ENCYCLOPEDIA PROJECT

The increase in space in Terrell Trails devoted to e-mail and web addresses is not an act of deserting our members who do not have computers with modems. It is an effort to link as many descendants as possible and to provide you with as many electronic research locations as possible.

Even if you do not have a computer, there is probably one hooked to the Internet at a nearby library. As a library patron, you can take Terrell Trails with you and ask for assistance in learning to search the various sources listed. Your library might allow you to set up a temporary e-mail box on their system so that you can send e-mail to others and receive their replies. Even if they won't allow you to have e-mail access, they can show you how to print what you find to diskette. Once the information you locate is on diskette, you can either print it out and take it home with you (usually for a per page fee) and/or send an electronic copy of the information to the TERRELL SOCIETY via the link on our web page as an attachment to an e-mail message.

One of the original goals of the TERRELL SOCIETY OF AMERICA, INC. is to locate, store, and distribute as much information about the various TERRELLS (including all variations) who came to America as possible.

An Encyclopedia of American TERRELLS including information gleaned from previous works and adding as much new information as we can, resolving as many conflicts as possible, documenting as many events as possible, & publishing as many pictures as practical; has been on the back burner since 1984.

The officers have decided to start this project, at least electronically. We don't have the funds to print such a work and distribute it in book form. Unless we come up with some way of attracting more than our average of 150 paying members at a time, we never will. Since those with the

surname (including all variations) number less than one-half of one percent of the populace, we are not likely to attract enough purchasers outside the Society to provide the revenue to publish such a work.

The officers are considering purchasing a new computer with a massive hard drive to store this information. (The 516MB HD that is in my computer is almost filled to capacity.) This new computer will have a HD that is 5 to 26 times that size, depending upon the best deal we can get with the money available.

We are also looking into the possibility of putting this computer onto the Internet. However, we are going to have to either attract a large sum in donations from those who visit our web site, or set up access levels based upon annual dues specifically for web access. Our curent annual income is not sufficient to put a computer on the web and keep it there 24 hours per day for a year, even if we stop publishing TRAILS and doing most of our other correspondence.

You can assist us with this project in several ways.

- 1. You can send us copies of family group sheets on your TERRELL ancestors and descendants that are not included in previously published works such as those in the LENDING LIBRARY. We especially need information on the generations between the 1920 census blackout and the present.
- 2. You can send us photocopies (or typed excerpts that include all names, and complete source information book, page, & location of the original record) of everything you come across that mentions any variation of TERRELL. This can include anything from court house records to daily newspapers. Newspaper clippings should include name, date, and page of publication. Copies of pages from books should include a copy of the Title page complete with copyright and ISBN number.

Paper copies of 1 & 2 above should be sent to the Cairo, GA address. Electronic text copies may be either attached to e-mail via the link on our web page or sent as an attachment to your regular e-mail if your system supports attachments. Until we get the new computer in operation, we do not have storage space for scanned pages in .bmp, .gif, .TIf, and other graphic formats. Please do not send these unless specifically requested to do so.

3. I refuse to turn TRAILS into a Baptist (no offense, I'm one) Begging Journal. We realize many of our members are elderly and on fixed incomes that make it difficult for them

maintain their membership, much less contribute to special projects. We appreciate their loyalty and are proud of each one.

Want ancestors & siblings of Jepthae TERRELL b. 09//1769 VA?; d. at Champaign Co OH 12//1817; and his spouse Sarah BARNES b. 06//1773 VA?, d. Champaign Co. OH 1840-1850; m. c1790 VA?. According to tombstone, parents were Matthew & Mary TERREL. Arrive Champaign Co. about 1811. #396 Kathryn Cox; 7920 San Felipe Blvd #2017; Austin TX 78729-7905

I am still searching for info on my great grandfather, James M. "Dock" TERRELL. Some years ago you wrote me about Doctor Hilton TERRELL. After some research I figured out he is not my great grandfather. I thought James might be the second son of Wyatt Monroe TERRELL in Lauderdale Cty, Ala. But the age would not work out right.

