A Quaker graveyard in Caroline County [Virginia] that had remained undisturbed for 258 years was recently bull-dozed to make way for a new home.

The cemetery was near the site of what was once the Quaker meeting house of the Golansville Society of Friends. It's near the intersection of US-1 and Cedar Fork Road in the Ladysmith area.

Fieldstones that had served as grave markers were pushed into a pile, and some old hickory trees that had shaded the spot were cut down.

According to historians, 60 to 100 bodies were buried there in the 1700s and 1800s.

Only the tombstone of an infant named Henry Terrell LUCK (1893) was left on the site after the clearing, and it was freshly scraped and appeared to have been pushed aside.

County records show that the property was sold by Revell & White of Stafford County to Juan and Annetta YOUNG of Dawn last spring.

Juan YOUNG said yesterday that he and his wife plan to build a three-bedroom house at the site where they own 22 acres.

"Honestly," he said, "I didn't know anything about the graveyard. I just saw one tombstone there and that was

covered by rubbish and weeds. The guy that did the bulldozing for us left the stone there."

But Linda MOYER, the L.J. Realty/Century 21 Realtor who handled the sale, said the couple should have been aware of the graveyard. It was marked on the survey of the property, and an environmental specialist had walked the land with the YOUNGS. Investigator Scott MOSER of the Caroline County Sheriff's Office is looking into what happened.

MOSER said it's a felony for anyone to willfully or maliciously destroy or remove a gravestone or any other structure from a cemetery.

Anyone found guilty faces a maximum of five years in prison, one year in jail, and a \$2,500 fine.

Quakers apparently came to Caroline soon after the county was established in 1727 from the Cedar Creek Friends Meeting in western Hanover county.

The settlers built their on meeting house, the Quakers' equivalent of a church, in Golansville in 1739.

Herbert COLLINS, a historian and a native of Caroline, discovered and documented the foundation of the meeting house and burial site two years ago.

He said he advised the Virginia Department of Historic Resources of his findings and urged state officials to take some action to preserve the site.

COLLINS spent years compiling information on all the burial grounds in Caroline and has published a book. Now retired, he spent 30 years working for the National Museum of American History.

He was devastated to learn that the cemetery had been bulldozed.

When he found the cemetery, **COLLINS** said, there was a wire fence surrounding the area about 25 yards wide. Inside was the infant's tombstone and another large stone marked only with a date. Placed around were about 35 fieldstones, some etched with names and dates. Periwinkle covered the ground.

"The Quakers generally did not mark graves. If they did, it was with ordinary fieldstones," COLLINS said.

The earliest Quakers in Caroline appear to have been members of the CHEADLE, CHILES, HACKETT, HUB-BARD, and TERRELL families, he said.

The Golansville group stayed active for 114 years before the meeting house was closed in 1853.

The only part of the Golansville house that survives is a brick foundation which is just south of an abandoned gas station.

It was preserved because another house was later built on the foundation, and a concrete porch surrounded it on three sides, COLLINS said. That house is gone, but the original foundation remains.

Caroline Quakers were the first organized body of settlers to successfully assert their right to worship, "according to the dictates of their conscience."

When they refused to pay the wages for the priests of the Church of England or to serve in the militia, the sheriff and his deputies reportedly visited the farms of the Friends to confiscate livestock and household goods. [End of quoted article]

Rebecca PEATROSS; Elizabeth 'Betty' TERRELL b. 09/07/1738 md. Zachariah MOORMAN; & Ann TERRELL b. 09/15/1740 md. Col. Charles LYNCH. Anne CHILES TERRELL was living 09/15/1740 but died c1740—41.

On 04/03/1744, Henry TERRELL md.(2) by a Quaker ceremony in Henrico Co VA, Sarah WOODSON b. c1716, daughter of Tarleton & Ursula FLEMING WOODSON who had married in 1710. In the report of his second marriage, he was designated as son of William TERRELL, deceased of Hanover Co. VA. Henry & Sarah WOODSON TERRELL had children: Ursula TERRELL b. 03/11/1746; Charles TERRELL b. 08/03/1748, md. Nancy TYLER, daughter of William TYLER, Jr.; Judith TERRELL b. 02/06/1750 md. Capt. George TYLER; Abigal TERRELL b. 10/06/1751 md. Col. William DURRETT; George TERRELL b. 06/28/1753 md. Elizabeth TYLER, sister of Nancy; & Tarleton TERRELL b. 11/19/1754, d. young before Henry TERRELL made his will.

