He developed a special beef jerky food for astronauts that is still being used.

He published more than 100 articles and abstracts in food science journals and trade publications.

He had charge of feeding the troops who were federalized during Alabama's civil rights strife in 1963.

A retired consultant to the meat industry, he won an award just this summer for his service.

Dr. Robert N. TERRELL of 2101 Scott St. [Guntersville, AL] died Thursday, Sept. 28, 2000, at First Methodist Church with a private burial following. Visitation was Saturday night at Guntersville Memorial Chapel.

Dr. TERRELL moved to Guntersville in 1993 with his wife, the former Mary (Prissy) DUNSTON, who grew up here. They met while he was in Guntersville visiting the late Tim JORDAN, Jr.

They lived in Auburn, Chicago, Texas, and in Cincinnati before moving here. He had been vice-president of research for Hillshire Farm & Kahn's, a Cincinnati based meat processing company before starting his own consulting company.

He received his BS in animal science from Oklahoma State, his master's in meat science & biochemistry from the University of Tennessee, and a Ph.D. in meat science & food technology from the University of Wisconsin.

He also served in the Army and was the post commissary officer at Ft. McClellan, where he was given the responsibility of feeding the federalized troops during the civil rights problems in 1963. He and his wife had to cut short their honeymoon so he could go back to the base and take on the responsibility of finding 5,000 loaves of bread and everything else it took to feed several thousand His first job out of graduate school was as a meat technologist for the Auburn University Extension Service. He went from there to Chicago where he worked for Griffith Laboratories, a supplier of spices and seasonings to the food industry. Then as a college professor at Texas A & M, he was contacted by

NASA to develop a special beef jerky food that the astronauts could use in space.

He made 5 trips to Russia during the 1970s as a consultant to an American company that was building a baby food plant in southern Russia.

He won numerous awards in his field, including one this summer from the American Meat Science Assn. For his work in helping establish meat processing clinics held each year for graduate students in meat science.

He holds three patents for meat processing methods. He is survived by his wife, Mary (Prissy) Terrell, a daughter, Tracy Russell (Mike) of Charlotte NC; a son, David TERRELL of Guntersville; a brother, Dr. William TERRELL of Wichita, KS; and 2 grandchildren.

I found your website through a Terrell inquiry on genforum.com. I found a listing for a Mr. **Elijah TERRELL** with the page numbers - 164, 167, 169, 530, 553, 594,663 listed by the name.

Please tell me what these pages are to and how I can purchase copies or whatever. I am looking for **Elijah W. TERRELL** (b: abt 1802 in VA) went to Kentucky and married **Elizabeth FRANKS** on Dec. 1, 1833 in Caldwell Co., KY. He was my g-g-grandfather. We have him and his wife and children in Caldwell county identified but have no date of passing. Do not know if he left KY or died there and the family was too poor to mark his grave. I have a copy of the Union Army discharge for his son, **David C. TERRELL** (also listed as **James A.C. TERRELL**, a brother who also enlisted but died in the War). I would gladly share the information I have on this man and his descendents. My mother is a Terrell descended from **David C. TERRELL**.

According to our **THOMPSON** family tree, **Esther TERREL** was born at CT. Farms, NJ now Union, Union NJ. June 30 1753. She married a **Jerimiah JAGGERS** (what a bunch of them there are) supposedly born on LI Nov 9 1750. There is no date given for his removal to CT. Farms, but he married **Esther** in 1775, was a member of the Presbyterian church there and died there Sep. 18 1826 aged 75 years - a farmer.

The THOMPSON tree names only their daughter Charity JAGGERS who married William THOMPSON (of Madison, NJ) Aug 31 1801 and their children. There is another family chart that gives the names of Charity's siblings but no dates.

On a LDS film 0849582 Collection of Essex Co. of NJ Families 1600-1900 I found two cards **for Samuel TERRILL** b. Milford. CT and d. in Elizabethtown, NJ with a list of his children but almost no definite dates. However the spouse is listed for each of his nine children and his **Esther** is said to be married to **Jeremiah JAGGERS**!