I know he was killed in a logging accident in Calhoun County and died in Pontotoc County MS, in 1881. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge in Sarepta, MS.

I found in the 1860 census in Pontotoc County, a James age 15 (census lists birth as Ala) living with Martha M. TER-RELL age 42. They are living with the O'HARE family. On the farm next door John T. TERRELL is living on the BASS Farm with his wife Mary and their daughter Martha age 1. James later marries Francis Elizabeth BASS in Feb. of 1865.

In the Lafayette County, MS 1850 census I found a Wm. G. TERRELL (census lists Va., as birth place) married to a Martha TERRELL, with twins John and Mary. No James is listed. There is a Mary TERRELL that marries a Simon SCREWS [CREWS?] in Feb 1866 in Pontotoc County.

Editor's Note: I assume you have read the LIBRARY selection Terrells in Alabama County Records, but just in case, here are a few tidbits.

Page 6: Lauderdale Co. AL, M.B. 5, p. 409; Wyatt Monroe TERRELL m. Catherine BRYANT 08/31/1848 by J. BIGGER J.P.

Page 6: Probate Minutes Book A 1852-1853, p 210; Calvin TERRELL admr. of Alfred THREATT, dec'd filed petition to sell land; heirs included his wife, "Martha TERRELL" etc. *Ibid* on page 244, she is listed as "Matilda TERRELL and husband Calvin TERRELL."

Page 5: Probate Minutes Book A 1850-1855,p. 507: Calvin TERRELL (age 38, b. SC m. 1835 Matilda THREET) is appointed guardian of his six children. Seven are listed with commas between all names. There is a John age 12, but no James.

Page 6: Wills & Estates Book 1821-1840, p. 346 Heirs of Joseph TERRELL: widow, Tabitha HILTON Terrell: Ransom HOWELL in right of wife Eliza nee TERRELL; Darthney TERRELL ca20; Manerva TERRELL ca18; Silas TERRELL ca17; Richmond B TERRELL ca15; West Maddox TERRELL ca12; William Carroll TERRELL ca10; Joseph Calhoun TERRELL ca8; Doctor Hilton TERRELL ca7; James Bear TERRELL ca7; Andrew Jackson TERRELL ca6mos; & George W. TERRELL ca13 (for whom) "he acted as guardian, in addition to the minor heirs ofsaid deceast." Recorded 02/01/1838

Page 9: Joseph & Tabitha TERRELL had a son 2 years younger than Doctor Hilton TERRELL, (age 14 on 1850 Lauderdale Co. Census) named James aka James Bear TERRELL. On the next farm, Monroe TERRELL and wife Catherine, had son James age 1 in 1850. [This is evidently Wyatt Monroe and Catherine BRYANT TERRELL and the son listed would be 10-11 in 1860. Census ages fluctuated from census to census. An 11 year old boy might pass for 15. However if this is the same, Catherine must have died and either Monroe remarried, or James is living with a relative. At least one thing is clear, Wyatt Monroe TERRELL was not a son of Joseph & Tabitha TERRELL.]

DICKEN lists: p. 198, James Milton TERRELL b. 1811 s/o Capt John TERRELL & Abigail ALLEN who m. Clark Co. KY 1797; had brother Dr. John Harrison TERRELL b.1801; p. 206, he m. Emaline HOLLIS 08/05/1836, d. at North Madison, IN about 1839, left 3 daus, one d/y; no sons. p 237 James Martin TERRELL b. ca1810-20 s/o Archibald TERRELL & "a Miss MARTIN of a wealthy NC family." Archibald TERRELL (12/05/1774—07/14/1824) was a merchant, planter, and cotton buyer in Natchez MS. His wife d. between 1821 & 1824. Children were orphaned at a young age. DICKEN does not trace the family.

p 268 James Madison TERRELL b. 06/11/1817 Wake Co. SC; s/o Solomon TERRELL and second wife Nancy WALL m. 1851 Martha A. WIGGINS. No further info listed.

p. 270 James Macon TERRELL b. 07/22/1842; killed at battle of Gettysburg

p 273 James Maxwell TERRELL (11/05/1829—01//1891) b. NC, was a lawyer, married (doen't say whom), had a son Joel and others.

