[Member #60] **Kathryne Elizabeth TERRELL
Voelker**, 88, a former Indiana college teacher who
later taught classes at Mount Olivet United Methodist
Church in Arlington [VA], died of cardiac arrest April
15 [2000] at home in Arlington.

Mrs. Voelker was born in Martin County IN. She
graduated from Indiana University then spent a year
at the University of Paris, where she took courses for
teachers of French in foreign countries.

On returning to the United States, she received a master's degree in French and English from Indiana University.

Later, she taught French at the main campus of Indiana University in Bloomington and also at branches in Fort Wayne, East Chicago, and Gary.

In 1954 she moved to Dahlgren, VA when her husband **Donald E. VOELKER** became head of the training division at the Naval Weapons Laboratory there.

They settled in Arlington when he joined the National Aeronautics and Space Administration in 1962. He died in 1993.

At Mount Olivet United Methodist Church, Mrs. Voelker taught classes about her research into the life and influence of **Susanna Wesley**, the mother of **John & Charles WESLEY** who founded the Methodist movement in England. Two years ago, a women's group at the church was named for Mrs. Voelker. Her avocations included genealogical research, travel, playing bridge, and gardening.

She is survived by two nieces and two nephews. Memorial service April 18, 4 pm at Mt. Olivet United Methodist Church, Arlington. In lieu of flowers, memorial contributions may be made to the Donald and Kathyne Voelker Fund of Mt. Olivet UMC.

Robert TERRELL the father of **John TERRELL** below. Robert TERRELL's Will, *Terrell Genealogy* book by **Emma Dickens** (Bledsoe #145). **Robert Sr.** is in the DAR Patriot Index, Centennial Edition, Part 3, Page 2935. Was in the Rev. War listed for Patriotic service (PS).

Robert (Terrill) TERRELL (III) Sr., a patriot of advanced age, not only gave sons and grandsons, but occasionally furnished supplies for the Revolution Army. Two instances remain matters of record. On December 1, 1780, and on July 20, 1781, he supplied for the public service, to-wit the Revolutionary Army, 550 pounds of beef and 275 pounds of beef, respectively, as indicated by record of Orange Co., VA. (Order Book 1774-1789, pp. 177, 178, 202 and 205). The Revolutionary service of his son, **Robert (Terrill) TERRELL (IV)**, and of his

grandson, **William (Terrill) TERRELL**, have previously been proved.

She lists the wife of **Henry TERRELL** as **Lilda HILLIARD**. Mr. Terrell obviously knows the correct name of his mother so we must assume that DICKEN erred in this case.]

8. **John Francis TERRELL** (1930--Living) & **Frances Lorene WALKER** (1925--1994) children: **William Lewis; & Donald Lee**. [This family not listed in DICKEN]

Of interest is that **Henry and Maria DUGGAN TERRELL, John Tyler & Alice Darden TERRELL and Henry Alonzo and Mina Linda HILERT** are all buried in the Old San Geronimo Cemetery in Seguin TX. I have previously submitted a photo of the tombstone of Henry and Maria.

As noted in DICKEN, there is some dispute over the parentage of **William & Susannah**.. The document lists **Robert TYRRELL** who m. **Jane BALDWIN** as having sons **Richmond and William**. I placed William as his father, but also added a note that he may be son of Richmond.

It has been very interesting to research my family. While my document relates to my basic family line, I did include a little about my distant cousins. I determined that both **Robert Adams TERRELL** for whom the city of Terrell TX was named and **Alexander Watkins TERRELL** for whom Terrell County was named are both sixth cousins.

As always, I will share my info with others. *I am still trying to obtain information about the wagon train [carrying Terrells] to Mexico following the*

Jim,I received your 14 July e-mail asking about Joseph Terrill, b. 1873, Pa., and saying "He was born in Penn and said his father was born in New Jersey."

With the limited amount of information you provided, I checked several sources:

- a. He is apparently not one of the Southern Terrills in my own database.
- b. I thought he might be one of the Pa./N.J. Terrills in Audrey MacLennan's 1994 book, but he is not.
- c. I checked the "Tirrell Tirrill-Terrill Tyrrell Book" (1969)(New England Terrills), but found no likely candidates.
- d. I checked "Roger and Abigail (Ufford) Terrill and Some Descendants 1632-1993" (1995) (New England Terrills), but found no likely candidates.

Perhaps Mr. Brinson will run this query in the *Terrell Trails* newsletter, but it would be helpful if you would provide him additional dates and places concerning Joseph Terrill's life.

My name is **Chuck Dickerson** and I am researching my Winnfield/Winn Parish family history. Thank you all for all of your effort.

My father's family is from the Winnfield/Winn Parish area. My father's father (my grandfather) was **Authur Monroe DICKERSON** son of **Matthew Monroe DICKERSON** and **Isadorah JONES**.

