Jane Eliza BIBB was baptized by Elder **ALLEN** at temple.....May 12th 1849.


I do not know the origin of the original owner of the Bible. I suspect that because of the BIBB, HAR-GRAVE, TERRELL, CHILES, HARRIS, WHEAT, BURRUSS connections that the Bible was in the possession first of Captain Thomas BURRUSS and his wife Knelly BIBB. After their deaths, I believe the bible passed to their oldest son, Charles E. BURRUSS and his wife Lucy HAR-GRAVE, daughter of Samuel HARGRAVE. Samuel HARGRAVE was the great grandfather of the WHEAT children (Daughter Fanny HAR-GRAVE and husband Fleming BIBB, then to granddaughter Inez BIBB and her husband Frances WHEAT) For a copy of the WHEAT Portion that has been omitted from this work, please let me know.



DON TERRILL'S LAWSUIT

EDITOR'S NOTE: the following is excerpted from a press release made by Mr. **Kirk D. Lyons**, attorney who represented our Society president in this matter. Copy was supplied by Don Terrill. **DFB**

Confederate-Americans Seek Civil Rights

ALEXANDRIA, VA, Saturday April 28, 2001 A federal judge ruled Friday that he had no authority to grant national-origin status to Confederate-Americans under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

Title VII prohibits employment discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex, and national origin. The case before **Claude M. Hilton**, chief judge of the Eastern District of Virginia, was filed against the U. S. Dept. of Labor. The dept. had denied employee, **Don Terrill**, participation in a "diversity day" celebration because he wanted to set up; a Confederate-American exhibit.

Terrill's lawsuit survived the government's motion for dismissal. He was defended by **Kirk D. Lyons**, chief trail counsel of Southern Legal Resource Center in Black Mountain, NC.

Lyons said the government's position has been that "there's 'no such critter' as a Confederate-American under federal law, and we would agree with that. This is a case of first impression," he said, meaning that no court has yet addressed the issue.

The attorney said that "a good bit" of the government's case hinged on the interpretation that the Confederate States of America was not a sovereign nation.

But even accepting that argument (which he doesn't), **Lyons** said that sovereignty was not determinative in national origin. "Look at the Armenians," he said, "If an Armenian is discriminated against by a Turk in the workplace, he would be accorded national-origin status."

He said that cases involving discrimination against Confederate-Americans in the workplace "are falling our of the trees."

A related case in SC is titled **William Vanderhoff vs. John Deere**. "Mr. Vanderhoff was fired for having a Confederate flag on his toolbox which he refused to remove.," Lyons said.

Lyons said that the outcome "was the best that we were hoping for. We were not expecting to win today; we were hoping to survive the motion to dismiss. The case will be appealed to the 4th Circuit Court in Richmond VA.

Judge Hilton asked the plaintiff's attorneys why they did not file a claim under the First Amendment of the U. S. Constitution, which guarantees free expression. Lyons told the judge that he knew that remedy was available, bujt he "specifically wanted to test Title VII, Civil Rights Act of 1964 under national origin for Confederate Americans. We probably could have won a first Amendment claim, but that is not what we are in court for."

"We're trying to make law,: Lyons said, "and the way you make law is to lose. Every group that gained protection under national origin had to start somewhere." Terrill "is not an isolated plaintiff." We have cases all over the federal court system.

Eventually one of these cases will go to the Supreme Court of the United States."

The attorney agreed that some people might find it ironic that his group is using the civil rights laws to protect Confederate-Americans, "But, there is a real problem of discrimination in the workplace, in the schools, and in society against people who are proud of their Confederate heritage,: he said.

Don Terrill says that details of this current event "will be continued" as the case progresses.

Thanks for all your hard work on my Terrell inquiry. I now have more information, which may help us locate my TERRELL connection.

Andrew Jackson TERRELL was born on March 1, 1815, in Ohio. His parents were both born in Connecticut.

He married **Sarah**, born March 10, 1817, died August 10, 1890. He then married **Mary A**. about 1891.

Children of Andrew and Sarah were: **John T. TERRELL**, born Ohio, 1840, married **Mehetabel LILLY** July 3, 1866 at Byron Center, Kent County, Michigan;

Sarah L. TERRELL born December 17, 1843, Ohio, married **Alvin LOOMIS** in Michigan, died 1900;

August TERRELL, born April, 1853, Ohio, married **Sarah O**.;

Charles A. TERRELL, born 1848, Ohio.