Of the above, James Martin TERRELL is nearest geographically to your James M. Dock TERRELL. The TERRELL AND CARRUTH GENEALOGY by John H. PARKER also lists this line. Page 14, he says Archibald TERRELL m. Nancy MARTIN of Red River VA. Children: James Martin TERRELL; Virginia Ann Courtney TERRELL m. 07/23/1828 Ferdinand L. CLAIBORNE, Jr; Frances Elizabeth TERRELL m. Henry S. DAWSON; Julia Louise TERRELL d. 11//1878 m. Dangerfield SMITH; & Matilda TERRELL d/y.

Archibald TERRELL is listed as son of Micajah TER-RELL & Hannah GOODMAN; grandson of Timothy TERRELL & Mary MARTIN. Sources cited on page 15 include: Claiborne's History of Mississippi p. 175, 283; TERRELL GENEALOGY by Emma DICKEN p. 236-246; Adams County MS court records; Amite County MS court records; N. C.Dept A. & H. Army Accounts Vol I, pp. 23, 27, 128; Canceled Vouchers 3957, 4597 Wilmington Dist. Mil. Records; Research of Mr. Milton J. HARPER, Vicksburg MS.

Family is repeated on page 27, but no additional details are given on **James Martin TERRELL**. The same applies to the citation below.

On page 73, PARKER muddies the water by printing TERRELL FAMILY RECORD by Grace TERRELL Talbert, Liberty MS [m. TALBERT in 1912]. She begins with one James TERRELL [brother of Archibald] and gives him as a second wife, Nancy MARTIN of Red River VA [Wife of Archibald]. This page continues the muddling by listing as the children of James TERRELL not only the children of Archibald TERRELL, but by adding the TERRELL surname to their husbands. She ignored the children of this James TERRELL & his second wife Amanda EDWARDS listed on page 14: Betty TERRELL b. Edwards, MS 10/28/1829 m. J. S. BYRNS; Sally TERRELL; & James TERRELL, Jr. except as cited below.

The next paragraph continues with "Later a James TER-RELL was born 02/28/1806. [nephew of Archibald, son of his brother James above; his birth date is contemporary to that of Archibald's children. She lists 5 boys and 5 girls born between 1831 and 1850. The eldest, John N. TERRELL was her great grandfather. She continues for 3 pages with his descendants. Unfortunately, after the contradictions in the first paragraph, we don't know how much credence to give to it.

I haven't found anything to prove the parentage of your **James M. "Dock" TERRELL**. Maybe you will get lucky and something in this mass confusion will be the lead you need. *DFB*

Thanks for the address, will get a check in the mail in a day or two. Do not know about William WILKINSS as a connection. So far my search has been a deadend! My maternal grandmother's father was "Mat" TERRELL and the only thing I know is he died in 1884 when grandma was three months old. She was born in Ninekah (Grady County) Okla Indian Terr. The only other Mathew TERRELL I have found was born about 1833/34 in Ohio, this from the Ohio 1850 census and know nothing else about him. One uncle thinks "Mat" was in the U.S. Army. Zena m Daniel Edwin LYON (my grandparents) the book says they are cousins. They were 3rd cousins. Their children were: Baby girl LYON, buried St. Stephens Cem. Louisville, KY 1909, d at birth; Rosina Elizabeth, Harry Austin (not Harrison), Herbert and Margurite Terrell LYON (Margurite, my mother) I do have birth, death cert's and personal knowledge of these children.

Nancy Whittaker TERRELL Lyon died in Ojai, CA. not Ventura. Zena & Daniel LYON both died in Ventura, CA. Nancy, Zena & Daniel are buried in our family plot in Ojai, CA

Minnie Carl LYON also d in Ventura, Ca and is buried at Ivy Lawn Cemetery, Ventura, CA.