Matthew Monroe DICKERSON was the son of **John Joseph DICKERSON** and **Mary Margaret JACKSON**.

Isadorah JONES was the daughter of **William Tunley JONES** and **Martha Ann Caroline MC CARTY**. My father's mother (my grandmother) was **Susan Elizabeth ALLEN** daughter of **Archie Lee ALLEN** and **Maddie Abigail TERRAL**.

I believe **Archie Lee ALLEN**'s father was **Albert H. ALLEN**.

Maddie Abigail TERRAL was the daughter of **Asa Larkin TERRAL** and **Susan Elizabeth HIGHT**.

I am writing you in hopes that you might be able to provide me either some additional information on my ancestors (as listed above) or guidance on where to search for additional information locally in the Winnfield/Winn Parish area.

Both my father and I live in Mississippi now but hope to soon travel to the Winnfield/Winn Parish area to visit some of the gravesites of our ancestors and hopefully do a little research in the local archives (library? and/or court house?, etc.). I thought I would check with you and see if you might have any personal records or insight as to what / when / where to search locally.

The questions I am trying to answer are who were **John Joseph Dickerson's** and **Mary Margaret Jackson's** parents? Where did they live? What did they do? Etc. I know that John Joseph had a brother **William H. Dickerson** and that William H. married Mary Margaret Jackson's sister **Elizabeth Julia Jackson**. I also know that John Joseph and William H. ran a saw mill, farmed, and were active in the church and community. According to the 1870 census (online at the Winn Parish USGenWeb site) both John Joseph and William H. list their place of birth as North Carolina, however in 1880 they both list it as South Carolina. The 1898 Voter Registration Records (also on line at the Winn Parish USGenWeb site) indicates John Joseph's place of birth in NC.

I also believe from other land records that both John Joseph and brother, William H., moved to Winn Parish from Jackson Parish sometime in the late 1850's. Before that they may have moved to Jack-

son Parish from somewhere in Texas. I have no information on the ancestors of the Jackson sisters. Of course, I have all of the birth/death/marriage dates on most of these ancestors as well.

I am doing fairly well on **Isadorah Jones** family history since they moved to Winn Parish from Mississippi.

The **Allens** and **Terrals** are still somewhat of a mystery though.

Any help or guidance you can provide would be greatly appreciated. I have only been actively researching my family history for a few months now. Do you know of any other researchers actively researching any of these lines that I might could contact?

I do thank you again so very much for all of your time and effort. I hope to hear from you soon.

What would be the recommendation for doing research in 1811 Mathew's County? This is new territory for me, as my entire family has been from Norfolk. Yesterday I found the death record in the Registers for **A F TARRELL**, a widow who died in 1885 at age 74 with her birthplace listed as Mathew's. We have been assuming her maiden

name was **FERNANDEZ**, a name that is in Norfolk back to the early 1700s when **Abraham FERNANDEZ** is listed in colonial Records as a shipper. **Anne F** (how she is listed on her son's death cert.) was married to **Nicholas TARRALL** who died between 1862-7 and is buried in Cedar Grove Norfolk (where she is also listed, no gravestone found) on the plot of **Joseph FERNANDEZ**, a gent the age of their children. Nicholas was once (and now again) thought to be the Nicholas listed in Kingston Parish born 1776 or so (we thought that would make him too old but have to rethink now) to Michael and Susanna Tyrell. All of my research has shown only one other Nicholas in all of Va (in 1850 in Louisa Co). Any suggestions?

I saw your posting on rootsweb.. I liked the one about the **PRESSLEYS**, because the line of **TERRELL, SHEPARD, ANDERSON** are connected to the **PRESSLEYS** and **Elvis's** family in particular, he had an uncle **Willie** or a cousin Willie who died in the fifties early sixties maybe forties and this person whom I am researching for went to Willie's funeral and Elvis was there. Here is what i have so far would appreciate an expert **TERRELL** person to help me..

The 1860 census of Yorkville, Gibson Co, Tenn. (p. 157/277) shows **William TERRELLE**, age 70 with daughter (or granddaughter) **Julie Ann TERRILL** age 9. This may be your Julia.

The 1850 census of Gibson Co, Tenn (p. 227) shows **William TERRILL**, age 52, with wife **Elizabeth**. This is probably the same William as above. In 1850 he is co-located with **George TERRILL**, age 74, of Virginia -- probably William's father.

I have not been able to identify this particular clan; however, I am inclined to think that this **George TERRILL** may be the same George TERRILL who is the father of **Achilles TERRILL** (and whose clan is identified). The disconnect is that my records show that my George married **Sarah STEPHENSON**; whereas, the 1850 census shows that George (above, father of William) is married to "**Martha**" (age 79).

