19. **Maria M. HANSELL** (John<sup>4</sup>, George<sup>3</sup>, Michael<sup>2</sup>, Johann<sup>1</sup>), dau. of **John & Hannah (ADAMS) HANSELL**, was b. in Frederick Co., Va., Oct. 10, 1815. She m. **Richmond F. TERRELL** in Highland Co., Ohio, Aug. 7, 1834. He was b. In Lexington, Ohio, Apr. 21, 1810, and d. in Kokomo, Ind., May 14, 1888. **Maria** d. in Kokomo, Ind., Jan. 21, 1869. They are both buried there in the Crown Point Cemetery. Separate inscribed flat stone slabs mark their graves.

They came to Howard Co., Ind., from Highland Co., Ohio, in 1851. Upon Maria's death Richmond m2. **Anna P. WAILEY** (b. ca 1818) in Kokomo, Ind., Mar. 31, 1870. There were no children born of this second marriage.

His will, as filed in probate court Howard Co., Ind., follows.

**Richmond F. TERRELL Will**

“In the name of the Benevolent Father of All. I Richmond TERRELL, of the county of Howard, in the State of Indiana, aged Seventy five years, and upwards, and being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and Testament, in manner following, that is to say,

First. I direct that my funeral charges, the expenses of administering my estate, and all my debts, re paid out of my personal estate, and if that be insufficient, I xpressly charge the payment thereof, or of any deficiency, upon the real estate whereof I may die seized or possessed, and for that purpose I authorize my executors hereinafter named, to sell, at public or private sale, as to him shall seem beet, the whole or so much of my real estate, as may be sufficient for that purpose.

Second. To my beloved wife Ann P. TERRELL I give devise and bequeath, the use of the dwelling house where I now reside situate in south Kokomo Howard County, Indiana, together with all other buildings situate on the lot or plat of ground where said dwelling House is situate, such dwellings House and buildings to be used by my said wife as a residence for herself, during her life time, or so long as she may remain my widow. If my said wife should again marry, or cease to occupy said dwelling House as a residence then her right to said residence, property or any interest in it shall cease. Upon the death of my beloved wife or in case she Shall cease to occupy said property, for a residence then it shall descend in fee to my children. Share and share alike as other property of which I may die seized, shall be bequeathed or descend to my children, or the descendants of such as may die before my death.

I further give and bequeath to my beloved wife, all the household goods & Kitchen furniture of which I may die seized and possessed, and continue in my residence and home at the time of my death absolutely, to use occupy and dispose of as she may see fit, and which shall not be appraised by my executor nor receipted for to him by my beloved wife. but shall be her own. This provision in favor of my beloved wife is to be in full discharge of so much of a mitten contract entered into. on March 25th AD 1870 between my beloved wife and muesli, preceding our marriage and in view to said marriage as provides for the payment of one Hundred Dollars annually from my estate to my said wife. In case she accepts this provision in my will, then so much of said contract, as provides for the payment of one Hundred Dollars annually to my said wife shall be deemed fully satisfied.

Third. As to all other estate of which I may die seized, I give, devise, and bequeath the same to my children, or the descendants of such as may die before my death. Share and share alike, subject to such advancements as I may have made, or may hereafter make, before my death.

I have heretofore advanced to my children the following sums prior to this date.

I may hereafter make further advances, and take receipts for them as such, and in the final disposition and distribution of my estate I direct that no interest shall be counted on any sum I may have advanced to any of my children.

Fourth. I hereby revoke all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.

Fifth. I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my son-in-law. Donald W. Moore executor of this my last will & Testament

In witness whereof I hereunto subscribe my name and affix my private seal this 5th day of February AD 1886.

We, whose names are hereto subscribed, do certify that Richmond TERRELL, the Testator subscribed his name to this instrument in our presence. and in the presence of each of us, and at the same time he declared in our presence **Richmond TERRELL** and hearing that the same was his last will and testament, and requested us, and each of us, to sign our names thereto as witnesses, to the execution thereof, and which we have done accordingly, in the presence of the testator and of each other, the day of the date of said will.

She was also a faithful and energetic member of the Women's Relief Corps and performed a great service in her capacity as a member. Mrs. Stanley was also a constant contributor to the missionary cause and materially assisted the Rev. **Howell RYKE** while he was in China. She was cared for during her illness by Miss **Mary BOSALL** who resigned her position in the city schools that she might care for Mrs. Stanley. "The last will and testament of Elvira J. Stanley was filed for probate yesterday (Feb. 16, 1918). The instrument was executed Oct. 16, 1916, and is witnessed by **W. W. DRINKWATER** and **John DRINKWATER**. **Joseph TERRELL** is named as executor of the will and is directed to act without bond. The property after the just debts are paid is bequeathed in 10 equal shares, subject to certain liens, to the brothers and sister of Mrs. Stanley and her deceased husband George Stanley and to their descendants. She is survived by one sister and three brothers." At the time of death she was residing at 405 West Mulberry St., Kokomo, Ind.

**The Kokomo Tribune Sat., Sept. 23, 1933**

R. E. TERRELL, 74, well known resident of Kokomo and life long citizen of Howard County died at 7:30 o'clock Friday evening at his home, 524 West Mulberry Street. Death was attributed to a heart attack and a complication of ailments. He had been ill for the past two years. Mr. TERRELL, a retired farmer, was born on the old TERRELL homestead on the Alto pike and was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Richmond TERRELL, pioneer settlers of the county. He was the last survivor of the family of eleven (sic) children. He operated a farm for many years and retired from active management of it about twenty years ago. His sole survivor is his widow. He was a member of the I.O.O.F., being a charter member of the Alto Lodge and was a member of the Grace Methodist church. The funeral will be held Monday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the home with Rev. **S. H. TURBEVILLE** officiating. Burial will be in Crown Point cemetery (mausoleum)."