One of the cards is supposedly taken from Note Book of **Daniel T. CLARK** (NJHT Lib) and it says that **Samuel** married a **Mary JONES** of LI. It looks like his will ?at July 2 1765 asks his son **Nathaniel TERRILL** to take care of "my brother **Lemuel**", widow **Mary TERRILL** d 1817 age 93.Even with all of this I have not gotten any further. Do you have any suggestions?

The approximate birth dates are from a family Bible that belonged to the youngest daughter of their son **Boyd TERRELL**. According to the 1850 Census of Jennings

County, IN Jared was 37 which would have put his year of birth as 1813. At the moment I can't find my copy of the 1860 census page for Olney, Richland Co. Illinois where the listing is **Jerred.** In the 1870 Census, Round Prairie Pct., Wabash Co. IL **Emaline** is listed with **Minerva**, 22, **Mary M.** 20, **Emma** 18 and **Joseph** 14. **Boyd** and his family are living next door.

Boyd & Leah JONES TERRELL are my husband's great grandparents. They moved to Kaufman Co. Texas around 1877 then to Comanche Co. Indian Territory (OK) in 1902. Their children were:

William Morris TERRELL b. 1867; Charles Jasper TERRELL b. 1869; Mary Jane TERRELL, 1870; John Wesley TERRELL 1872; Thomas Edward TERRELL 1876; Jerry Boyd TERRELL 1877; Victoria Ludemia TERRELL 1880; Annie TERRELL 1882; Joseph Campbell TERRELL 1884 and Adella Mae TERRELL 1887.

Thomas & Annie died as infants.

Hi. This is **Judy Moody** in Lakin KS. I was browsing the genealogy of the my Grandmother. Her father was **David Nelson TERRELL** born May 9 1862 in Ottumwa (Wapella Co.) Iowa Married Wilhelmina Clara FIENE. They were married on April 13 1897 in Kansas. He died in McDonald Ks Oct 25 1934. They had 7 children. Guy TERRELL, Edna TERRELL, Frieda TERRELL, Hazel TERRELL, Erwin TERRELL, Leland TERRELL, & Lawrence TERRELL. This is sketchy and I do have a little more information. My mother says if it's a TERRELL, especially from Phillips CO. KS or even in Ks we're probably related somehow. So I'm taking the time to e-mail and see what happens. The information I have is from a Mark Joseph CAPPEL-LO that lived in Waldorf, MD in 1990. He has a list of TERRELLs going back to 1769. For many years now, my family has been trying to locate the parents (and siblings) of my greatgrandfather. Henry TERRELL was born in June 1823 in Indiana; died in May of 1873, close to Huron, Lawrence Co., IN. The family has always known that his family was originally from North Carolina. He married Rachel JOHNSON in Lawrence Co., Indiana in the 1840's. My maternal grandfather, Levi TERRELL, was Henry and Rachel's youngest child, and was born in September of 1862. Rachel JOHNSON's parents were John JOHNSON and Sarah BARNES. Sarah's father was Jehu mother BARNES. and her was Lurannah **TEAGUE**. These people and many Teagues, Barnes, and Johnsons show up in the Burke Co.,NC census of 1820, most on the same page! AND, there are just two TERRELL's that show up in Burke Co. and are ALSO on the same page. They are William & Solomon TERRELL. There have been rumors for years that Henry's dad could have been William, but no real proof; nor do we know who his mother was. Henry

and Rachel named their very first child, **Solomon**, and he died at five years of age. My family had also heard that the name Solomon had been in the family in the past. I have a strong hunch that the Solomon in the census is Henry's grandfather, who may have later moved to Kentucky and died there, as there is no record on the Indiana census in the early 1800's of a Solomon living in the area Henry was born, but there were several William's. I am researching the BURFORD family. I have my line pretty well down back through the Reverend Daniel BURFORD ((1750-1820). In 1853 he made a donation of twenty thousand dollars for the establishment of an agricultural professorship in the university of Georgia, which professorship bears his name. He died July 4, 1855, in Sparta, Ga. Thomas William Herringshaw, Encyclopedia of American Biography, p.920

TERRILL, William Rufus, soldier, was born April 21, 1834, in Covington, Va. He was appointed brigadier-general of volunteers in 1862, and was killed in the battle of Perryville in the same year. He died Oct. 8, 1862, near Perryville, Ky.