Do you have any additional information regarding the parents of your **William TERRELL**?

John Dabney TERRELL [Jr.] were 1st cousins. Regrettably, I have no further information on either **Robert** or **William**.

4. I have a **Thomas Willis TERRELL** (b. 1846, Shelby, Ala.) who married **Cynthia CANTRELL** (b. 1844). He is probably the **Thomas Washington TERRELL**. I have no further information on their lives. I can tell you that **Thomas** was the son of **William A. TERRELL & Samantha GLASSCOCK**. William A. TERRELL was 1st cousin to John and Edwin, above.

I did a thorough search of my database. I have six **Lewis TERRELLs**, but none of them fit. I did a search of all TERRELLs recorded in the 1850 and 1860 census of Caroline Co, Va. There were no likely candidates. I did a search of all Lewis TERRELLs recorded in the 1850 and 1860 census of all the southern states, and there were no likely candidates. I'm still trying to construct a listing of all TERRELLs in the 1870 census, but haven't yet gotten to Virginia. It took me a year to compile the 1850 and 1860 lists. I've often wondered how peo-

ple can be bypassed by two or more census. The birth date of daughter **Lucy** suggests that he may have been born after 1860.

I'm sorry I couldn't help. I have, perhaps, the most complete database of southern TERRELL genealogy, and it is constantly growing. Perhaps I'll eventually find him.

Attached is my chapter on the COOK family of northern Conecuh if you wish to post it to the Conecuh County page. They lived originally in Fork of the Sepulga between present Mixonville and Old Texas. As you can see, they intermarried with many early families. **Bill Daniel**

The family of COOKs discussed here were early settlers of Conecuh County, Alabama, there being three siblings whose parents I have sought to identify; that is, **Samuel Wiles COOK, James R. COOK & Maranda COOK Etheridge**. We know from early census records that their mother was **Edy or Edith COOK** who was a widow by 1830 but their father remains a mystery.

Certainly one of the earliest records of the inhabitants of Conecuh County, Alabama is the tax list for 1819 and since all of the early county records have been destroyed, it remains an invaluable source of

information. On this list, there were five **COOKs** - **Samuel & James (together)** and **Henry, John and Isaac COOK (together)**.

D. Mary Marranda ETHERIDGE - born Feb 23, 1850 in Conecuh County, AL - married 1) Dec 26, 1867 in Conecuh County, AL to **Samuel Terrell HIGDON** (born April 6, 1846 in Wilcox County, AL - died Nov 1, 1883), son of **John W. & Elizabeth (HENDERSON) HIGDON**; 2) c1887 to **John C. ANTHONY** - died 1931 or 1936 in Jay, Santa Rosa County, FL - buried Jay, FL.

Issue by **Samuel Terrell HIGDON**:

1. **Elizabeth Marranda HIGDON** - born Dec 24, 1871 in Wilcox County, AL - married **Asberry Jackson HAWSEY** - died Aug 28, 1948 in Santa Rosa County, FL.

With respect to my agreeing to take 1000 dollars it is not the fact; had I have made such a consent, I would have written you --- I feel very solicitous in having a decision situated as matters are, I find it will be impossible to have a hearing until the spring session ---

I have stated the situation of our suit to the members from this County, and I have every reason to believe that they will make such appointments & arrangements to bring us to fair trail --- **Doctor Claibern** is a member from this County. I have made him acquainted with the whole business, and I have not a doubt, but he will do everything in his power to facilitate a recovery of the suit, one way or the other.

It is said that Judge **Jackson** is about to retire, Judge **White** also, if so two disinterested characters will be appointed, and I flatter myself all will be well --- This being the state of the business, With sentiments of ____ and respect

ROBERT ADAMS TERRELL

Robert Adams TERRELL was born 11/Feb/1820 in Murfreesboro, TN. His parents were **James TERRELL & Penelope Lynch ADAMS**. (James and Penelope m. 16/June/1798 in Campbell Co. VA).

Robert married **Emily LOVE**, daughter of **John Gilbert LOVE & Rebecca EXUM** on 26/Mar/1846. Emily was born 17/Jun/1826 in TX (when TX was still part of Mexico) and died 23/Jun/1866 in Kaufman Co. TX. He died in Terrell, TX on 08/Mar/1881. His second wife was **Nancy Amelia LOVE Terrell** (a distant cousin of Emily's), widow of **Jonathan Wilson TERRELL**. Robert & Nancy had no children together. They married 09/Apr/1868.

Children of Robert & Emily LOVE TERRELL (per Robert A. TERRELL's family bible):

1. **Christopher Irvine TERRELL** born 30/Dec/1846 in TX and died 26/Jan/1855.