Willis B. TERRELL, born August, 1855, in Michigan, died after 1900. Arthur L. TERRELL, born September 17, 1862, died November 13, 1867.

Andrew Jackson TERRELL lived near **Alonzo P. TERRELL**, born September 5, 1809, died April 4, 1895, who was probably his brother. Alonzo's wife was **Caroline M.**, born June 18, 1810, died May 25, 1893.

I am thinking that my **Andrew Jackson Terrell** may be the son of **Tillotson TERRELL** or at least a close relative. One of the relatives who went to Byron Center, Kent County, Michigan, and is buried there is shown on her tombstone as the wife of **Tillotson**. I think her name was **Alvira** (don't have the info here). She was born in 1828, and was probably a second wife. Anyway it's a clue.

While I am prepared to believe that John T. could be a son of Hezekiah Sr., we need some sort of proof of ties between the two families. Lets try another theory. James' first son is **William Thompson TERRELL**, and we can speculate that his grandfather is **John Thompson TERRELL**. We find **Simon TERRELL** (b. 1755, N.C.; d. 1840, Franklin Co, Ga.) and wife **Sarah THOMP-SON** (b. ca. 1760, Brunswick Co, Va.; d. before

1808, Franklin Co, N.C.). No son yet identified as "John," but who knows.

The answer to your questions may be found in the county records of Gordon Co and maybe Franklin Co, Ga. Sorry I cannot provide you with more. Don C. Terrill

Don [Terrill]-I have been in contact with Stacey who is looking for MURPHEY's, we have also shared TERRELL information and some of it, I believe, came from you. She said that John TERRELL & Ann BUTLER were married in VA; also, she said that the TERRELL's, MURPHEYS, HERNDONS, etc. were from Culpeper area. However, I have not seen any documentation for any of this. I do know that these names all show up in the Caswell Co., NC, area. Also, these families seemed to marry into each other and I know that a couple of the MURPHY brothers married the TERRELL sisters.

This all does get confusing later in Caswell records, especially where the MURPHEYs are concerned as there are more than 2 **Gabriel MURPHYs** and they are from different families. Also, there are a couple of **Basil MURPHY's** and they are from different families - however, they might be cousins (2nd, 3rd, who knows.) I have been researching these families for more than 25 years, and still have trouble although I do have my husband's line clear and documented.

Following is my ancestor outline for my earliest TERRELL for 2 generations. I can document my husband's connection to this **John TERRELL** and the descendants listed for him. These TERRELL's were in Caswell County, NC. My husband descends from John's daughter - **Martha/Patsey** - who married **James MURPHEY** in 1795. I also am in contact with a lady in California who descends through this same line.

I have 19 **Richmond TERRELLS** (not all of whom lived to adulthood). I have those you have listed with these exceptions: Your reference to #2 is unclear; and I don't list **a Richmond M. TERRELL** (#6), unless perhaps it is the **Richmond TERRILL** (b. 1771) who went to Texas. Don C. TERRILL

Thanks for your message. I have a question on where in the family line did the **TERRILL's** and **TERRELL's** (for lack of a better word) "split off"? Thanks **A J TERRELL**

There wasn't a general split-off. My own family is somewhat unique. I am descended from Richmond TERRELL (arrived in Va. in 1656), and most (probably all) other branches of that family use "TERRELL." In 1822 my ancestor William C. TERRELL and his son William C. TERRELL Jr. were elected to city offices in Darien, Ga. Apparently, William Jr. didn't want to be known as "Jr.," so he simply changed the spelling of his name to **TERRILL**. There are several spelling variations among New England TERRELLs (TURRILL, TIRRILL, TERRILL, etc.); however, I am familiar with the history of only one clan -- the descendants of Roger TERRILL of New Milford, Conn. who arrived there ca. 1630 and have always used "TER-RILL."