An Eccentric Educator. "...

Prof **Alex. TERREL**, a native and for many years a resident of London, Britain township (which is in Chester Co.)

Prof. Terrel is one of the most erudite men of the day, but his singular retiring disposition rendered him comparatively unknown outside of his immediate neighborhood. He has for many years resided in a small log house, dilapidated and forlorn, with a single loft-like bed room, on the second floor and scantily furnished with rude furniture. Here in this retirees place has this learned recluse lived with his wife and held communion with nature and his books; here has he taught for nearly forth years, instructing some of his pupils through the broad range of the science - astronomy, geology, botany, mathematics, navigation, engineering, history, the languages and various other studies. ...

Mathematics was his great hobby, but he gave great attention to history, geology, botany, etc. He was an assiduous Bible reader having read the scriptures through two or three times yearly, translating into some several languages as he read. ...

At one time an effort was made by Newark College (that would be Newark, DE) to withdraw Prof. from his retirement by the offer of a professorship.. but he preferred the retirement of his secluded home.

He had not left his home for so great distance for 30 years, until last August, when he was prevailed upon to visit the Centennial Exposition, with which he was greatly pleased.

His nephew Dr. **ASHTON** and Dr. **Samuel SMITH**, of Piqua, Ohio, after much persuasion, prevailed upon him to remove to Ohio.

Mrs. TERRELL(Mia Jane/Mary Jane/Mira STREET), the life companion of this remarkable character, is a woman of excellent mind and endowments. She is a sister of the celebrated painter, **Robert STREET**, of Philadelphia and was herself possessed of considerable artistic talent, which in former years she exercised to a considerable extent...

A memoriam sketch of **Alexander TERRELL** prepared by his friend and pupil Dr. **S. D. SMITH**...

Alexander TERRELL born Jan 2, 1807 and departed this life Feb 9, 1888, aged 81 years 1 month and 7 days. He was a native of the state of Delaware and was born on the landed estate that extended over into the States of Pennsylvania and MD, and upon which the historic stone was planted by Charles MASON and Jeremiah DIXON when Mason and Dixon Line was established.

Being the youngest of a family of seven, of whom his sister, **Mrs** .Ashton...

Although delicate and shrinking as a child, he early manifested an extraordinary aptitude for learning, having mastered without seeming effort, all the branches in the schools of his day, when but a mere boy, at the age of twelve years, without the assistance of a teacher he thoroughly mastered a large treatise on (I can't read, possibly plaric?) trigonometry and surveying and copied it into a book, with the neatness and accuracy that would have done credit to one of mature years.

Having exhausted all the available means at hand, an opportunity offered through a Mr. MONTGOM-ERY, a graduate and professor of mathematics in the Dublin University of Ireland, who owning to convivial habits was deposed and came to American and was engaged to teach in the Academy of Newark, Delaware, then the great educational center of a large area including several States thus the way opened for the gratification four friend's thirst for knowledge and well did he improve his advantages. A strong attachment very soon sprung up between the warmhearted and erratic teacher and the youthful and retiring schoolboy.

Before his teens were past the field of mathematics had been mastered including the Differential Calculus, as well as a very liberal classical foundation laid in Latin, Greek, Hebrew about this time the gifted and cultured **MONTGOMERY** succumbed to his inebriate habits, and soon we find **Mr. TERRELL** in the West, visiting friends, where he remained for years teaching in this vicinity and in the adjoining State of Indiana.