4. **Unnamed male infant** born 17/Jan/1853 and died 18/Jan/1853
5. **John Love TERRELL** born 10/Apr/1854 in Kaufman Co. TX and married **Celestia W. PHILLIPS** on 30/Nov/1875 in Kaufman Co. TX and died 29/Oct/1924 in Dallas, Dallas Co., TX.
6. **James Robert TERRELL** was born 21/Apr/1856 in Kaufman Co. TX and married **Mary BROYLES**.
7. **Josephus Whitfield TERRELL** was born 26/Feb/1858 in Kaufman Co. and married 18/Jan/1882 in Terrell, Kaufman, TX (Terrell became a city in 1873) to **Florence ROWELL**. He died in 1938 in Royse City, Rockwall Co. TX.
8. **William Alexander TERRELL** was born 09/Oct/1860 in Kaufman Co. TX and married **Mattie RAGSDALE** on 17/Jan/1883 in Gaines-

ville, Cook Co., TX. . He died in 1948 in Royse City, Rockwall Co. TX.

9. **Emma Lela TERRELL** was born 19/Apr/1864 in Kaufman Co. TX. She married **William B. TOONE** on 24/Jun/1884 in Daingerfield, Morris Co., TX. She died 26/Jun/1952 in Dallas, Dallas Co., TX.

JONATHAN WILSON TERRELL

Jonathan Wilson TERRELL was born in 1816 in Virginia. He married first **Azelia A. JOHNSON**, daughter of **Abner JOHNSON** in Calloway County, KY on 04/July/1843. They had a son, **Thomas Olynthus TERRELL** who was born in 1849 and died June 1850 in Kaufman Co. TX. They had no other children.

Jonathan Wilson TERRELL next married **Nancy Amelia LOVE**, daughter of **William Harvey LOVE** and **Nancy Amelia KIRK**, on 04/May/1854. J. W. died on 16/Feb/1861 at Rocky Cedar, Kaufman Co. TX. He ran a mercantile store and was postmaster. J. W.'s and Nancy's children were:

1. **Jonathan Olynthus TERRELL** born 06/Apr/1856 in Kaufman Co. TX. He married 12/Dec/1877 in Terrell TX to **Mattie SIMPSON**. He died 28/Jun/1923 in San Antonio, Bexar Co., TX. A whole book could be written about J. O. He was a lawyer, a state legislator and a republican candidate for governor of Texas. His descendants still live in San Antonio (Terrell Heights is named for him). His son was Speaker of the House of Representatives for Texas.
2. **Thomasia O. TERRELL** was born 16/Jun/1858 and died 26/Jan/1859.
3. **Annie Amelia TERRELL** was born August 1860 in Kaufman Co. TX and was married 01/jan/1883 in Terrell TX to **Alfred Harrison ABLES** and died in 1936 in Kaufman Co. TX.

JOHN TERRELL

Jonathan Wilson TERRELL was the son of **John TERRELL** (not John H. as **Emma Dicken** states. Never in his probate papers is he listed as anything but John. John had a *nephew* about the same time period named **John H.**) John was born

24/May/1784 and his parents were **Jonathan TERRELL and Margaret HUNNICUTT.**

John was married to **Sarah** at the time of his death. We do not know whether she is his first wife.

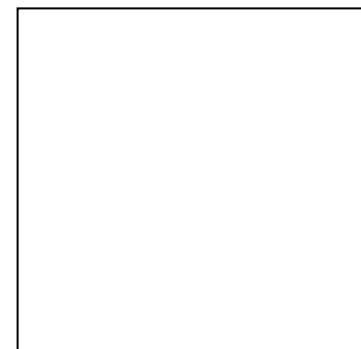
Terrell named 'Outstanding Citizen of Year' by Chamber

Webster describes the word servant as "one who works diligently for a cause" a description which certainly fits **Robert Steely "Bobby" Terrell**. [Member # 129] Terrell was recently named 2000 outstanding Citizen of the Year by the Greater Corbin Area Chamber of Commerce.

He will be honored as Grand Marshall of the NI-BROC Parade and will be presented a plaque commemorating the honor.

Since returning to his native home of Corbin in



1996, Terrell, like his father, former Corbin Mayor, **Steely Terrell**, has played a very active roll in the community.

Terrell's most recent challenge was serving as fundraiser for the

new Ossie Burch Field House.

In his role as fundraiser, Terrell has worked unselfishly to raise funds for the facility, speaking at various civic clubs and groups, making contact, either in person or by phone, to garner financial support for this project.

The culmination of his efforts on behalf of the field house project will take place on September 15, when the Coach Ossie Burch Field House will be dedicated.

Terrell was a 1951 graduate of Corbin [KY] High School. After graduating, he attended the University of Louisville on a basketball scholarship. He graduated in 1955 with a BA in Economics from Georgetown College. He holds a honorary Master of Law degree from Cumberland College, and institution which he has supported over the years.

