Edmund Terrill Rev. War Records

From Official Company Muster Rolls and Company Pay Rolls As found in the National Archives

Jan. 27 1777... Enlisted for 3 year term. Rank is listed as Sgt. in all below records, and he is found in Capt. **John Gillison's** Company in all below entries, except the last, regardless of regiment or commander. Location from this enlistment date to below first muster roll is unknown, and may have been inactive until March.

Mar. 28 to Dec., 1777... 10th VA Regiment, commanded by Col. Edward Stevens, who is a Brig. Gen. later in the war.

Jan. to Mar., 1778... 10th <u>VA Regiment</u>, Commanded by Major **Samuel Hawes**. Maj. Hawes is later found as a Col., commanding 5th VA Regiment heroically in the Battle of *Guilford Courthouse in NC* in 1781, and in *Hobkirk's Hill Battle* after that. Edmond is listed as being mustered at Valley Forge during these dates.

April to May, 1778... 10th VA Regiment, Commanded by Col. **John Green**, who is later found as commanding the 4th VA Regiment in the Battle of Guilford Courthouse Edmund is still listed as being at Valley Forge during these dates, confirming

that he was present in the infamous period of cold, starvation and deprivation. He did not desert, as many did.

June to July, 1778... 10th VA Regiment, Commanded by Col. **John Green**, listed as being at *Camp White Plains (NY)* during those dates.

Aug, 1778. 10th VA Regiment, Commanded by Col. **William Russell**, located at White Plains.

Sept., **1778**.. Same as in last entry, but located at *Camp Robinson's Farm*.

Oct. to Nov., 1778... 6th VA Regiment, also commanded by Col. William Russell, located at Middlebrook. later in the war. Dec., 1778 to April 15th 1779... 6th VA Regiment, Commanded by Col. John Green, assigned to *Camp Middlebrook*, but listed as being on furlough during these dates. There was no action in the winter, and many of the men were sent home on furlough, rather than having to feed and clothe them.

May to June, 1779... Same as last entry, but listed as being at *Camp Smith's Clove* during these dates.

July to Sept., 1779 ...Same as above, but listed as being at *Camp Ramapo* (NJ)

Oct. to Nov., 1779... Same, but listed at *Camp Haverstraw* (NJ).

Dec., 1779 to Mar 1780... 2nd VA Brigade, Commanded by Col. **Febiger**, and in Capt. **John Steed's** Co. This winter was as hard as Valley Forge. Edmund was apparently discharged from 3 yr. enlistment in March of 1780.

I got the above from photocopies of actual payroll records I obtained from the National Archives.

Edmund was my ancestor. My line from my grandmother Anne Calvin Terrill is: Anne Calvin; John Robert; William; Robert; Edmund (this one); Robert; Timothy (immigrant).

Editor's Note: This will was made early enough (1802) for the John TERREL below to be the same John TERREL who left widow, Marian in Henry County GA, provided that he first m. Ann ALLISON as noted above. Marlboro S. C. borders N. C. near Tyrrell Co. NC where Absalum CLIFTON {possible father of Marian [CLIFTON?] Terrel} lived in 1780s. We do not know that Marian was the only wife of John, nor that she was the mother of any of his children, but I believe she was mother of at least the last two, John & Absalum. I emphasize, this is a mere possibility, not proof. However, if this is the same John TERREL in the 1825 will of William PLEDGER, then it could not be our John because he was GA long before 1825 and would not have been there to serve as Executor. DFB

In the Name of God, Amen, I Jesse COUNCIL, of the State of South Carolina Marlborough County, Being Weak in Body, but of Perfect Mind and Memory, thanks be Given unto God, Calling unto Mind the Mortality of My Body, and Knowing that it is Appointed for all Men Once to die, do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament, that is to Say, Principally once first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hand of the almighty God, that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the might power of God, and touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless in this life. I give, Devise, once dispose of the same in the following manner and form--First I give and bequeath to John TERREL my half brother all my lands lying on both sides of Pee Dee river, one Negro fellow named Carolina, one Negro woman name Silva one other Negro woman named Any, one negro boy named Tom, one other boy named Peter, together with all my stock of horses and pigs.