As for the southern TERRELLs, there are two major branches: the descendants of **Richmond TER-RELL** (mentioned above) whose origin is Reading, England, and the descendants of **Timothy TER-RILL** whose origin is London, England (but whose clan is traced to West Hagbourne, England). Although a few of their branches have opted for "TERRELL" (probably through the acquiescence of an illiterate ancestor), most have stuck with "TER-RILL." Timothy's descendants

spread from Orange Co, Va., to Ky. and Mo. during the mid-19th century. **Don C. TERRILL**

LITTLE, Amelia; Miss; 506; "Want descendants of Hezekiah TERRELL born 1801 VA; died Wolfe Co. KY between 1873 & 1880; and his first spouse, Amelia LITTLE b. ca1809 KY, died at Wolfe Co. KY between 1873 & 1880; married 04/10/1828 in Morgan Co. KY. First on record, his marriage in Morgan Co. KY; lived & died Gilmore Creek, Wolfe Co. KT; listed on census 1830--1870; on tax list through 1873. Who were parents of Hezekiah TERRELL? First son named Timothy; other sons were John, Charles, and James Lee. #228 Mrs. Madge TERRELL Tate; 76 East Troutman Rd. NE; Rome GA 30161."

LITTLE, Emily; Miss; 1166-1167; #481 Beverly L. PELFREY Houghtling; 7561 Glenhurst Dr.; Dayton OH 45414 submitted chart showing that she descended from Timothy, son of Hezekiah TERRILL and Emily (Amelia) LITTLE but listed no ancestors for Hezekiah.

The name **Hezekiah TERRELL** appears in LEND-ING LIBRARY selection #090 *RICHMOND*, *WIL-LIAM & TIMOTHY TERRELL* by **Celeste Jane TERRELL Barnhill**.

Page 115: Second Generation: John & Elizabeth [HARRISON] TERRELL of NC; list of children includes one Hezekiah TERRELL. Children in the order listed are: Hannah TERRELL m. Jacob BELDSOE; Jeptha TERRELL; John TERRELL m. 04/17/1760 Susannah DOUGLAS; Ann TER-**RELL** m. William MARTIN, was probably mother of George & James MARTIN; Agnes TER-RELL m. 09/04/1761 Robert WASHINGTON. (This record from a deed dated 07/07/12764 Butte Co. NC from John TERRELL naming above children.) Abigail TERRELL b. 01/08/1760 m. 02/09/1775 William RUSH; d. after 1833. Timothy TERRELL b. 1762. Halcot TERRELL b. 1768. (This record from an old family Bible) **Hez**ekiah TERRELL [B. 1732 per LL selection #241] (From a deed recorded in Granville Co. NC, made by John to Hezekiah TERRELL dated 04/12/1857 {This date is highly unlikely. Probably should be either 1758 or 1785. This John died about 1783 [per LL selection #241]} "The above gift I give to my son, Hezekiah, b. to my wife Elizabeth." Another deed to "my son-in-law, Robert WASH-INGTON."

Third Generation: Issue of Hezekiah TERRELL [no spouse listed]; Abigail TERRELL; Timothy TERRELL. (From a will recorded in Butte Co NC, Will book 1, dated 1765. Timothy was to receive his legacy when 21. Witnesses: George MARTIN & James MARTIN. Hezekiah must have been the oldest of John's children.

Ibid p.289: *Miscellaneous Notes:* Hezekiah TERRELL served in the Colonial Wars, 1754 Granville Co. NC, Capt. S. JONES Co.

Because **Barnhill** is so difficult to follow, I am continuing with LL#241, *John Terrell of NC*, page 2. **Hezekiah TERRELL** b. 1732 Caroline Co. VA, m. 1758 **Phoebe MARTIN**; d. 1767 Butte Co NC. Children: **Abigail TERRELL** b. 1760; **Timothy TERRELL III** b. 10/17/1762 Butte Co. NC, d. 07/31/1781 Franklin or Warren Co. NC; **Halcut Hawkins TERRELL** b. 01/10/1768.

Back to the spousal surname, there is only one LIT-TLE in LL#241, page 16. **Nathaniel Macon TER-RELL** b. 12/04/1810 m. **Eliza Ann LITTLE**. [no

place listed] children: Anne, George, & Lewis C. TERRELL.

Nathaniel Macon TERRELL (above) was son of **Joseph Henry TERRELL** and **Elizabeth FORT** of Wake Co. NC.

Joseph Henry TERRELL (above) b. 07//1785 was son of **Solomon TERRELL** & his first spouse **Amelia ROBERTSON**.

Solomon TERRELL (above) b. 11/27/1755 was son of **Jepthah TERRELL & Obedience**. He was the eldest of 3 known children of this couple. **Jepthah** was son of **John and Elizabeth HARRI-SON TERRELL**.

