 and she died 05/27/1849. Both are buried in the Old Tent Cemetery on Peter's Run Road in Ohio County, WV. **Jane TERRILL** is buried there also. Her grave is the newest in this pioneer cemetery.

Daniel & Jane had ten children:

1. **Mary**, b. 1796 md. **Joseph COATES** on 03/28/1822, only family member whose heirs were unknown at the time of the distribution of the estate of sister Jane;
2. **Rebecca** probably b. 1798, md. **Lewis WATSON**, date unknown, probably settled in Guernsey county OH;
3. **Elizabeth** b. 1800, md. **Matthew MARLING**, probably settled in Guernsey county OH;
4. **Jane**, b. 1802, d. 08/13/1882; spinster, continued to live on the TERRILL homestead after her brother Jeremiah farmed it. Since she died without a will, her brother did the distribution of her estate;
5. **Margaret**, b. 1804, still alive in 1884, md. **John THOMPSON** 03/09/1830 in Ohio County [now West] VA.
6. **Ruth**, b. 1806, according to her father's will, md. man with last name of **HARTONG**;
7. **Adam**, b. 1808, md. **Elizabeth MARLING** on 08/31/1830 in Ohio County. According to diaries of **Tom TERRILL**, he d. in Muskingum county OH;
8. **Daniel**, b. 1810, d. in Iowa after going there by steamboat down the Ohio River and up the Mississippi. He left only two heirs--**Charles Sims** who returned to Wheeling WV, and **Thomas Milton** who lived in Greene county Iowa;
9. **Robert**, b. 1812, d. 05/16/1866 in Muskingum County OH according to some sources, but he appeared to be alive in 1884 at the time of the distribution of Jane's estate. There is all kinds of information in the 1850 & 1860 census but there were probably two or three **Robert TERRILLS** living at that time to confuse researchers even further;
10. **Jeremiah**, b. 09/14/1814, d. 07/02/1903 in Valley Grove, VA. He stayed on his grandfather's farm and the farm was inherited by his son **Daniel Watson TERRILL**. The **TERRILL** name in this branch of the family disappeared about 1950 due to no male descendants.

Just to make genealogical research more interesting, there was another **Daniel TERRILL**, son of **Jared TERRILL** living in Ohio county (later Hancock county) Virginia at the same time. That family line immigrated from Newtown CT at approximately the same time and some of the first names are the same.

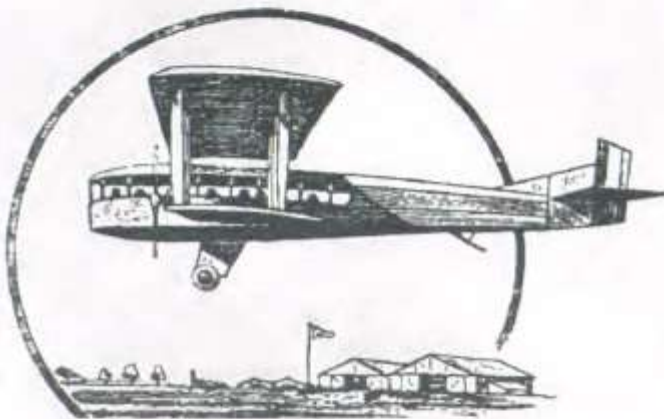

#### TERRELL DESCENDANTS SURVIVE EARTHQUAKE

From our President, Mrs. Lorraine Ratto, via letter to Lawrence F. LeStourgon [edited]

October 25, 1989

We survived the [San Francisco] earthquake beautifully. I've been writing down my experience as well as that of my children, because it is a historic event and something I hope we don't experience again in our lifetimes. It might be of some interest to future generations.

Being native of the area, and almost natives of San Francisco, we've become very "oh, another earthquake." Of course there is the knowledge that the "big one" is lurking out there, but human nature can live with knowing these things because we never really and truly believe they will happen to us or ours.

I was still at work at 5:04 P.M. One of the secretaries had just left. I was right behind her. I remembered a letter my boss wanted first thing in the A.M., so I decided to go back and print it out for him. Otherwise, I would have been in the elevator when it hit. I would have been a very perturbed woman if that had happened. I would have been in there for hours because our fire department had other concerns more important than getting people out of elevators.