Henry TERRELL was a man of considerable influence in the colony. He made large shipments of goods from Bristol ENGLAND for use on his plantations and exported the surplus products of his lands, especially tobacco. His land purchases included some from Joel TERRELL & Roger QUARLES which may have been all or part of the 400 acres patented by John QUARELS 04/20/1720 in the north fork of Pole Cat Creek in St. Johns Parish, King William County VA and/or the land patented to John QUARELS on 09/28/1730 for land adjoining William TERRELL's Raven Neck tract (Land Book 10, p. 40, 01/22/1718).

Henry's sons Henry & Thomas TERRELL received his land in Albemarle Co. VA patented on sheepskin and still [ca1954] well preserved, under King George II, 08/20/1748 for 1750 acres in Goochland Co. VA which later became Albemarle Co. The land was located on Mechums and Whitesides creeks & the town of Batesville was later built on part of it.

Henry and his brother, David TERRELL, united with the Quakers, or Society of Friends in 1739. Henry was clerk of the meeting for years. (Source: DICKEN, TERRELL GENEALOGY, pages 193-196)

CHARTER TREASURER CARRIES TORCH

Treasurer who served the Society from 1984 when the Society was formed until she resigned in 1995.

For months now, she has lifted her makeshift Olympic torch she concocted by filling a brass vase with an empty pickle jar topped off with a small can of Vienna sausages.

Barbells simply would not do for this training. Her homespun torch weighs exactly three-and-a-half pounds, just like the Olympic Torch.

At 89, Eleanor TERRELL is Clayton County's oldest torchbearer. And she's ready for Olympic fame.

"This is one of the biggest things I've ever gotten to do," she said.

She has conducted her intense training regimen from the comfort of her rocking chair.

"I can hold it up for 30 minutes while I watch television," said the enthusiastic Jonesboro denizen. "I just sit and rock in my rocker and hold it like it's the torch."

To build her endurance, she has alternated lifting her improvised torch first in her right hand, then in her left.

She is confident this routine has prepared her to carry the torch in Wednesday's relay through Jonesboro.

"I'm ready," she said.

TERRELL admitted that she did not have the clothing to

meet the ACOG-required torchbearer uniform of spanking new white shorts and T-shirt. Luckily, ACOG furnished her the necessary clothing.

Shorts, regardless of the color, are not part of TERRELL's everyday attire.

"I haven't worn shorts in 40 or 50 years," she said. "But, I'll wear them since they're my uniform.

The ACOG warning that cautions torchbearers not to use hair spray because the flame could ignite it does not affect TERRELL, she said.

"I'm not one of those women who primps a lot, so I'm not worrying about it," she said.

Although she moves about pretty well, TERRELL will complete her torch run by wheelchair.

She opted to ride her little more than half-mile route because she is afraid she may experience shortness of breath. Her daughter, Barbara McDONALD, who nominated TERRELL as a torchbearer, put the wheelchair requirement on the application.

TERRELL is one of nine Clayton County torchbearers chosen through Coca-Cola's community hero selection program. She's also one of 10,000 citizens across the country who will carry the torch before its final arrival Friday in Atlanta in time for the opening ceremony of the 1996 Olympic Games.

She was selected for her contributions to the community.

The 65-year Clayton County resident has served as Sunday school teacher, Forest Park PTA president, and was chosen the 1957 Georgia Homemaker of the year, along with a list of other accomplishments. The article continued her accomplishments on page 12A, but Mrs. TERRELL did not include that section of the article. She wrote modestly, "You need not use it all. Your George C. TERRELL is about the right age to be son of George Washington TERRELL Jr, brother of Tom, age 1 in 1870. I suggest that you write to Mrs. Waites and see if she can fill in some of the gaps. I feel you may find you are related to her husband. Another area to pursue is the names of the cousin(s) the TERRELL boys visited in Pike County GA. My g-great grandfather, Absalom TERRELL had a brother Ignatius TERRELL who reared a family in Pike County GA plus two or three sisters who also lived in that general area. Most of their descendants are untraced.

