We could not have produced 2400+ pages of Trails without your help and support.

Due to my health, this is probably my last issue. I ask your indulgence for a few moments as I reminisce about the good years that I have enjoyed as your editor.

In 1984 we organized The Terrell Society of America, Inc. at a multi-branch family reunion of the descendants of **John TER-REL**, who d. 1828-29 in Henry County, GA. We met at the home of Mr. **Sylvester** & Mrs. **Eleanor PACE Terrell** in Jonesboro, GA. Nearly 100 descendants attended. Most lived within 50 miles of Jonesboro, GA; but we had some from as far away as California.

We selected officers and incorporated. In 1985, we concluded enrollment of what we considered to be our "charter membership" and began publishing Trails.

I became the *Corporate Secretary* and *newsletter editor* by pure voluntary default. I was the only one in the group with a computer; no one else wanted either job! Today, I hold the distinction of being the only charter officer still active in the operation of the Society.

One of the primary purposes for incorporation was to create an entity that can continue after the organizers have entered into eternal rest. It grieves me to think that our efforts toward that goal may have been in vain and the Society may not outlive me. We tried several more national reunions in: Texas; California; Unicoi State Park, GA; and Coosa County, AL. We had members in attendance at Unicoi from as far away as Alaska! However, due to the age of our membership and the distance between them, none of these reunions had as large attendance as the original one in Jonesboro, GA. We gave up on national reunions and tried to encourage members to hold local reunions for their immediate line.

Spring 1987, we began our *LENDING LIBRARY* with Mr. Lawrence Fontaine LE STOURGEON as our first lending librarian. Lawrence was an octogenarian when he joined us; retired from managing his own business for many years. His closest TERRELL ancestor had died nearly 400 years earlier! However, he was mentally alert and deeply interested in helping TERRELL descendants find their ancestors. He loved to read and draw charts. Some of his handiwork is incorporated into some of the Lending Library publications. He had knee problems, but he was willing to carry books into the post office in a small red toy wagon to make them available for our members.

Lawrence also became our first "Correspondence Secretary." The title gave him a feeling of "belonging" and being a vital part of our organization. He lived on interest income. Only he and God know how much of his personal money he spent on phone calls to potential members.

Lawrence found Mr. **John TERRELL** of Hickory NC and through him obtained our original copy of the work of Gen. **William Henry Harrison TERRELL**, of Indianapolis. TERRELL's work was the catalyst for several books on the VA descendants by others such as: Virginia Wharton Lamb; Celeste Jane Terrell Barnhill; Parker; and what I personally consider the best so far, Emma Dicken's, *Terrell Genealogy*.

When Lawrence's health declined to the point of needing help, Mrs. **Pat Terrell Walker** assisted and finally took over the operation of the Lending Library and most of the initial correspondence with members and prospects.

About 1999, Mrs. Walker apparently became too busy to handle these voluntary services in a timely manner, so I inherited both the Lending Library and all member correspondence. I have slowed down now due to my health.

I have not been fortunate enough to meet many of our current members. I have not used Trails as a vanity publication to promote myself. I do not wish to do so now, but I would like to share a brief testimony with you.

At the age of 17, during a "Hell Fire & Damnation" sermon, I accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Saviour. I have tried to live out my life according to the King James Bible as a member of a number of Baptist Churches, most of them Fundamental, Independent.

This is the method of salvation that was presented to me.

The preacher said: "All have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;" Romans 3:23. I realized that "all" included me. I was a born sinner!

The preacher said: "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Romans 6:23

I realized that I was a sinner doomed to eternal death in Hell.

The preacher said: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16

I realized that there is hope for me. God made a way out!

The preacher said: "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. Romans 10:9

When he preacher said: "Who hath saved us, and called us with an holy calling, not according to our works, but according to

his own purpose and grace, which was given us in Christ Jesus before the world began." 2 Timothy 1:9

I realized that Christ paid the penalty for my sins and offered salvation (eternal life) to me as a gift. The gift was by His grace, not because of any works that I could ever do. All I needed to do was accept his gift of eternal life.