**The Kokomo Tribune, Sunday April 3 1960**

"Mrs. Nora E. TERRELL, 94, died at 9 p.m. Thursday at the home of her niece, Mrs. **Hester Harper**, in Wood River, Nebr., where she had gone seven months ago to make her home. She had been in good health until suffering a stroke of paralysis the preceding Monday night. She was born Feb. 26, 1866 at Brookville, Ind., one of five children of Mr. and Mrs. W. A. QUICK, and came to Alto as a small child, where she lived until her marriage, Aug. 31 (13) 1885 to R. E. TERRELL. They lived on a farm just north of Alto for many years, moving to Kokomo about 30 years ago. Mr. TERRELL died Sept. 22, 1933. In 1894 Mrs. TERRELL became a member of the Alto Methodist Church, transferring her membership to Grace Methodist Church upon moving here. The only surviving member of the originally (sic) family is a sister, Mrs. D. A. McIntosh, 139 Conradt Ave. There are several nieces and nephews living in Kokomo. Funeral services will be held at the Fenn Funeral Home at 3 p.m. Monday, with the Rev. Donald Bailey in charge. Interment will be in the Mausoleum (Crown Point Cemetery). Friends may call at the funeral home after 2 p.m. today."

In Highland Co., Ohio, ca 1835. She m. **Nathaniel F. WHITAKER**, in Kokomo, Ind., Mar. 26, 1857. Hannah d. in Kokomo, Ind., Apr. 25, 1888.

The civil war service record of Nathaniel S. Whitaker in Washington, D.C. discloses that he was a private in Co. D, 39th Regt. Ind. Inf. Vol., under the command of Capt. Thomas Herring, having enrolled in Kokomo, Ind. on Aug. 26, 1861 and was mustered into service at Indianapolis, Ind. on Aug. 29, 1861 to serve for three years or for the duration of the war. The record also discloses that he was born in Harrison Co., Ky., was 25 years of age at time of enlistment, was 5 ft. 9 ins. in height, having light complexion, blue eyes and dark hair, by occupation was a farmer, and that he died at the General Field Hospital, Murfreesboro, Tenn., on June 15, 1863, of typhoid fever.

Nathaniel's organization was charged to a cavalry unit (to Co. D, 8th Reg t. Ind. Vol. Cav.) shortly before his death and he was made company wagoner on Mar. 1, 1863. He is buried in the military cemetery (grave No. 942) in Murfreesboro, Tenn. His surname is spelled "Whiteker" in the record.

**AGED WOMAN DIES**

**Mrs. Mary A. TERRELL Dies at Home in Alto.**

After an illness of many years, Mrs. Mary A. TERRELL, age 76 years, died at her home at Alto Saturday night. The funeral services will be held at the Alto M. E. church at 10 o'clock this morning, in charge of the Rev. **HIXON**. Interment will be made in the Alto Cemetery. Mrs. TERRELL is survived by a son, **Oscar TERRELL**, of Kokomo, three brothers, **F. D. KIRKMAN** of California, **P. T. KIRKMAN** of Jay county, and **J. O. KIRKMAN** of Kokomo, and three sisters, Mrs. **James Heady**, Mrs. **Ells Wird** of California, and Mrs. **Ellen Samer**.

**L. U. TERRELL, A Pioneer Resident of County, Dies At His Home Near Alto**

After an illness of over two weeks with uremic poisoning, L. U. TERRELL 53 years old, died at his home near Alto late yesterday afternoon. He resided near Alto practically all his life.

Mr. TERRELL was born on a farm near Alto May 3, 1864, but after his marriage to Miss **Bell BARBER**, in October, 1906, moved to Alto, where he engaged in the painting and paper-hanging business. He is survived by his mother, his wife of Alto and a brother and sister of this city.

Scores of friends are also left to mourn his death. Mr. TERRELL was a member of the Alto M. E. church and also of the Alto Odd

Fellows lodge. The funeral is to be held in the M. E. church of Alto at 10:30 o'clock Thursday morning. Services will be in charge of the Odd Fellows with Rev. **G. L. HIXON** officiating. The place of burial is undecided.

(HANSELL) TERRELL**, was b. in Highland Co., Ohio, 1841. He m. **Mary E. BOWMAN** in New Vienna, Ohio, Oct. 28, 1868. She was b. In Ohio, ca 1847. John and Mary d. In Kokomo, Ind. - he on Nov. 6, 1878 and she on July 27, 1889 and both are buried there in Crown Point Cemetery. Separate inscribed gravestones mark their graves.

John enlisted for service in the Civil War and was enrolled on Nov. 4, 1861 at Kokomo, Ind. for service of 3 years. He was assigned as corporal in Co. G, 57th Reg't. Ind. Vols. He re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer, Jan. 1, 1864, and was promoted from 1st sergeant to 1st Lt. Adjutant on May 5, 1865 in the same regiment. He was slightly wounded on the right hand by a shell on Nov. 25, 1863 and was mustered out of service, with the field staff, on Dec. 14, 1865.