It commenced to shake and I merely thought, "oh, another earthquake." I have high shelves behind me that hold a lot of my legal books, etc. When the books started dropping off the shel-

ves and down at me, I decided it was time to get out of the chair. I was between my desk and the wall. Instead of stopping as usual, the quake got harder. I was very close to the wall, so I can't say it "slammed" me into the wall, but I touched the wall rather briskly.

It was still getting harder. Things were flying off the top of the filing cabinets. I was trying to get to my fish tank because it was dancing closer and closer to the edge. I couldn't get to it because the building wouldn't let me. The old building was bucking, rolling, groaning, creaking, snapping, and popping. I have never heard such a noise. The quake was getting louder and louder. I will never forget the noise. I don't know which is more frightening: the shaking; or the noise!

It continued to increase in intensity. I finally yelled out to no one in particular, "Goddammit, it isn't going to stop." I'm not ashamed to say I was scared half to death. This was the first quake that scared me. Those were the longest 15 seconds of my life. The power went off and the phones went out.

I could hear someone screaming in the dentist's office next door. I finally made it to the doorway and a man was in Dr. Salem's doorway. We asked about each other's health. The woman was still screaming. Suddenly he turned around. I could see that he was holding onto someone and heard him tell her to be quiet, it was over. She kept screaming; then suddenly she was quiet. I've never asked Dr. Salem, but I wonder if she didn't fill the mouth with plaster.

Though I didn't realize it at the time, I suppose I was in some sort of shock. When I turned around and looked at the mess in my office (chairs overturned, files and books everywhere), I decided I'd best clean it up. I started picking up, rearranging, putting books back on shelves, & putting files together. I had almost finished when the first aftershock hit about half an hour later. I came to my senses and called myself a fool. I told myself to get out of that building. I still don't believe I was doing house work!

As I was going down the stairs, I was very careful. I could see a huge crack in the wall on the landing. Plaster was everywhere. I was concerned that there might be space where I put a foot so it was slow going. I was much relieved when I finally got to the bottom.

I walked all the way around the block to the underground garage where my car was parked. I did not stop to think that I could not get my car out because the electricity was out and the door was electric. I was standing there looking up at the outside box that contains chains for manually opening the door. I wished that I had my angel status so I would have the necessary wings to fly 8 feet off the ground to reach the box.

Suddenly, two mid-teenage boys were standing beside me. I thought, "Oh, Lord, now this!" I was already sliding my purse off my shoulder to hand to them. I was hoping all they'd take was my purse. One asked if they could help me. I told them I couldn't



reach the box. One jumped up on the little post under the box, balanced on the ball of his foot, and actually twisted off the little lock. The chains came down. They got the door open for me; asked if I needed any more help, then left. My knees were knocking together!

My car was parked across the pitch dark garage farthest from the door. I fished out my keys and made a record-breaking sprint for the car. I'm sure I was in that car and out of the garage in less time than the quake lasted!

I had no idea of the extent of the quake at that time. Radio stations had been knocked off the air. The emergency broadcasting station was not working. It had been almost 45 minutes since the quake, and still no radios. Can you believe that?

A few minutes later, some of them got back on the air. They were talking about the bay bridge collapsing. At that time, it was an unconfirmed rumor.

I couldn't see any damage where I was driving. It is a good thing I was so busy dancing inside my office that I didn't look out at the giant building across the street for I might have gone into cardiac arrest on the spot. I am told that building was swaying over toward our building. People in the shoe store on the corner said it looked like the top of that building would land on our building if it snapped off.

Lawrence, I've prayed for years I'd never be in San Francisco during a major disaster. I felt that the majority of the people would turn into animals. With great pleasure, I freely admit that I was wrong. It might have been different if buildings had been toppling in that area. I don't know, but they were magnificent!

Traffic was heavy. All signal lights were out. It was almost as if motorists had rehearsed. At very intersection, the apparent rule of thumb was two cars, two cars, two cars, two cars, etc. Traffic was orderly; no gridlock; no honking horns. People were letting people in front of them. This was unheard of normally! When emergency vehicle sirens were heard, people started moving so others could move over to open a lane.