After graduating from Georgetown, Terrell served three years in the Marine Corps. In 1989, he retired from a 30 year career with Ford Motor Company and began a second career as president of Fred Jones Enterprises.

Shortly after returning home in 1996, Terrell was asked to help raise funds for the Burch Field house a project which he said has shown the love and dedication that Corbin people have for their community.

"There is a real outstanding community spirit here. This building is a good example of what people have been able to accomplish working together," Terrell said., adding that even people who have been gone from Corbin for years still consider Corbin their home.

"I think it's amazing how there's still a great loyalty on the part of people who don't live here anymore but they still come home and this is where their heart is," he said, adding that about 30 percent of the donations for the field house have come from former Corbin citizens who have moved away.

Even though he appreciates the honor of being named Outstanding Citizen of the Year, Terrell said it is an award that he would like to share.

"I guess I just with this award could be split up in little pieces and given to all the people who have contributed and worked on the Ossie Burch Field House," Terrell said. "I've got a hundred stories of

people that helped at the right time just when we thought we were vulnerable and had to raise more money quickly, people came through at the right time. I have a lot of good memories of these last two years of people that sacrificed and stepped forward to help us. Those people deserve the award"

Terrell said he also is proud of his former teammates who have stepped forward to help with the project. He also recalled the support of three friends who passed away before the facility was completed Coach Ossie Burch, Ed White, and Roy Gilliam.

"I was just thinking about even though these people are deceased, their good works go on after they're gone. We will celebrate in their honor," Terrell said.

Terrell explained that the one thing that seems to make Corbin unique among hometowns is the loyalty that people have for the town. "There is a bond of friendship that exists that just seems to carry on. I've been very blessed to get to come back here and have my health hold up good enough to come back and get to be back with my buddies and people I grew up with. They have been so helpful. When I'd get a little bit discouraged, there was always some of my friends there to help out and give me a boost."

"There's a loyalty among Corbin people. Wherever you run into one of them anywhere in the world, there's a certain pride and feeling of loyalty about the community," he added. Terrell said he wishes to express his appreciation to the people of Corbin.

"I feel a little selfish in getting an honor when I ought to be honoring them," he said. "I'm going to accept it on behalf of them."

Terrell and his wife **Phyllis** have five children: **Linda, Marcy, Patty, Bob & Ron.**

Mr. Terrell provided a copy of the above article when he renewed his membership in March, 2001. He included a personal note, "My ancestors settled in Kentucky in the late 1700s and early 1800s, and it is good to be back where I started. We have three grandchildren here in Corbin and we are enjoying them very much."

ENGLAND LATEST INFO

Editor's note: The following information is from TFHS Newsletter Vol. 24, No. 2, Summer 2001. This is the latest and in my humble opinion (with due respect to all who believe otherwise) the most accurate information we have on the origins of the best known immigrants to the colony of Virginia. We sincerely thank Arthur and the other members of our sister society, The Tyrrell Family History Society in England for sharing this info. *DFB*

The Terrills of West Hagbourne and Richmond Terrell

As I mentioned in my report, I have exchanged much correspondence with **Don Terrill** about the Terrills/Terrells of Hagbourne and **Richmond Terrell's** family. In view of the outcome of this exchange of correspondence, I thought that it would be better to write a separate report on this topic. Members will recall that in the Summer 2000 newsletter I published two trees and wrote about this subject reaching the conclusion that **Richmond Terrell** of Reading *may not* have descended from the **Terrills** of Hagbourne. Since then, I have had access to copies of most of the wills of the Hagbourne Terrills and this has caused me to change my views. I shall explain later.

The first letter that I received from **Don** indicated that for some time it was believed that **Timothy Terrill** (b. 1656) who married **Elizabeth Foster** was a son of **Richmond Terrell**. In **O. F. Brown's** book, he concluded that **Timothy** was probably descended from the **Tyrrold** clan of Hagbourne rather than from **Robert** of Reading. Don has been actively compiling a comprehensive database of the descendants of **Richmond Terrell** and **Timothy**. He

has concluded that **Timothy** was not descended from **Richmond Terrell**. By way of proof, he offers the following facts:

1. The descendants of **Timothy Terrill and Elizabeth Foster** have generally adhered to the spelling "**Terrill**", whereas the descendants of **Richmond** have generally adhered to the spelling of "**Terrell**."
2. Among the descendants of Richmond Terrell's two sons, (**Richmond II & William**) he has discovered 22 persons named **Richmond Terrell**, whereas from among **Timothy's** many descendants, he has found *none*.

The research by the TFHS that was published in March 1996 newsletter by **John Tyrrell** (645) also reinforces this conclusion, as does my own conclusion as shown in the tree that I published in the Summer 2000 newsletter.