Following John's death in 1878, his widow, on May 2, 1883 made application for a war widow's pension, in which application she stated that her husband had died on or about the 6th day of Nov. 1878 "of cerebral apoplexy superinduced by chronic diarrhea contracted in the service and line of duty". She listed as their only child, **Clarence V. TERRELL**, born Apr. 14, 1870. Her charge that John's illness began with war service is substantiated by muster rolls revealing that he was absent on several occasions because of sickness - one sick leave in Louisville, Ky., one in Nashville, Tenn., one in Knoxville, Tenn., and others. It is not known whether or not Mary Ellen was granted a pension. Even if she did she did not live to enjoy it long as she died in 1889.

### Kokomo (Ind.) Morning Dispatch, Wed. June 30, 1909

**Daniel GREESON**, a prominent resident of Harrison township, and well known throughout Howard county, being a member of a pioneer family of the county, died yesterday at 12:30 o'clock, at his late home, Alto, at the age of seventy-eight years.

The deceased was a victim of paralysis being stricken three weeks ago while at his home. The funeral will take place at the late residence Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The Rev. **F. A. HALL** of Greentown will preach the funeral discourse. Interment will follow in Crown Point cemetery this city.

The widow and three children survive. The later are **Arthur GREESON** of Turin; **C. E. GREESON** of Parsons, Kansas; and **Charles F. GREESON** of Chicago. The deceased also leaves two brothers, **George F. GREESON**, of Alto, and **Elijah GREESON** of Hendricks county, **M. Edwin GREESON** and **Dr. J. O. GREESON** of this city are nephews and **Mrs. W. D. Ward** of South Kokomo is a niece of the deceased.

Mr. Greeson, the deceased, was a devoted member of the Methodist church. A number of years ago he moved to Iowa, returning to this county about ten years ago. He passed his life chiefly in farming, and was a straight forward man of quiet manners, but respected for his worth by all who knew him. He was a kind neighbor, devoted to his family, and deserving of the good opinion of all who knew and respected him.

### The Kokomo (Ind.) Tribune, Fri. April 5, 1912

Mrs. Ella Greeson, widow of Daniel Greeson, who would have been seventy years of age had she lived until May 8, next, died at her home southwest of the city at 11 o'clock this morning. Death resulted from valvular heart trouble, complicated with an apopical affection and other ailments.

The funeral arrangements await word from her sons, two of whom live away from Howard county.

Mrs. Greeson had been ill for three years, and for the greater part of the time her condition was regarded as serious. For the last several days she had been sinking, and her death was not wholly unexpected.

She was the daughter of **Richmond TERRELL**, and was born at an early day at the old **TERRELL** homestead near Alto (sic). She was reared at Alto, and during her girlhood became a member of the Methodist church there. Throughout her life she was a faithful worker in the church, and wrought earnestly in the labor for good.

In 1862 she became the wife of Daniel Greeson. The young couple did not remain long in Howard county after the wedding. They went first to Morgan County, where they lived for a decade, and thence to a farm in Iowa. They returned to Howard County some fifteen years ago.

Mrs. Greeson was a woman whose death is a direct loss to the community. Sweet and gentle and kind, her active, busy, helpful life was a benediction to the hundreds who knew her, and, they will learn of her departure with deep and sincere regret.

She is survived by three sons - Charles, Chicago; Arthur, Kansas; and Edward, who lives in this county. Surviving brothers and sisters are: R. E. TERRELL, David TERRELL and Gaddis TERRELL. Mrs. D. W. Moore, Mrs. L. C. Miller and Mrs. George Stanley, all of this county.

**Kokomo (Ind.) Dispatch, Tues. Morning, Oct. 22, 1912.**

Tombstones that are crumbling in many burial places of Howard County bear the marks in the cutting of their moss-greened Inscriptions of handwork supervised by Daniel W. Moore, when **John WELSH** was the monument-maker for Kokomo. Monuments that promise to stand for proof eternal in the scores of sacred spots through-out the county were wrought under his direction. The earliest memory hereabout is of the "marble shop" which stood next door to **Reuben PORTER'S** "coffin store" in Railroad street, now known by the name given it in the original plat of the town as Buckeye street, and the quiet, gentle mannered man who sat in the summer afternoon in front of its door - even up to hour that la hardly longer gone than is the yesterday. And it was yesterday that the call came, as it must come to all of flesh, to the builder of the marble markers by which flowers, watered by tears, have been planted for more than half a century. The kindly heart that throbbled true in the days of **Reube PORTER, "Dan" DOWNS, Jonathan DUNKLE** and **Henry BOWMAN**, his neighbors and business associates in the far-away years, ceased to beat at 8:30 o'clock yesterday morning at his late home, 609 North Main Street.

Just Fell Asleep.

There was nothing the matter. All was well with him. The man whose house had never been in order, in the full-ripened years fell asleep. In all the years since he had known Kokomo as hardly more than a cabin there in the clearing he had met every obligation of an upright life, walking in the fear of God and to the furthest striving to make the world the better for his having lived in it.

One of the oldest of the men of the mighty past of Kokomo, he

was one best beloved by those who knew him well and had opportunity to measure him at his true worth.

Daniel William Moore was born in Bartholomew county, Indiana, March 7, 1836, and was the son of Snodde H. and Pernelia Moore.

**Active in church Work.**

The deceased was a life long member of the Christian church and at all times was active in the work. For several years he was a member of the board of trustees, and for the past thirty years he has been the church treasurer. October 1, he asked that the church board accept his resignation, as his health was failing, but up to the hour of his death they had not done so, and he was in office at his death.

The funeral will be held from the residence Wednesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, the Rev. **Richard EDWARDS** officiating. Interment will follow in Crown Point cemetery.