How can I get the information in the Terrell Genealogy book corrected? I would appreciate your thoughts on this.

I read in the Terrell book a picture was taken of **Zachariah TERRELL** of Mt. Eden, KY. Have you any idea who would have a copy that they would share with me? I would be happy to pay all copy and postage costs. I would be happy to share my family pictures with anyone that is interested.

I am looking for any information on my great grandfather Louis Abraham BOISVERT/AKA GREENWOOD b. 9/18/1877 unknown d.4/9/1942 Nashua NH. He married Hilma Garrison TERRELL in 1925 Abington, MA. I am really looking for info pertaining to his parents Abraham BOISVERT/GREENWOOD & Exilda RODIER. All that is known is that they came from Quebec and were probably Abenaki. I can't trace my family generations back far enough to check the records at Wolinak and Odanak.

I am also looking for parental info on Alphonse Joseph GAGNON b.1/21/1895 Trois-Rivieres,PQ d.19? Nashua NH. He married Maria Zoe GENDRON in 1913 Nashua NH. His parents were Athanase GAGNON & Marie BOUCHER. Also Abenaki blood believed from this side of the family. Thanks in advance for any help!

For a long time I have been searching to find who exactly my Cherokee ancestor is. I know it must be from this side of the family so here goes: Hilma Garrison TER-RELL/TIRRELL b.11/12/1886 Abington MA d.1975 Salisbury MA. Married Louis BOISVERT/GREEN-WOOD 1925 Abington MA. She was the daughter of Albert TERRELL b. 1/27/1861? d. 2/24/25 Weymouth MA. He was the son of Amerigus Vespucius TERRELL and an unidentified woman. He married Mary Sophia COCKER-HAM/CORKERHAM b.8/16/1861 Summit MS d.2/11/21 Abington MA. She was the daughter of Andrew J. COCK-ERHAM/CORKERHAM & Sara Jane FIESHLEY.

That is as far as I am able to go back. I do know that the TERRELLs owned a plantation called *The Quarter* in Suffolk Co, NC up until 1835. All the TERRELLs in my family descend from a William TIRRELL who landed in Weymouth MA 1634 and founded the town of Abington. He then moved down to North Carolina. His sons were Indian traders, maybe that's where the connection lies but I am unable to go back that far. Mary COCKERHAM/CORKERHAM is a mystery. The family says that she just appeared in Abington one day which seems to be quite a ways from MS. I cant find the FIESHLEY surname anywhere. Thanks again in advance for any help or advice offered!!

Terrell Trails, page 538: Americus V TIRRELL Plymouth Co MA 195 Abington 1850 U S Census. This is the only reference I found to anyone named above. *DFB*

I just visited the index websites on the TERRELL name. I am "very" interested in the WINGFIELD, BUTLER, TERRELLS of VA & GA and found many article references to these connections. My line of research involves the STAMP(L)ER and all variations in VA & GA. There are two records involving the BUTLER & WINGFIELD name in connection with Powell & Mary (Polly) STAMP(L)ER. From my research, I've found that the WINGFIELDS, BUTLERS & TERRELLS were all neighbors Thus, my focus as to how they connect with the STAMPERS.

Monroe Co., GA; Deed Bk. B pg. 6 GA, Wilkes Co., 19 Oct 1822 Polly STAMPER widow of Wilkes Co. to John CHANDLER of Augusta GA, Richmond Co., for \$144 being pd in one horse and waggon at \$125 and taking the plat and grant out of the office which was \$19, 202A in Monroe Co. on water of Ichocans Creek #36 11th Dist. Polly STAMPER X(SEAL). Wit: Mary WINGFIELD, John B. LENNARD, JIC, Rec. 11 Sept. 1823.

