1993 NEW ENGLAND CONFERENCE

In conjunction with the 360th anniversary of the founding of Windsor CT, the first permanent settlement in CT, a conference will be held at Windsor CT on 22-24 September 1993 to study the "West Country" ancestral heritage of the founding families.

In 1630, a ship called the *Mary and John* sailed from Plymouth harbor in England carrying approximately 135 West Country Englishmen to their eventual settlement at Dorchester MA. Five years later, a majority of the so-called "Dorchester Company" trekked 110 miles to settle in the CT river valley at what we now know as Windsor, CT which had been established as a trading post on 26 Sept. 1633.

They lost few of the group to the early years and raised their families in the Puritan tradition. History has properly recognized the *Mayflower* settlers while ignoring those who came aboard the *Mary and John* only 10 years later. Developments in the past 15 years have increased interest in these unsung pioneers and this conference is a culmination of those efforts.

Those presenting include an impressive list of historians, archivists, designers, and genealogical organizers from both England and the USA.

You will recall that **Daniel TURRELL**, featured in our last winter issue was one of the "West Country" immigrants. GENEALOGY? ASK DAN!

QUESTION: Since there are so many different spellings for **TERRELL**, how can I be sure I don't miss some of my ancestors whose name is not spelled like I spell it now? ZPS GA

ANSWER: Simple, use phonics (sound of letters) rather than the actual letters themselves.

Phonics is the art of reading or spelling according to the sounds of letters. Each letter of the alphabet represents certain sounds. Once all these sounds are learned, one can correctly pronounce words he has not seen before.

Prior to about 100 years ago, very few persons could read and write. Those few who could kept the records for those who could not. They served as clerks of court and in other record-keeping capacities.

Remember--there are no rules for spelling proper names. You can spell your name any way you want and pronounce it any way you desire. For example, the surname **TALIAFERRO** [Italian, one who cut or otherwise worked with iron] has been pronounced **TOLIVER** for centuries. Some are so proud of their name's original spelling that a family tradition states that the **TOLIVER** spelling began when a man named **OLIVER** stole a horse and put a "T" in front of his name to avoid capture.

The record keepers spelled names according to what they thought the persons said. A person of German ancestry who

could not read and write might say his name as **Braun**, which is German for "the dark complexioned man." The clerk who probably could only speak and write in English, might record the name as **Brown**, or **Browne**; not because he knew its original meaning, but simply because of the way the name sounded to him.

When our federal officials began planning for Social Security and the verification process that would be necessary, they recognized the above fact and developed a system called **SOUNDEX**. They then applied this system to the 1880, 1900, and 1910 census for households having children in them and created what we today call the Soundex Index. [*The 1890 census was destroyed by fire.*]

The Soundex system is alphabetical for the first letter, the numeric thereafter. This keeps together names that have the same or similar sounds regardless of variations in spelling.

The Soundex system uses the first letter followed by 2 numeric consonant sounds, if any. Each Soundex group consists of the first letter followed by 3 numerals. Where there are no numeric sounds, "0" (zero) is used. For example **Lee** is listed in Soundex as **L000**, because there is no other consonant in the word. Also in the grouping would be: **Lea, Leo, Lei, Lae, Lie, Loe, Lou, Lye, Ley**, etc. **Leigh**, which is also pronounced as "Lee," would be coded as **L200** because of the one consonant "g"; the "h" was not coded in the Soundex system. So even the government's system is not fool proof and all inclusive. You still have to use your head when searching for ancestral records.

The Soundex system ignored double letters of the same numeric sound. For example, **Kelly** is coded as **K400** as though it were spelled **Kely**. The same would apply to any name containing **ck, jk, sq, ks, sk**, etc. because both letters in these sets are all grouped under the numeral "2" along with several other letters.

The Soundex sometimes, *but not always*, ignored prefixes such as **D', de, Di, dela, du, O', van, Von**, and others in both alphabetizing and in coding.

So much for the apparent confusion of the Soundex indexing system. Now let's explore ways to use this system to your advantage.

The Soundex Coding Guide is based upon several rules:

1. The letters **a, e, i, o, u, y, w, & h** were ignored and *not* coded
2. The first letter of the name is *not* coded;
3. The remaining letters were divided according to the following--

List #1

Code Key Letters & Equivalents

- 1 b,p,f,v
- 2 c,s,k,g,j,q,x,z
- 3 d,t
- 4 l

5 m,n
6 r.

In order for us to use phonics to find variations of our ancestors' names, we must reverse the process. Therefore:

List #2

a,c,i,h,o,u,w,y = 0
b,f,p,v = 1
c,g,j,k,q,s,x,z = 2
d,t = 3
l = 4
m,n = 5
r = 6.

Now let's use what we have learned on a common length surname of 7 letters--**Brinson**.

Remember, we want to keep the **B** and substitute numbers for each of the other letters. We now have **B605205**.