Item I give and bequeath to Ginsey FEILDS my half sister one

negro girl by name of Sarah-

Item I give and bequeath to **James FEILDS** my half brother one negro girl by name of **Dol**., one negro boy named **Harry**, Item: I lend to my mother **Elizabeth Feilds** during her life all the rest of my property and at her death I give and bequeath the property to her lent, to **John Terrel**, **Ginsey Fields**, and **James Fields** to be Equally divided between them--and I do hereby appoint my **Uncle William PLEDGER** and my **brother John TERREL** my Executors and I do hereby utterly disallow re-

appoint my *Uncle* William PLEDGER and my *brother* John TERREL my Executors and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke, and disannul all and every other former testament, Wills, Leagases, bequaths, and executors by me in any Will before named, Willed and Bequeathed. Ratifying and confirming this, and no other, to be my last Will and Testament I Witness whereof I have thereunto set my hand and seal this tenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two and in the twenty seventh year of the independence of America. MORE OHIO TERRELLS

Submitted by No. 683 Terry Terrell

I found **Shepherd** and **Mary TERRELL's** first daughter and first child. Her name was **Jemimah TERRELL**, which suggests Shepherd may have been the son of **Abner** and **Jemimah TERRELL**. I tried to get Abner's will last year, but Rush Co., Ind. doesn't have it.

According to the census, **Jemimah** was born May 1821. She married **Isaac HILL** in Belmont Co. on Oct. 7, 1842. At the time of the 1860 census they were living in Mead Twp. near **Thomas TERRELL**, **Shepherd TERRELL**, and **Daniel TERRELL**. Thomas' home was the 229th the censustaker visited, Isaac and Jemimah's was 232, Shepherd and Mary were 238, and Daniel and Mary were 291st.

Isaac HILL and Jemimah's children were; Mary born 1844; John Thomas HILL born 1849; Letitia HILL born 1846; Shepherd HILL born 1858; Isaac HILL born Aug. 30, 1859; Clarrissa B. HILL born 1864. By 1880 they had moved to Marshall County where they remained until their deaths. Isaac died in Kossuth, Marshall Co., WV on Feb. 19, 1897. Letitia appears not to have married and remained with her widowed mother.

Isaac and Jemimah's son **Shepherd HILL** was first married to a woman named **Jane**. Their children were: **Mary HILL** born 1875; **R. Hayse HILL** born 1877. He married **Lizzie CROW** and lived in Belton, Marshall Co.; **George E. HILL** born 1879; **Shepherd M. HILL** born 1894; **William H. HILL** born 1897.

Jane died between 1910 and 1920. By the 1920 census Shepherd had remarried a woman named **Rachel**. Their children were: **Rachel Birdie HILL** born abt. 1919; **Alvera HILL** born abt. 1920. By 1930 Shepherd and Rachel and daughter Alvera had moved to Smith Twp., Mahoning Co., OH.

Shepherd and Jane's son **George HILL** was a farm laborer in Marshall County. He married a woman named **Martie O**. their children were: **Charles HILL** born 1905; **Archie H. HILL** born 1906; **Letitia J. HILL** born 1908; **Nellie S**. **HILL** born abt. 1909.

Isaac and Jemimah's son John Thomas HILL married Ida Ellen RUM.

Isaac HILL, Jr. married Louella May MARSHALL. She was born Oct. 10, 1863. Isaac and Louella '.s children were: Fred W. HILL born Oct. 1882; Alice C. HILL born Nov. 1885; Chalmer HILL born May 2, 1889; Anna HILL born Aug. 1891; Isaac HILL born March 8, 1896: Willis HILL born Sept. 1898.

Isaac and Louella Hill's son **Chalmer HILL** married **Essie J. HARRIS**. She was born Sept. 24, 1894. Their children were: **Dixon HILL**; **Doris HILL**; **Sylvester HILL** born 1914; **Mary Ann HILL** born 1917; **Liberty HILL** born 1918; **Irene HILL** born 1920; **Alta HILL** born 1922; **Austin HILL** born 1926; **Raymond HILL** born 1929. Isaac Hill, Jr. died Aug. 28, 1922 and Louella on June 27, 1922.

Isaac and Louella's son Isaac HILL married Dessie Lucille HARRIS. She was born Oct. 1896. Their children were: Laura HILL; Alma HILL; Robert HILL; Samuel HILL; Kenneth HILL; Wilfred HILL. Isaac died June 27, 1954 and Dessie on Dec. 4, 1935.

I also found another child of **James** and **Margaret Jane TER-RELL**. Her name was **Ida M. TERRELL** and she was born abt. 1882. She married **Ross C. LOTSHAW** of Monroe Co., OH on Aug. 27, 1903. He was born abt. 1885 and was the son of **William** and **Anna BEARDMORE LOTSHAW**.

The marriage record also gives Margaret Jane's maiden name. It was **TERRELL**. The death record gives her father's name as **James TERRELL** which I thought was a mistake, apparently it wasn't.