An issue that concerned **Don** from both conclusions shown by **John Tyrrell** (645) in the March 1996 newsletter and from my tree in the Summer 2000 newsletter was regarding the age of **Timothy** who died circa 1656. He would have had to be 63-64 or more when he fathered **Timothy** who was born in 1656. He was wondering if a generation had been missed out of the trees.

Whilst it is obviously possible to have a child at the age of 64 it might on the face of it seem improbable? However, although **Robert's** death was around 1592 this was in fact the date of his will and he may well have lived longer. Also, there is no mention of **Timothy** in his will so it may be that he like his own son was born posthumously. It is also a fact that many of the male Tyrrells in this family married women much younger than themselves, e.g. Timothy the father of Timothy the Remembrancer of London. He was baptized at St. Mary Reading in 1693, married Elizabeth, the widow of John of Hambledon, in 1754 and had two children who were baptized in 1755 and 1764. Thus making him 71 when his second child was born. I am therefore of the opinion that the trees as shown are correct as far as we can prove.

Don's next query came from one of his members of the Terrell Society of America, a **James Van Der Mark** who is a descendant from **William Terrell** (b. 1629) (**Richmond Terrell's** brother). Don was asking if we had any reason to believe that **William** did or did not immigrate to America. My searches of our records found that there were two main camps into which researches had fallen about William. The first group shows one **William** born 1629 marrying a **Martha Washington** and dying in 1729. This would make him 100 years of age. Possible, but not probable. Some show him marrying a **Susannah Walters** [*not Waters*, but note the similarity, *DFB*] and having several children. The second group suggests that he immigrated to New Kent Virginia some time after 1657. Married a **Martha** date unknown, surname unknown, but family tradition says her name was **Washington**. They had two children, **William** born about 1657 and an unknown daughter. **William**, their son married a **Susannah Walters** some time before 1690 and had at least 8 children and it is this **William** who died in 1729. I am inclined to support the second group in their conclusions. Certainly our records state that he went to America in 1657 although it is stated in **O. F. Brown's** book that he may have gone to Virginia in 1667. It would seem that he was in London in March 1657 when his brother, **Robert**, returned from Virginia. It is possible that he may have returned to Virginia with him.

As a result of dealing with these queries and consulting with **John Tyrrell** (645) who has carried out much research in conjunction with **Joanna Crabtree** and the late **Frances Jackson**, I took the opportunity to re-examine our records and was able to read the copy of wills that John (645) has for this family. I had not previously had the opportunity to see these wills and could only refer to those previously printed in the newsletters. I was particularly interested to check the family of **Robert Tirrold** and **Jane Baldwin** as both **Don** and **John** had previously concluded that he was from the Hagbourne family. I went through each will related to this line of the family which descends from **David Tyrrold**

circa 1577 and carefully listed all names and details of spouses, children, and other relatives mentioned in each will. I drew mini trees for each person so that I could see any connections with other members of the family. As a result, I updated my Hagbourne tree with the available details and have concluded that in fact **Robert Tyrrold** of Reading, the father of **Richmond Terrell** *does* descend from Hagbourne and is one of the three sons of **William Tyrrold** and **Elizabeth**, William being the son of **David** as shown on the revised tree enclosed.

Why have I come to this conclusion? Firstly, John (645) has seen the transcripts of St. Giles Reading and there is *no marriage* of a **William Terrell** to **Margaret Richmond**. Neither is there a baptism for a **Robert Terrell** 1592 at Reading. The only place this occurs is in the IGI index with no day or month of birth shown. It must therefore be suspect. Reading through the wills of **Davy** and **Francis**, they both refer to their brother **Robert**. **William** of Hagbourne, who married **Elizabeth** and who had a sister **Elenor** refers in his will to his three sons, **Francis**, **Robert**, and **Davy**, all of whom were under 21 years of age when he died. The fact that **Davy** and **Robert** were clothiers and **Francis** was a broadweaver also tends to suggest a link between them. Thus it is believed that the Reading trio are the sons of **William** of Hagbourne.

John has also pointed out to me that Frances Jackson's ancestor **Timothy** (1755--1832) and/or his son **Edward** (179[2?]-1881) and/or **Avery** (1840--1909) did much of the original research into this family and that the historical documents were recovered on **Avery's** death.

I must apologize to all those descendants personally involved with this family for setting off a false trail with my report in the Summer 2000 newsletter. However, as you will appreciate with so many similar name patterns being used throughout this family, it is very easy to make mistakes. I am extremely grateful to John Tyrrell (645) for his help with these inquiries and for loaning me the transcript wills. I trust that the enclosed tree may be somewhere near correct. However, as I have said before, we may never be able to prove the facts conclusively.