The following information is from an untraced George TERRELL in my own line. Andrew 'Jackson' TERRELL was brother of my great grandfather. These Coosa TERRELLS' descendants migrated into Elmore, Chilton, & Autauga counties later.

If your birth date and my marriage dates are correct, he is not father of your George, unless he had a wife prior to Emma. He may have married Alice later, I don't know. I'm passing this along in case there is something here that connects with your info.

7/10 Andrew 'Jackson' TERRELL (02/03/1852—10/01/1925) son of Absalom TERRELL & Margaret VESSELS was born in Coosa Co. AL; md. 1874 to Frances 'Fannie' SUTTLE. Known children (May not be in order of birth):

7/10/1? William Jabez TERRELL b.1877

7/10/2? George TERRELL md. Emma PATTERSON (??-1914) Untraced; may have married more than once 7/10/3? Margaret 'Maggie' TERRELL never married (??—age 19)

7/10/4? Mary Frances 'Fannie' TERRELL md. Calvin JONES This daughter moved to Montgomery AL, had children.

This info from interview with Arcie TERRELL, son of William Jabez TERRELL a few months before he died in mid 1980s. It is almost entirely from his memory and may or may not be correct.

ADDENDUM: The preceding information was mailed directly to Nancy Bannister. The following is the next message from her.

I have heard from Mary Waites, she knew one of George C Terrell's son, Malburn Dea Terrell. It seams he was her teacher in school in 1939-1940. She says there is a Francis R Terrell buried beside James Terrell at Ross Cemetery in Elmore Co., AL. She says the gravestone for Francis reads b. 23 Feb 1916 d. 23 Jun 1969 also marker reads Mamma Daddy. Do you have anything on this Francis R Terrell. If this is James Terrell's daughter, he was only 15 when she was born. I don't think Francis was his daughter. [I don't have anything on this Francis R. TERRELL. If I have interpreted your information correctly, James TERRELL m. Sallie Belle COOPER 1925, had 2 children, and she d. 1928. I think that Francis R. TERRELL is his second or later wife and the R. probably stands for her maiden name. The inscription "Mamma Daddy" may have been placed there by the children of his first marriage and/or additional children by the later marriage. Unfortunately, the 1930+ census information is not available and this can only be resolved through living descendants and relatives. Proving or disproving this theory will take some research, probably in AL. DFB]

Mrs. Waites says George W Terrell filed for a CSA pension in 1918 and listed these children:

It seems they moved to Chilton Co., about 1918 she says from Coosa Co. She sent me a list of other Terrells (17) buried in Elmore Co., but she doesn't know them.

SUMMARY: Those of you who have followed this column for several years know that I don't get into "who were the parents of X" unless there is either some information of interest to most readers or some valuable lessons to be learned from the case in question. This episode falls into the latter category—valuable lessons in genealogical research.

I publish almost everything that crosses my desk pertaining to descendants of the TERRELL variations in TRAILS.

I do this because I never know when some tidbit will benefit one or more readers and because this is the only way I can find it later.

Neither Mrs. Waites, her husband, nor Nancy COOPER Bannister are members of the Society. I do not limit my efforts to help to Society members only. I publish queries from anyone who has some TERRELL information and is seeking more.

- 2. Share your known information through a family society if possible. It will reach more interested people in less time that way. Mrs. Waites shared her information including census data with the Society several years ago. Mrs. Bannister shared her information in the past few months. The names and the area were too similar to overlook the possibility of a relationship.
- 3. Share similar information (my personal line from the same areas) even though it does not appear to be a perfect match. I may not be related to the TERRELL brothers who m. COOPER sisters, but there is a long shot that the lines will connect through one of my distant relatives if not through my immediate line.
- 4. Follow up on new information (Mrs. Waites info & address). I don't know what Mrs. Bannister wrote to Mrs. Waites, but I assume it was the same info that she sent to me which is reproduced above. She received some additional information that may help solve the mystery even if it is not immediate conclusive proof.
- 5. Digest the new information to see what you have learned. In this case, the letter from Mrs. Waites to Mrs. Bannister included the following useful information that she may (or may not) have known.
- A. The former profession of Malburn Dea TERRELL
- B. The cemetery containing the grave of one James TER-RELL
- C. A probable later wife of James TERRELL, Francis R. TERRELL
- D. That James TERRELL may have had other children who may have family Bible or other information that she seeks if she can identify and locate them.
- E. That a researcher seldom finds the proof needed in one or two letters. Many of us don't find it with years of serious research. *DFB*

