RELL (William's brother), John HUBBARD, Joseph BUTLER, and Nicholas STONE in April 1739. Although no purpose for the land is stated, it is known that those listed as purchasers were members of the Religious Society of Friends. The date corresponds to the foundation of the Golansville Meeting of the Society of Friends.

The Golansville Meeting was "laid down" 1853, the group no longer having sufficient strength to continue. For more information, please refer to the current issue of *Tidewater Virginia Families*.

I am contacting you now because of an action that is now before the courts and other civil authorities. The meeting house site, and one acre of adjoining ground which was donated by John BURRUSS in 1739, eventually became part of a 23-acre tract through transactions that cannot be traced because of loss of County records. That tract, located at the Southwest corner of US Route 1 and County Route 601, was acquired in 1996 by a man named Juan YOUNG. Mr. YOUNG intends to use the site for a car wash and has action before the zoning commission to get permission to do this. He had already started the clearing the land of junk and vegetation when the Sheriff was called to stop the destruction of the graves in violation of State law.

Because Mr. Young seems to have allies on the County Commission and the Zoning Board, it is felt that he will get the zoning code he wants, and that it is only a matter of time before he succeeds in clearing the last vestiges of this historically significant site. The church foundation and land are not protected by the same law as the cemetery).

Although the Quakers had religious beliefs which caused them to leave their graves unmarked by engraved stones, there one such stone in the burying ground. It marks the grave Henry Terrell LUCK, March 30, 1893. Another marks the "laying down" of the meeting and inscribed "S B Terrell — 1860." Other Terrells are known to be buried here, with exact location of the graves probably forever in doubt.

It would appear that the historic site of the meeting house can be preserved only by ownership of the property by a "friendly" party. Even the burying ground will be in peril some day when watchful eyes are not on guard.

The whole tract of 23 acres had a price of some \$70,000 in 1996, so is probably out of reach of any reasonable person, however noble. No one (incredibly) has approached Mr. Young with an offer for the 1-acre burying ground and additional acre or so for the meeting house site. Do you know of any person or organization to step up to this duty?

I've learned that my ancestor in Liberty Co, GA was **Richmond TERRELL**, brother of **Philemon**, who died there c 1826. Who is the Richmond who lived with his son Richmond in Newton Co, GA 1840 Census? I've also run across several Richmond Terrells in VA. Can you help? **Elaine Steere c21highctry@SkyBest.Com**

*Editor's Note:* In *Terrell Genealogy* by **Emma DICKEN**, pages 75-76, she says that, "A Mr. **Philemon TERRELL**, who it seems moved from Robeson [Lumberton] County NC to Liberty County GA thence to MS, left descendants living in Texas who claim descent from **James TERRELL**, son of **William & Susannah**." She continues that there appears to have been a Philemon in two or three generations of that family—at least one who moved from NC to GA and another who moved from GA to MS.

TERRELLS are notorious for perpetuating names from generation to generation. It is worthy of note that no **Richmond** was listed in the known descendants of either **Philemon** discovered by DICKEN.

DICKEN states "Besides Philemon TERRELL, there was a Richmond TERRELL in Robeson County NC named in the 1790 census. He had one son under 16 years of age and 4 females in the family including his wife. Living in the same county suggests that Philemon and Richmond **may have been brothers, or at least related**. There was also a **Robert TERRELL** in Bladen that we failed to connect to the other TERRELLS." She says that there was a **Richmond TERRELL**, Revolutionary Soldier number 60 in **Thomas CLARK**'s company, but nothing to indicate what county he was from.

*Annals of Georgia*, page 94 gave, "Liberty County Connections in SC," from Probate Records in Charleston, 10/16/1773 **Susannah TERRELL** qualified as administrator of **John TERRELL**. On page 95, **Richmond, Elizabeth, & Susannah TERRELL**, under 14 years, guardian appointed. DICKEN does not indicate that she found a connection between these children and John TERRELL, possibly because the book she cited did not draw such conclusions.

*Terrell Trails* page 1076, *et seq* contains the will of **John TERRELL** and his consort, **Elizabeth HARRISON** of NC. This will does not name a Richmond. However, it does name, **son John's children**, but it does not name any of them. This will was written in 1883. It is possible that he was referring to the John and children above, but we have no documentation to either support or refute that theory.