That article begins, "The legatees of **Robert TYRROLD** of Hagbourne in the county of Berkshire, whose will was proved on 13th August 1545, included his four sons, **William, David, Richard, and Avery**. . . **Avery** was appointed joint executor with his mother **Agnes**.

Therefore, I conclude that the father of **David TYRROLD** with whom Arthur begins the preceding chart was **Robert TYRROLD** and his wife, **Agnes**, was probably David's mother.

On page 1012-13, John noted that **Avery** (the executor above, brother of David) had his will proven 27th May 1584. Avery's executor was his son **Robert**, whose will was proven 7th May, 1592. This **Robert** left his estate to his wife, **Elienor & sons; William, Avery, & Robert**; daughters, **Elizabeth & Mary**, but did not mention a son **Timothy**. The date of Robert's death is unknown. He may have had a son **Timothy** either after he wrote his will, or posthumously.

John of TFHS concluded that **Timothie TIRRELL**, citizen and leather seller of London (will proven 11th Aug. 1656) was the son of above **Robert & Elinor** because he named brothers, **Robert, William, & Avery** and sister **Mary Waller** who under that same name also benefited from the will of her brother **William**.

Timothie, the leather seller, left a legacy "to the **child** my wife goes with," and to the poor of All Hallows.

The parish registers of All Hallows record the baptisms of three sons to **Timothy and Dorothy TYRRELL**: **Avery**, 28 August, 1647; **William** 25 August 1650 (buried 0 October 1651); and **Timothy** 5 December 1656. Avery is presumed to have died before 1656 since he is not named in the will.

John of TFHS concluded that it is probably the above **Timothy**, b. 1656 who married **Elizabeth FOSTER** in Virginia.

Regardless of whether you trace to **Richmond, William, or Timothy TERRELL** of VA, it appears that the lineage ends with **Robert & Agnes** of West Hagbourne in Berkshire, now part of Oxfordshire. The long accepted lineage through **William** to *Thornton manor* is proven to be false speculation, at least to my satisfaction. Unless someone discovers the parentage of Robert of Hagbourne, this will probably be the last article I publish on this subject. *DFB*

In the Summer issue of *Terrell Trails*, page 1428, lower left, you referred to a "*sketch of the TERRELL Family*" by Judge **John D. TERRELL** of AL, and that it might be buried in his writings in the Alabama Archives in Montgomery.

While recently visiting in AL I did some research at the AL Dept. of Archives & History, and looked for the subject sketch. I was shown a box of eleven folders of the Judge's materials from the "*Private Records Collection*" of the Archives.

These folders contained letters, accounts, legal papers, will, Indian affairs, math and memo books, Baptist Church papers, printed materials, and fragments of political opinions, but *NO TERRELL Family Sketch*. Its' location remains a mystery!

According to his papers, **John D. TERRELL** (1801-1885) of Marion Co., AL, was a planter, Circuit Clerk, and Probate Court Judge.

The Judge **John D. TERRELL** of Marion Co., AL whose material I searched in July in the "*Private Records Collections*" of the AL Archives was b. 1801 and d. 1885, per info in his papers.

This is not my line, but on the surface it appears they might have been father and son. In any case, if the records/files of **J.D.T. SR.** can be located, the *TERRELL Family Sketch* may yet be found.

Editor's Note: **DICKEN** frequently referred to a "*Terrell Family Sketch*" by John D. TERRELL. As noted on page 1387, John Dabney TERRELL, Sr. d. 10 May 1850 in Marion Co. AL. John Davis TERRELL d. Aug 1857 in Bladen Springs, AL. The fact that both of these died almost 50 years before the birth of the Judge John D. TERRELL whose papers were reviewed, it would appear that the archive has at least two files -- *unless the letter is buried somewhere in the "letters" in those eleven folders*. Also, the relationship between the two John D. TERRELLs (sketch writer & judge whose files were reviewed) could not be closer than grandfather/grandson. The search continues . *DFB*

GENEALOGY? ASK DAN!

Q. I have seen at least three theories about **Susannah WATERS'** parents at genforum and other sites. Does the Society have an official stand on who her parents were?

1. Theory one: **Lt. Edward WATERS** and **Grace O'NEIL**. **Edward** died years before **Susannah** was born. So I think this one incorrect. I understand when he died in 1630 he left his widow with a son ***William WATERS**.

2. ***William WATERS** who married **Margaret ROBINS**. It has also been mentioned (documented?) that Edward's widow (**Grace O'NEIL Waters**, mother of Wm) remarried to Margaret ROBINS' father, **Obedience ROBINS** so by the time of **Susannah's** birth **Grace** was no longer a **WATERS** (idea being: if she had gotten pregnant out of wedlock the baby would still have had the mother's name.) (one undocumented source says **Susannah's** name was really **Martha Susannah WATERS**)

3. **John WATERS** and **Ann LLOYD**

A. I find **Obedience ROBINS** a very unusual name for a man--father of married **Margaret ROBINS**.

The purposes of the Terrell Society of America, Inc. are to collect, store, and spread information about the various TERRELLs (and their descendants) who may have migrated here from England or elsewhere in Europe.