We can now substitute the first letter of our 0 list "a" for each zero making **B6a52a5**. Next we will use the first letter of our 2 list making **B6a5ca5**. The next logical step is to replace both #5 letters with the first from that list--**B6amcam**. Last but not least, substitute the 6 for the only letter in the 6 list "r." We now have our base variant starting point--**Bramcam**. I'll be the first to admit that it doesn't look or sound much like **Brinson**, but with a slight misunderstanding on the part of a clerk, it is possible. Our objective is to not overlook any possibility, no matter how remote. You can always discard anything you decide doesn't fit, but you can't insert something you didn't look for.

Since most indexes are in alphabetical order, we can save time and trouble if we build our list of possible variants in alphabetical order. For the moment, we will ignore prefixes and suffixes which can be added to any variation. To keep our list alphabetical, we will start with the last letter and work toward the front.

In order to visualize what we are about to do, let's list the possibilities for each numeric sound vertically (in alphabetical order) first:

List #3
B605205
Bramcam
Brengen
Brh jh
Bri ki
Bro qo
Bru su
Brw xw
Bry zy

From looking at List #3, you can readily see that almost any word beginning with the letters "Br" and containing any combination of "n," "m," or both can be a variation of **Brinson**.

This becomes even more obvious when it is noted that most numerical sounds (1,2,3,4,5,& 6) can be doubled and **ALL** zero letters can be used as doubles or in any combination, ie, aa, ae, ah, ai, ao, au, aw, ay, ei, ie, au, ha, hi, hy, ad infinitum.

You might want to try this now with your surname. You will be amazed to find how fast the variations appear. Just remember to **BEGIN** with the **LAST LETTER** and work toward the **FIRST LETTER**.

When you are tired of playing with your surname, take some hard earned advice. Don't even try to make up a complete list if your name has more than three letters. To list all the possible variations of **BRINSON** would take over 100 page long columns. Therefore, it is out of the question to make a list and check them off alphabetically with each index you search.

You won't miss many, if any, probable ancestors if you use List #2 above to make a table like List #3 for each of your surnames and simply refer to it as you check an index.

You can easily see in the case of **BRINSON** that we are going to be checking first in the "Br" section of the index followed by any vowel, h, y, or w; followed by either "m" or "n"; followed by any vowel, h, y, or w; and ending in "m" or "n."

To be thorough in our search, we have 3 more alphabet sections to check. You will note in List #1 that "b" is grouped with "p," "t," & "v." If those letters sound similar to "b" in the middle of a name, it seems reasonable that they would also sound similar at the beginning. Therefore it is reasonable to make sure that some of my ancestors are not hiding under the names like **Prinson**, **Prinston**, **Friinson**, or **Vinson**.

While we are on the subject of "hidden" ancestors, there is one more pitfall to avoid that has absolutely nothing to do with phonics, but rather is the result of sloppy penmanship. Certain capital letters look alike when they are written. The poorer the handwriting, the more alike they look.

Those I have found most often include: **T, L, & F**. One one occasion, I found **Tilly** indexed as **Lilly** because the indexer could not tell the difference between a written capital **L** and a capital **T**. **Terrell** is frequently confused with **Ferrell**, and vice versa.

Running a close second are the capital letters of **I, J, & S**. In school, I learned that the written **J** descends below the line. Some of our census takers did not know that. I have seen some records where the tail of the **J** was almost horizontal and looked more like a capital **I** than a **J**. I have checked census records where the similarity between those two letters was so great that I would have to read several pages of the census to tell which was which.

The capital letters of **H, M, N, V, & W** frequently look alike especially when the writer embellishes his capitals with a lot of curlicues and gets sloppy with the horizontal line across the H.

Earlier I mentioned prefixes can be added to the front of almost any name and suffixes can be added onto the end of any variation that you might find with the above system. A list of these follows.

SOME COMMON PREFIXES AND SUFFIXES FOUND ON SURNAMES

The following list of prefixes and suffixes found on surnames is not intended to be complete. However, it does cover those most commonly found in genealogical research in the USA.

PREFIXES

Prefixes are placed on the front of a name. The meaning varied from one country to another, but they usually pertained to what one did, where one lived, or to whom one was related.

ap *Welsh*: son of; ie, **Evan-ap-Rice** was Evan, son of Rice; in Anglization of the name, the "a" sound disappears and the p tends to become the first letter of the surname. Examples: **ap-Hugh** is likely to become **Pugh**; **ap-Richard/Pritchard**; **ap-Howell/Powell**, etc.