If Mrs. Madge TERRELL Tate is correct in her statement that **Hezikiah & Amelia** had "first son named **Timothy**; other sons were **John, Charles**, and **James Lee**" — these are the best clues we have to the parentage of this **Hezekiah**. **Timothy** (if first born) is the best prospect for the father of **Hezekiah**. The question now is WHICH **Timothy**?

LL#241, p. 1: **Timothy TERRELL**, s/o **John & Elizabeth HARRISON TERRELL** m. **UN-KNOWN** in VA, but died in 1784. This was 15+years before your **Hezekiah** was born. No children are listed for him.

Ibid, p.1 et. seq. **Joel TERRELL**, brother **of Hezekiah**, son of **John & Elizabeth**, m. **Elizabeth RUSH**, lived & d. in Granville & Franklin counties in NC — named children **James**, **John**, **Hezekiah**, **& Timothy** in that order with other children between them. However, both **James & Hezekiah** are listed as born 1775.

James TERRELL b. NC m. 1802 Mary "Polly" HOUSE [no location listed] d. 1826 Williamson Co. TN. Their sons included Timothy b. 1810; Hezekiah b. 1815; James b.1822.

Halcut Hawkins TERRELL b. 01/10/1768 Butte Co. NC s/o Hezekiah & Phoebe MARTIN; m. 08/28/1811 Warren Co. NC Martha COOK. Halcut d. 01/09/1839 Rapides Parish LA. They had 6 known children, but none were named either James, John, Hezekiah, or Timothy.

Unless your **Hezekiah** was the son of an unknown son of **Timothy** who d. 1784 with unknown spouse, we can conclude that he was not a descendant of

John and Elizabeth HARRISON TERRELL of NC.

LL#013 *Terrell Genealogy* by **DICKEN** has 21 persons listed with **LITTLE** surname, but neither **Amelia** nor **Emily** is listed.

Hezekiah TERRELL is listed on 5 pages: 263, 264, 265, 271, & 272. This is the son of **John & Elizabeth HARRISON TERRELL** and his descendants whom I have already covered. The only difference is that **DICKEN** goes into more detail with more document citations to pin own dates.

Timothy TERRELL appears in **DICKEN** on pages 8-9. 11-12, 19, 38, 54-55, 57-58, 61-62, 181, 212, 214, 232, 236-238, 243, 245, 247-249, 252, 258, 261, 264, 271-272, 179-280, 283, & 287. Is one or more of these in the right time and place to be father of your **Hezekiah**?

Pages 8-12 deal with **Timothy**, brother of **Richmond** who came to Virginia. This Timothy is believed to have died before 1661.

Ibid., pages 19--38. Timothy TERRELL of New Kent Co. VA; son of Richmond of VA; descendants say he was b. 1658; m. Elizabeth FOSTER; known children Mary TERRILL baptized 01/03/1688/9; Robert TERRILL baptized 12/25/1697; Joseph TERRILL baptized 12/31/1699; family tradition says they had sons William and Timothy and some daughters in addition to the three above. Due to the long span between the baptisms of Mary and Robert, it is likely that they had others. The big question is whom, and what did they do?

Ibid., page 54-55; **Joseph TERRELL** b. 1699 is believed to have been father of both **Timothy** and **William TERRELL** of Hanover VA. All three lived in the same immediate area. Tax records show that **Timothy TERRELL** d. about 1809 and **William** by 1812. [This makes this **Timothy** a possible father of your **Hezekiah** b. 1801-04. However, he was probably over 50 years of age by that time.]

Joseph TERRELL b. 1699 had a son [probably his first], **Joseph TERRELL** b. 01/28/1745; d. 04/09/1787; m. 09/29/1767 **Elizabeth MILLS**. Their known children included **Charles** b. 07/03/1768; **John**, and **David**. [No Timothy or Hezekiah listed.] These are cited as being men-

tioned in *Colonial Families of the U.S. Vol. VII* p. 267.

Charles TERRELL b. 07/03/1768 m. widow, Anne LEWIS Phillips after 1801. [No Timothy or Hezekiah listed among his known children.]

John TERRELL, said to be s/o Joseph & Elizabeth MILLS TERRELL appeared on tax rolls in Hanover Co. VA 1799 with lands obtained from William HUGHES. He was still there in 1830. DICKEN did not look further.