**The Kokomo (Ind.) Daily Tribune, Tuesday, May 11, 1915**

Shortly after 3 o'clock this morning, the spirit of Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Moore passed from its pain racked mortal frame and found peace in the certainty of everlasting rest. The deceased had been confined to her bed for the past eight months, but she bore her sufferings patiently and bravely. Death was due to a complication of diseases.

Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Moore was the daughter of Richmond and Mariah TERRELL and was born in Highland county, Ohio, seventy years ago last April 26. At an early age she moved with her parents to Howard county, settling on a farm on the Alto pike. Here she grew to womanhood and lived until her marriage September 3, 1863 with D. W. Moore.

To this union, five children were born. They are Mrs. **Eva Sumption**, Mrs. **Cora A. Sulavan**, **Maidie Yager**, Mrs. **Grace E. Clifford** and **Roll W. Moore**. Mrs. Moore has reared her two grandchildren, **William** and **Mona Yager**.

Mrs. Moore was a life-long member of the Christian Church and she was a regular attendant of the Main street church until sickness compelled her to take to her bed. During her long siege of illness she had a perfect assurance and was content. Her friends and relatives worried a great deal more than she. She was one of those women who came out of the mighty past in Howard county, one whose life was a blessing to all who knew her with any degree of intimacy.

The deceased has suffered with an affliction of the eyes for the past few years and this ^o dimmed her vision that• she was unable to recognize her many friends.

The following biographical account of David is taken from Morrow's *History of Howard County, Indiana*:

**DAVID J. TERRELL.**

Standing for upright manhood and progressive citizenship the subject of this sketch has long occupied a conspicuous place among the representatives of the great agricultural interest of Indiana and his influence in every relation of life has made for the material advancement of the community in which he resides and the moral welfare of those with whom he has been brought into contact. David J. TERRELL comes of an old and highly esteemed Ohio family, the genealogy of which is traceable to an early period in the history of that commonwealth, the first mention of the name occurring in Highland county, where Richmond TERRELL, the subject's father, was born and reared, the ancestral

home being near the town of Lexington. Maria M. Hansell, wife of Richmond F. TERRELL and mother of the subject, was also a native of Highland county, and her father, a farmer by occupation and a most excellent and praiseworthy citizen, spent his life there, dying a number of years ago at his home near the above seat of justice, at the advanced age of seventy-five.

The subject's father was early left an orphan and after the death of his parents became an inmate of the home of his cousin, with whom he lived until young manhood, the meantime serving an apprenticeship at the trade of cabinet making, which he followed for a number of years in his native state, subsequently discontinuing mechanical work to engage in the pursuit of agriculture. In 1851 he disposed of his interests in Ohio and moved to Howard county, Indiana, purchasing a partially improved farm, which in due time he brought to a high state of cultivation and on which he continued to reside until his death, at the age of seventy-eight years. Richmond F. TERRELL was a man of excellent traits, upright in all his dealings and his life was filled to repletion with good to his fellow men. He was reared in the faith of the society of Friends, but some time after his marriage he united with the Methodist church, of which his wife was a member, and continued in that communion until her death, when he returned to his former belief and to the end of his days remained loyal to its teaching. Mrs. TERRELL, whose death occurred at the age of fifty-two, bore her husband ten children, five sons and five daughters, the father living to see all of them married and well settled in life. One of the sons, John H., was a soldier in the Fifty-seventh Indiana Infantry, in the Civil war and gave nearly four years to the service of his country, during which time he

took part in a number of bloody battles and for meritorious conduct rose from the ranks to the position of adjutant of his regiment, filling the intermediate offices with credit to himself and to the honor of his command.

David J. TERRELL is a native of Highland county, Ohio, where he was born June 11, 1850. He spent his childhood and youth on the family homestead near the town of Lexington and in 1851 accompanied his parents upon their removal to Indiana, since which time he has been an honored resident of Howard county. In due time he entered the district school, not far from his home, and continued his attendance at the same until obtaining a knowledge of the branches constituting the regular course of study, meanwhile devoting the spring and summer seasons to farm labor, at which he was able to make a full hand at a comparatively early age. He remained with his father assisting in the cultivation of the home place until his twenty-sixth year, when he purchased a small farm of his own in Center township to which he at once removed, and which under his efficient labors and excellent management soon became one of the best cultivated and most highly improved places in the township. He still owns his original purchase, but has increased his holdings from time to time until he now owns several valuable tracts of land, the greater part thoroughly drained and otherwise well improved, the general appearance of the lands indicating the presence of a master of agriculture who aims to keep freely abreast in all matters relating to his vocation.

In the year 1900 Mr. TERRELL turned his farm over to other hands and moved to Kokomo, where he maintained a residence until the fall of 1905, when he returned to the country and took possession of a beautiful farm adjoining his own in Taylor Township, which came to his wife through her parents, and on which he has since lived and prospered. Since resuming agricultural pursuits he has made a number of valuable improvements on his place, adding much to its beauty and attractiveness, and it now is conceded that he has one of the best and most desirable rural homes in Taylor township, the land being enclosed with wire fence and well tiled, all taut fifteen acres being susceptible to a high state of cultivation. Although giving personal attention to his farming interests and looking carefully after the management of his lands, Mr. TERRELL does little physical work, his son-in-law attending to the active operation of the farm, which yields an income sufficiently ample to maintain his own and the latter's family in comfortable circumstances.