There have been many different Richmond TERRELLs in various generations of the various lines. It is doubtful that we will ever sort all of them out. Good Hunting! *DFB*

Want descendants, siblings, & marriage info on **Samuel Frank TERRELL** b. ca 1839 (Pike Co. GA?) d. Chimbrazo Hospital, Richmond VA 02/02/1864 and his spouse **Martha Jane BASS** b. 01/23/1836 (AL?) d. Midland TX 01/30/1900. No date or place for marriage listed. Samuel Frank TERRELL enlisted Company C, 2nd regt. Mississippi Infantry twice: 03/02/1862 and 12/27/1863. #386 Mr. **PCharles Bryce Terrell; 1872 Milton Dr; Cheyenne WY 82001-1644**

I am still hoping to find a clue to the parents of my great-grandfather **Henry W. (or M.) TERRELL**. I am 86 years old but I was born and spent my childhood in Martin and Lawrence Counties IN where my great-grandparents lived. My great-grandmother, **Rachel JOHNSON Terrell** survived her spouse by almost 30 years and we have a little book in which she kept vital statistics. She recorded the death of her husband as well as the death of her mother in 1873 but she made no reference to the parents of siblings of her husband.

**Henry** was b. 06/20/1823 in IN (according to census), d. at farm home, Martin Co. IN 05/22/1873 and his only spouse **Rachel JOHNSON** b. 07/16/1823 at (NC?), died at home of son **John William TERRELL** (my grandfather) in Martin co. IN 02/02/1903; m. 04/07/1842 at Bedford, Lawrence Co. IN. Recorded on page 321; I have photocopy of marriage license.



The middle initial is **M** on the marriage license, but is **W** on the old sandstone marker at his grave in Lawrence Co. IN. They lived in Willow Valley area of Martin Co. IN near the boundry with Lawrence Co. IN. Henry & Rachel had six children who grew to adulthood; three boys and three girls. I have been in contact with all their families, but they can tell me nothing about Henry's ancestors. I have searched records in Martin & Lawrence Counties and have found deeds for land they owned and sold. There are records of many TERRELL families in the area, but I can find no proof of any relationship.

I sometimes wonder if the census birth place information is correct for Henry. Rachel was born in NC, probably Burke Co. Could Henry also have been born in that area? #60 Mrs. **Kathryne E. Voelker**; 508 North Livingston St; Arlington VA 22203-1023

Mary DOWDY**; **Jesse VESSELS**; **Charlotte VESSELS m. William LATHAM**; **Sealy Ann VESSELS m. Mathew HALE**; **Margaret VESSELS m. Absalom TERRELL**; **Rebecca VESSELS m. William PAGE**; **James VESSELS m. Martha KNIGHT**; **Elizabeth VESSELS m.**

**William PATTERSON**; **Mary VESSELS m. Peter WARREN**; **Celia VESSELS**; **Sivility VESSELS m. John MEADOWS**; **William VESSELS m. Phoebe BATSON** (this is my great-grandfather). **Edwin & Mary Vessels**; 9113 Oak Cliff Dr; Midwest City OK 73130-4236 Ph: 405-732-0783

Can you help me find more information on **Sidney Maguendia TERRELL**? He was my great grandfather. I have his birth as 04/04/1841, death 12/30/1912; stone in cemetery lists birth as 1843.

I found his name as a son of **Paul TERRELL**, one of twelve children in the 1850 census of Caswell Co. NC.

**TERRELL, Paul** 56 m farmer; **Sarah B.** 44 f; **Emaline** 23 f; **Monroe** 19 m farmer; **Bannister** 16 m farmer; **Jonathan** 14 m farmer; **David** 13 m; **Jesse A.** 11 m; **Sidney** 10 m; **Joseph W.** 9 m; **Susan W.** 7 f; **William** 5 m; **Marie A.** 2 f; **Sarah W.** 1/2 f.