Timothy & Ralph H. TERRELL paid tax 1830 on land which formerly belonged to **C. TERRELL** and brothers. [DICKEN did not comment further on these.]

A Richard TERRELL has been named as a son of Joseph & Elizabeth MILLS TERRELL. [DICK-EN did not reveal her source for this information.] *Ibid.*, 57-58; Timothy TERRELL, son of Richmond TERRELL of VA whom DICKEN believed had brothers Richmond, and William TERRELL (d. Hanover Co. VA before 1744) who m. Susannah WATERS.

[Judge] John Dabney TERRELL (1773--1850) in his last years wrote from memory a family sketch in which he named William TERRELL as parent of his grandfather Joel TERRELL. "William lived and died in Hanover County on the Pamunkey River . . . I cannot remember who he married. . . . Of his daughters I know nothing; his sons of whom I have heard were James, John, Joel, and Timothy." [We now have another Timothy probably born before 1700 who might be an ancestor of your Hezekiah.]

Ibid., p. 61-, The accepted children of **William and Susannah TERRELL** included **Timothy** (d.1763 Orange Co. NC); **James TERRELL** (d. ca1772 Caroline Co. VA); & **John TERRELL** (d. ca1785 in Franklin Co NC [whom we examined first]; among others. [Again, we have Timothy, James, and John in the same TERRELL family.]

Ibid., p. 62 **Timothy** (above d.1763 Orange Co. NC) moved to Bladen Co. NC about 1743 where his daughter **Ruth TERRELL** m. **Isaac BROOKS**, son of **Susan or Susannah TERRELL** and **John BROOKS** traditionally first cousins, making her mother a sister of **Timothy TERRELL**.

Ibid., p. 181; Pleasant TERRELL (1735--1808) s/o David TERRELL Sr & Agatha CHILES lived near Golansville, Caroline county, VA. He m. 1762 Catherine "Caty" FARISH who d. 1813. Nine children are listed. The youngest, Mary TERRELL b. 02/03/1784 m. 03/10/1803 Timothy TERRELL; m. (2) Robert LADD. [Here we have possible parents of your Hezekiah — if he was not born until 1804.]

Birth dates of these children recorded in *Our Quaker Friends*, p. 19.

Ibid., p. 212,-214; Thomas TERRELL (1734-1804] second son of Henry TERRELL I & Anne CHILES m. Rebecca PEATROSS ca1760. Eight children are listed with birth dates from Our Quaker Friends, p. 20. The fifth child is **Timothy TER-RELL** (above) b. 03/23/1774 d. ca 1805. He m. (1) 06/10/1798 Miriam HUNNICUTT (1777--<1803) two children: Maria TERRELL & Edwin TER-**RELL**. He m. (2) 03/10/1803 Mary TERRELL d/o Pleasant TERRELL; one child Caty TER-**RELL** b. 07/11/1804. Widow, Mary m. (2) **Robert** LADD of Charles City VA 06/15/1807, Our Quaker Friends, p. 62. [If there were any LADD children, DICKEN did not list them. If this information is correct, this couple is eliminated as parents of your Hezekiah.]

Ibid., p. 232; DICKEN resumes on the descendants of **Timothy TERRELL** (1705-1763) who d. Orange Co. NC. He m. **Mary MARTIN**, had 14 children listed, but no Hezekiah.

Ibid., p. 236-238; Micajah TERRELL (1746 NC-1805 MS) s/o Timothy & Mary MARTIN TERRELL m. Hannah GOODMAN. His will named wife, Hannah, daughter Mary P. TERRELL; sons Archibald, Timothy, and Samuel TERRELL. This Timothy bought land from his father Micajah in Cumberland Co. NC in 1800, the deed witnessed by Archibald TERRELL and Mary Hawkins Terrell. [Now we have another Timothy old enough to father your Hezekiah, but nothing to connect them.]

Ibid., p. 243; DICKEN says **Timothy TERRELL**, s/o **Micajah & Hannah** was in Adams County MS by 1803 and in Lawrence Co. MS in 1817 but she found no later record of him.

Ibid., p. 245; same **Timothy TERRELL**, no additional info.

Ibid., p. 247; **James TERRELL**, s/o **Timothy** of NC went to GA.