Burial Records for Greenwood Cemetery, Bellaire, Ohio by Brenda Rushman lists two more members of Logan TER-RELL's family who are buried with him and the rest of his family. They have no headstones. William TERRELL who died Sept. 8, 1912 and George TERRELL who died June 17, 1930. The book doesn't give the grave number for either. Logan is 08 003 01, Esther is 02, James is 04, Wilma is 05, and her husband Delbert is 06. So one of them must be buried between Logan and Esther and James. Delbert MILLER is given as the purchaser of all the lots. He was only 10 years old when William died so he must have been moved. What relationship they had to Logan is unknown. The only one whose obituary I could find was George's and he was born abt. 1865 so he could not have been a child of Logan and Esther. The obit appeared in the Bellaire Daily Leader Wed. June 18, 1930.

TERRELL FUNERAL

The funeral of George TERRELL, 65, who died Monday in the

Ohio Valley General Hospital was held from the home of his sister Mrs. Frena Smith 3754 Belmont Street this afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. **Donald M. Salmon** pastor of the *Christian Church* was in charge of the rites and internment was in the *Rose Hill Cemetery*. Mr. TERRELL resided on 26th Street. He is survived by his sister and a daughter.

Shepherd and Mary TERRELL's son **Thomas TERRELL** may have been previously married. Belmont County Marriages 1803-1849 gives the marriage of a **Thomas TYRRELL** to **Nancy EDGE** Sept. 19, 1844.

Daniel and **Mary SNYDER TYRRELL's** daughter **Lavina TYRRELL** married **James CAVENDER** on Oct. 17, 1878. Belmont County Marriages 1871-1890.

Also there is some question about **Daniel** and **Mary's son Shepherd's wife's maiden name**. It is recorded as **SHREVES** or **SCHRIEVES** in two of their daughter's marriages. However in their daughter Clara's marriage record it is given as **COFF-MAN**. There is no marriage recorded for a **Shepherd Tyrrell** and a **Martha E. Shreves**, but there is for **Shepherd Tyrrell** and **Martha E. Coffman** on Jan. 18, 1877. Her age is given as 17 which matches her age in the census records.

I also found **Lewis** and **Amelia**'s daughter **Sarah**'s marriage date. It was Sept. 24, 1899.

Lewis and Amelia's son **Frank** died in 1959. He and his wife **Gertrude** also had another son: **Kenneth** who was born July 20, 1903. He died May 11, 1905. He had pulled a pan of scalding water onto himself and died from the burns.

Burial records for Mt. Rose Cemetery in Moundsville give several people who were the children of a **G. W.** and **E. A. TERRILL** who were probably **Amos** and **Matilda**'s son **George** and his wife **Elizabeth OGLE**. They were: **Alice TERRILL** born Aug. 25, 1868-died March 9, 1915; **William B. TERRILL** born Jan. 7, 1861-died Feb.19, 1916; **Sarah A. TERRILL** born Nov. 15, 1862 died Jan. 6, 1902.

Looking through back issues of *Terrell Trails*, I noticed you had some queries about a John W. TERRILL who was the police chief in Martins Ferry, Ohio in the early 1900's. The first was from a Cindy Delbridge <u>delbrid.ge.l@osu.edu</u> in the Fall 2004 issue page 1830 and the other was from a Terry Dawson grammaterry@earthink.net in the Winter 2006 page 2099.

I ran across the enclosed article and some other information.

The book the article is from was published before **John** became police chief. The Wheeling City Directory for 1907-1908 gives surrounding towns as well. John was police chief by that time. His address was 512 West Washington St. which is where he did his newspaper work. **Contrary to what the article says, John was still living in Wheeling in 1900**. He and his family lived in the *Triadelphia district*.

Terry Dawson wanted to know if you had any information on John's grandparents **John** and **Jane TERRILL** of Meigs County, OH. I checked the 1830 and 1840 census and there is no

John listed, however **John's father George** was born in Pomeroy, Meigs Co. according to the article.

Since James TERRELL's wife Margaret was also born in Meigs Co., and in the 1830's she might be related to this family. According to the 1850 census the Isaac TERRILL listed who might be the brother of George, had a son Daniel. If they are the same family, then it raises the possibility that they could also be Jared and Sarah TERRILL's descendants since so many of the names recur in both families and particularly since they were downriver from Marshall Co.

I found **George** and **Amanda's** son **Walter's** WW I and II draft registration cards. The first is illegible, but the WW II card gives his date of birth as Aug. 7, 1895 and his place of birth as Wheeling, WV. His wife's name was **Helen** and they lived at 411 8th. Ave., West Homestead, Allegheny Co., PA. He was the owner and operator of *TERRILL's Garage*.

George and **Amanda's** son **Wilbur** was living in Clairton, Allegheny Co., PA at the time of the 1920. census. His wife's name was **Eva L**. their children were: **Wilda**, **Dick** and **Harry**. **Wilbur** was a clerk at the steel mill.