*Editor's Note:* The census copy submitted is printed with names in random order apparently as the census taker traveled. I must remind you that the 1850 census did not list relationships to the head of household. With Sarah age 44, some of the younger children may be grandchildren or even children of the older unattached males next door. DFB

Next door is a possible brother: **James TERRELL** 57 m farmer; **William** 23 m; **Frances** 30 f; **Logan** 21 m farmer; **Henderson** 17 m student; **Andrew** 15 m.

I found he entered the Confederate army in 1861. Then in 1870, he was listed in Orange Co NC census, not as a married man, but with some of his brothers and sisters.

**TERRELL, Sidney M** 29 m w farmer 1,000, 500; **David C.** [brother] 32 m w laborer; **Susan W.** [sister] 28 f w keeping house; **[Egletine?]** 21 f w at home.

*Editor's Note:* This is from census page photocopy. No other TERRELL on the part of the page submitted. The 1860 census did not show relationships to head of household. Some census takers listed wives last. **[Egletine?]** may have been his wife. She does not appear in either of the previous families. DFB

In 1890 or 1891 he is listed in Haywood County NC census. He was married to **Anna E. Terrell**, but I don't know when or where she came into the picture. Sidney did have 3 children: **John Robert TERRELL** (my grandfather); **Harry**; & **Maggie** [probably short for Margaret DFB].

**John Robert TERRELL** was born in 1866 but I cannot find anywhere the marriage of Sidney to his wife Anna. If you can help me, please respond. **David E Terrell; P O Box 33; Bakersville NC 28705; phone 704-688-2213**

*Editor's Note:* Unless your birth date for John Robert TERRELL is from an unimpeachable source, that date may be incorrect. For example, if it is from tombstone, someone else obviously gave the information which may or may not have been correct.

As for his wife **Anna E.**, one obvious possibility is that "E." may be for **Egletine** and the census taker either could not spell or would not write the longer name. I suggest you snoop around Caswell and Orange counties—if courthouse fires have not destroyed the records. Last, but not least, to the best of my knowledge the 1890 US census for NC burned along with many other states. Is it possible you are referring to 1880 or to a state census? GOOD HUNTING!!! *DFB*

Would you please check your index of Terrell Trails for one **Katherine/Kathryn TERRELL** who would have been born about 1837 in Missouri?

I have been wholly unsuccessful in finding her family! A clue to her family may be that the 1870 census for Randolph Co., MO, one **Ann T. TERRELL** age 32 is listed with the family.

Katherine was married to **William C. JOHNSON** and they lived in Huntsville, Moberly, and Renick...all in Randolph Co., MO. Katherine died in 1878, leaving her husband with two children to raise: **William Price JOHNSON** age 3 and **Vienna JOHNSON** age 10. According to an old family bible, Katherine and William had a child named **Ara Whitfield JOHNSON** who died young (1 April 1861.) I don't have any further information except that the 1880 census shows William and the two surviving children with an 'aunt' **Zerilda** surname looks like **FOUNTIAN [FONTAINE? DFB]**, who was 'keeping house', probably to care for the children. She was 67 years old, born in KY, as was William, so she might be his aunt. Thank you! **Judy Crain judys-genes@uswest.net**

I still do not have my answer, but I "feel" like I'm getting closer. **Guy CLARKE** had some information to share with me too, and I've sent him some of my Terrell information.

I have my Terrell line in a family file, and I have all the other Terrells in a separate working file with hopes of joining the files when I make that illusive connection!

My Terrell database has come from *TERRELL GENEALOGY*, **Emma DICKEN**; *TIDEWATER FAMILIES OF VIRGINIA* Quarterlies by **Virginia Lee Hutcherson Davis**; and other TERRELLS that I have met online who have done their own research.

I always pass along information about the newsletter, so I hope it has generated some new subscriptions.

If you ever receive a query from someone seeking information on a **James M. TERRELL** who married **Martha Jane THOMAS** in 1849 and/or a **Soloman TERRELL** b. abt 1802 who married a **Nancy ???** (not the **Soloman** who married **Nancy Wall**), please keep me in mind.

In the Rockingham Co. 1850 census, those two lived near one another. Later, James moved to Caswell and started his chair factory. Neither made Emma's book, but they seem to have all the Terrell names!