Powell STAMPLER, Jr. to Powell STAMPLER Sr. Indenture 28 Feb, 1800, Justices of the Inferior Court bind Powell STAMPLER, Jun. orphan to Powell STAMPLER, Sen. until Powell STAMPLER Jun. is age 21. He is to be taught to be a scholar, [s] Pwell STAMPLER, Edward BUTLER, Danl. PRICE and John POPEL.(could be POPE but have not found) [Don't jump to the conclusion that a son was being bound to his father. If his father was alive, he was not an orphan. Do not jump to the conclusion that "Jr's" father was also named Powell STAMPLER. In this era, "Jr, Jun" and "Sr, Sen" were used merely to distinguish between older and younger persons of the same name. It did not indicate the blood relationship that we attach to them today. The "Sr." in this case could have been either grandfather, uncle, cousin, or no blood relation although the latter is unlikely with a surname this rare.]

Gone to Georgia by William C. Stewart: In 1782, Edward BUTLER and John WINGFIELD were next door neighbors in Hanover County, VA., with large families and many slaves. In 1785, Edward (absentee) was taxed in McCain's district of Wilkes County, Ga., along with the TERRELLS and WINGFIELDS and in subsequent years he purchased large tracts of land. Edward BUTLER's Wilkes County will (Book HH, p. 17, Dec/ 8. 1809/March 3, 1810) referred to his late mother Susannah of Hanover County, her 1770 will, his wife Elizabeth and children: John W. BUTLER, Elizabeth BUTLER Wingfield, Kitty G. BUTLER Terrell, Frances BUTLER Terrell, Nancy BUTLER, Zachariah BUTLER, David BUTLER & Lucy BUTLER; his 1000-acre tract in Jackson, formerly Franklin County, to be left to the daughters.

No other children are mentioned. Unfortunately I do not have the author or date of this publication - but believe it is a history of Amite Co.[MS]

James Landrum TERRELL - Feb 10, 1821 - Dec. 2, 1897 Alice TERRELL Brownfield - May 13, 1848 - March 16, 1923 [?daughter of James Landrum TERRELL]

Amanda Jane TERRELL wife of Rufus M. FARMER - Oct. 17, 1845 - June 1, 1935 [?daughter of James TER-RELL]

Mary R. [TERRELL] daughter of Hiram & Isabella TERRELL, consort of B. F. FORD, born June 29, 1828 died July 16, 1855 aged 27 years 17 d's.

Ann MORGAN Terrell - 23 Dec. 1827 - 27 Jul 1857 (consort of Josiah M. TERRELL)

Eliz. MORGAN Terrell - 18 Dec. 1825 - ? [Birth date is about right to be the person listed as Elizabeth TERRELL in the household of Josiah M. TERRELL in 1850. Questions—was she Elizabeth MORGAN and erroneously listed as TERRELL, or had she married another TERRELL prior to 1850? If she was still a MORGAN, did she marry Josiah

after 1860?]

Josiah Martin TERRELL - 14 Feb. 1818 - 20 Sept. 1883 Mary M. Terrell - 14 Nov. 1822 - 8 Dec. 1903 (wife of James L. Terrell)

Martha Elizabeth Terrell - 22 Nov. 1843 - 13 Apr. 1900 [Birth date about right to be daughter of James Landrum TERRELL]

I've located no will for Hiram, but the Pike Co. MS courthouse burned in the late 1800's and no records are available that far back - also have not located his burial place.

Family history states that Isobell moved to Texas with either her son, James Landrum TERRELL or her grandson, James Irvin (Ervin) TERRELL where it is believed she died in 1869 and is buried near Belton, Texas. This information I received from a cousin Deloris WYNNE Riley of San Antonio who is descended through Josiah and Ann's daughter, Mary Elizabeth "Molly" TERRELL Wynne, sister to my two great grandmothers - Nancy Isobell Emelie TERRELL Wynne and Louisa Lenora TERRELL Edwards. Molly was born in MS, the other two in LA.