John W. and Margaret's son Percy M. TERRILL married Bertha Mae SEDGWICK on May 1, 1909. She was the daughter of Wayland Chalmer and Alice Virginia THOMPSON SEDGWICK. Percy's WW I draft registration card gives his date of birth as July 6, 1888 Martins Ferry, OH. He died Aug. 23, 1965 in Canton, Stark Co., OH. He was a widower. Percy was residing in Weirton, WV in 1917 when he registered for the draft and was employed as a clerk at *Phillips Sheet and Tin Plate Co*.

Official Roster of Ohio Soldiers, Sailers and Marines, World War 1917-1918 lists **John W.**'s son **John Ross TERRILL**: NSN Martins Ferry, USMC May 28,1918, Martins Ferry; b. Martins Ferry, Ohio Oct. 1. 1891: Paris Is., SC May 28, 1918; Supply Co. July 15, 1918; Discharged Feb. 28, 1919. File 119148.

That's all I have for now.

JOHN W. TERRILL

Centennial History of Belmont County by A.T. McKelvey, 1903, pgs. 346/347

JOHN W. TERRILL, ex-postmaster of Martin's Ferry, Belmont County, is now engaged in newspaper work at No. 512 West Washington street in that city. He was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, August 28, 1858, a son of **George W**. and **Amanda HOPKINS TERRILL**, the former native of Pomeroy, Meigs County, Ohio, where his birth occurred February 11, 1831, and the latter a native of Florence, Pennsylvania, born May 11, 1837.

Our subject's father was united in marriage with **Amanda HOPKINS** September 24, 1857, and they had eight children, **John W. TERRILL** being the eldest. The others were: **Walter TERRILL**, now of Homestead, Pennsylvania; **Carrie TERRILL** (**Mrs. Henry KRIES**), who resides with our subject's mother; **Lida TERRILL**, a saleslady in the store of **George E. Stifle**, of Wheeling, for many years; **George TERRILL**, still

single, who resides with his mother and is a glass worker; Mollie TERRILL, the wife of Irwin MC KELVEY, a son of A. T. MC KELVEY; Aldin TERRILL, living at the old homestead, a steel worker by occupation; and Wilber TERRILL, also living at home, timekeeper at the steel works. The father of these children died September 15, 1891, but his widow still survives. John W. TERRILL, our subject, obtained his education in the schools of Covington, Kentucky, and subsequently engaged in work at the rolling mills at Wheeling and Martin's Ferry, and also in Pittsburg, his first position being secured at the last mentioned place. He was in the rolling mills until 1887 and then for some time followed painting, which trade he learned during the time he worked at the mills. After abandoning this, he took up newspaper work, and has continued along journalistic lines to the present time.

In 1890 Mr. TERRILL became interested to some extent in politics, and his first office was clerk of Pease township, in which he served two terms, --- from 1890 until 1894. During **President Cleveland's** administration he was appointed post-master of Martin's Ferry, and served from 1894 until 1898, the last two years under **President McKinley**. Mr. TERRILL always takes an interest in the actions of the Democratic party, with which his preference lies. Since 1898 he has been engaged in painting, and later in newspaper work to the present writing. He was a resident of Wheeling from 1870 to 1880, the date of his removal to Pittsburg, and spent but two years in the latter city before making his home permanently in Martin's Ferry, Ohio.

April 3, 1879 our subject was united in marriage with Margaret MC HENRY, a daughter of Josiah and Angeline COSS MC HENRY, and a granddaughter of David COSS. The McHenrys are one of the old families of Belmont county, and are contemporary with the Zanes.

Mr. McHenry was proprietor of the ferry for years after Mr. Martin had ceased to run it, and was marked as a man of integrity and ability. Mrs. TERRILL's father was a native of West Virginia, and was for many years foreman and manager in the mills of Martin's Ferry. His wife was born in that city and both were honored by all in their community. They reared a family of six children, Mrs. TERRILL being the eldest child.

Mr. and Mrs. TERRILL have been blessed with nine children, namely: Nellie M. TERRILL, still at home; Mary Angie TERRILL, a clerk in the Post Office; Chester W. TERRILL, a graduate of Parkview School, West Virginia, in the class of 1901; Jennie G. TERRILL; Walter L. TERRILL, a painter; Percy M. TERRILL, a clerk; John Ross TERRILL, Lida Marie TERRILL and Margaret A. TERRILL. Mary Angie became a clerk in the Post Office during her father's term of office there, having just been graduated from the Martin's Ferry High School at the age of 16 years, completing both classical and scientific courses. At the present time she is money order clerk, and is efficient in her work. Walter L. is now engaged in the painting business. Percy M. is now a salesman in one of the stores of Pleasant Valley.