**A.** I apologize for letting this get into my TRAILS material folder and be shuffled around so long before trying to answer you. Possibly that is due to not wanting the onslaught of comments that this response is going to generate from those who believe their lineage from Adam and Eve is written in blood and chiseled in stone. It may well be, but I am firmly convinced that the proof is nowhere to be found on the face of this earth. {:-)



I am a genealogical purist. I don't believe anything that cannot be documented by at least one original source. Therefore, I consider most of the lineages prior to 1850 to be somewhere between probable and mythological.

Thanks for the photo of your ancestors. If I can get a good scan, I'll use it soon.

Information on wills recently uncovered in England disproves the link above **Robert TERRELL & Jane BALDWIN** for several generations—at least to my satisfaction.

I wish I had a crystal ball that could answer your question, but I don't and I do not believe anyone else does either. All we can do is take the evidence we can find and draw the best conclusion we can from it. [The mere act of publishing something does not make it fact. I frequently quip that published materials (including *TERRELL TRAILS*) should be used only for leads to source materials. I wish you every possible success in your quest. *DFB*]

## HOSMER/TERRELL/STAPLES

Thank you for the recent query you posted for me in the newsletter. However, I think I gave you wrong information as I have just gotten a book on the old Covington Cemetery in Covington, LA. This is what it gives on the **HOSMER/TERRELL** family:

**James HOSMER**, who d. Feb 23 1831, was a native of Middlesex Co MA and was living in New Orleans in 1817 when he visited the ailing **John Warton COLLINS** (founder of Covington LA) on Christmas day. He was a witness to confirm **COLLINS'** will which was written on April 1, 1817, **COLLINS** died two days later.

In the 1820s, James **HOSMER** purchased land in St. Tammany Parish, part of which is the site of St Joseph's Abby, from **Jeremiah Jones MILLER** who operated one of the earliest water mills in the Parish, in exchange "for a house on Dauphine Street (in the French Quarter of New Orleans) and rights to a pew in the First Presbyterian Church in New Orleans."

Before coming to Louisiana, James married **Sallie SEC** of Concord MA. They had 4 children: **King Rufus HOSMER** m. **Rebecca CRAWFORD** in St. Tammany Parish on May 23 1834; **Emaline HOSMER** m. **Alexander G. PENN** on Nov 27, 1830; **Adeline HOSMER** m. **Elijah TERRELL** on Nov 12, 1828 and their daughter, **Laura TERRELL** m. Count **John Charles BARELLI**; **Angeline HOSMER** m. **Abraham PENN** on Sept 22, 1831 James **HOSMER's** second marriage was to **Arsene OLIVER** and there were 6 children born to this marriage. The article goes on about one or more of those six children, but no more mention of **TERRELLS**.

In the 1870 census of St. Tammany Parish LA, I have **TERRELL, (Adeline, age 60, head of household, b. MA); S. B. STAPLES (age 53, b. VA); Matilda LAURENCE (age 36, b. LA, school teacher); and a BAGLEY, Wm. D. (age 38, b. LA, store clerk) living in the same household with several children and servants listed.**

**Solomon Gordon STAPLES** (known as Gordon) was my g g grandfather and I have his Mexican War pension record which gives his occupation, physical description, address (which was New Orleans) and much information given by **Adeline Arsene TERRELL Staples**.

When **Adeline A. TERRELL Staples** died, she got quite a write-up in the New Orleans newspaper. It was entitled "The regretted death of a grand old Southern Lady." It names at least 2 of her daughters: **Mrs. Capt. June [STAPLES] Poitevant** and **Mrs. R. S. (Roberta STAPLES) Case** (my line).

I have her death certificate which gives some conflicting statements; it says her parents were born in South Carolina!!?? It states, "Mrs. Widow **Adeline A. Staples** (white) native of Covington LA, age 73 years 11 days died of Senile Debility certificate of Dr. **Sarah MAYO** (a very famous female doctor in this city - a hospital is named after her.) The deceased was a resident of this city (New Orleans) for the past 4 years."

My big question is: HOW did I get an ancestor named **Adeline Arsene TERRELL**??? I am in some confusion about the birth place of her parents. Any help will be appreciated.