By this time, they were announcing freeway closures. My freeway was one of them. Fortunately, I was in a place where it was easy to commit to another route without a lot of backtracking. That route had been under repair and there were a lot of signs in the middle of traffic lanes. These created no problem. People merely let other cars in for a change.

Once I got to the freeway, it was unbelievable. Either there were so many cars still trying to get to the freeway; or they had already been there and gone. Traffic was flowing smoother than I'd experienced in years!

There was a tunnel to pass through. It is pretty funny, thinking back on it. Cars were for a change traveling not much over the speed limit until they came to the tunnel. You could see them tear through that tunnel in a blaze of speed. I did, too!

Newscasters confirmed the bridge collapse; reported the collapsed freeway in Oakland, and covered the fires in the Marina District. It was almost impossible to really believe and absorb it.

I decided that since it had been over an hour since the quake, I would probably arrive to a huge mess in the house. Joe would certainly not bend over and pick up anything that was in the floor. I spent the entire commute home working myself into a snit!

Not even a picture on the wall had moved out of place. Our house sits on a thick concrete slab. Walls are made out of block with rebar. Although it shook mightily, Joe said, enough to get his attention and make him decide to take his chances with the oak trees outside; we had no damage, inside or out.

There I was, with a roaring snit going, and nothing to do with it. We only lost power about five minutes. Parts of S.F. were out until the next day, and parts of the Bay Area were without power for several days.

I tried to call my mother in Seattle because I knew she would be hysterical. I couldn't get through. First, no dial tone; then busy circuits.

I found out later she was OK until she got a shot of the Bay Bridge; then it was Katie, bar the door. She went into full blown hysterics. She was positive we were all dead, maimed, or at the least homeless.

Fortunately, my family all lived in S.F., so they know the area. My sister was able to finally sit on her and show her the illogic of her thinking: (1) none of us live in the Marina and would have no reason to be there considering the time of day; (2) none of us have to cross the Bay Bridge, so again would have no reason to be on it, and (3) likewise no need to be on the Oakland Freeway.

She settled down for a bit until she suddenly thought about my youngest son, John. He drives a charter bus; so she promptly placed him either on the bridge or on the freeway. It was pointed out to her that no busses were shown on the bridge, so she had him buried on the freeway. You see, Lawrence, where there's a will, there's a way.

My daughter, Cheryl, managed to get through on the telephone about 8 p.m. That poor girl had been on the 22nd floor of a downtown high rise. I could still hear the terror in her voice. She vows she will never take another job downtown. She's always expressed concern about being there when a large quake hit, and although they have proved themselves able to withstand at least a 7 (now they say 7.1), I can't argue with her. She said she was sure it was her last moment on earth. They all tried to get underneath the conference table where they were sitting, but they couldn't catch the table! (I call that swaying.) She said the most frightening part was going downstairs. People were starting to pour onto the stairway. Some were yelling and running. Fortunately, there were some cool heads who just grabbed these people and all but hit them to calm them down. Cheryl said they were so frightened that it was iffy whether they would make it all



insurance and have no place to put the possessions they are able to salvage.

The media is still making a big deal out of the Marina and not showing these people. An entire block between South VanNess and Shotwell Street has been completely closed. The buildings are tilting and leaning. Some of the buildings were so old they had brick foundations. Shotwell Street between 17th and 18th is buckled up probably 4' in some places.

The media has only given cursory glimpses of the real devastation: Santa Cruz; Hollister; Watsonville; Ben Lomond and through that area. Those people are suffering tremendously. Those areas wouldn't sell newspapers and make people sit up and take notice like "San Francisco." Although the damage is extensive here, and much worse than any of us thought, down at the epicenter, it's frightening.

It seems as if the media is disappointed that so few were killed and injured. They are counting every person that was admitted to an emergency room that night to bring the count up in the entire quake area to over 3,000. Now we have the people getting on the local talk shows talking about how guilty they feel and how emotionally upset they are because nothing happened to them or their family and these poor people are feeling guilty about it and how do they deal with it.

Others are saying that they are afraid to go outside. Women won't let their husband go to work or their children to school (these same women are wondering why their children are having nightmares). They are wondering if they should sit their families down "to talk about their feelings and fears," and some of them sound quite disappointed that their teenagers are "business as usual," so they want to sit down and talk to see if they might not have some deep seated fears that they're hiding. Good Lord!