Mrs. TERRILL is a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and the family also attends that church. In fraternal circles Mr. TERRILL has passed through all the chairs of the Knights of

Pythias organization, and is one of the charter members of Welcome Lodge, A. O. U. W. Both our subject and his wife are widely known and well respected in Belmont County.

FAMOUS PAIR OF VETERANS 'REUNE'

Daniel and John Terrell Meet Here Again on Thanksgiving Day

POMEROY Nov. 26 - Unique among Thanksgiving events in this district was a birthday celebration held at the home of **Daniel TERRELL** at Rocksprings. On Thursday **Daniel TERRELL** and his brother **John TERRELL** of Cambridge, OH, attained the ages of 86 and 96 respectively. [Dan's birth date Nov 2, penned in]

Annually for the last 20 years these two aging men, whose minds and memories are unimpaired by the weight of years, have joined each other to talk over the exciting days of 1861 to 1865 when they were soldiers in the Union Army. They were two of four TERRELL brothers who with their father, enlisted in the Army of the North soon after hostilities of the Civil War began.

Daniel TERRELL was 15 years of age when he enlisted, although his age was listed as 16, he learned after the war. He was a member of the Seventy-Seventh Ohio Volunteer Infantry, Company D. Because of his inclination to tease and joke, he gained the nickname of D. A. TEASAL soon after he entered the service, and did not again hear his correct name during the entire course of the war. In later years when he was attempting to secure a pension, his colonel declared that he had never heard of **Daniel TERRELL**, but when the name *D. A. TEASAL* was mentioned he immediately remembered **TERRELL**. During the war Mr. TERRELL served under Generals SHER-MAN, SHERIDAN and GRANT and was with General CANBY on the campaign to Mobile. On two occasions he went into southern territory to exchange prisoners. At one time 800 prisoners were exchanged at Richmond, and half of the Union men who were brought back were too weak from hunger to walk, the old soldier recalls. Many of them had been in the notorious Andersonville Prison.

After the war three regiments were needed in Texas to guard against attacks by Mexicans and Indians, and **Daniel TER-RELL** was in the brigade that was sent. For this reason he served 10 months longer. In later years he and his wife's uncle, **Ed DONALDSON**, who fought with the southern troops, compared experiences and decided that they had been nearly opposite each other in the lines at the bloody battle of **Shiloh Landing**.

John TERRELL, who resides at Cambridge with his son, Frank TERRELL, and granddaughter, Lula TERRELL, is the only living member of the Second Virginia Cavalry, and is one of the few men remaining that served under CUSTER. Although weak in body, having suffered a stroke in 1923, his mind is clear, and he can tell one anecdote after another about humorous events of the war days.

One time during the course of **LIGHTBURN**'s famous retreat from West Virginia to Ohio which, incidentally, followed a course through Pomeroy, **John TERRELL** told his brother **Ike** to watch his horse. Sometime, while no one was watching, the horse stuck its head in a barrel of flour. Drizzling rain converted the flour into a white pasty coating on the horse's head, giving the animal a white face. When the owner returned, he exclaimed (as he tells it): "Why, somebody's traded horses with me." Others nearby were as mystified as the owner, as it was at night. "Well, go ahead and use that horse until some one claims him," the captain said.

As TERRELL mounted, he declared: "It's no wonder that fellow made a mistake. He's got strings over his saddle just like I had." And not until hours later did he realize he was riding his own horse, probably a mare ahead of its time in the female habit of using a powder puff. "One time," said the old soldier, "several of us were thirsty and after searching awhile found a well. Sitting nearby was a Southern woman, and at the edge of the well was a huge bloodhound. We asked for a drink, and the woman said, 'help yourself'.

"Call your dog away," we said. 'I didn't put him there and I'm not going to take him away.' she answered. So I upped him with a rap of my sword and we got a drink. "SHERIDAN once issued an order against playing cards and all kinds of games. Well, sir, he thought he had all the forms of gambling listed, but the men got around the rules one way or another. Once we saw two men sitting on a log playing Odd and Even. And how do you think they were doing it? Why, they'd just reach in their shirts, and then bring out their hand, fist closed, and say: 'Odd or Even' and the number of lice settled the wager."

The old soldier returned Saturday morning to his home at Cambridge, and the two veterans are already looking forward to their next reunion.