The preacher said: "But there were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privily shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that bought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction." 2 Peter 2:1

As I studied and grew in grace and knowledge I realized that all religions that claim the name of Jesus Christ are not adhering to Biblical teachings. Many mix works with grace. Some say you have to speak in 'tongues.' Some have ordinances that have no Biblical basis.

I found only two ordinances established by Christ in the King James Bible.

1. Baptism, by example;

"Then cometh Jesus from Galilee to Jordan unto John, to be baptized of him. But John forbad him, saying, I have need to be baptized of thee, and comest thou to me?" Matthew 3:13-14 2. "The Lord's Supper," by commandment.

"And he took bread, and gave thanks, and brake it, and gave unto them, saying, This is my body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of me." Luke 22:19

On Sept 11, 1958, a little less than a year later, I married **Brenda Jean HARRELL**, a Christian girl who lived less than a mile from me. I was 18; she was 15. We both believed in Biblical marriage as commanded by God.

"Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh." Genesis 2:24 and: "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?" 2 Corinthians 6:14

We believed that our children were a gift from God: "Lo, children are an heritage of the LORD: and the fruit of the womb is his reward." Ps 127:3. We thanked God for each of our six children and dedicated each of them to Him as they were born, asking that He watch over them, protect them, and save their souls when they became of age. We reared them in church and all confessed Jesus Christ as Saviour before they left home.

God gave us 45 years, two months, and 16 days before he called Brenda home on Nov. 27, 2003. During that entire period, we kept our eyes set on Jesus Christ, each other, and our children. By the grace of God, we were both saved from immorality, alcohol, drugs, and other vices. We don't have any "war stories" to tell about how much we smoked, how much we drank, or with whom we had an affair.

Our youngest son was a murder victim in 1994. The grief from that accelerated the decline in Brenda's health, but we still had our eyes on Christ and I thank God for every moment with Brenda.

I live near 3 of our children and spend some of my "spare" time gardening and doing volunteer Terrell Society work. The rest is spent enjoying: the 5 remaining children; 16 grandchildren; and 10 great-grandchildren – when I can. They are scattered from Metro Atlanta to California.

I realize that I am who I am because about 1,000 ancestral men and women were in exactly the right place, at exactly the right time, doing exactly the right thing. I appreciate the pool of genes that they gave me. I have no desire to diminish their contribution; but truthfully, they are all dead. I cannot fellowship with the dead.

I always have been more interested in "who is" than in "who was." However, finding "who was" is the key to learning "who is" related to me today. As a result of my genealogical research, I have over 1,000 relatives that I did not know about 26 years ago. God is good and allowed me to meet several hundred of them.

I enjoyed trying to help others in their search for their ancestors during the past 26 years. My only regret is that I had neither the time nor the resources to verify the huge volume of materials that crossed my desk. All I could do was pass the information on as accurately as possible based upon the materials submitted. That is the reason for the numerous times that I cautioned readers not to believe anything in print, but rather to use the printed work to seek the source materials for proof.

As for my present genealogical interest, it is safe to say that my "get up and go; got up and went." I am no closer to proving the father of my **John TERREL** today than I was 26 years ago. He seems to be a twig that fell from the tree during the era when most public records either burned or otherwise disappeared.

Thanks for bearing with me through these memories.

My primary health problem is an Aorta Aneurism which will probably cause unannounced, instant death whenever God removes His protection from me.

I have no symptoms at this time except getting out of breath with the least exertion. Those symptoms are side effects of medication aimed at keeping my blood pressure and pulse rate minimal. I have no way of knowing when the end will occur.

It is imperative that we make arrangements for continuation of the Society as soon as possible – if it is to continue. I cannot over emphasize the importance of this

Rather than see the Society die, I am willing to continue doing whatever I can as long as God grants me the health to do it. I really hope and pray that He will send us another member willing and able to continue the work before my demise.

The volumes in the Lending Library are heavy and will be expensive to ship to a successor. Therefore, unless you object, I will continue the operation of that and my heirs can ship the materials wherever the officers desire when I am no longer able.