Ibid., p. 249 **Timothy TERRELL** b. 1832 GA; p. *Ibid.*, p. 252; 258 more on descendants of **Timothy and Mary MARTIN TERRELL**, no Hezekiah.

Ibid., p. 261, 264, 271-272; descendants of **John TERRELL** of NC again.

Ibid., p. 279-280 283,; William TERRELL of Halifax County VA will 10/22/1792 — 06/26/1797 named 10 children including Timothy TERRELL. Timothy appears on tax roll in 1791 only. One Timothy TERRELL, possibly the same moved to Elbert County GA. He d. 1826. List of heirs did not include a Hezekiah.

CONCLUSION: I have not found anything to prove the parentage of your **Hezekiah TERRELL**. At best, I have done nothing more than provide some candidates and some (hopefully new) sources to explore. I have invested hours in this article. Days, weeks, months, or even years in this endeavor could prove equally fruitless. *DFB*

Emma Dicken debated whether or not William TERRELL (who married Susannah WATERS) was Richmond's son or his brother in her 1952 book Terrell Genealogy (pp. 14-19). Indeed Richmond did have a brother named William (b. 1629) who is suspected of also visiting Virginia; however, Emma concluded (p. 19) that the William TERRELL who married Susannah WATERS was the son of Richmond. You are the first person I've encountered who challenges this conclusion. However, old theories are replaced by new ones when evidence is discovered. If you feel you have a better explanation, I hope you will share it with the Terrell Society.

Thanks for your response. I don't have evidence to challenge/doubt Emma Dicken 's theory, that **Richmond TERRELL** was the father of **William TERRELL** who married **Susannah WATERS**. Somehow I gained the impression it was a theory, nothing more. In fact, I apparently don't have a copy of p. 19 from Emma Dicken's book on the TERRELL family, which may explain my lack of information and doubts.

In 1990, from the records I have seen, I formed my own conclusion: "There is no question that **Richmond TERRELL** had a son named **William** born circa 1660 in Virginia. But there was another **William TERRELL**, Virginia-born and of a similar age, who also could be Richmond's son. I find no records eliminating the one and supporting the other as the true son of Richmond: further, I have found no male child named **Richmond** listed among the known descendants of **William and Susannah** (WATERS) **TERRELL**."

I may have formed an incorrect conclusion, of course. It seems you are convinced by Emma Dicken's conclusion, to the point that you claim Richmond as your ancestor. I am aware that Emma Dicken's work is highly regarded.

I'll try to find a copy of her book in order to make a copy of page 19.

There was information new to me in the report you sent — the death date (29 Jan. 1812) of Henry **TERRELL II,** for example. The endnotes are much appreciated. I have yet to review the entire report, much of which agrees with my research. Certain portions disagree, too. For example, in Generation No. 2, Henry Chiles TERRELL and Miss REDD are incorrectly shown as parents of 5 children, including Henry Keeling TERRELL. Emma Dicken lists the TERRELL-REDD marriage, and one child: Catherine TERRELL b. 1790 (Dicken, pp. 196-7). I have a copy of the death certificate for **Henry** Keeling TERRELL (1808-1908), which names his parents: Henry C. TERRELL and Phila. SMITH. According to Orange Co., VA marriage records, "Delphia Smith" and "Henry C. TERRELL" m. 1809, years after the birth of their oldest child (Richard, 1796). I am told delayed marriages were not uncommon.

Emma Dicken's conclusion that William was the son of **Richmond** is a theory. It was based on her analysis of the few known facts. Because of her extreme expertise in TERRELL research and her logical explanation for reaching that conclusion, I have not previously seen the decision challenged. Regarding the claim that there is no male child named "Richmond" listed among the known descendants of William TERRELL & Susannah WATERS: Not true. Richmond TERRELL, the emigrant, had two children known to us: Richmond TERRELL II (b. 1656, m. ?) and William TER-RELL (b. 1659-60, m. Susannah WATERS). Both had descendants named "Richmond," although none of William's own children were named "Richmond." Here is my list, so far:

In contrast, **Timothy TERRILL**, who was NOT descended from **Richmond TERRELL** (and whose early descendants settled in Orange Co, Va.), had no known descendants named "Richmond."