DR TYRRELL'S DEATH LOSS TO PROFESSION Held High Place as Homeopathic Physician and General Practitioner

ENJOYED LARGE PRACTICE

The medical profession has suffered a severe loss in the death of Dr. **Joseph D. TYRRELL**, well-known Toronto physician, and for the past 50 years a general practitioner in this city, who

passed away yesterday [17TH]at his home, 176 Bloor Street East, at the age of 74 years. Although failing in health for some time past Dr Tyrrell had continued his practice to a limited extent up to a few weeks before his death.

He was a pioneer in Canada of the school of homeopathy. His ability as a prescriber had earned him a reputation which extended far beyond this city and Province, and placed him among the leading physicians of the Dominion.

A native of Ontario, Dr Tyrrell had spent a good part of his early life in Toronto, later going to the United States, where he took up his studies in medicine. These were followed by further research in the system of homeopathy, at that time a young doctrine so far as this continent was concerned. In 1880 he graduated from the Cleveland Homeopathic College, and, after practicing for a few years in the United States, was admitted, in 1887, as a member of the Ontario College of Physicians and Surgeons. Settling in Toronto, he soon built up a large practice, at one time said to be one of the largest held by any doctor in the city.

Dr. Tyrrell is survived by his widow, one son, Lieut-Col. W. G. TYRRELL D.S.O., on the staff of the Royal Engineers in India; a daughter, Miss Maisie TYRRELL of Toronto, and one sister, Mrs. C. T. Campbell of London, Ont. (Also printed in *The Mail* on 18 July 1928)

TERRILL BROS OF BATH CO VA

At the Richmond Civil War Round Table's September [2005] meeting, members had the privilege of hearing "one of our own." RCWRT member **Robert E. L. Krick** spoke to the Round Table on the **TERRILL** brothers of *Warm Springs*. Krick, who spends much of his time traveling across the country speaking to groups at various Civil War events, remarked that he was happy to have a "home game" here in Richmond.

There are many reasons why the Civil War has fascinated millions of people throughout the generations that have passed in the last 140 years. One of the major attractions is the way the war pitted family against family, cousin against cousin, and sometimes brother against brother. Perhaps there is no more

compelling story of two siblings on opposite sides of the conflict than the *Terrill brothers of Bath County*.

James Barbour TERRILL was born in 1838, the sixth of eight children. Though he was far from an excellent pupil, his father wrote a recommendation letter for him to be accepted at Virginia Military Institute - a common practice at that time. It would be an understatement to say James struggled at the Lexington school. Pleading letters from his father to a VMI administrator may have been the only reason James was not dismissed. Eventually he persevered and was one of 19 graduates in 1858. He returned to Warm Springs and began practicing law.

William Rufus TERRILL was four years older than his brother James. William went to *West Point* and became an above average student. He graduated 16th in his class of 52 but accumulated several demerits. Often these offences were tobacco related and it is said that he kept cigars under his bed. A much publicized fight with **Phil SHERIDAN** marks William's west Point record. The fracas netted Sheridan a one-year suspension from school. William stayed at West Point after graduation and became a math teacher. Ironically, this was his younger brother's worst subject. William's marriage to a *Philadelphia woman* may have been a significant factor in his decision to stay north after school.

Back in Bath County, James had become a major in the prewar militia. April 1861 found him drilling new cadets at Harper's Ferry. He married a girl from *King William County*, became a *lieutenant colonel* in the 13th Virginia Infantry and learned under then Col. A. P. HILL. James was not popular with his men one soldier's diary referred to him as *Major Terrible*. This animosity may have been fueled by James's refusal to endorse a petition drafted by some of his junior officers. Without his endorsement, their petition to become a cavalry unit was effectively killed. The move alienated his men and there was speculation that James shunned the endorsement because he knew he could be promoted easier in the infantry.

At the beginning of the war, William was sent to the Western Theater. There is evidence that he requested to be sent west away from-his family. He was a *captain* of *Shiloh* and had risen to *brigadier general* by the time of *Perryville*. It was at this Kentucky battle that William was badly wounded in the chest when a Confederate artillery barrage decimated his unit. He died the following day.

In the Eastern Theater, James reached the zenith of his career under **John PEGRAM** at the battles of Wilderness and Spotsylvania. James was probably witness to the famous "Lee to the rear" incident. On May 30, 1864, days before the Battle of Cold Harbor, he was shot and killed.

Editor's Note: In response to Mr. Mills' question about who they were, I am providing the following excerpt from TER-RELL GENEALOGY by Emma Dicken, pages 44-45. *DFB*

William TERRILL, son of Robert and Mary FOSTER TERRILL, was the fifth child named in the will of his father. He was left a share of the estate and was named as one of the executors.