*Editor's Note:* One obvious POSSIBILITY is that **Adeline Arsene TERRELL** is the **Adeline A. TERRELL** who m. **Gordon G. STAPLES**, probable daughter of **Elijah TERRELL & Adeline HOSMER** who may have been given the

name **Arsene** out of respect for **Adeline's** step-mother (or to appease the step-mother if she was the domineering type; note that **Lucinda** also has middle initial A.).

She is also a probable sister of **Lucinda A. TERRELL** who m. **Samuel B. STAPLES** as **S. B. STAPLES** was living in the household of **Adeline TERRELL** (probable widow of **Elijah**) in 1870. Other information submitted later strengthens these theories, but it is too extensive to include here.

As for the conflicting birth place of her parents on the death certificate; that information was probably given by someone other than the deceased who either did not know where her parents were born, or possibly knew that **Elijah TERRELL** was born in SC and simply assumed that she was too. In 1870, she was probably home when the census taker came by and may have told him she was born in Massachusetts. I would give more credence to that than to the death certificate. Any source record created while one is alive is more credible than one created after death. There is no **HOSMER, STAPLES, or Elijah TERRELL** in the index to *Terrell Genealogy* by **Emma DICKEN**.

Intrigued by the 1801 marriage of **BAGLEY, Wm. D** to **Delphine TERRELL**; I checked **BAGLEY** to see if this marriage was in **DICKEN**. Due to the span 1801-1828 between the marriages, it is possible that **Delphine and Elijah TERRELL** were brother and sister, but more likely aunt & nephew or cousins. I did not find that marriage, but I did find 2 later **TERRELL/BAGLEY** marriage in Texas.

**DICKEN**, page 137: **Henry TERRELL** b. Wilkes County GA 03/03/1808; s/o **Peter Buford TERRELL & Penelope JONES** of Wilkes Co. GA; d. 06/11/1873 in Texas where he moved in 1837 or 1838. At an unlisted date, he m. **Maria DUGGAN**, d/o **Thomas DUGGAN & Elizabeth BERRY**; she b. 06/04/1818, d. 10/04/1872.

Their daughter, **Beatrice TERRELL** (birth & marriage dates unlisted; 6th of 7 children listed) m. **Robert Franklin BAGLEY**. DFB

### Will of James Terrill, Planter St. Margaret's Parish, Caroline County

Submitted by **Lyndon H. HART, III**

*This previously unknown will was located among the Miscellaneous Papers of Cumberland County's County and Superior Courts, 1760-1850, at the Library of Virginia. This document provides proof of the sons of James TERRILL and identifies for the first time, his daughters.*

In the name of God, Amen, I **James Terrill** plant<sup>f</sup> of St<sup>t</sup> Margarets Parish, & County of Caroline in the Colony of Virginia, am weak in body, but of perfect Sense & memory,



thanks be given to Almighty God. Therefore, calling to mind the Mortality of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, Principally revoking and disannulling all other Wills heretofore made by me; first of all I give & Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it to me, and my Body to to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like manner; nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection to receive the same again by the mighty power of God; and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life, I give and dispose of the same in the following Manner and Form, viz'

Secondly, I lent unto my beloved Wife **Margaret** a Childs part of my Estate, be it in what place or of what nature or quality Soever, and after my loving ife Margarets decease my will and desire is that the part I lend her should be divided equally between my five oldest children viz' **William TERRILL, Mary Herndon, my son, James TERRILL, Betty Newton, & Patty Hord.** [HEARD? DFB]

Thirdly. What I have given heretofore to my eldest son, **William TERRILL**, being a full part of my Estate, too tedious to mention at this time, hoping he will take it kind enough of me, not being able to give him any more of my Estate.

Fourthly. I give & bequeath to my son **James TERRILL**, the Tract of Land whereon I now live and my Still as it now stands, & also the fifth part of my Stock after my s<sup>d</sup> Wife's part is taken out of my Estate, to him and his Heirs & Assigns.

Fifthly. I give & bequeath to my Daughter **Betty Newton** one Negro wench named **Jane**, to her and her heirs and Assigns.