Neither the Society officers nor I claim to have the ability to determine whether a person who has the name you are seeking is your ancestor. We report

the evidence and in the case of published works, the theories voiced by the authors.

Judge **John D (Dabney) TERRELL** wrote in his later years a letter to **John Davis TERRELL** in which he stated the following about **Susannah & William**: " . . I cannot remember what her name was unless it was **Waters**. . . . They married in New York City, then called New Amsterdam."

In my personal opinion, if **John** was correct about their marriage place, that virtually rules out either **William** or **Susannah** being natives of the colony of Virginia. They could have either traveled together from England or elsewhere and docked there, or they could have chanced to meet there, possibly after having known each other previously elsewhere.

In the 1670s overland travel between Virginia and New Amsterdam (now NYC) did not exist. It would have been necessary to travel to Chesapeake Bay, book passage on a larger vessel, travel up the coast to what is now NYC, get married, then book passage back. At that time, New Amsterdam was a mud hole in a swamp. It was not the honeymoon destination that NYC became later.

Before auto travel became common, a man usually married a woman who lived within five miles of him. Travel by foot or horseback did not permit a larger radius and still leave time for him to get back home and rest before work (usually feeding stock, farming, etc.) the next day.

The truth is: *we don't know for certain what her last name was, much less who her parents were.*

In an item that I am publishing in *Terrell Trails* at this time, **Arthur** with the *Tyrrell Family History Society in England* referred to her as **Susannah WALTERS**. In the TERRELL lineages at various times, I have seen **WATERS**, **WATTERS**, **WALTERS**, & **WATKINS** mentioned as surnames of TERRELL brides, with both **WATERS** & **WATKINS** attributed to **Susannahs** who were married to **Williams**, but not necessarily the *same* **Susannahs**.

Before the late 1800s over 90% of the population was illiterate. The few who could read and write spelled names like they thought they sounded. All the above names are similar enough to be easily misunderstood and/or misspelled. Also it would be

very easy to confuse couples with the same given names.

There are at least 3 theories about the parentage of William.

1. Brother of Richmond. (I doubt that because he would have been over 50 when they married)
2. Son of Richmond. (Possible, but children of Richmond were born in VA, no reason to go to NYC to marry)
3. Nephew of Richmond, son of Richmond's brother, William -- merchant of London, England. (I am inclined to support this theory. Richmond gave 100 acres to his brother William. William almost immediately sold it. We don't know if he saw it. Richmond was granted land for paying passage for one William to the colony of Virginia. We don't know whether that William was his brother, or his nephew. If both William & Susannah were from England and either traveled together or chanced to meet again in New Amsterdam enroute, that could account for the unusual marriage location.)

However, all this is based upon family tradition and theories. I know of no documentation to support any of it.

Hope this at least adds to the mystery, even if it doesn't solve any of it.

As a TERRELL descendant, we cordially invite you to join us in search of the truth. *DFB*

QUERIES -- CONTINUED

I have used census, marriage records and obituaries to trace my line back from my grandfather, **Oscar Ellis TERRELL**, to his gg-grandfather, **Thaddeus. Thaddeus TERRELL** was born 7-24-1807 in KY, according to 1830 census. This is the first record I can find of him, he was in Washington Co., IN at that time. He was married in Wash. Co. also, in 1836 he married **Martha TRUSNER**. She was also born in KY, per census records. They had the following children:

1. **Jacob TERRELL** who married **Rachel WYATT** (My line),
2. **Nancy TERRELL** who married **Samuel BLANKENBAKER**,

3. **William R. TERRELL** who married **Sarah GOSS**,
4. **Thomas TERRELL** who married **Huldah TOWNSEND**,
5. **Caroline TERRELL** who married **David GRAY**,
6. **Walker B. TERRELL** who married **Huldah ROBERTS**,
7. **Newton Jasper TERRELL** who married **Margarette LITTELL**,
8. **Milburn TERRELL** who married **Amanda MC CLELLAN** and
9. **Samuel TERRELL** who married **Nancy LITTELL**.

After **Martha** died in 1869, Thaddeus remarried **Julia SMITH Townsend** and moved from Wash. Co. to Scott Co., IN. I know that he owned a Livery Stable in Scott Co. and was very well known horse trader. He died in 1894. I have data on their descendants, but have had no luck tracing their ancestry, does anyone have any information that might help me with this line?