Was named in the 1790 census in Orange County. It has been said that he was born 1733. If that is the correct date he would have reached his majority about 1754. It is tradition that he was married twice, first, to **Mary MALLORY**, second to **Ann**

DANIEL. The marriage bond of **William Terrill, Sr.** and **Ann Daniel** filed in Orange County was dated 23 May 1780, so she was evidently his second wife. In the same county is the marriage bond of **William TERRELL, Jr.** and **Jane MORTON,** dated 28 Jan. 1793. **William, Jr.** was no doubt a child of the first marriage of **William, Sr.** The appraisal of **William TERRILL, Jr.** was filed in Orange County by **Reuben TERRILL on 27 Mar. 1815.** (W.B. 3, p. 449.)

In a family sketch written by Dr. Uriel TERRILL, and additional date given by his grandson, A. E. Terrill, the children of William, Sr. were not named but said William TERRILL, (son of Robert and Mary (Foster) Terrill) was the grandfather of Dr. George TERRILL; William H. TERRILL; Sarah TERRILL, first wife of John W. YANCY of Rappahannock County; and Mrs. Jane PILCHER.

Records of Col. William H. TERRILL state that he was a son of William TERRILL, Jr. and his wife Jane MORTON. Col. William H. TERRILL, b. 21 Apr. 1804, d. 28 Nov. "at the age of 77," at the residence of his son-in-law, Col. G. M. PORTERFIELD in Charleston, West Virginia. He was a distinguished lawyer and his obituary in the Charleston *Free Press* mentioned him as Col. William TERRILL of Bath County, Va. Was a member of the House of Delegates from Allegheny Co. 1829-1831, was prosecuting attorney for Bath county for 37 years. "He was preeminent in his profession, a gifted speaker, and an able prosecutor."

Col. **Terrell** was married twice, first in Allegheny County 26 Oct. 1827 to **Elizabeth PITZER**, b. 24 May 1805, d. 20 Apr. 1858, daughter of **Bernard** and **Jane PYLE PITZER**. He married second Mrs. **Rachel SCOTT** of Covington, Virginia. No children by the second marriage. The children of Col. W. H. Terrill and his wife Elizabeth were:

1. Dr. George Parker TERRILL of Salem, Va. who m. Sarah DOLD. He graduated at V.M.I. in 1849 and in medicine at the University of Pennsylvania 1853. He had a son Dr. Francis or Frank H. TERRILL, b. 1854, d. 1888. He graduated in medicine in 1873 and served in the medical department of the United States Navy. Resigned 1884 and entered private practice in San Francisco, California. Married, but had no children. He was an exceptionally fine young man.

*William Rufus TERRILL b. 21 Apr. 1834 at Covington, Va. d. 1862, graduated from West Point in 1858 and was an artillery officer in the U.S. Army. He m. Emily HENRY, daughter of Col. HENRY Superintendent of West Point and a sister of General HENRY, U.S. Army, Governor of Puerto Rico.

When the war between the states was declared William Rufus Terrill remained in the Union Army and became a Major General. Was killed at the Battle of Perryville, Ky. 1862.

Emily Cornelia TERRILL, b. 10 July 1832 m. Col. **George PORTERFIELD**. They had a daughter who m. **John Esten**

COOKE and another who m. Chase MORTON of Richmond, Va

*James Barbour TERRILL b. at Warm Springs, Va. 20 Feb. 1838, d. 1864, was a lawyer, m. Charlotte DRURY, daughter of Martin and Mildred FOX DRURY. He was educated at V.M.I. and cast his lot with his native state, joining the Confederate Army. He was a Colonel and was killed at Cole Harbor 1864. On the day of his death President Jefferson Davis sent in his appointment as Brigadier General to be confirmed by the Senate.

Phillip Mallory TERRILL b. 6 June 1842, d. Nov. 1864. While a student at the University of Virginia he joined a Cavalry company and received a wound at Cedar Creek from which he died the next day.

TERRELL DEATH PATCH

I am enclosing an embroidered shoulder patch that I recently purchased. It is worn by the prison guards at the *Terrell Penitentiary* located in Polk County, Texas. The prison is part of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCJ, as on the patch), and this prison is where Texas executes criminals who have been sentenced to death. That is why the patch says "Death Row."

The prison was named for **Charles Terrell**, a long-time employee of the prison and now retired. I was not able to find any biographical or genealogical information on Charles Terrell; however, in a paraphrased quote from a magazine interview he said he was somewhat uneasy about having a death-row prison named for him (although he still supports capital punishment). This may be why the prison has been recently named *Polunsky Penitentiary*.

SOLOMON TERRELL

Editor's Note: I am running this article for the benefit of our members who are new to Internet Genealogy and believe that you have found a Panacea of ancestral information.

The following was posted on the TERRELL Message Board several years ago. It is an exchange of information between 3 TERRELL descendants. Each is sharing his/her "bit of the puzzle" and hopefully we will eventually have the whole picture.

