BOBBIE TERRELL LEDFORD EULOGY

We received a copy of the funeral home announcement and a personal eulogy from **Lucretia LEDFORD Etienne**.

Her mother, **Bobbie LaVell TERRELL** Ledford of Longview WA passed away March 1, 1999. Bobbie was born 09/08/1915 in Coosa county, Alabama and passed away at Longview, WA. Funeral service was held Tuesday, March 2 at Columbia Funeral Chapel with Rev. **Gary LAN-DRUS** officiating. Hymns "Amazing Grace" and "How Great Thou Art" were used. Interment was in a private vault in Green Hills Memorial Gardens.

Lucretia delivered the following eulogy at the service.

As Mama was preparing for her journey, I realized that the one thing about her that would stay with me forever, besides her love, would be the images of her hands guiding and teaching, caressing, and disciplining throughout my life. They were so capable, expressive, strong, creative, and gentle.

These beautiful hands that you see here were once eight years old and hopping a freight train with three cousins' hands. She made it all the way from Coral Gables Florida to Atlanta Georgia before those inquisitive hands were caught by her uncles, brakemen.

Imagine these hands at eighteen stealing alligator eggs and hatching them under her pot belly stove. They finally had to be given to a local zoo because the cat was in tatters from trying to keep the little gators in the bath tub.

Now it is time to add another pair of hands to this picture, the hands of my father, as they came together to start their life. There was a Christmas when our tree was the saddest thing that ever tried to grace a Christmas star. These hands set to work with knife and twine and turned that skinny, lop-sided evergreen into the most perfect Christmas tree that ever existed.

Think of these hands cleaning the storefront building early every Sunday morning; clearing away all the debris from the dance the night before, so that church services could be held. Then these hands would spend a couple of hours driving through the cold Ohio winter morning or the hot summer morning bringing people to church. Imagine the embarrassment of these hands when they realized that they had just voted themselves Treasurer of the church, instead of the wise hands of her mother-in-law.

There were many times that my Mama's hands worked miracles. A birthday that will always be remembered was one when, as all families experience, there wasn't enough money for extra things like gifts. Mama made a doll house

using the Sears and Roebuck catalog and cardboard—complete with people that were bendable, three dimensional furniture, and a puppy dog whose tail wagged!

These hands made it possible for me to give my father a homemade birthday cake that looked store bought. We are still finding toothpicks that were used to hold that cake together.

They guided me through my teenage years, during which yet another miracle occurred. These hands performed with lightening speed when they administered discipline in the form of a soft bar of soap applied to a disrespectful mouth. These wonderful hands were there, strong and capable, when my daughter came into this world. Without those steady teaching hands, I would have been totally lost. With the guidance of these hands and the wisdom and knowledge from God, I was able to raise a wonderful person.

One more time, try to imagine these hands as she sat and held her husband's hand as his spirit was welcomed into heaven.

These hands taught me to be strong and survive. Even in her last days, her hands remained a constant reminder of all that she meant to me. The way she so delicately wiped her lips after a sip of water prompted my memory of all the times

she would gently enforce the "proper manners at all times" edict.

The way she straightened the bed sheet over the blanket recalled to me the cleanliness ethics she instilled in all who knew her. The way she combed her hair and adjusted her jewelry reminded me of how much of a lady she was and always had been.

When I was small and living in Ohio, we never went to town without being "properly dressed." When we moved to the Pacific Northwest, I remember how shocked she was to see women in the stores without hat and gloves.

I will miss her face, voice, and advice, but I will never be alone because the image of her hands will always be with me and constantly remind me of my mama and her love.

CORRECTIONS

Member #514, Mrs. Lais Henderson Cash informed me that I had misread her first name. I had it as Lois. I apologize for this error.

Mrs. Ann Butler-Blackburn of San Marcos TX pointed out that there is an error in our current STONEAGE article titled, *The Early Tyrrels of Heron in East Herndon*. She pointed out that the Tyrells of Heron owned a manor house known as Heron Hall in East HOMDON, not East HERMDON as contained in Edwin H. TERRELL's *Genealogical Notes* on our LENDING LIBRARY list.