Lawrence, I hate to tell you how I would tell them to deal with it, but since we're related, you probably already know!

I was in it. I had things flying through the air at me (one book grazed my back and my shoulder was sore for a couple of days. Guess I should have gone to emergency so I could have been counted.). I'm no more neurotic than usual (I don't think). In fact, all it is now is just something that happened. Now that I've been through one, it's at the top of the list of things I don't want to do again!

## Tyrrell

discovers dinosaurs in the Alberta Badlands

Joseph Burr Tyrrell was sent to survey the Alberta badlands. He had already proven himself among the scientist-explorers of the Canadian Geological Survey; those unheralded heroes who mapped the vast territories of Canada in the last century.

In June 1884, 24-year-old Tyrrell and his assistant were paddling their canoe between the steep banks of the Red Deer River. In the layers of ancient rock, the geologist found seams of coal, outcroppings of one of the largest coal deposits in North America. He also discovered something even more amazing.

On the morning of June 9, Tyrrell set off on his usual routine of examining the river banks when a peculiar brown substance sticking out from the valley wall caught his attention. He climbed 200 feet up the steep slope and then, with mounting excitement, began to clear away the dirt. With his hands and his geologist's hammer, he gradually uncovered the fossilized skeleton of a dinosaur.

Dinosaur remains had been unearthed in

Western Canada before, but as Tyrrell explored the Valley, he knew that nothing like this dinosaur graveyard had ever been found.

One day, after a month of surveying and collecting fossils, Tyrrell looked the ancient past directly in the face. Sixty-nine years later, at the age of ninety-five, he recounted the instant of his most dramatic discovery.

"I was climbing up a steep face about 400 feet high. I stuck my head around a point and there was this skull leering at me, sticking right out of the ground. It gave me a fright." Tyrrell had found the first skull of *Albertosaurus*, close cousin to the fearsome *Tyrannosaurus*.

Tyrrell went on to make many important mineral discoveries and to write major works on early Canadian explorers, but his discovery of the world's richest paleontological dig has brought him his lasting fame.

Today, the Royal Tyrrell Museum of Paleontology in Dinosaur Provincial Park in Drumheller, Alberta, pursues the work Joseph Burr Tyrrell began in June, 1884.

## Rites set for broadcasting exec James Terrell

Services for James R. Terrell, former president of Gaylord Broadcasting Co. in Dallas, will be at 1 p.m. Monday at Sparkman-Hillcrest's Northwest Highway Funeral Home in Dallas. Burial will follow at Sparkman-Hillcrest Memorial Park.

Mr. Terrell died of cancer Friday at Humana Hospital Medical City Dallas. He was 69.

In 1987, he became president of Gaylord Broadcasting, which owns KTVT-TV (Channel 11). He was also executive vice president of Gaylord Entertainment Co., which owns Opryland USA. He retired in August.

His 41-year career with Gaylord Broadcasting began in 1951, when he

joined the company as a newsman for WKY-TV in Oklahoma City. After working in several positions, Mr. Terrell moved to Fort Worth and became the first general manager of Channel 11 under Gaylord Broadcasting in 1962.

He subsequently held various positions in the company, including president of Cencom Cable Television Inc., vice chairman of Opryland USA Inc. and director of Oklahoma Publishing Co.

He was chairman of the Association of Independent Television Stations, president of the Texas Association of Broadcasters, president of the

Association of Broadcast Executives of Texas and a member of the Television Code Review Board and Television Bureau of Advertising.

The Little Rock, Ark., native moved to Dallas in 1978 and was active in civic affairs. He served as president, chairman and campaign chairman of the United Way of Tarrant County and president of the Rotary Club of West Fort Worth.

Survivors, all of Dallas, include his wife, Betty Terrell; son James Robinson Terrell II; and two grandchildren.

## William Y. Terrill Jr., 80, retired accountant

William Y. Terrill Jr., 80, died July 8 at Arlington Hospital of cardiac arrest. He was a retired management accountant with the Defense Logistics Agency.