Cam *English*: winding; **Cameron** = crook-nosed; **Campbells** = crooked mouth

D' *Italian*: descendent of or son of

De *French*: from or dweller of; ie **DeVille** = from town; **DeTeril** = from Teril

de *German*: one who, one from, or the

Del *Spanish*: dweller; ie **Del Rio** = one who dwells by the river

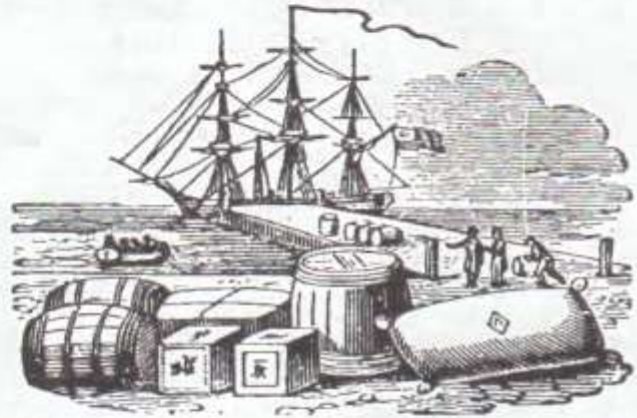

REVOLUTIONARY WAR PENSIONS

**TERRELL, Asahel/BLACKMAN, Hannah;
CT - NY W17311**

Hannah BLACKMAN, who was the widow of **Isahel TERRELL**, who died 10 Oct. 1777 of Fairfield County CT and was a private in the NY Line. Certificate of pension issued 12 April 1837 #743

Fairfield Co. CT 7 Jan 1837 - **Hannah BLACKMAN**, a resident of Fairfield, age 88 years stated that her name before she married was **Hannah HOYT**. She married **Asahel TERRELL** of Fairfield on December 25 1763 in Fairfield in that part now called Weston, by the Rev. **James JOHNSON**. That **Asahel TERRELL** enlisted in the spring of 1776 into Captain **Robert WALKER**'s company of CT for one year.

She also stated that in a letter to her, **Asahel** wrote that "besides his wages, he had a Bounty of Land, which is believed to be 500 acres." His wages nor his land has she nor her children received.

Asahel TERRELL was born September 10, 1739 at New Milford, Litchfield Co. CT and was killed while in service at Saratoga on October 10, 1777. He had just come off guard and sat down on a log when he was killed by a cannon ball from the enemy.

In the spring of 1776 her house burnt, leaving her and 4 small children (the youngest ones were twins) destitute. She was born

May 6, 1748 in Fairfield and has resided there since the Revolution and has been dependent on her son, **Israel BLACKMAN** for her support, aged about 28 years and he has lost use of his right arm and is not well able to support her.

Asahel TERRELL and Hannah's family record:

Asahel TERRELL was born September 10 1739 and was married to **Hannah HOIT** on December 21 1763. She was born May 06, 1748. **Jonathan TERRELL** (10/21/1764--11/05/1764); Daughters born Sept. 1765 and May 27, 1766 died without names; **Ruth(?) TERRELL** (02/22/1768--?); son born 05/04/1770 died without name; daughter born 04/1771 died without name; **Roch(?) TERRELL**, a daughter (01/19/1773--?); **Abijah & Elijah TERRELL**, twin sons, (Ma__ 8 1775--?)

Asahel TERRELL was killed at Saratoga on 10/10/1777.

TERREL, ELIHU CT S-3773

Elihu TERREL of Pittsburg, Lorain County, OH was a private under **Captain LEWIS** on the CT line for nine months.

Certificate of Pension issued 25 Oct 1833 #22,403 26,532

Elihu TERRILL was born in 1758 at Waterbury, CT and while living there, he enlisted in April 1776 and served until Dec 15 1776. He was drafted in Aug. 1778 and served one month. He was allowed a pension on August 8, 1833 while living at Ridgeville, Lorain Co. OH. He lived in Waterbury until about 1813 when he moved to Ridgeville.

Waterbury, New Haven Co. CT 13 July 1833 - **Jared TERREL** of Waterbury, aged 75 years, stated he also enlisted April 1776 under **Captain John LEWIS** and served for eight months and was discharged on Christmas day of the same year. He and Elihu enlisted together. (No relationship between Jared and Elihu was stated). Invalid File #3773

TERREL, ENOCH & NANCY CT S-11,528

Nancy TERRELL, widow of **Enoch TERRELL**, who was a private in the NJ Mil. line for 6 months. Certificate of pension issued 26 Nov 1839 #4634; Sept 2 1843 #1744

Essex County, NJ -14 Nov. 1838 - **Nancy TERRELL**, aged about 74 years on the 19th of January, stated she was the widow of **Enoch TERRELL**, deceased, of the township of Westfield, NJ. That Enoch was a private in the New Jersey Militia. She was married to him on 18 May 1788 by the Rev. **Benjamin WOODRUFF** at Westfield, Essex Co. NJ. Her name before her marriage was **Nancy DENMAN**. Enoch died 14 March 1828 at his residence in said county. Widow file #874

TERRIL, EPHRAIM CT S-11,528

Ephraim TERRIL of Cheshire, CT was a private in the CT line for 6 months and 4 months in the Militia. Certificate of pension issued 27 Sep. 1832 #575.