Family records state that Josiah had 3 brothers who served in the Confederate Army (Deloris has documentation): William "Bill" Harrison TERRELL, Thomas W. TERRELL, David W. "Dave" TERRELL. (However, obit states that James Landrum TERRELL was also in CSA) With this information along with census data - Hiram & Isobell TERRELL would have had the following 9 children (not necessarily in birth order):

- 1. William Harrison TERRELL
- 2. Thomas W. TERRELL
- 3. David W. TERRELL
- 4. Hiram TERRELL
- 5. Martha Elizabeth TERRELLm. Joshua FORD
- 6. Mary R. TERRELL m. Benjamin FORD
- 7. Josiah Martin TERRELL
- 8. James Landrum TERRELL
- 9. Lewis TERRELL

This is the data plus a history written by Orvilla WYNNE Moore, daughter of Nancy Isobell Emelie TERRELL Wynne and granddaughter of Josiah Martin TERRELL on which I base Josiah's parentage. Please correct me if I am mistaken in this theory.

GENEALOGY? ASK DAN!

Q. I was wondering if anyone has traced the line of James TERRELL, son of William TERRELL & Susannah WATERS. James married Mary WATKINS and had William (born in Caroline County), Dudley, & James. I'm a member of the Terrell Society now, but I'm wondering if this line has been printed or discussed in the past?

I'm still trying to connect my James TERRELL (Terrell chairmaker) in Caswell County, North Carolina to Virginia Terrells. I was told that this James may be a possibility.

A. I'm not aware of anything being published on this family, so I'll try to answer your question.

DICKEN's Terrell Genealogy, page 72-73 speculates that James TERRELL, b. ca1700-05, s/o William & Susannah TERRELL d. before April court 1772 in Caroline Co. VA when Roger QUARLES, Wm. TYLER, Robert TOMPKINS, & John CHILES were selected for any two of them to settle and divide the estate of James TERRELL, deceased (O.B. 1770-1772, p. 430).

Earlier, 03/10/1764, James TERRELL & Margaret, his wife, of Caroline Co. VA were complainants against John ALMON, executor of the estate of John WATKINS. By consent of the parties, and by order of the Caroline Court, 2 men were appointed to arbitrate and settle the matter. They made their report to the court on 05/07/1764, and stated that they had examined into the personal estate whereof John WATKINS died possessed of, as also the produce since his death while in the custody of Mary WATKINS. They appraised the personal estate and awarded James TERRELL one-fourth part; he having agreed to abide by their decision(O. B. 1764-1765, p. 226). [In that day, it was

customary for a man to inherit his wife's part of her father's estate. This tends to indicate that James' wife, Margaret {not Mary} was daughter of John WATKINS and that Mary WATKINS was probably her mother or maybe her sister. There isn't enough information here to draw a firm conclusion.]

DICKEN continues that on 05/14/1772, an account of William WATKINS administration of the estate of Margaret TERRELL was approved by the court, and ordered recorded. [This indicates that she died shortly after James, and either had an estate of her own or her portion of the estate of James was divided among the heirs. The latter is probable since James apparently acquired her share of the estate of John WATKINS. The relationship of William WATKINS is not stated, but due to the custom of the day it is likely that he was Margaret's brother.]

On 09/12/1776, a settlement and division of the estate of James TERRELL was ordered recorded (O. B. 1776, p. 628).

DICKEN admitted that she did not find any record of who shared in the estate of James TERRELL, but "it seems probable that he had sons: William TERRELL; Dudley TERRELL; & James TERRELL, and perhaps others." [Unfortunately, DICKEN didn't leave us the crystal ball she used to arrive at that conclusion.] She stated that James & Dudley TERRELL were listed in tax records as living together and paying 2 tithes in 1789.

TERRELL in Caroline [Co. VA] who must have been a generation younger than the James who d. 1772. It appears from the tax records that he d. about 1793. Part of his land went to Judith, who was probably his wife, and to James TERRELL & Dudley TERRELL. [If DICKEN is correct in that statement, we now have 3 James TERRELLs of Caroline Co. VA: one d. 1772; one d. 1793; and a third also of unproven origin still alive in 1793 sharing the estate with Judith and Dudley. If your James, chairmaker of NC, was from this area, he would have had to be the latter.]