Tiring of the west he returned East, where for years he was a recluse almost unknown to his most inmate friends, so fully enthralled was he in books and particular in the study of natural history of which he was most passionately fond and which he mastered not only in part but as a whole....

IRA NATHAN TERRILL in Oklahoma

Ira Nathan TERRILL, (1853-1921), a geologist, inventor and poet from Wichita, Kansas participated in the opening of the Unassigned Lands, (the Oklahoma Land Rush) on April 22, 1889. On June 27, 1889 he homesteaded 70 acres southwest of the present city of Stillwater, Oklahoma on the north bank of the Cimarron River on a ford at Wild Horse Creek. TERRILL had been a member of "Payne's Boomers" a group led by David L. PAYNE and William L. COUCH which early on pushed for the opening of unoccupied Oklahoma lands, which were then extensively used by cattle companies. He was with Couch's party when they established a settlement at Stillwater and were subsequently removed back to Kansas by federal troops in 1884.

A leader of the Farmer's Alliance in the Populist Party, TERRILL was elected, on August 5, 1890, to the First Oklahoma Territorial Legislature for the 1890-91 term. Oklahoma historian Marion Tuttle ROCK said of TERRILL, " His Herculean blows in defense of the peoples rights made him one of the prominent members of the first legislature. He was brave and fearless in the defense of any and all principles that he conceived to be just, and whether in the majority or minority was a matter of supreme indifference to him." Tradition has it that TERRILL sponsored the Oklahoma homicide law under which he became the first person to be tried and convicted. It was his vigorous support of the Occupying Claimants Act that incurred the lasting vengeance of lawyers, land speculators and cattlemen who viciously preved upon the property of those who lost homesteads in court cases over 'soonerism.' A 'sooner,' who had been in the territory thirty days prior to the opening was ineligible by federal law to homestead. Such homesteaders lost their land and improvements which was auctioned off to the highest bidder. TERRILL's law required that the losing homesteader be paid for his improvements from the auction proceeds. Land speculators, shyster

lawyers and cattlemen were the primary instigators of 'sooner' claims and were generally the only ones with the means to buy and profit from the disputed land. They frequently resorted to hiring professional witnesses to testify that homesteaders were sooners whether or not they actually were. History records that the practice of perjury was notorious, and a December 1889 issue of the GUTHRIE NEWS said: "This business of filing contests for blood money -for it can be nothing else -- deserves the severest condemnation and the most thorough exposure." The requirement to reimburse the homesteader's for their improvements reduced profits and the fact that TER-RILL helped many homesteaders dispute the sooner charges gained him numerous political enemies among the speculators, lawyers and cattlemen.

George M. EMBREE (EMBREY) from Texas, known only to be a large man over 200 pounds and under 40 years of age, reputed to be a ne'er-do-well even though his family were apparently industrious and well-liked homesteaders in the area, served as a professional witness for the land speculators, lawyers and cattlemen. He reportedly testified in a number of sooner cases and quickly ran afoul of TERRILL, even apparently threatening to kill him on several occasions.

On January 3, 1891 Ira N. TERRILL, with his brother David Bliss TERRILL, was in the Land Office, on the federal acre, in Guthrie, Oklahoma. He had gone there either to commute his own homestead by paying \$1.25 an acre or to help another party contest a sooner charge. EMBREE was reportedly in a nearby saloon when he was told TERRILL was in town and egged on by some of his benefactor lawyers and speculators went to the land office to challenge TERRILL. Some reports indicate he intended to question TERRILL's right to prove up on his homestead. The two met as TERRILL was leaving the land office. Both men were armed as was the custom of the day, a gunfight ensued, EMBREE was killed and TERRILL wounded in the right arm or hand.