We thank her for pointing this out. However, the article is titled as reported in all capital letters. I did not mistake a capital E for a capital O. From the vast citations in this article, I assumed that Mr. Moriarty knew the proper name of the place. If he did not, then a large cloud of doubt looms over the entire article. It is possible that an error was made in typesetting the original publication, or even in transmission after the text was digitized. However, the name appears as Herndon in several places in the text as well as the title. I do not recall seeing Homdon anywhere in the text. There is an Eastthorndon listed unless the second "t" is a typo. There is a Thorndon in J. H. TYRRELL's book section on the Essex families, but neither Homdon nor Hemdon.

I do not have time for an indepth study of an area about which I know nothing. I did spend a few minutes on the net and found the following:

Note that there is no Hemdon—East, West, or otherwise. However, if you compare the above list with the article in the last issue, this issue, and the issue(s) to follow, you will find many of the above names existed in the 1300-1500 era with slight variations in spelling in some cases.

If someone there will take time to write me and explain whether the name evolved from Hemdon to Thorndon to Homdon over the centuries, or if these are actually separate villages, manors, estates, or whatever, I'll be glad to pass it on in the next available issue.

AL 1825, so it is possible that he was in AL before he was in GA or they may have met in GA. Their children, **Washington, Caroline, Amanda, Jane, Harriet, Robert, & Henry** were born in Polk co. GA except for Washington who was born in Greene co. GA. Except for a few living near the costal waters around Mobile and a few scattered along the Tennessee and other large rivers, most of the persons living in AL in 1825 were Native American. Antoinette sounds French, so I'd bet on Mobile, if the AL birthplace is correct. If she is the mother of all the children, then they must have met in or before Greene co. GA. If you have anything that might help, please share it with Mrs. Tumlin. DFB

I am **Ronald Eli TERRELL** son of **Bernard Eli TERRELL**. My grandfather was **David Ezra TERRELL**. My ggrandfather was **Eli TERRELL** a minister. He was the son of **William George TERRELL (FORD)**. He was the son of **Matilda TERRELL Ford** and **Coleman FORD**. Ma-

tilda was the daughter of **William TERRELL** who was supposed to be a revolutionary war veteran.

Matilda died when **William George** was born and **Coleman FORD** left him with maternal grandparents the Terrell's. So he took the Terrell name at adulthood. I am descended from this line. I use the Terrell name like all the descendents do but technically we're supposed to be **FORDS**.

Nonetheless we are descended from **William TERRELL** of old Dekalb county. It was rumored that the Ford family had dispute with **William George Ford Terrell** over property that is now Grant Park and Little five Points in the Atlanta area.

I am resarching the ancestors of **John Martin TERRELL**, 1855-1938, who lived and died in Liberty Co, Ga. I believe his people moved from Bladen Co, NC after the 1790 census, but I'm not sure. I do know he had 3 wives. 1st **WELLS**, 2nd **REDDISH** & 3rd **FUTCH**.

He is buried between 3rd wife and a baby born and died the same week he died in Gum Branch cemetery off the road between Hinesville and Glennville and that he may have been both/either a blacksmith and a miller whose land now belongs to Ft. I am **Jack Norton TERRELL**. My Father was **Jack Allen TERRELL** and his father was **Chilton DeWitt TERRELL**. I can go no further back than my grandfather because he ran away with a pretty (I hope so!!) circus performer around 1926-27 while serving as postmaster in Memphis. **Chilton Dewitt TERRELL** was allegedly born around 1890 in St. Francis County, Forest City, AR. There is a land grant record of a Terrell there around 1840 and a DeWitt county AR. I know my grandfather had several brothers and sisters and that his parents must have died while they were young.

My Dad would never talk about his father even to my Mother. But according to my Mother, when she talked to his neighbors they all said he was a fine man and great father. He stayed around until his sons were old enough to take care of themselves and they were able to. My Uncle **James**

My g-grandfather was **John Greene TERRELL** (b. 12/22/1845; d. after 1899). I am approaching my search from the angle of the uniqueness of his middle name. Since people often named their children after grandparents, aunts or uncles, I am hoping "Greene" shows up somewhere in the paternal line. Family lore indicates he insisted on spelling it with an "e" on the end, so I am going with that for now.