As to Henry Chiles TERRELL and Miss REDD. The great majority of my TERRELL database is an aggregate of the research of other persons. I try to be careful to cite all my sources in my endnotes. A few times there are contradictions of essential information. Many times, more recent researchers will add knowledge (such as additional children) to what is already known from the Dicken research. Also, I spend a great deal of time doing census and other research from federal records at the National Archives. Based on the information you have provided, I have moved Henry Keeling TERRELL from Miss REDD to Philadelphia SMITH.

Occasionally, a researcher publishes information which is dead wrong (linked to the wrong ancestor), but most of the time they simply become stuck. That's where I try to help out. In exchange, I get data from them. They are working from the present to the past, and I'm working from the past to the present. We both have something to exchange. *Don C. TERRILL*

EDITOR'S NOTE: I do not know who first espoused the theory that the William TERRELL who m. Susannah WATERS was the son of William TERRELL, merchant of London, and therefore nephew of Richmond. I do not know what, if

any, documentation supports this theory. I am aware that Judge **John D. TERRELL** of AL wrote in his later years that William & Susannah m. in New York City (then New Amsterdam, *Trails*, *p. 1388*). He must have been told that by an ancestor. Unless it was a chance meeting while both were enroute to somewhere else, it is highly unlikely. Travel was too difficult in the late 1600s to go from VA to NY just to marry. I do not now if those below who were discussing this issue were aware of Judge TERRELL's tradition on their marriage.

I know that the topic was discussed in phone conversations, letters, and in some cases in person between: the late Mr. **Lawrence LeStourgeon** of Charlotte, NC; the late Mr. **Jeddie Mack Terrell**, of Concord, NC, one of our former V-Ps; Mr. **Banks McLaurin** of Dallas, TX; and possibly others. As far as I know, they neither proved, disproved, nor agreed upon their differences of opinion.

When the Society began tentative plans to do an Encyclopedia of American Terrells, we asked Mr. **Jeddie Mack Terrell** to do the *Prologue*. This section is intended to *TRY* to either *prove* or *refute* the *Adamic Chart* that has been circulating for about 100 years allegedly tracing the ancestry of the **American TERRELLS** back to **Adam & Eve**.

Jeddie TERRELL stated that he was a historian, not a genealogist. He sincerely believed that the chart is based on *ancient recorded facts*. I still believe it is *pure mythology*. Everyone has an opinion about the Adamic Chart — Jeddie's, mine, or yours which can be anywhere between fact and mythology.

Mr. **TERRELL** completed the first draft of this chart containing 131 generations from **Adam** to **William TERRELL** who m. **Susannah**.

William TERRELL (131) [Son of William & Martha of London] Emigrated to New Kent Co. VA in his late teens about 1675 and being too young to own property, lived in the care of his uncle, **Richmond**. In 1688, he m. **Susannah WATERS**, (the niece of her namesake, **Susan Elizabeth Mary WATERS**), they had 8 children, all b. New Kent Co. VA.

Jeddie included the following facts and observations for use in the *Prologue*. We hope you will find them informative or at least interesting.

Spelling by phonics usually changed the original spelling of the names of most emigrants into America during the 17th. and 18th. centuries. The name has been observed spelled three different ways in the same document. Most often a dialect spoken caused a phonic spelling change.

The *Adamic* chart of genealogy was apparently drawn up several hundred years ago by the Vatican for the **Hapsburg** family of Austria. At least the first twenty generations are taken from "*The Book of Jubilees*" which is a book of the family genealogies kept by the Patriarchs. It is written in *Akkadian* which was the language spoken up until *the Tower of Babel*. The wives and women's names were recorded in the *Book of Jubilees*.

Even translated into English it is difficult to understand until you work out the dating system and translate it into the Gregorian Calendar.

Briefly, a jubilee is a period of 49 years. The month was 28 days based on the orbit of the Moon and the days were called by number. They had 13 months to the year and were called Moons. The week was a period of 7 years and 7 weeks made a Jubilee.

Noah's children are recorded in *the Book of Jubilees* and their children and grandchildren are recorded in the *Table of Nations* recorded in the 10th. Chapter of the Book of *Genesis*.

The dating system used in the center column of the *King James Bible* was devised and drawn up in the later part of the 17th. Century by **James Ussher**, Bishop of Amaigh, Ireland. Bishop **Lloyd** had the system adopted by the Church Fathers and added to the *King James Bible* in 1702. This was the last thing ever added before final adoption.