There were varying accounts of the fatal encounter. TERRILL maintained he had acted in self defense and several witnesses agreed with him. The Perkins, *OKLAHOMA BEE* newspaper of the day said, "Had TERRILL been a leading Republican or Democrat, they would have handled his case with gloves, and gross misconduct in the jury room while his case was being considered would have been ample grounds for

a new trial. But TERRILL was a Populist, and it makes all the difference in the world." No concise records can be found but some accounts indicate that a trial was held in Guthrie that resulted in a hung jury, 10 for conviction and two for acquittal, but some of TERRILL's descendents adamantly maintained that he was apparently first tried in Payne County (Stillwater or Perkins?) and a jury acquitted him. In actions that led to his lifelong claims of double jeopardy, as well as self defense, he apparently was tried again in Logan County (Guthrie?) and was eventually sentenced from Noble County (Perry?) to twelve years for manslaughter in the first degree. These last two locations possibly being temporarily designated as Federal District Courts as the shooting took place on the federal acre at the Guthrie Land Office, a fact which deprived local courts of any authority in the matter and there were no federal courts in the Territory at the time. Oklahoma had no prison during that period so he was eventually incarcerated, under a contract with it's warden, at the Kansas State Penitentiary in Lansing.

TERRILL spent his entire time in prison filing appeals on numerous grounds for release, (including the legality of Kansas imprisoning him,) and in 1905 agreed to an insanity plea with the statement. "I'm crazy to think I will ever get justice from this system." A few months later (Oklahoma ?) Governor Frank FRANTZ pardoned him.

In 1907 TERRILL published a three act play, A PURGATORY MADE OF PARADISE, A Tragedy Depicting Early Day Scenes in Oklahoma. The gunfight in Guthrie is depicted in the play. Few copies of this and other of TERRILL's works remain but in 1961-62, Dr. B. B. CHAPMAN of the History Department of Oklahoma State University at Stillwater (whose predecessor Oklahoma A and M College TERRILL helped establish while in the legislature) made an extensive study of TERRILL's history and published a book named after and including the play. The 1966 winter edition of OLD WEST magazine carried an article Ira TERRILL - Lawbreaker, Madman or Political Scapegoat? by Paul T. NOLAN. This appears to be a romanticized, factually questionable depiction of the events at Guthrie which draws on some of Chapman's research.

Ira N. TERRILL spent the remainder of his life lecturing on prison reform and prospecting for oil and minerals throughout Oklahoma, Texas and Arkansas.

During that period he established the town of Terlton, on the Cimarron River, west of present day Tulsa, Oklahoma. He died on October 14, 1921 at the home of a daughter **May Agnes** (**TERRILL**) **James** in Wichita Falls, Texas and is buried in Columbus, Kansas.

TERRILL Case

A case of importance to the Territory at large has been the habeas corpus proceedings brought by **Ira N. TERRILL** in the Supreme Court of Kansas. This case involves the question of the right of Oklahoma Territory to imprison its convicts beyond its territorial boundaries. By virtue of an Act of congress, Oklahoma is authorized to enter into a contract with the proper authorities of any other state of territory for the care, custody and maintenance of persons convicted of crime by the courts of this Territory. By vir-

tue of this power, a contract was entered into with the Warden of the State Penitentiary at Lansing, Kansas. There are several grounds alleged, and raised by **TERRILL**, demanding his release. The most difficult question raised by him is whether the contract with the Warden of the State Penitentiary of Kansas is legal, because of the fact, that the Warden has never been authorized by the proper authorities of Kansas to enter into a contract of this character. Another point raised by him is whether one state or territory may confine its prisoners convicted within its limits beyond its borders.

This case was before the full bench of the Supreme Court of Kansas, July 1902, and was submitted on briefs and oral argument. No decision has, as yet, been handed down by that Court. I am informed that **TERRILL** intends to sue out a writ of habeas corpus from the Supreme Court of the United States, if he fails in this case.

It is equally possible that they are married daughters of Thomas SPANE. Whatever kept Thomas SPANE from being named executor died with Frederick SPANE. DFB