In 1800, Dudley sold his land to James, which in 1805 he had disposed of, and it appears that he may have left the county for a while. Also in 1800, Judith, seemingly the widow of James, had died and her land reverted to James TERRELL's estate.

Susannah TERRELL, d/o James TERRELL who d. 1793 m. George THOMAS. She and her husband petitioned the court to equally divide the land, her younger brothers and

sisters not being of age. A report was made to the court in 1805, with plots of land, showing each child's part.

Children named were:

- 1. Mrs. Susannah TERRELL Thomas
- 2. Elizabeth TERRELL
- 3. Mary or Polly TERRELL
- 4. Ann or Nancy TERRELL
- 5. William TERRELL
- 6. John TERRELL

On 05/14/1801, in St. Margaret's Parish, Caroline Co. VA, William TERRELL, orphan of James TERRELL was bound to Matthew CAMPBELL (O.B. 1779-1801, p 266).

At January court 1802, Nancy & John TERRELL orphans of James TERRELL deceased, were bound to Jesse TERRELL according to law (O. B. 1799-1802, pp. 266, 434).

Caroline Order Book, 1802, p. 485, May Court, 1802 recorded that George TERRELL and two others named were to state and settle the executorship account rendered by James JONES and Nathan WINSTON of the estate of James TERRELL, deceased, and report.

It is supposed that Elizabeth TERRELL was of marriagable age and the same amount of land that was awarded her in 1805 was the following year assessed to Thomas MOORMAN from James TERRELL's estate. On 12/23/1804 a Thomas MOORMAN & Elizabeth H. TERRELL were married in Campbell Co VA, but DICKEN did not find proof that she was the same Elizabeth.

The marriage records of Caroline Co. VA show the marriage of [one] Polly TERRELL to [one] James JONES 09/14/1807. [If these were the same Polly TERRELL who was underage when petition was made to divide the estate, and this was the same James JONES who helped settle her father's estate, the was a lot of difference in their ages.]

John TERRELL [son of James who d. 1793] sold his land about 1815. His brother, William TERRELL sold his land about 1829-1830 according to DICKEN.

DICKEN, p. 75, tells of Texas TERRELLS who claim to have descended from William and Susannah TERRELL though one James TERRELL who sired Philemon TERRELL, and "he thought" 2 others named James & Edward. There appears to have been at least 2 generations of Philemon in that family. The earlier Philemon served in the Revolution. The family claimed to have silver knee buckles with the initials "J. T." that were worn by their ancestor, James TERRELL. This branch included Charles Vernon

TERRELL who wrote our Lending Library selection, #145, TERRELLS OF TEXAS, 85 YEARS INDIANS TO THE ATOMIC BOMB.

DICKEN rambles on through "four brothers, Peter, Dudley, William, & John Pleasant TERRELL" of Campbell Co. VA. She did not find record of their parents and was not sure they were descendants of James TERRELL, but they all married in that county apparently between 1799 & 1816.

In short, DICKEN raised far more questions in Virginia than she answered. I sincerely hope that one day we will have the bits and pieces entered into a computer where we can sort them by date and location. Maybe we will be able to determine whom is most likely to have descended from whom, but that day has not arrived.

TERRELL, Thomas; Mr; (//10/08/1781-) son of Joel & Sarah Elizabeth OXFORD T.; will proved 10/08/1781; md. TERRELL, Timothy; Mr; Augusta County Court; May 1768; Purviance * vs. Timothy TERRELL; 12/28/1767. * Purviance is probably a colonial English spelling of the modern term purveyance which stems from English law that gave royalty the right of buying up provisions without the owner's consent, ie, since this was prior to the revolution, either a member of royalty or his representative in the colony of Virginia had tried to buy something from this Timothy TERRELL against his wishes and without his consent. This action parallels the act of condemning private property for public use today, except that it usually involved personal property such as cattle and crops rather than real estate. DFB)