Bishop **Ussher** had only one child, a daughter named **Elizabeth**. She was married to Sir **Humphry Tyrrell** of Oakly for over 50 years and bore him 14 children and all were reared beyond maturity.

Apparently **Joseph Henry Tyrrell** had access to this *Magna Chart* when he compiled his first book on the Terrell family line. While verification of the validity of the line cannot be documented, it may be taken to be basically correct. The *Vatican* has for many hundreds of years collected and assembled

the writings of many different languages based on Kings in order to establish an accepted and working calendar of reference. Even then, based on **Augustus Caesar**, there was a four year error because Pope **Gregory** failed to recognize that **Augustus** had served 4 years as **Octavius** before being declared as **Augustus** by the Roman Senate. To transfer all of the known king references of period rule to the *Gregorian Calendar* was a monumental task and took many years of scribe work. **The Pope could support or deny the authority of a king based on Genealogy.**

Genealogy became very important to the church because of God's many references to the subject and great efforts were made to collect and keep accurate information on family lineage.

Hebrew Rabbis must chase their lineage back to **Aaron** (**Moses**' brother) and their wives must have a clean genealogy for at least five generations.

History and Genealogy go together because one cannot truly be studied without the study of the other. Even Mythology is composed of Genealogical relationships.

Fictious characters such as Sherlock Holmes and the Lone Ranger were given genealogies by their authors for the purpose of giving some background to their existence to make them more acceptable as living characters. Those genealogies are interesting to read even though they are knowingly made up and false.

While Census records were kept on kings to prove their right to rule, most of the kings called for a census of the people for the purpose of knowing the ownership of properties and to control the collection of taxable tribute. They too reflected the genealogy of the people.

This country is a Republic and not a Kingship, but requires a census be taken ever ten years and basically for the same purposes that they have always been taken and they still reflect the genealogy of the people.

The census is not without error or even complete and becomes less accurate each decade because of illegal immigration and illegal identities. This does not pose a large problem yet as the 1920 census is the latest available to the public and the errors are present, but will increase with the 1930 census because of the great depression and the population movement.

If a *class* were to be applied to the **Terrell** Line it would be the "*Warrior*" class from 2000BC until 1500AD with only a very few exceptions. The Terrell line males seldom died in bed, but rather died in Battle.

After 1500AD they settled down to being *tradesmen and farmers*, but kept their swords sharp and handy. Politically the first born males became lawmen while the second born became churchmen and the other males became soldiers or tradesmen. This was generally dictated by their size, wealth and temperament. The families were usually clannish in nature and put forth great efforts to keep peace in their homes.

Several generations after coming to America the Terrells began to leave farming and have gone into all walks of life. This [planned] Encyclopedia should cover the last 350 years of Terrells in America. We have some Terrells in South America who left North America during and after the Civil War who may no longer speak English.

Apparently **Jeddie Terrell** accepted the traditional lineage that has been cited since about 1910, except that he disagreed with **DICKEN** about the parents of **William who m. Susannah**. If he had any documentation to support his theory, he did not share it with us before his death.

Documents uncovered by the *TYRRELL FAMILY HISTORY SOCIETY* in England have failed to prove the family tradition of having descended from the TYRRELLS of Thornton. The last word we

have from there is that the proof now ends with **William**, the accepted father of **Robert TYRRELL** of Reading, England. *DFB*

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OLD NAMING PATTERNS

The first son was named after the father's father.

The second son was named after the mother's father.

The third son was named after the father.

The fourth son was named after the fathers eldest brother.

The first daughter was named after the mother's mother.

The second daughter was named after the father's mother.

The third daughter was named after the mother.

The fourth daughter was named after the mothers eldest sister, always.

ALSO:

2nd wife's oldest daughter named after the first wife, using her full name.

Children after those listed above were usually named after a favorite relative with some possible exceptions:

If a child died in infancy, a later child might be given the same name. When a newly ordained minister baptized his first child, if that child were a boy, he would be named for the minister, if a girl, she would receive his surname as her middle name.

If a child were fostered, usually because of being orphaned, he may be named for the foster parent.

If you are sure that you have the earliest birth or baptisms and that they are in the correct order then,

if John's first son is named Charles and his second daughter is named Elizabeth then John's parents *might* be Charles and Elizabeth.