New Haven County, CT - 7 Aug 1832 - **Ephraim TERRIL**, aged 75 years and a resident of Cheshire stated he entered the service in the early part of the summer of 1779 while residing in Cheshire. He was born in Woodbridge County the 27 Nov. 1756 Invalid File #11,528

TERRILL, HEZEKIAH CT W-22,393; BETSY BL Wt 36,668-160-55

Betsy TERRILL of Albany NY, widow of **Hezekiah TERRILL** who served in the Revolutionary War as a private in the CT Continental Troops. Certificate issued 3 April 1869 #6460

Fulton Co. NY 26 July 1855 - **Betsy TERRILL**, aged 79 years on 8 May 1855, a resident of Mayfield, Fulton Co. NY, stated she was the widow of **Hezekiah TERRILL** who was a private in the Continental Troops of Connecticut in the Revolutionary War for a period of three years. She married **Hezekiah TERRILL** on or about 19 Nov. 1790 in the town of Caughnamaga, Montgomery Co. NY (now known as the town of Broodolkin, Fulton Co. NY) by **Elder SMITH**, a Baptist Clergyman. Her name before marriage was **Betsy TAYLOR**. **Hezekiah TERRILL** was born a North Stratford CT on 2 July 1759 and died 21 Aug 1821 (another place says he d. 9 April 1821) at Mayfield, Montgomery Co. (now Fulton Co.) NY.

Fulton Co. NY - 26 July 1855 - **David BEERS**, aged 78 stated he was born in North Stratford CT on 2 July 1777 the same town as **Hezekiah TERRILL** and was acquainted with him from the time he can first recollect. **Hezekiah** moved from CT to NY about 10 years after the close of the Revolutionary War and settled in Caughnawaga, Montgomery Co. NY. (Now Broodolkin, Fulton Co.). About 2 years after he became a resident of NY, **Hezekiah** married **Betsy TAYLOR**, daughter of **Niles TAYLOR** of Caughnawaga on 19 Nov. 1790.

15 Aug 1860 - Hamilton Co., NY - **Harding TAYLOR**, aged 84 years stated he was present at the marriage of **Betsy** and **Hezekiah** and he remembered it being in the fall of 1790 because his father died the same fall of 1790. **Betsy** was born in Shetfort CT, and resided there for 10 or 12 years and **Hezekiah** resided there as a near neighbor until they both came to NY state. (No relationship stated between **Harding TAYLOR** and **Betsy**)

Hamilton Co. NY - 5 Sep 1860 - **John ROSVELT** aged 87 years of Providence, Saratoga Co. NY stated he was 17 years of age when he came to town of Providence and has known **Geoshon TERRILL** from his infancy to the present time and that he is the son of **Hezekiah** and **Betsy TERRILL** who now resides in Mayfield, Fulton Co.

Fulton Co. NY - 8 Feb 1869 - **Betsy TERRILL**, a resident of Kingsboro, aged 95 years applied for an increase in pension

Bounty Warrant #36,668 for 160 acres of land issued 5 Aug 1856.

TERREL, JARED
CT S-18,625

[See another statement by one **Jared TERREL** of Waterbury under **Elihu TERREL**]

Jared TERREL of Waterbury, CT was a private under **Captain LEWIS** in the CT line. Certificate of pension issued 25 Feb. 1833 #6271

Waterbury, New Haven Co. CT - 28 July 1832 - **Jared TERREL**, aged 74 years of age stated that he entered the service in February 1776 as a substitute for his brother, **Abijah(?) TERREL** for two months at New York. Then an April 1776 he enlisted for eight months under **Captain LEWIS** and was discharged in 1779. He was born in Waterbury, New Haven Co. CT on Dec. 25 1857 and has lived there ever since. Invalid #18,625

TERREL, JOEL
NC AGENCY S-14,664

Joel TERRELL was a private in the late army of the United States. Certificate of Pension issued 27 Dec. 1816

Joel TERRELL served as a private in the United States Army and was wounded in the battle of Guilford in NC. On account of this disability he drew a pension from December 13, 1813. His residence at the time he received his pension is shown to have been Wake Co. NC. He died in Rutherford Co. NC 12/26/1819. His age was not stated. **Joel TERRELL** was survived by a widow, **Martha**, who died 03/10/1839 in Rutherford Co. NC. The date and place of birth of Martha, or date of Joel's marriage to her were not stated. Four children survived the soldier, three of them were still living in 1856. The only child named was their daughter, **Evelina A. TERRELL** who married **Arthur ERWIN** 01/18/1825 in Rutherford Co. NC. In 1885, **Evelina A.** was aged 85 years and a resident of Floyd Co. GA and the only surviving child and heir of **Joel J. W. TERRELL**, a grandson was living in Qualla Town NC in 1856. In 1886, another grandson, **Charley ERWIN**, son of **Evelina A.** and **Arthur ERWIN**, was a resident of Pleasant Grove, Forsyth Co. GA. The names of **J. W. TERRELL**'s parents were not stated.