As already indicated, Mr. TERRELL has devoted much study to the science of agriculture and easily is the peer of any farmer in the county, being progressive in his methods and making use of the latest and most approved implements and appliances by means of which the labors of the farm are not only greatly lessened, but made much more effective and economical. He also keeps in touch with the trend of current events, takes an active interest in the public and political issues of the day, and as a Republican wields a strong influence for his party, helms one of its leaders in the township in which he resides.

On October 12, 1875, Mr. TERRELL was united in marriage with Julia A. Neal, daughter of Enos and Margaret A. (Fauchier) Neal, natives of Ohio. Mrs. Neal was of French lineage, her grandfather Fauchier having been born in Marseilles, France, in

the year, 1766, and Martha D., his wife, born in New Hampshire in 1780, and their marriage occurred on September 23, 1798, in the city of Boston, Massachusetts. John B. Fauchier, the grandfather of Mrs. Neal was born in Suffolk, Massachusetts, in 1799, married in December, 1823, to Sarah Broyles, of Kentucky, and became the father of fifteen children. Enos Neal, father of Mrs. TERRELL, was born May 23, 1835, in Miami county, Ohio, came to Howard county in 1851, was married on August 8, 1858, to Margaret Fauchier, who departed this life in August, 1900, his death occurring in Kokomo, February 12, 1905, at the age of seventy years.

Mr. and Mrs. TERRELL have two children living, the older being Oma May, who was born in the year 1878, and who is now the wife of John E. Harland, and the mother of three offspring. Charles F., the second of the family, was born March 16, 1882. He too is married and the father of two children, his home at this time being in Chicago.

Mr. TERRELL is well situated to enjoy the material comforts with which fortune has blessed him and stands high among the citizens of the community in which he lives. He belongs to the Improved Order of Red Men, aside from which he is identified with no fraternal organization, his greatest satisfaction being in the quiet life he leads as a prosperous and contented tiller of the soil and in the mutually agreeable domestic ties which make home the happiest and most attractive spot on earth to one of his tastes and ideals.

### Gaddis TERRELL to be Buried Next Saturday

J: Gaddis TERRELL, aged 66 years, died at his home, 1013 West Mulberry street yesterday morning at 8:45 o'clock of anemia following an illness of three weeks. Mr. TERRELL's health began to fail about two years ago, but he was confined to his bed only a few weeks.

Funeral services will be conducted at the residence Saturday after noon at 3 o'clock by **Rev. ARNOLD**, pastor of the Grace M.E. church. The burial will to in Crown Point cemetery.

Mr. TERRELL was born April 14, 1853, near Alto where he spent his boyhood days on the farm and after he grew to manhood he became one of the substantial farmers of Howard county. He continued his occupation as a farmer until 1896 when he was elected county assessor of Howard County and in 1900 up-

on being chosen for a second term he moved to Kokomo where he has since resided. As a county official he was obliging and efficient in the discharge of his duties and the spirit of fairness in which he discharged the duties of the office made him many friends among the citizens of Howard county.

Early in life Mr. TERRELL united with the Methodist Church at Alto. After he came to Kokomo he transferred his membership to the Grace M.E. church. At the time of his death he was financial secretary of the church and had served for a number of years as one of the stewards.

After retiring from the office as county assessor, Mr. TERRELL engaged in the grocery business until three years ago when declining health compelled him to seek out door life.

He is survived by the widow, two daughters, Miss Berths TERRELL and Mrs. Orda Moore of this city, two sons, Lewis TERRELL of Kokomo and Richmond J. TERRELL of Brookings, North Dakota. He is also survived by two brothers, Edward and David TERRELL and one sister, Mrs. L. D. Miller all of this city.

Mrs. Miller had lived in Kokomo 15 years. She is survived by two brothers, **R. E. and D. J. TERRELL**, of this city, and her daughter, Mrs. C. E. Johns.

Mrs. Miller was of the Methodist faith, being a member of the Grace M. E. Church. She realized that the end was near, but was ready to go, remaining patient and kind during her last illness, and planning all the details of her funeral, especially requesting that Mrs. **Mabel Ingles** and **Leroy Lacey** sing at the services.

Mrs. Miller was a woman of many fine qualities of mind and heart. She was of a lovable disposition and her friends were as many as acquaintances she made. She endeared herself to all, and never had for any person but words of kindness and helpfulness. Most of the years of her life were spent as the wife of a physician and to this capacity- she performed many acts which won for her the golden encomiums (?) of those who shared her thoughtfulness. As a mother she was tender and dutiful in all her responsibilities. She was serious in the dignity and conception of the relationship and performed her maternal duties with success and honor. As a neighbor she was without peer in the locality where she was for so many years known - Alto.

When she came to the city her devotion to her new neighbors was no less than to those who had known her in the old home. It was with deep personal grief of all the neighbors in the little village to the south that she left there to come to Kokomo. As deep a personal bereavement will be felt by all who knew her in this city now that she has joined her loved ones on the golden shores of eternity. As a wife she was helpful in the utmost and never saw a duty in her household that it was not a pleasure to perform. Her home was ever in order, her home a haven of rest and a delight to visit. She was a choice companion, a woman of intelligence and refinement and of spiritual purity. Her last suffering was borne with the meekness and serenity which became the serenity and philosophy of her temperament and now that this beautiful life is ended a calm reflection of her deserts will enshrine her memory in affection.

**Kokomo ( Ind.) Sunday Dispatch, April 20, 1919**

Dr. Lewis C. Miller, aged 75 years, Civil War veteran, and the oldest physician in Howard County, died yesterday morning at 8 o'clock at his home, 101 South Washington Street, following an illness of five weeks of a complication of ailments. Funeral services will be conducted Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the residence. The services will be in charge of Rev. **A. G. NEAL** of Ft. Wayne. The burial will be in Crown Point cemetery.