State of Tennessee Montgomery County Septr. 25th 1798

To the Honourable

The General Assembly of the State of North Carolina

Gentlemen

Having received information that sundry frauds and Misdemeanors have been committed against the Interest of the State of north Carolina by some young men that attended me in the months of August & September last, with Muster Rolls Pay Rolls & papers Otherwise, in Order to Obtain Certificates under my hand for Soldiers which has served in the Continental line of the State aforesaid, I have thought it proper and necessary to write this Letter to your Hon'ble. Body as a Justification to my Character, as an Officer and as a friend to the Citizens & Old Soldiers of North Carolina, and in as concise a manner as possible I mean to explain to you, Gentlemen, the nature and cause of this Business, in which I have not the Smallest Interest or advantage Only as it Ought to become the duty of myself or any Other Officer having knowledge of the Old Soldiers under Our Command, to hear their Complaints, give them Councel & Grant them Certificates, must be a duty of mine (as Senior field Officer in this Country of the Old Continental line) in order to enable them if possible to get something more or less for their faithfull & severe services -

and now in the first place, your Honble Body, will please understand, that William TYRELL a young man with whom I had no previous acquaintance applied to me at Nash Ville (very much as an intruder, however, by the bie) Then and there to examine Rolls and papers, and to Grant him Certificates in favour of Soldiers never yet satisfied for their Services, in any manner whatever (many of them, maney it seems Obtain'd Certificates, to lay before the Commissioners of Army accts from myself & Other Officers having a right to Grant such Certificates, but did not apply for Certificates to Command Warrents from the Secretaries Office for Land in this Country, as they thought it too far off, ever to be of

[second page] of any account to them, and indeed they Often told me when Granting them Certificates, that they cared nothing about Land in the moon, and so by that means, saved me the trouble of wrighting duplicates, thus Gentlemen I give as my Opinion that the Certificates sign'd by me for William TYRELL and Several others are perfectly just and Ought to be attended to at the Secretaries Office, as I do not think it probable that the Certificates have ever issued by the hands of any of the Officers before me.

TYRELL applied to me I asked him how he came to engage himself in this kind of business in favour of the Soldiers his Answer to me was that he had purchased a number of their rights, the he intended to purchase more as many as he cou'd & the residue he hopes, that the Soldiers wou'd allow him something for his trouble in geting the Certifycates from me and the Warrents from the Secretary, very much in like

manner the Other Young men express'd themselves after having as carefully as in my power examined Rolls &c & recollected at my liesure (at times for upwards of a fortnight) I signed those Certificates, and recommended to the young men to be as carefull & just as possible at the Secretaries Office as the Books thereof Ought to be the Checks in case of Other Officers having certified for the same men.

in the whole for these young men I think I issu'd about four Hundred Certificates about that time. A Bennett ROGERS one of the number here aluded to recieved for himself & some Others about two Hundred these were chiefly men of the first & Second Regiments, many of the Rolls have been in my possession ever since the End of the War, many of the men are here in this Country, however, the greater part lives low down in North Carolina, as well as I can recollect within two years I have signed upwards of Six Hundred Certificates at different

[third page] times, some for Junr. Officers that had left the Army before the war was ended, & had neglected making application till they met with me in this Country, There are maney soldiers here belonging to the different Regiments respectively, as I have some time since signifed by letters to your Govr. & Secretary of State, these were discharged at different periods as they had Served Out the respective terms of their enlistments, maney of these in Order to avoid Millitia duty came off to the Mountains & Holston & then to this Country, without having applied for payment, or Emolement, of any kind, I find difficulty in Granting Certificates to many of their Heirs &c, as they were at Bryer Creek defeat where all Rolls & Papers were lost, reletive to their term of Service, also many of the Rolls were Burnt by Colo. THACKSTON, when he got mad at the frequent applications made to him, he tho'd a Small Trunk with them his private papers Bonds & all into the fire, these men eluded, to were the fourth & Sixth Regiments.