TERRILL, JOEL & EUNICE
CT W-4353

Eunice TERRILL, widow of **Joel TERRILL** who died 22 March 1825, of Lorain Co. OH was a corporal in the CT line for 3 years from 1777. Certificate of pension issued 14 May 1838 #2024

Lorain Co. OH - 9 Nov 1837 - **Eunice TERRILL**, a resident of Ridgeville, Lorain Co. OH, for more than 20 years, aged 79 years the 9 September 1837 stated she was the widow of **Joel TER-**

RILL, deceased. They were married December 1778. He died March 22, 1925 at Ridgeville.

Family record of **Joel & Eunice TERRILL**: **Joel TERRILL** was born 07/13/1757/59; **Eunice HODGE** was born 09/09/1758; **Joel** and **Eunice** were married 12/30/1778; **Wyllys TERRILL** was born 02/11/1780; **Polly TERRILL** was born 05//1785 and died 04/12/1805 being nineteen years, 11 mos. and 7 days old.

Joel TERRILL was born 07/23/1757 at Waterbury CT and while living there enlisted in the Spring of 1775. He married 12/30/1778, **Emma HODGE** born 09/09/1258, and he died March 22 1825 at Ridgeville, Lorain Co. OH. **Joel TERRILL** was the brother of **Elihu TERRILL**.

9-Nov-1837 - Lorain Co. OH - The deposition of **Elihu TERRILL** of Ridgeville, Lorain Co. OH, in the case of **Eunice TERRILL**, widow of **Joel TERRILL**, stated he was a brother of **Joel** and that **Joel** was born in Waterbury CT in 1757 and died in Ridgeville OH in 1825. That **Joel** resided in New Haven Co. CT until about 1810 when he moved to Ridgeville OH. He enlisted in the Continental Service in the spring of 1775 under **Captain PECK**. **Israel TERRILL** was Ensign or Lieutenant. **Joel** married **Eunice HODGE**.

19 Feb 1838 - **David BEEBE, Jr**, **Belinda BEEBE**, and **Molly TERRELL** gave testimony for **Eunice TERRILL**. (No relationship between **Molly** and **Eunice** was stated) Widow file #4353

In 1840 **Eunice TERRILL** lived in Ridgeville, OH and was aged 81.

TERRILL, JOHN
PA S-37,484

John TERRILL of Bourbon Co. KY was a private under Colonel **FLOWERS** of the Pennsylvania Line. Certificate of pension issued 2 July 1819 #12,373

Commonwealth of Kentucky - 29 Aug. 1818 - **John TERRILL**, aged 66 years, a resident of Bourbon Co. KY, stated he enlisted in the fall of the year 177_ for three years. He served about 2 years and 6 months and was then discharged. He has no person near him except his oldest daughter. He and his wife are unable to support themselves at housekeeping and are obliged to separate and live with their children apart.

John TERRILL enlisted at Carlisle, PA, served as a private. He was allowed pension on his application on August 31, 1818 while residing in Bourbon Co. KY, aged 66 years. In 1820, he referred to his wife aged 72 and his children. He had daughters but neither their names nor that of his wife are stated.

28 May 1819 - Mrs. **Jane HIBLER** stated she knew of the distress of the wife of **John TERRILL** when he enlisted and that he stayed from his family for some time. She remembers him coming home on furlough and the joy of the family. She was then young. She thinks she may have seen his discharge papers but is not sure. Invalid File #37,484

TERRILL, NATHAN & DOROTHY CT W-4083

Nathan TERRILL of Knox Co. OH was a private under **Captain STARR** in the CT line for 1 year and 10 months from 1775--1777. Certificate of pension issued 27 July 1833 #13,487 15,082 **Dorothy TERRILL**, widow of **Nathan TERRILL** - Certificate of pension issued 9 January 1844 #4275. Certificate of pension issued 8 Jan 1839 #3143

Knox Co. OH - 25 Sep 1832 - **Nathan TERRILL**, a resident of Clinton Township, aged 77 years, stated he enlisted in the United States Army with **Stephen TERRILL**, **John TERRILL**, and others about the middle of May 1775. He resided at the time in New Milford, Litchfield Co. CT. He was born at New Milford, Litchfield Co. CT on 12 April 1755.

The family record of **Nathan** and **Dorothy TERRILL**: **Nathan TERRILL** and **Dorothy PHELPS** were married 02/26/1778; **Joana TERRILL**, dau, b. 03/13/1779.

Knox Co. OH - 29 June 1837 - **Dorothy TERRILL**, a resident of Clinton, aged 81 years stated she and **Nathan** lived in New Fairfield, Fairfield Co. CT at the time **Nathan** served in the Revolution and lived there until 1816 when they moved to Knox Co. OH where **Nathan** died 24 Jan 1834. They were married on 16 Feb 1778 at New Fairfield (later called Sherman) Fairfield Co. CT.

Knox Co. OH - 29 June 1837 - **Elijah TERRILL** stated he was the son of **Nathan** and **Dorothy TERRILL**, that he was 46 years old [b. ca 1791] and was born in Litchfield Co. CT where he resided with his parents until 1816 when they moved to Knox Co. OH where they resided until his father, **Nathan**, died 01/24/1834. That he had one sister living who was born in March 1779.