Dr. Miller was the son of Jacob and Eliza Miller, natives of Virginia, who emigrated west ward in the early part of the nineteenth century and established a homestead in Shelby County, Indiana, where Dr. Miller was born December 11, 1843. He was the fifteenth child in a family of seventeen children of whom only two survive: **Jacob MILLER** of Shelby County, and **Mrs. Henry Meyer**, of "infield, Kas.

Dr. Miller enlisted in Company E, 79th Indiana Infantry and served during the Civil War. At the close of the war he studied

medicine with Dr. **Lewis KERN** and Dr. **Jacob KERN**, father of the late Senator **John W. KERN**; Dr. Miller being a cousin to Senator Kern. Later he graduated from the Indiana Medical College at Indianapolis after which he located at Alto and engaged in the practice of his profession. He soon built up a large and lucrative practice, his services being in demand of a large clientele.

He was united in marriage March 16, 1875 to Miss Sarah E. TERRELL at the Richmond TERRELL homestead in Harrison Township and established a home in Alto. He and Mrs. Miller continued to reside at Alto until about fifteen years ago when they came to Kokomo, as Dr. Miller wished to rest from his labors and spend his remaining days in quiet contentment. Dr. and Mrs. Miller have one daughter, Mrs. C. E. Johns, of Noblesville, Indiana.

Dr. Miller was a descendant of the best representatives of the "Old Dominion" the mother of presidents. His ancestors being among those who represented the best Virginia blood, and intellectual attainments. While Dr. Miller never boasted of his ancestry, yet it was commonly known that it was a source of pride to him to be able to point to such a noble parentage.

As a man, Dr. Miller was a gentleman in every respect. He was possessed of sound judgment, and good business ability. He was respected by his neighbors, even those who did not always agree with him on public questions found that he was reasonable in all things. Fraternally Dr. Miller was a member of the Masonic lodge.

In Kokomo and Spent His Life Here, Making a Great Success In Business**

The death messenger invaded the sacred precincts of home at 8:30 o'clock last evening and called from earthly scenes Roll William Moore, aged 38 years, 6 months and 15 days. He was stricken about one week ago with the dreaded influenza which was followed by pneumonia. He made as heroic fight for life and the best medical skill available failed to stay the ravages of the disease.

He is survived by the widow and three children: Mary Louise, Martha Frances, and Earl TERRELL aged ten, seven, and two years. He is also survived by four sisters: Mrs. Charles Sulavan; Mrs. Frank Clifford; Mrs. Maidie Yager; & Mrs. Eva Belle Sumption.

Roll William Moore was born in Kokomo, Indiana, May 16, 1880. He was the son of Daniel W. and Mary Moore, early pioneers of Howard County, both of whom passed away in recent years. Roll, as he was familiarly known, spent by boyhood days on North Main Street near where the office of the Kokomo Water Works is now located. He attended the Kokomo city schools, graduating from high school in the class of [1897?] He afterward attended Butler College at Indianapolis for one year.

Soon after his return from college he entered the employment of the Howard National Bank of Kokomo where he continued for a number of years [not legible] of the Kokomo Trust Company. While in the employ of the Kokomo Trust Company, he purchased the interest of H. W. Vrooman and Dr. Frank Smith in the Vrooman-Smith printing company, then located on the third floor of what is now the American Trust Company building.

Fraternally, Mr. Moon was a member of the Elks and Knight of Pythias lodges of this city. He was also a member of the Delta Tau Delta fraternity. As a lodge member he was true of his obligations and his clean life was a worthy example and an inspiration to his brothers in the lodges.

The loss of so promising a young business man hardly past the threshold of a successful business career, the going out of a life so full of promise, and filled with the desire to do good to others, cannot be measured from a pecuniary standpoint. There will be a vacancy in the spirit and business life of this city that will never be filled.

In the passing away of Mr. Moore, the greatest loss is to his family which until he passed away was yet unbroken. **FRED M. KELLY'S BODY FOUND IN MISSISSINEWA**  
**Kokomo Florist Meets Death In River At the Outskirts of the**  
**City of Marion**  
**MAY HAVE BEEN A VICTIM OF THUGS**  
**Police and Firemen Drag River**  
**For Several Hours During Night.**

Fred M. Kelly, well known Kokomo florist, whose establishment is at [1015?] East Sycamore Street, near Crown Point Cemetery was found drowned in the Mississinewa River at the outskirts of Marion a 5 o'clock this morning.

The body was brought to Kokomo this afternoon in [Losey?] ambulance. Arrangements for the funeral have not been announced.

While police of Marion have not issued positive statement, there is every indication that Kelly was robbed and thrown into the river. The police are searching for persons who may be able to throw some light on the affair.

Kelly got off an [I R & L?] traction car at Marion at 8 o'clock Wednesday evening. He went to the court house square and met several acquaintances. He displayed a roll of bills to a number of them and several witnesses testified that he said, "I am over here to get drunk. My wife won't let me drink at home. I would just as soon get the whole crowd drunk while I am at it."

Several of the men accepted the invitation. A half dozen of the started with Kelly to "Duganville" at the outskirts of town where there are several saloons.

About 11 o'clock Wednesday night, Dr. Hugh Pope on his way back to the city from a professional call crossed the bridge over the Mississinewa near Duganville. When about half way across, he was set upon by two thugs who tried to hold him up. Dr. Pope made such vigorous resistance that he managed to get clear of the men. He ran to the nearest telephone and notified the police.