Sixthly. I give & bequeath to my Daughter **Patty HORD** one Negro wench named **Fortune** to her & her heirs and Assigns.

Seventhly. I give and bequeath to my son **John TERRILL** two hundred acres of Land, lying on the north side of Muddy Creek in Cumberland County and five pounds curr<sup>t</sup> money to buy him some stock, to him and his Heirs & Assigns for ever.

Eightly. I give and bequeath to my son **Dudley TERRILL** two hundred acres of Land, lying on the south side of Muddy Creek in Cumberland County joyning s<sup>d</sup>. Land as I have given to my son John TERRILL and a fifth part of my Stock to him and his Heirs & Assigns for ever. And the fifth part

of my house hold goods after my s<sup>d</sup>. Wifes part, to him and his Heirs and Assigns for ever.

Ninthly. I give & bequeath to my Son, **Jonathan TERRILL**, three hundred acres of land lying in Culpepper County, and the fifth part of my house hold Goods after my s<sup>d</sup>. Wifes part, to him and his Heirs and Assigns for ever.

Tenthly. I give and bequeath to my Daughter **Neffe** one Negro girl named **Rose**, and the fifth part of my Stock and house hold goods after my s<sup>d</sup>. Wifes part is taken out of my Estate, to her and her Heirs and Assigns for ever.

Leventhly. I give and bequeath to my Daughter **Mary Herndon** one negro boy named **Charles**, to her and her Heirs and Assigns for ever.

Twelfthly. Remembering from the beginning of my Will that all my just Debts & Burial Charges to be paid before any division of my Estate made between my loving Children; also my Will and desire is, that if any of my aforesaid Children should be so disturbed at this my Will and Occasion Lawsuits to interrupt my Will, that they him or her should be paid by my executors one Schilling Sterling and cut off from all other part of my Estate and the part of my Estate left them by this my Will should be equally divided between my Contented Children.

Lastly. I do appoint and Ordain my Son in Law **Thomas HORD** and my loving son **James TERRILL** Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have set my Hand and fixed my Seal this eighteenth day of October, in the Year of our Lord Christ. One thousand seven hundred and sixty six.

**William Beverley TOON** was born July 12, 1860, in Wil-  
liamson County, Tennessee. He was the fifth child of seven  
children (four daughters and three sons) born to **B. B.** and  
**Sallie D. TOON**, both of whom were born and reared in  
Williamson County, Tennessee.

He attended the schools of Franklin and vicinity until he was  
17 years of age, when he entered the Webb School at  
Culleoka, where he completed the course in 1879. From here  
he went to Vanderbilt University, where he graduated with  
the degree of A. B. in 1883.

He then went to Texas and taught at Dangerfield and Terrell  
from 1883 to 1885. From the latter place he went to Spring-  
field, Conway County, and took charge of the Springfield  
College, where he remained until from 1885 to 1890, except  
one year which was spent in Terrell, Tex.

From Springfield he went to Morrilton in 1890, and became  
one of the principals of the Morrilton Male and Female  
College, where he now resides.

He was married in June of 1884, to Miss **Lela TERRELL**,  
of Terrell, Tex., the youngest daughter of **Robert A. TER-**  
**RELL**, for whom the Town of Terrell was named.

To **W. B. TOON** and wife was born one child, a son,

It was a pleasant surprise finding your site in the web, when I was searching for TERRELL information. It has basic information in a clear and simple manner, and I am sure it will help my research.

I would like to tell you about my family bough of the Terrell genealogy.

My great-great-grandmother **Mary Terrell** (1837 - 12/18/1916) came to Brazil from Texas in 1868, soon after the American Civil War was over. She brought her three children: **William Thomas TERRELL** (02/24/1856 - 12/06/1923), **James Ithamar TERRELL** (04/10/1861 - 06/22/1927) and My great-grandfather, **Guilford Dudley TERRELL** (?). Many American families came to Brazil at that time. It is not clear in the documents available if Guilford's father, **William A. Terrell**, came with them and died soon after he arrived here or if he died just before the family left Texas. **William Thomas** was born in Louisiana, but there is no information (until now) whether they lived there all the time before coming to Brazil or not. So, I am researching for about five years looking for the connection point that links my family bough to that of the TERRELL pioneers in North America.