3 November 1838 - Knox Co. OH - **Dorothy TERRILL**, aged 82 years on the 24 May [b. 1756]. 16 Oct. 1843, Knox Co. OH - **Dorothy TERRILL**, aged 87 years. Widow file #4083

TERRILL, PRESLEY VA S-38,430

Presley TERRILL of Woodford Co. KY, was a private under **Colonel Wm. WASHINGTON** of the Virginia Line for two years. Certificate of pension issued 17 Feb 1819 #6993.

Fayette KY - 3 July 1820 - **Presley TERRILL**, aged 58 years [b. ca 1762] and a resident of Woodford County, stated he enlisted in 1781 in **Captain James GUNN**'s company of Lighthouse and served till the end of the war and was discharged in South Carolina. He was a farmer and his family consisted of a wife, aged about 60 years [b. ca 1760] and a daughter, **Nancy**, aged about 15 years [b. ca 1805] and a white boy, named **William CLARK** aged 10 years [b. ca 1810].

In 1818, one **Archibald TERRELL** testified in behalf of **Presley TERRILL** but no relationship was stated. **Presley TERRILL** died Aug. 23, 1835. Invalid File #38430

TERRELL, RICHMOND VA R-10459

Newton GA - 23 March 1840 - **Richmond TERRELL**, aged 80 years [b. ca 1760] stated he entered the service in the summer of 1776 under **Captain Jack FOX** and served two months until the fall of 1776. He resided in the county of Louisa, VA when he entered the service the first time and he resided in Bedford Co. when he entered the second time, and at the time he entered the last service he resided in Pitsylvania (sic) Virginia. After the revolution, he resided some time in Louisa Co. VA then moved to Wilkes Co. GA; to Warren Co. GA; to Jefferson Co. GA; to Jefferson Co. GA; and to Newton Co. GA, his present residence which make up in all 40 years of residence in Georgia.

Richmond TERRELL was born in Albemarle Co. VA, but date of birth is not shown. He applied for pension on March 23, 1840 but age is not shown, a resident of Newton Co. GA. While a resident of Louisa Co. VA, he enlisted in the summer of 1776 and served until 1781. His claim for pension was not allowed as he failed to furnish proof of service as required.

TERRELL, SIMON NC S-32,008

Simon TERRELL of Franklin Co. GA was dragoon under **Captain Douglass** in the North Carolina Line for 7 months. Certificate issued 1 Sept. 1836 #30876

Franklin Co. GA - 6 April 1836 - **Simon TERRILL**, a resident of **Captain MURRAY**'s district, aged 81 years, stated that he entered the service in the latter part of 1777 in Chatham Co. NC where he resided at the time. In about the middle of September 1780 his brother was wounded and he was employed the balance of the time in nursing and taking care of his wounded brother. He was discharged on 25 Dec 1780. He also served again from 1781 for three months and was taken prisoner by the British and Tories and exchanged in Charleston SC, he thinks in 1782. He obtained Bounty Warrant from the state of NC.

He was born in Orange Co. NC on 27 March 1755. He lived in Chatham Co. NC and has lived in Pendleton District SC, but now lives and has done so for 40 years past in Franklin Co. GA. He gives **Timothy TERRELL** and **Thomas DAVIS** as references who reside in the neighborhood of **Simon TERRELL**. No relationship between **Simon** and **Timothy** is stated. There is no mention of family. Invalid file #32008

TERRILL, STEPHEN CT S-41,234

Stephen TERRILL of Monkton Co. VT was a private under **Colonel C. WEBB** of the Connecticut line for one year. Certificate of pension issued 17 May 1820 #16984

Addison Co. VT - 16 April 1818 - **Stephen TERRILL** of Monkton, aged 72 years stated he enlisted in **Captain STARR**'s Company in 1776.

Litchfield Co. CT - 9 Nov 1819 - **John TERRILL** of New Milford stated he had known **Stephen TERRILL** from childhood. (No relationship stated)

Addison Co. VT - 6 July 1820 - **Stephen TERRILL**, aged 74 stated he was a farmer and his family at that time consisted of his wife, aged 74, a son and his wife, **Joseph SANFORD(?)** aged 45, and a grandchild aged 10 years, the child of his daughter.

Addison Co. VT - 10 June 1823 - **Stephen TERRILL**, aged 77 years, stated that in the summer of 1821 he was in debt to **Joel TERRILL** \$245.57 for material and labor in building his house in 1815. At that time he was not a resident of Stephen's family and had not been for a number of years previous, but was living and keeping house by himself.

TERRELL, WILLIAM NY S-42,467

William TERRELL of Palatine, NY was a private under Colonel VanSCHARCK of the New York Line for one year. Certificate of pension issued 1 Sep. 1819 #15,236

Montgomery Co. NY - 12 June 1821 - **William TERRELL**, aged 67 years, stated he enlisted in July 1775 and served until Jan 1 1777. He was a farmer but had a lame foot which occurred while he was in service. His wife's name was **Jane**, aged 71 years [b. ca 1750].