Indeed I cou'd wish that your Hon'ble Body in your wisdom cou'd find a mode of relieving me from the attacks of these men not satisfied, some of them are very impertenant impeaching myself & Other Officers as [well?] with having promised that which we never have been able to perform infavour of the public Service, indeed my Rank in the Army & activity, almost throughout the War, both in the Northern & Southern Armey, gave me so General an Acquaintance with the Solders that I have abundantly more trouble with them thier Heirs, & Speculators, than I am well able to bear.

As there is every reason to believe that a number of Certificates handed forward to the Office to Obtain Warrents are Counterfeits forged by some of these dextrous hands, I wou'd beg leave to recommend to your Hon'ble Body, to appoint Some of your Old friends as Commissioners to examine all those Certificates General RUTHERFORD & Majr. David WILLSON [illegible] some of your Old friends & members, these Gentlemen with Judge TATUM, Majr. Anthoney SHARP & some other officers with myself cou'd view these Certificates we are all in this Country and cou'd in two or three days set them all right & afterwards return them to the Office in Order that Warrents might issue. thus Gentlemen I exonerate myself, and have the Honor to be with good integrity

There are Certainly four or five Hundred Soldiers or their Heirs never yet Satisfied for their Services, as may appear by the last General returns when compair'd with the office Books. I mean exclusive of the Certificates which I issued within this two years, where these Soldiers, or their Heirs are Generally I cannot tell, I am infomred that last General Assembly apprehended as many as Thirty, Guilty of frauds, if I mistake not there are three times thirty in north Cara. & Tennessee, equally Guilty with these thirty.

For want of room I have not express'd myself full enough But would beg here to Observe, that there are Ten or a dozen Old Officers in this Country, which serv'd throughout the War & are well acquainted with the names of the Soldiers, having had them so Often call's, can remember them as well as myself so that those Certificates being light carriage cou'd easily come forward and be sent Back after examination. I have thought that a Letter from the Speaker, or a proclamationa from the Governor, forwarded to some Gentleman here might produce some good consequences. this letter of Proclamation expressing fully the Sence of your Hon'ble Body relitive to the Soldiers in this Country not Satisfied & thereby relieve

Mr. Allen also sent us a copy of a GEDCOM file covering all of the descendants of this **John TERRELL** that are in his database. In addition to giving the Society permission to use the GEDCOM file as we see fit, he also offered to provide a copy for anyone for the current cost of diskette, mailer, and postage, which he estimates to be \$1.50.

INTRODUCTION

As I understand, this will was misplaced at the North Carolina Archives during the middle part of this century. **Emma DICKEN**, for example did not have it available when she was researching and writing her *TERRELL GENEALOGY*.

The will names two children, Joel & Timothy that Miss Dicken did not have in her book as listed on pages 261-265. Timothy apparently deceased prior to the date of this will. Miss DICKEN listed Joel and some of his descendants in her book, but she was unable to connect him to any parents. She provided a lot of data on the Virginia and North Carolina TERRELLs. This source record makes one more connection and ties up a few loose ends.

I have looked at a fair amount of 18th century script, but I must admit that this will was a challenge. I put ??? wherever I couldn't make out the word or letter. I think I got the major items, names of children, etc. correct. I would appreciate correction of any errors the reader may find. I have also separated each ITEM of bequest in an effort to make the document more readable. I have not changed any spellings or added any punctuation. James M. Will of John Terrell of Franklin County, North Carolina Dated 20 September 1783

In the name of God amen I John Terrell of the County of Franklin in the State of North Carolina being somewhat in Disposed in body but of perfect sence & Memory thanks be to God for his Mercies but knowing the frailty of human nature & that it is Decreed that all men must surely die do make & ordain this my last will & testament as followeth that I give & bequeath my soul to God who gave it & my body to the Earth to be Decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors & as to my worldly Estate

I give and bequeath to my reputed wife Elizabeth who is called & known by the name of Elizabeth Terrell with whom I have Cohabited ???? ????? [ever since?] my furni-

ture I desire is then provided 5 Negro slaves towit Mingo big Jack old Saul Lidia & Willy also my Mill on Sandy Creek & all my household Furniture & such of my stock as she may think fit during her life & after her Decease to be Disposed of as hereafter shall be Decreed.