I have removed their names. This also emphasizes the necessity for documenting your sources of information.

The Family Group format has been removed to conserve space, but no data was lost in this change. The original was 7 pages.

As usual, I remind you that published genealogy, whether on the Internet or in publications like *Terrell Trails*, should be used only for leads to source documents. *DFB*

Hello,

Just home from travel, and read with interest your emails on Solomon and Solomon Jr. I am a descendant of **Solomon** and **Amelia** (maiden name I am 99% sure is **SPAIN**) **Robertson TERRELL** through **William Pitt TERRELL**.

For several years I have "sort of" looked for other family members that may have moved to Arkansas from Wake County, NC. Your emails concerning **Martha Robertson** may contain information that relates to this.

Amelia Robertson TERRELL is, in my opinion, the widow of **Richard ROBERTSON**. He would have been deceased or gone before her marriage to Solomon in 1778.

Another clue to family is your mention of the surname **COOK**, the maiden name of Solomon Jr.'s wife, **Mary**.

My William Pitt TERRELL had a daughter, Fetney G. who married William S. COOK. Fetney was born in 1828, NC and later lived with her husband in Union County, Arkansas.

Another of William Pitt TERRELL'S daughters, **Ellen G. TERRELL** married **William H. TERRELL** (Wake County Marriages, 1770-1868, pg. 310 and a deed in Union County, Arkansas). I have never tried to discover how Ellen and William were related before marriage. They were married 29 July 1844.

Solomon TERRELL Jr.'s occupation is written as *Baptist Minister* on the North Carolina census of 1850.

William Pitt TERRELL and family moved to Union County, Arkansas, before 1850, probably about 1848 or so (date because of date on deed in NC and AR). Magnolia Arkansas and El Dorado Arkansas are so close, I wonder if they all moved in the same group, and if there are more family ties here than the TERRELL connection.

The book *Terrell Genealogy* by **Emma Dicken** is the basis of most of my family information, with many other references found in the library/courthouses to double check what I can.

I would appreciate very much any information that you might have that would show more connections between my TER-RELLs and COOKS and Robertsons in NC and AR.

Hi.

So nice to hear from you and even more so when we have family ties. You have given me some TERRELL information that I do not have and that I am so glad to get. Thank you for taking the time to contact me.

Let me say first and regrettably that I failed to make note of the sources for this part of my TERRELL genealogy. Why I didn't, I don't know, unless it was during the time I first started doing genealogy and did not realize then the importance of references for the data I was researching. I learned real quickly how important that is.

I had thought that Robertson was the maiden name of Soloman Sr's wife **Amelia**, so that is new to me. You say you are 99% sure her maiden name is **SPAIN**. Why are you so sure? Do you have a reference? I have no **Richard ROBERTSON** in my records.

You did not give a name for the wife of your **William Pitt TERRELL** and I have her as **Lucy JEFFRIES**. You mentioned two daughters for them, whereas I had no information that they had children. Therefore, that is new information for me. Neither do I have any children for **Soloman, Jr.** and his wife, **Mary COOK**.

I am including all the information that I have on these families below, except that I have the father of Jeptha, and his father, and so on back. Also, I do have children for **Joseph Henry TER-RELL**, Soloman, Sr.'s 4th child by his first wife, and their children. Look it over and let me know your comments. If I can furnish anything further, I'll be more than glad to do so. Note there is no record of any of these TERRELLS being in Arkan-

Missouri complicates it some because descendants of both the New England immigrants---William THERRELL & Rebecca SIMPKINS of Boston; Roger TERRILL & Abigail UFFORD of New Milford CT-- and the VA Lines, Richmond TERRELL & William TERRELL both migrated to MO. If you find that the Joel J. TERRELL/TERRILL who entered the LDS IGI information is yours, then you probably descended from one of the New England immigrants. Even then, the water is muddied because descendants of both families migrated west in the same general pattern. Regardless, as a TERRELL we cordially invite you to join us in search of the truth. Jesse was a son of **Noval Robert (Rob) TERRELL** and his first wife **Clementine ELIS**. Jes was a brother of **William (Little Will) TERRELL** who married **Minnie GOODMAN**.

Rob TERRELL was a son of Rev. William Sylvester TER-RELL and his 2nd wife Marie (Mary) SAUCIER. He was born in the Mississippi Territory and Marie in Old French Mobile of the Lower Louisiana Territory with government center on Dauphin Island.

Rev. William was a son of Josiah TERRELL and Lucinda SWILLEY and Marie was a daughter of Pierre SAUCIER and Isabel NIAISE. Both lines continue into ancient times.