A cousin in Oklahoma recently lost his elderly mother. Among her effects was a manuscript, of which he has sent me a copy. It deals largely with Terrells in general, but a single line states, "The family of **John Green TERRELL** [he wouldn't have been happy with that spelling] of Oklahoma and a family in Arkansas by the name of **DICKEY** are thought to be of the **Joel TERRELL** line."

I have traced the family back only to 1860, Pontotoc County, MS. In all these years, I've not met anyone else researching my branch. However, I've recently made contact with two people researching Terrells in NE Mississippi, mainly prior to the civil war. I am incredibly pleased to report a photo of my great grandparents, **John Greene TERRELL & Nancy Ella SMITH Terrell** was provided to me by my Oklahoma cousin! It was taken around the turn of the century, and I can clearly see the family resemblance! What a treasure I can pass on!

I apologize for this lengthy tome. I am wondering two things primarily: Have you come across any Terrells with the first or middle names of Cullen or Greene? And, can you tell me what information is contained in Terrell Trails at page 632 regarding **Dr. Joel Edgar Greene TERRELL**? I'm afraid I became a member shortly after that and don't have that page. Wouldn't it be interesting if this **Joel Edgar Greene TERRELL** is a direct descendant of **Joel TERRELL**? Editor's Note: In my email to you re: Terrell Trails at page 632, **Dr. Joel Edgar Greene TERRELL**, apparently father of **Meriwether TERRELL**, governor of GA, I neglected to include that Gov. **TERRELL** was in office in 1905 when Grady county (where I live) was formed. I have not researched his service, but I think he only served one term. The name Greene may have come from an ancestor, either maternal or paternal. Also, if your **TERRELLs** passed

through GA, it may have been derived from Greene county GA. Some of the TERRELLS lived there. DFB

WINGETER, WISE, WOGEN, WOOD, WRIGHT, YANCEY, YOUNG.

Some of these families came back to the United States after some years; some began to live in Brazil, married with Brazilians, Italians, Germans and people from other countries, rarely or never contacting their relatives or friends in North America, forgetting the language, habits and religion.

But some families like the **NORRIS, STEAGALL, MC FADDEN, DEMARET, JONES, CULLEN, VAUGHAN, MATHEWS, SMITH, HAWTHORNE, CARLTON, FENLEY, MINCHIN, MAC KNIGHT, CARR, PYLES, BOOKWALTER, MILLER, WEISSINGER, STEAGALL, KEESE & TARVER** have until today their descendants in two cities in São Paulo State: Americana and Santa Bárbara D'Oeste (the **TERRELLs** nowadays live mainly in Jundiaí and São Paulo cities).

Some American descendants have founded an association (**American Descent Association**), and their members meet four times a year in Santa Bárbara D'Oeste.

I will research about the families that have settled near the **TERRELLs**, soon after they came to Brazil. I will contact you again as soon as possible.

Editor's Note: If you had any of these surnames who mysteriously disappeared after the Civil War, they may have been part of this migration. *DFB*

They are advertising a book regarding all the people with your family's surname in the Civil War. Don't be fooled. This is the same poor craftsmanship and outdated generic information in a new cover. This time they want \$49.95 + shipping and handling.

Be very, very careful!!! Don't believe their money back guarantee. They are a real hassle to deal with.

I was lured to order several microfilm copies from this company with "guarantees" of "speedy delivery" and "low price".

My order was placed in October of 1998 and as of this posting I have not received the order or a refund after numerous contacts with Steven Jensen at this firm. In his occasional replies he repeatedly gave false information to me as to the status of the order and cashed the check when I mentioned stopping payment on it (dumb on my part). I have copies of all documents and correspondences for those interested.

Complaints have been filed with the Better Business Bureau and the United States Postal Inspectors, they have informed me that even they can't order this company to give a refund, but may seek criminal charges. I guess small claims court is next.

He lists these Roberts respectively as gg & ggg grandsons of Sir **Walter TYRRELL** of Heron