Montgomery Co. NY - 16 May 1818 - **William TERRELL** of Palatine stated he was 64 years of age on the 22 Feb. past [b. 1754]. He enlisted in Salem, County of Charlotte, now County of Washington, in July 1775 and served until Jan 1777.

16 Apr. 1819 - **William TERRELL** has an aged wife and a daughter who are depending upon him for support. Invalid File #42,467

TERRELL, WILLIAM SC S-16550

William TERRELL of DeKalb Co. GA was a private in the South Carolina Line. Certificate of pension issued 5 Oct 1833 #16823

DeKalb Co. GA - 8 July 1833 - **William TERRELL** stated his parents told him he was born August 6, 1760 'on Neuse River, NC.' The name of his parents are not stated. While a resident of Craven County which later became Lancaster District, South Carolina, **William TERRELL** enlisted and served as private in the South Carolina troops. He was allowed a pension on his application of October 12, 1832, at which time he was a resident of DeKalb Co. GA, having moved there from Lancaster District, SC in 1826. There is no mention of a family.

George W. TERRELL

[EDITOR'S NOTE: This book was published after 1881 but probably before 1900. It is quoted in its verbose entirety to preserve the color of the writings of that era.]

George TERRELL was born within three miles of Ft. Worth, Texas, August 16, 1850, and grew to manhood on the western frontier during the most troublous period of its history.

His father, **Edward TERRELL**, who was born in Kentucky in 1809, and who married Miss **Lou PEAVLER**, born in Iowa in 1835. **Edward TERRELL** is a man remarkable for his energy and tireless disposition, traits of character which were of special value in the early days of his first settlement in Texas. During his residence in Tarrant County, where he settled after a short residence in Fannin, he had frequent difficulties with the Indians; and in 1860, in the company with two other white men, was captured, but managed to get away unharmed. They were made prisoners by the Indians near the present site of Ft. Worth, but after three days of captivity were released after agreeing to pay three wagon loads of corn meal for their liberty.

Edward TERRELL was a large cattle dealer before the war and made considerable money, but upon the first indications of trouble, he sold his stock and invested in property in Hempstead. He was a purchasing agent for the Confederate army during the war. Like all Southern men, he lost heavily through the failure of the loved cause, and though he returned to active business life when peace was declared, he was never able to regain his lost prosperity. He is still living in Young County, Texas and is known and valued as one of the oldest and best liked of its citizens. He raised a family of eight children, all but one of whom are living.

Our subject, **George W. TERRELL**, in the matter of obtaining an education received but little assistance from teachers or books. In this he shared the common lot of all Texan youths whose boyhood was coincidental with the war period. His school days were of short duration, for, when only fourteen years old, he hired to one of his brothers to do work for him on the range.

He was with this brother, and with Joe MATTHEWS, for some time; bought some yearlings from his brother David TERRELL, and eventually came to own about 100 head, which he held at what was known as the Whiskey Creek ranch in Young County. The "N U G" brand, which he then adopted, is still kept up by the Loving Cattle Company in that locality.

In 1868, Mr. TERRELL sold out his cattle and hired to Joe MATTHEWS to drive cattle to Colorado for \$45 a month. He was absent on this trip about eleven months, including a side trip to New Mexico, and upon his return he invested what ready money he could secure in cattle, buying a heard of 600 head, which he located on a ranch on Whiskey Creek and held for three years, then selling to Charles RIVERS.

Going into a partnership with his brother David, Mr. TERRELL next purchased a large herd from Sam GHOLSTON, and, after holding them for two years in Coleman County, sold the greater portion of them back to GHOLSTON, their original owner.

The next year was spent handling cattle on a ranch in Baylor County, and then Mr. TERRELL took a position with BOAZ & GODWIN, who purchased his cattle for \$10 a head and paid him a salary of \$100 per month for his services. From that time until the present, he has continued to handle and speculate in cattle, and his transactions have been, at times, on a large scale.

In the spring of 1877 he sold a herd for a considerable sum, and made a trip to Old Mexico, where he purchased 500 head of choice steers, bringing them to Young County, where he located them on a ranch on the Brazos River, and afterward sold them to advantage.

His present ranch was purchased and stocked in 1881. It comprises 2,000 acres of fine land with 300 acres in cultivation, and is considered one of the best ranches in the county, being well watered and supporting a luxuriant growth of mesquite grass. He now has some 400 head of stock cattle, and is feeding 400 head for the market, and his ranch is well supplied with necessary horse stock for its management.

In 1873, Mr. TERRELL married Miss Nannie PENN who was born in Dallas County, Texas in 1862 [1852?, surely she was more than 11 at marriage]. She is the daughter of William PENN, now dead, who was one of the first settlers of Dallas County, and will be well remembered by such of our readers who may have lived or visited in that section of the state thirty or forty years since Mr. & Mrs. TERRELL have had six children, and five of them living. Their names are: Walter P. TERRELL; Whitfield B. TERRELL (dead); Lily E. TERRELL; George A. TERRELL; Myrtle E. TERRELL; and Maud A. TERRELL.