The officers reached the scene about twenty minutes later. While they were searching the neighborhood for the footpads they heard cries and moans from the river.

They went to investigate, but could not, in the darkness, locate the source of the cries, though they could be distinctly heard. At this juncture, "Lough" Francis a powerful Negro, offered to help. He returned after a half hour saying that at one time he had

his hands on a drowning man, but the figure slipped away from him. Francis says he dived again and again to no avail.

At two o'clock this morning, police and fireman with boats and lanterns began dragging the river. At the end of an hour's fruitless effort, they decided to wait until morning. At five o'clock this morning, the hooks caught and the body of a man was brought to the surface. There were no marks of violence, but some of the pockets had been turned inside out, and it is this that makes for the belief that the man was "rolled" for his money. A receipted bill of the Indiana Natural Gas and Oil company of Kokomo, bearing the name of Fred M. Kelly, gave a clue to the identity of the victim.

Mrs. Fred Kelly and the man's mother, Mrs. W. W. Sefton of East Walnut Street went to Marion early today.

Fred Kelly was the son of Mr. and Mrs. George M. Kelly. He was about thirty-five years of age and attended the Kokomo schools. He was born and reared in this city. He entered the florist's business about fifteen years ago, and had the reputation of being thoroughly grounded in his calling. He is survived by his mother, the widow, and one child, a girl of nine years. His father met a tragic death some twelve years ago.

Mr. Kelly had many friends among the people of Kokomo. His eccentricities were somewhat marked, but he was unfailingly generous, impulsive, affable, and good hearted. Knowingly he wronged no man and his death should have been so pitifully tragic is a matter for sincere regret.

That sounds so very formal to address a 4th cousin and her husband, but, as I don't know you personally, Marianne and Bill doesn't seem quite right either.

It is just amazing to me how you were able to trace my Father's branch of the family - even apparently to the fact that both of my brothers are deceased and Francis' widow remarried and you have her new name; and probably, strangest of all, how you traced me.

I divorced Judson's father in 1933 and remarried in 1936 to Joseph W. Fogarty; Joe died of cancer in 1957; then in 1962, I married again to William J. Holt.

This list of names (Greeson, Goltra, Fogarty, Holt) is like dragging skeletons out of the closet - and I can just imagine some of my living and future cousins, nieces and nephews, and even my own great-greats in grandchildren (when I am long forgotten and am just a name to them) being a bit shocked.

My husband (also "Bill") mentioned that this ancestry would make me eligible for the D.A.R., and although I am not interested in that at all, it is most interesting for me to learn a bit more of my Dad's side of the family. I can remember an Uncle Ed and Aunt Nora TERRELL in Kokomo - and there was a Virgil TERRELL - and I think a Charlie. I'm pretty sure that when I was a little girl we got a white poodle dog from some TERRELL's -- our dog was named "Fussy", but I can't think of the given names of the TERRELL -- oh, I think her name was Eva. I don't remember ever hearing "Hansell" as a family name; however, my sister, Ruth, probably would know of that. I don't remember my Greeson grandparents as they died before or shortly after I was born, and after living in Chicago for the first twelve years of my life my parents moved to Detroit. My Dad died

when I was just 14, and we just sort of lost track.

Does your genealogy go back further than George Hansell? I would be interested in securing a copy of your final results if that is possible -- or are you just doing this for your own information?

I was going to fill in my son Judd's copy and mail it right back to you, but I couldn't remember if his wife's mother's maiden name was spelled Reed or Reid -- so I sent it on to him, his address is 48140 Rushwood Lane, Novi, Michigan, 48050. He was in the Navy in WW II, also during Korea.

We are leaving for Florida this Sunday, the 14th, and won't be back until about the 1st of April. Our mail will be forwarded to us periodically. Your return address sticker shows "Civil Engineer", but I am sure you must have had some detective training - at least perseverance personified!

*Editor's Note:* We have no documentation that **William TERRELL** below was knighted and entitled to the "Sir." Likewise, I have not seen any documentation that his wife was entitled to "Lady." The English ancestry published was the incorrect one assumed by **Edwin Holland TERRELL** and **J. F. TYRRELL** in 1910, so I am not including it. Generation numbers are as used in the book and have no actual value to this work prior to the marriage of **NEGUS** and **COPPOCK**. This work was done before the current generation numbering system was developed. Generation numbers in this work are indicated by characters before and after the person number: First generation #.; second generation (#); third generation -#-; fourth generation =#=#; fifth generation /#/. *DFB*

21. Sir **William TERRILL**, also spelled TERRELL married Lady **Susannah WATERS**. During the protectorate of **Oliver CROMWALL**, being Quakers and grievously persecuted because of their religion, they decided to try to get to America. Crossing over to Ireland as colonists, they sailed for Virginia about 1665. There is in the possession of the family of **Richmond TERRELL**, a watch and ring bearing the crest of the

## AARON B. TERRIL - IOWA

*History Of Delaware County, Iowa, And Its People, Volume 2* edited by John F. Merry p. 485, 486

**Aaron B. Terril**, now living retired in the city of Manchester, was born in Lorain County, Ohio, June 25, 1843, a son of **Truman** and **Amarilla (HIGGINS) Terril**, the former a native of Connecticut and the latter of Ohio. In 1852 the parents and two sons, including our subject, drove across the country from St. Joseph, Missouri, to California, ultimately arriving at Diamond Spring. They drove five yoke of oxen and it required five and a half months for them to complete the trip. The father engaged in the grocery business at Diamond Spring, but in 1856 they were burned out, losing all their property, and two weeks later the mother died.