I think the Internet is a wonderful place to research anything, including genealogy. The matter is the time it takes to select the information you need in the amount available.

I was a member of the SCV - Sons of Confederate Veterans, an American association relating to the descendants of the confederate soldiers of the American civil war. They have a lot of information about the confederacy and its soldiers.

Do you think my family could be descendant of **Richmond Terrell**, the British immigrant? Could be any close bough of my family in Louisiana or Texas? Would you please tell me the ways you think could be better for me to research the information I need about my family? I have seen in the Library of Congress site the name of some books about Terrell genealogy, including one book of Emma Dicken. Have you tried them? I am beforehand grateful for any help you can offer me.

Congratulations for your Terrell site. I think it is very important to maintain those information available.

*Editor's Note:* I frequently quip that every TERRELL man who had two sons between 1100 & 1900 named one of them William and the other John.

Names are often leads to ancestors. Unfortunately, there are several different patterns that were common here in that era. My TERRELL ancestors seemed to name children for uncles from both sides of the family. Other lines seemed to name the first child after the father or the father's father. Others picked the first name of the father and the first name of the mother's father. The oldest son in this case was named **William Thomas TERRELL**. Both William and Thomas are too common in all lines, including TERRELL to be much help.

The second child, **James Ithamar TERRELL** has a very common TERRELL name, James, combined with a very unusual middle name that could have come from either side of the family, but if I were a gambler, I would bet on it being from his mother's side. I did not find either a James I. TERRELL or Ithamar TERRELL in the first ten volumes of *Terrell Trails*. I do not recall having ever heard that name.

The key to tracing this family lies in the unusual names and possibly in the names of families who migrated to South America with them. You are fortunate to have an ancestor named **Guilford Dudley TERRELL**. Guilford is the name of a county in North Carolina as well as a surname. He may have been given this name for either the location or an ancestor. I found no listing for either GUILFORD or a Guilford TERRELL in the first ten volumes of *Terrell Trails*.

Dudley is a very rare name in the TERRELL lines (for the earliest account we have of it, see James TERRELL Will in this issue). *Terrell Trails* has only two listings for Dudley TERRELL in the first ten volumes:

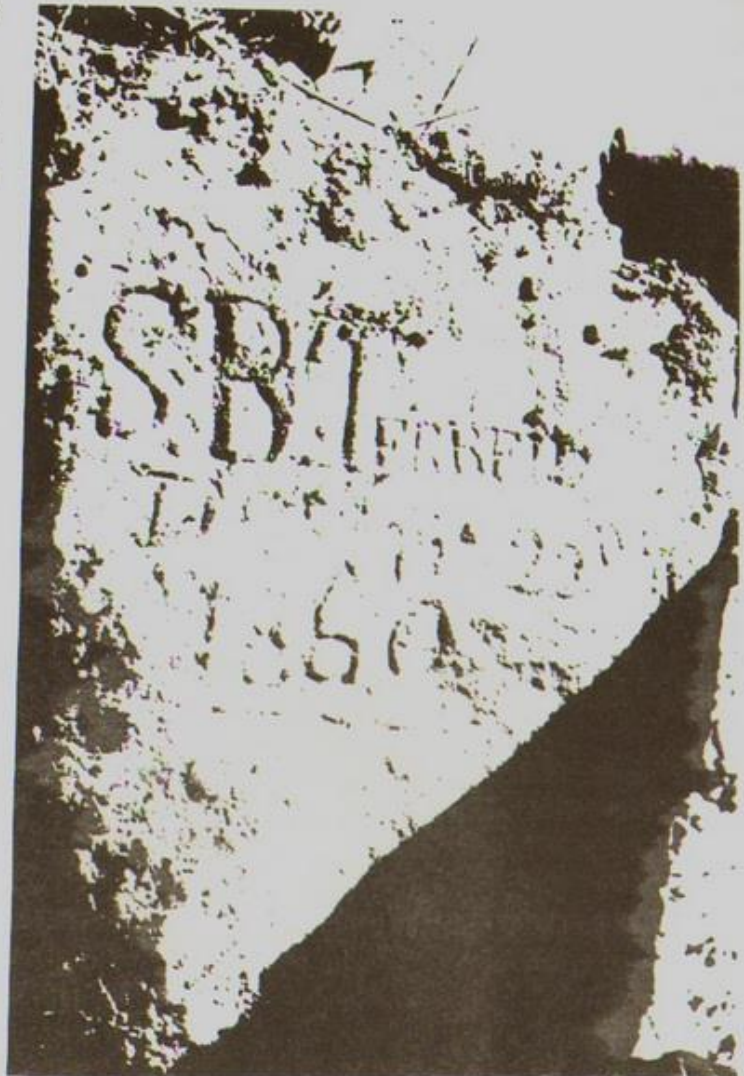
### STONE OF S. B. TERRELL

In early May my husband and I went to the G'ville cemetery and retrieved the stones laying on top of the ground, or protruding enough see. Among the MORE THAN THIRTY stones that MAY OR NOT have been used as head/foot stones, was a very large stone inscribed 'S B Terrell - then another line of inscription I haven't been able to read except the first letter D several letters and 22 a couple more letters, then the third line is 1860.

We know the Golansville meeting was 'laid down' in 1853 - so I assume this was a member of the family that owned the property - Joseph and Sally B. TERRELL????

I cannot find a death date for Sallie B., but if you can find it in your files - or publish this info in case someone else has it - we can pinpoint the place WHERE THIS STONE WAS FOUND - but it does not at all mean it is the actual place of burial. We cannot judge for sure whether it was moved during the bulldozing, although it was buried except for one small corner, so may not have moved far.



I have a couple of others that are very interesting, too, so let me know if you think you can use them.

TERRELL (1788—?) b. at Caroline Co. VA; m. 04/15/1804 at public meeting of FRIENDS (Quakers) Caroline Co. VA. Anna Lynch TERRELL m. 1831 William L LEWIS.

Trails, p. 265: Census Index lists Sarah B. TERRELL Caroline Co. VA 246 no township listed 1850. This index lists head of households only and does not show age or any other data. No other S. B. TERRELL listed in this index for Caroline Co. VA or anywhere else.

They lived at Golansville. See *Our Quaker Friends*, p. 21 [by **J. Pinkney BELL** descendant of Joseph TERRELL's sister **Joannah TERRELL & John BELL**].

Based upon the above information, I conclude that this is **probably** the stone of **Sarah B. TERRELL**, widow of **Joseph TERRELL**. I do not have access to the 1850, 1860, & 1870 census records for Caroline County VA. In order to make a positive statement, it will be necessary for someone to check those censuses to confirm that there was no other S. B. TERRELL in Golansville, Caroline County, in 1850-1860. The 1870 census may list Sarah B. TERRELL. If so, this will indicate that she died after the date listed on the census page and may help clarify some of the missing date.

## WILLIAM H. TERRELL, LA CW RECORD

Excerpted from *James Monroe NASH Military Service in the War for Southern Independence Jackson Parish, Louisiana*. Submitted by **J. Hugh LeBaron**

**William H. TERRELL** is identified with Young Greys from DeSoto Parish. TERRELL was a forty-year old, Mississippi born brick maker with four children when the war began.

He enlisted at Mansfield on March 5, 1863 and was elected captain of the Young Greys. Fourteen days later he became a major and was placed in command of the 1st Louisiana State Guards Battalion. Command of the Young Greys passed to Captain **John W. STUART**.

In the reorganization of the 1st State Infantry into the 2nd State Cavalry, John Stuart retained his command of the Young Greys.

It is not known what happened to Captain **W. T. HARDEE** who commanded James Monroe Nash's unit, but he was not in command of the Winn Reserves when the reorganization was complete. It is known that Major **William H. TERRELL** was demoted to captain after the reorganization, and it is highly likely that he replaced Captain Hardee as commander of the Winn Reserves. This hypothesis is reinforced by the fact that Terrell was still commander of an unidentified company when the 2nd State Cavalry later entered Confederate service as the 8th Louisiana Cavalry.