Mr. TERRELL is a shrewd business man and an excellent judge of all kinds of stock, and as such his success is a natural consequence of his long years of experience. As a citizen and a friend his associates prize him highly. Honorable in all things, and never going out of his way to court notice or popularity, he has won the respect and friendship of all, and may be relied upon to retain the esteem and good wishes of all who may come in contact with him, in business and socially.

He has a comfortable and cozy home, and it is kept in perfect order by his talented and loving helpmate, who is rightfully proud of her husband's enviable position in life, while she shares with him the multiplicity of friendships which their commendable traits have won them.

Since the youngest son George M. is 7 years old and was born in IL, it is likely that their marriage occurred in Hopkins Co. TX, probably shortly before the 1850 census.]

George M. TERRELL

From Biographical Souvenir 1889

George M. TERRELL, the only child born to **John** and **Rebecca SULLIVAN TERRELL**, was a resident of Texas from the age of five years. He was born May 27, 1843, and lost his mother when he was but an infant.

His father, **John TERRELL**, was a native of Kentucky, a farmer and a stock raiser, and on coming to Texas in 1848 settled in that part of Hopkins [County], which became Delta County, and here he ended his days in 1863.

Having come to the state as a mere child, **George M. TERRELL** saw the vast wilderness of prairie change to cultivated fields, and materially assisted in bringing about the change and in building up and developing the county which he assisted to erect and organize.

In 1862 Mr. TERRELL enlisted in Company G. Ninth Texas Regiment, and was attached to the western army. He was wounded at the battle of Middleburg, Tennessee, was captured, but escaped imprisonment by being exchanged for a Federal who had been taken by his own company the same day. The final surrender took place while he was at Canton, Mississippi, and he was paroled at Jackson, Mississippi.

On his return to Texas he engaged in farming and stock raising till 1873, when he started business, and enjoyed an enviable reputation for individual integrity and upright dealing with his customers. He was identified with the town since its beginning, and did much to aid its growth.

Mr. TERRELL married Miss **Amanda J. CONDIT**, daughter of **William** and **Jane CONDIT** of Delta County, his affection for his wife having been formed when they were schoolmates. Two children brightened their home, named **John W.** and **Egbert**. The parents were members of the Methodist Protestant Church and lived fully up to its teachings.

George M. TERRELL helped organize the First National Bank of Cooper; and we have a Historical Medallion on his home.

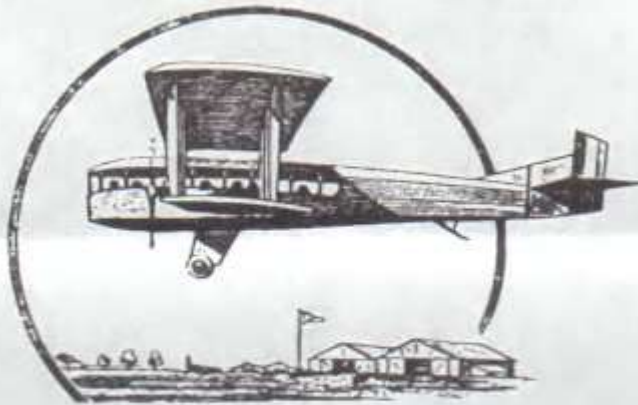

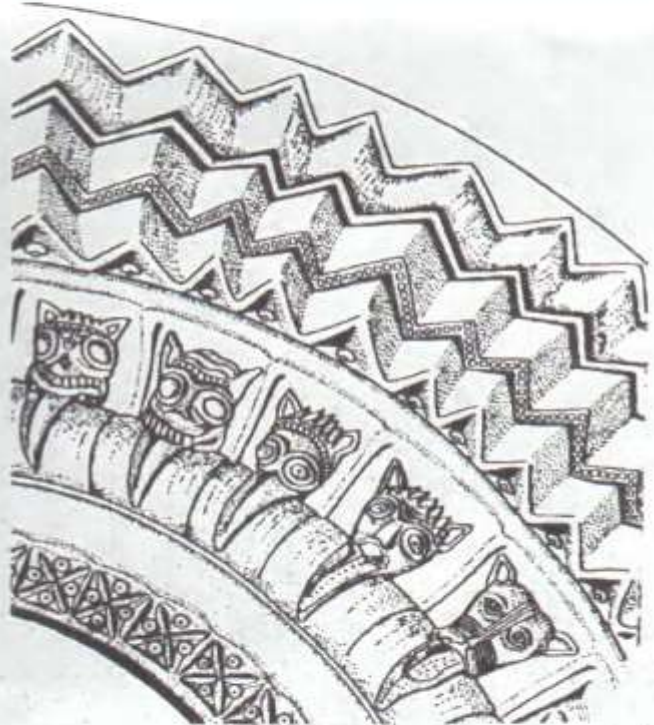