A resident of Fairfax County, Mr. Terrill was born in Shamrock, Texas, and grew up in Melrose, N.M. He later lived and worked in Topeka and Wichita, Kan., Kansas City, Mo. and Ponca City, Okla. In 1939, he accepted a U.S. Civil Service position with the Department of the Navy, working with the Bureau of Supplies and Accounts in Washington and began a career in federal service that continued until his retirement in 1974.

He enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 1943 and served in the Washington area until he was discharged in September 1946.

Mr. Terrill earned a bachelor's degree in 1942 and a master's degree in 1946, both in commercial science, from Benjamin Franklin University.

In addition to his government career, Mr. Terrill served with distinction in the American Legion from 1948 to 1973, including as delegate to the national conventions from 1949 to 1957, as commander of Navy Department Post No. 58 in 1961-1962 and as chairman of various committees and commissions for the Department of the District of Columbia from 1952 to 1957. In 1957, he was awarded the American Legion Silver Medal for outstanding service.

Following his 1974 retirement, Mr. Terrill continued to perform professional accounting work and conducted genealogy research. He and his oldest son, Don, traced their family's history back to its arrival in Virginia from England in 1856. Together, they wrote the book "The Terrill Family" in 1988.

Survivors include his wife of 50 years, Mary Louise Terrill of Fairfax County; his children, Patricia Brucher of Ontario, Calif., Don C. Terrill of London, England, and Bruce Terrill of Houston, Texas; four grandchildren, one great-grandchild, two sisters and one brother.

## Ex-Drugstore Proprietor Martine Terrell Dies at 65

Martine Terrell, 65, who until 1982 owned and presided over one of Oklahoma City's last neighborhood drugstores, died Wednesday at his home.

Terrell ran the Drexel Pharmacy, at the corner of NW 19 and Drexel, acting as counselor to his regular customers and employer to neighborhood teens, from 1947 until he lost his lease in 1982.

Terrell's store had an old-fashioned soda fountain, and served as a hang-out through the years to hundreds of students at Taft Junior High School. Terrell's wife, Mary, delivered prescriptions to their older customers.

After serving in the Army in World War II, Terrell worked for an uncle who also owned a drugstore in Oklahoma City.

Three of his uncles, Si Terrell, Jimmy Robinson and Johnny Robinson, all pharmacists, owned neighborhood drug stores in northwest Oklahoma City.

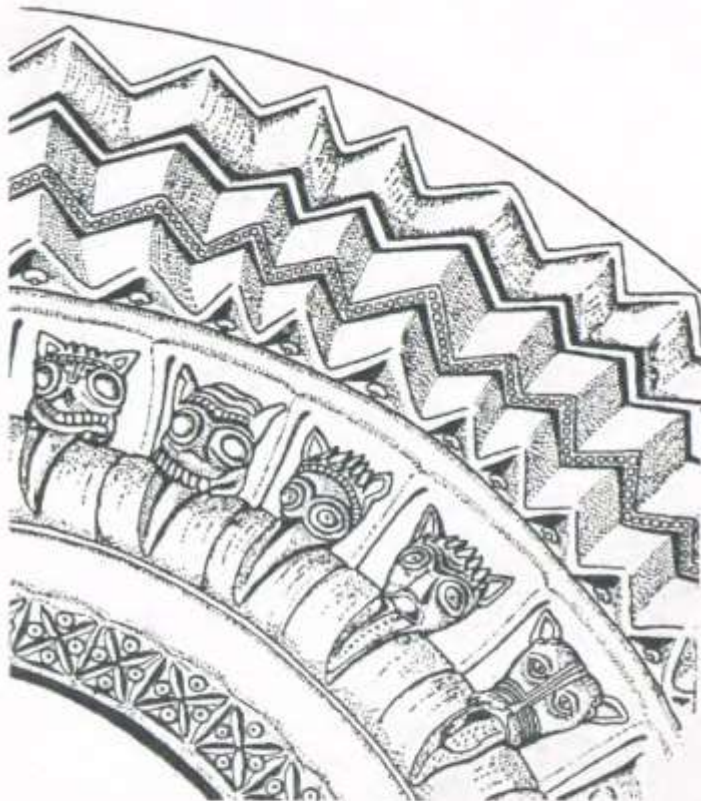