In 1857 Truman Terril and his son Aaron returned to the middle west, settling near Coldwater, Michigan. In 1864 the father came to town, where he embarked in the grocery business and was afterward joined by his son Aaron. Later, however, Truman Terril sold his interest in that business, he died in 1884, in Crawfordsville, Indiana.

In the family were three children, of whom one died in infancy. One son, Elbert, enlisted for service in the Civil war as a member of Company I, Fourth Michigan Cavalry, at Coldwater, for three years, being mustered in August 29, 1862. He was at that time a young man of twenty-two years. He was afterward taken prisoner and was paroled December .11, 1862. He was transferred to the invalid corps May 1, 1864, and was discharged at Springfield, Illinois, on the 8th of July, 1865, at which time he was a member of the Fifteenth Regiment Veteran Reserve Corps,

As previously stated, Aaron B. Terril accompanied his father on various removals until he lit length became a resident f Coldwater, Michigan. There, in 1862, he enlisted for service in the Civil war as corporal, joining Company I of the Fourth Cavalry on the 7th of August. He was nineteen years of age at that time. On the 29th of August he was mustered in and went to the front, pledged to support his country as a soldier for three years. In an engagement he was taken prisoner but was paroled January 26, 1863, and later he, was discharged at Columbus, Ohio, on account of physical disability, contracted in service, on the 12th of January, 1864. In the meantime, however, he had participated in many engagements both of major and minor importance, the

regiment in all participating in ninety engagements. It was this regiment that captured •Jefferson Davis at Irwinville, Georgia, May 10, 1865.

Mr. Terril took part in the following engagements: Stanford, Kentucky, October 14, 1862; Gallatin, Tennessee, November 8; Lebanon, Tennessee, November 9; Rural Hill, Tennessee, November 15; Bairds Mill, Tennessee, November 30; Hollow Tree Gap, Tennessee, December 4; Wilson's Creek Road, Tennessee, December 11; Franklin, Tennessee, December 12; Rural Hill, Tennessee, December 20; Wilson's Creek, Tennessee, December 21; La Vergne, Tennessee, December 26; Jefferson's Bridge, Tennessee, December 27; Nashville Pike, Tennessee, December 30; Stone River, Tennessee, December 31; La Vergne, Tennessee, January 1, 1863; Manchester Pike, Tennessee, January 5; Harpeth River Shoals, Tennessee, January 12; Cumberland, Tennessee, January 13; Bradyville, Tennessee, January 21. After this engagement he was taken prisoner.

Several years after the close of his military experience, or in October, 1868, Aaron B. Terril joined his father in Manchester and engaged with him in the grocery business under the firm name of *Terril & Son*. The business connection between them continued for about three years, at the end of which time **H. A. GRANGER** purchased the interest of the father and the firm style was changed to *Terril & Granger*, under which style tile trade was conducted for about three years. At the end of that time Mr. Terril purchased his partner's interest and conducted the business alone until 1878, when he turned his attention from commercial pursuits and took up the study of medicine in the State University of Iowa, where he was graduated in 1881.

A short time after his graduation, however, he entered the grocery business and for eighteen years was active as a grocery merchant of Manchester. He occupied a very prominent and enviable position in commercial circles and won a substantial measure of success. For some time he has now lived retired in the enjoyment of a rest which he has truly earned and richly deserves.

Mr. Terril has been married three times. On the 7th of February, 1866, at Elyria, Ohio, he wedded **Louise E. TUTTLE**, who was born March 21, 1840, in Cooperstown, New York. She was a devout member of the Congregational church and passed away in that faith on the 30th of August, 1905, leaving two daughters, **Lillian Louise** and **Blanche M.** For many years prior to her death she was a semi-invalid and the extreme devotion and unremitting care shown her by her husband and daughters were only equaled by her great and unselfish concern for her husband and children.

Since the mother's death the elder daughter has passed away. She was born in Coldwater, Michigan, and during her infancy was brought by her parents to Iowa. For twenty-five years she was the organist of the Congregational church and Sunday school of Manchester and following her death, which occurred March 31, 1907, her father gave in 1908 a handsome pipe organ to Herrick Chapel of Iowa College at Grinnell, as a memorial to her. The younger daughter, **Blanche M.**, is now attending Moody Institute in Chicago.

Mr. Terril was married again March 17, 1909, his second union being with Mrs. **Elizabeth (CLEAVES) Shaw**, who died on the 5th of July of the same year. On the 9th of November, 1910, he

was married at Waterloo, Iowa, to Mrs. **Nellie (HANCOCK) Ranson**, the widow of **George RANSON**, of Fortuna, California.

Mr. Terril united with the Congregational church April 3, 1870, and in its teachings has been found the motive spring of his conduct. He has served as a deacon for the past twenty years and for a number of years has been a member of the board of trustees and chairman of the finance committee. He was superintendent of the Sunday school for fourteen years and for thirteen years acted as president of the Delaware County Sunday School Association.

The town of *Terril*, Dickinson County, Iowa, was named for Mr. **Terril**, he owning the land which is now the town site.

His political allegiance is given to the progressive party, after long connection with the republican party, and he belongs to the Grand Army of the Republic, being a member of W. A. Morse Post, of which he was commander for two years. In matters of citizenship he has always been as true and loyal to his country as when he followed the old flag upon southern battlefields. His entire career has been characterized by progress and by patriotism and he has made a splendid record as a citizen, as a soldier and as a business man.
