RIGIN OF THE NAME: Volumes have been written about the family in its earlier enturies in France & England. The most concise listing of these is found in a book written by Walter Garland Duke in 1949 titled HENRY DUKE, COUNCILOR, with pages 398-400 containing the lineages from Pepin Le Gros of Heristal through 25 generations ending with Sir Thomas Tyrrell, of Heron, Sheriff of Essex and Herts in England in 1460.

The generations to the origin of our name is listed as follows:

99 Pepin Le Gros of Heristal

- 100 Childebrand I, Duke of Burgundy, son of Pepin Le Gros and his second wife Alpais
- 101 Nivelon I, Count of Autun, Macon, and the Vexin
- Childebrand II, Count of Autun, Macon, and the Vexin
- the Vexin

- 104 Nivelon II. Count of Autun, Macon, and the Vexin
- 105 Terric, Count of Autun, Macon, and the Vexin
- 106 Waleran, Hereditary Standard Bearer of France; died 965; md. Eldegarde, dau. of Arnulph I, and his wife Alisa de Vermandois, dau. of Heribert I, Count of Vexin and Vermandois.
- Walter I, Count of Vexin and Amiens, 995; gave land to the Abbey of Soissons; md. Eve, dau. of Landry, Count ٥f Dreux
- Ralf, fourth son; Sire de Tirel 108 and Poix, Viscount of Amiens; md. a dau. of Gueranville. He was first to adopt the name which has descended to the Tyrrell family of England and Ireland and to the Tyrrells, Terrells, and Terrills of [the U S A]. He had his castle near the village of Tirel, on the banks of the river Seine a short distance below Paris. This village is now known as Triel, a transposition of two letters.

Now that you have a record of our origin we will stop for this issue and will continue in future issues. A special thanks to Rev. Dr. Robert E. H. Peeples of Hilton Head Island, SC who brought this information to editor's attention.

Revolutionary War to WWI TERRELL, JOHN Coldest proven progenitor of our direct line | probably born in VA; we have yet to prove when, where and to whom. It is believed that he was born between 1760 and 1780; it is known that he married Marian ? either in VA, GA, or enroute between by the 1890's. All the following notes may not apply to our John. but they fit within the realm of possibility. 01/10/1791: Frances Burt of VA sold to John Terrell of Greene Co., GA 287-1/2 acres in Greene Co., GA on the waters of Fishing Creek bounded at the time of survey on the north by unknown and on all other sides by vacant lands. The land had been granted to Moody Burt, Sr 09/13/1784. The purchase price was 8,100 pounds of tobacco inspected at harvest. Signed Frances Burt, witnesses: Arch Beall, James Beall, D. Hinter J. P., recorded 03/06/1798. (Greene Co., GA. deed book 2, 1793-1802, part 1, p.394-395) He appears in 1797 Greene Co. Tax Digest in Capt. R. Melton's district, but returned poll without property. If he is the John above, either he was unable to pay the purchase price or Frances Burt had paid the taxes during the interim. In 1798, 1799, he returned 50 acres of

land on the waters of Richland Creek adjoins Howell, granted Sisney?; in 1799, he included 1 negro in his return, but none for the other years. 02/20/1802: John McMichael of Greene Co., GA sold to John Terrell of Greene Co. 50 acres in said county on the waters of Richland Creek for \$62.00. Property bounded on the south and west by McMichael, on the north by Blake Hollomon, on the east by Kicker. Signed John McMichael; witnesses: Lemuel Gresham; Little Berry Gresham, J. P.; recorded 04/09/1811. (Greene Co.; GA, Deed bk DD,1810/1818, p 106-107) 1805 Land Lottery, John Terrell had 2 draws, but drew blanks. 1807 Land Lottery, John Terrell of Owsley Dist., Greene Co., GA. drew

Land Lot 392, 21st. Dist., original Wilkinson Co. GA, granted 02/29/1808.

1808 John Terrell of Greene Co., GA

sold to Longino Bartholemew of Laurens

Co., GA. Land Lot 392, 21st. Dist.

original Wilkinson Co., GA. for \$300.

Signed John Terrell; witnesses M. (Marian?) Terrell, M. Devereaux, J. P.; recorded 08/26/1810. (Pulaski Co., 8A Deed Book A 1807-1811, p. 190-191) In 1809, John Terrell returned the above property in Capt John Turner's District and indicated that it adjoins [TO BE CONTINUED] Wingfield.

TERRELL, ALMON PERRY (09/13/1909--) born Anderson Co. TX; son of Robert Perry & Florence Tippen T.; married Snow; who died 07/07/1966; Artie married second: Lassie Terrell: retired machinist; Reed Roller Bit Company; no children; address: 5811 Sherman, Houston, TX 77011; ph. 713-923-4265.

TERRELL, ALZY BEA (02/25/1885--10/10/1926) born Coosa Co. AL; daughter of James Ignatious & Rebecca Ann Pittman T.; reared on her father's 260 acre hillside farm; married James 'Jim' Mansen Wilson in Coosa Co., AL 08/31/1902; mother of 6; migrated to Grady Co., GA 1917 with husband and about 50 other Coosa families; moved on to Miami, FL c1923-25, returned to Grady Co. GA where she died in or near Whigham, at the birth of her twin daughters. She is buried in Long Branch Baptist Church Cemetery Cairo, Grady Co., GA; he remarried.

TERRELL, ANDREW DAVID Jr. (08/10/ 1874--11/16/1949) born GA, TX, or enroute between; son of Andrew David & Hester Ann Rogers T.; reared on his father's black land Texas farm; never married; probably buried Camel Cemetery, Navarro Co. TX.

TERRELL, ANN RANDOLPH (09/20/1958--) probably born N. C.; daughter of Clifton Randolph & Jo Ann Larew Shewey T.; daughter of Presbyterian Minister; no further info.



Kinship has long been a facinating and sometimes frustrating subject. Persons frequently know that they are related, but do not know just how.

The old traditions, religious taboos, and even laws which forbid marriages of third-cousin or closer have caused many to stop considering one as kin beyond that point. However, kinship can be

carried on to as many degrees as there are generations from a known common ancestor.

I frequently encounter persons who are confused by the 'handles' attached to cousins such as 'once removed,' 'twice removed,' 'three times [or more] removed,' etc.

I hope the following will help to clear up some of this confusion.

Kinship begins with a COMMON ANCESTOR, then descends through successive generations until both relatives are equal or until one is reached, then the 'times removed' count begins until the other is reached.

The descendents of John Terrel(1) are used in the adjacent example.