ITEM I Give & bequeath to my reputed Daughter Loruhimah born of the body of Elizabeth Harrison aforesaid reputed wife the Four Negro slaves towit Mourning Phebe Patch & after her mother's Death old Sal together with the said Negros increase

ITEM I give & bequeath to my reputed son Jeptha called & known by the name of Jeptha Terrell born of the body of the aforesaid Elizabeth the labour of the 5 negro slaves following During his life & after his decease to his children as he shall think proper to them & their heirs forever towit Sare & her child & their increase James & little Jack & after his mother Deceases big Jack

ITEM I give & bequeath to my reputed Daughter Anne born of the body of the afsd Elizabeth the 4 following Negro slaves towit Judy & her Child little Amy old Amys Child & little Jenny Lidias child together their increase to her & her heirs For Ever

ITEM I give & bequeath to my reputed son Joel born of the body of the aforesaid Elizabeth 7 Negro slaves towit Bob Sam Old Amys Child Amy old Sals child little Saul Peter & Priscila Sabina Lidias Children & after his mother's Death Lady I also Give him the plantation & tract of Land whereon I now live together with another tract adjoining thereto to Him & his Heirs & assigns for ever.

ITEM I give & bequeath to my Reputed son Timothys children called & known in his lifetime by the Name of Timothy Terrell born of the body of the aforesaid Elizabeth the 4 following Negro slaves towit Andi Buck & his increase Nat & after their grandmothers Decease Willy & his increase to be Equally divided among them as they come of age that is the boys to the age of 21 & the girls to the age of 18 It is also my will & Desire that the widow of my reputed Son Timothy shall have a childs part during her life that such part shall return to the children of said Timothy & be Equally Divided among them.

ITEM I give & bequeath to my reputed son Johns children who was called & known in his Lifetime by the name of John Terrell begotten of the body of the aforesaid Elizabeth as followeth to his daugher Elizabeth one Negro Slave old Amy to her and her heirs for ever. To his son Richmond one negro Girl Lucie to him & his heirs for ever.

To his daughter Susannah one negro boy Will to her & her heirs forever I also give & bequeath to my reputed son Johns Children above mentioned the value of One Good negro to be Equally Divided among them

& lastly my will & desire is that all & every part of my Estate which I have not herein before particularly mentioned & disposed of in Legacies together with my Mill on Sandy Creek before mentioned be divided [thrown?] into 6 Equal totts [lotts?] & Equally Divided by Drawing for the same by my 4 reputed Children towit Jeptha Joel Lorihuma & Anne aforesaid & the Orphans of the two Deceased John & Timothy & whoever receives the Mill is not to have his part till the Death of their Mother or Grand Mother as the case may happen. I hereby Nominate & appoint Jeptha Terrell & Joel Terrell & Jenkins Devaney Executors of this my last will & testament hereby revoking all other Wills heretofore made or Executed. In witness Whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand & seal this 20 Day of Septm. 1783 cs.



EDITOR'S NOTE: At the risk of incurring the wrath of descendants who have read otherwise & sincerely believe they know better, I must voice the opinion that the name of John's oldest (or at least first named) daughter was Lorihannah. This conclusion was reached by careful comparison of the handwriting in this will, especially comparing this name with Susannah who witnessed the will. The name of the daughter appears first ending in "h" and later without the "h." Miss DICKEN published her name as Lohamar, b. about 1730 m. Jacob BLEDSOE. We do not know the origin of her list of children for John & Elizabeth. In addition to missing Joel & Timothy as she did not have a copy of this will. She inserted Hezekiah b. about 1732, d. about 1767 m. Phoebe MARTIN & Agnes b. about 1739 m. Robert WASHINGTON. We don't have space in this issue to quote DICKEN fully but I will try to do so in a future issue in light of information gleaned from this will. DFB