CONNECTICUT TERRILLS

Extracted by Dan Brinson from pages 513-516 of *Genealogical And Family History of the State of Connecticut, Volume 1*,
Lewis Historical Publishing Co., New York, 1911
The several branches of the family are scattered widely over the United States. The branch using the form Terrill is largely in

New England, the Middle Eastern states and west of the Missis-

sippi. The branch using the form Terrell is chiefly to be found

in the Middle West and southern states. From this latter branch came General W. H. H. Terrell, now or late of Indianapolis, Indiana, Ex-Governor Terrell, of Georgia; and the influential Terrell family of Texas.

Several immigrants of the name of Terrill appeared at an early period in Connecticut. **Roger TERRILL**, progenitor of an important branch of the family, was then in Milford and Stratford. He signed the fundamental articles for the settlement of Woodbury, Connecticut, whither he carne with the first settlers, and where he died April 17 1722; his widow, **Sarah**, died April *13*, 1728.

Editor's Note: I believe the compiler of this work confused wife and dates of Roger TERRILL those of John TERRILL below. The only wife I have seen listed for **Roger TERRILL** is **Abigail UFFORD**. *DFB*

William TERRALL was a resident of Norwich, Connecticut, among the earliest and was one of the petitioners asking to be allowed to remain when the permanent settlement was made. He may have been father of **John TERRELL**, who was a tax-payer as early as 1664 and was one of the grantees of New London. Connecticut. John married **Sarah**, daughter of **Issac WILLEY**, and died February 27, 1712, the death of his wife occurring March 7, of the same year. No children are mentioned in her will, but it is thought that he had children by a first wife, for the church records mention two children, **William** and **Mary**, baptized May 7, 1671.

(I) Lewis TERRILL was son or grandson of John TERRELL, of New London, and was born 1700-10. He married (first) December 25, 1733, Mehitable, daughter of Joseph HEBARD (HIBBARD), of Windham, Connecticut. He married (second), May 30, 1745, Anna SIMONS. He settled at Mansfield, Connecticut, many of the settlers of which were from New London. Children of first wife, born at Mansfield, Connecticut:

Mary, February 21, 1734-35, baptized May 4, 1735;

Mehitable, March 11, 1737;

Triphena, October 3, 1739

Children of second wife:

Thomas, born at Coventry, Connecticut, in 1746;

Arad, mentioned below;

Lewis. October 8, 1752.

Anne, November 10, I754;

Josiah, August 23, 1756,

Hannah, at Windsor, June 27, 1758;

Eunice Simons, January 9, 1762.

(II) Arad, son of Lewis TERRILL, was born at Coventry, August 23. 1750. He removed from Coventry to Hampden, formerly part of Hampshire County, Massachusetts, where he lived several years. Later he went to Bennington County, Vermont, and died there, leaving many descendants in that State. He was a blacksmith as well as a farmer, and was an industrious and upright man. He married Jemima TRACE. Children:

Timothy, mentioned below,

Thaddeus,

Samuel.

Jemima,

Susan,

Anna,

Mehitable and

Lewis.

According to the census of 1790 **Arad** had a family consisting of two, males over sixteen, two under that age and four females, and was living at Rupert, Bennington county, Vermont.

(III) Timothy, son of Arad TERRILL, was born in Hampden, Massachusetts, August 7, 1770 died at the age of sixty-two. He was a farmer. In politics he was a Whig; in religion a Congregationalist.

He went to Vermont with his parents and married at Rupert (first) November 22, 1792 Martha LEAVITT. He married (second) Charlotte FULLINGTON, of Fairfax, Vermont. Children of first wife, born at Rupert:

- 1. **Triphena**, August 4, 1796; married **Hiram CADY** and moved to Brown county, Wisconsin, in the fifties, settling at De Pere.
- 2. Moses, mentioned below.
- Aaron, July 19, 1801, died in Vermont; lived at Morristown and followed farming.
- Asaph L., September 2, 1803, a farmer at Underhill, Vermont.
- 5. **Rachel** died young.
- Arad, April 2, 1808; settled in Jefferson County, New York, and died there.
- Silas H., December 11, 1810; died of typhoid fever in Underhill in 1861.
- 8. **John**, February 2, 1814, died at Morristown, Vermont. Children of second wife:
- 9. **Joseph**, October 4, 1815, carpenter at St. Joseph, Michigan, where he died early in life.
- Timothy, December 19, 1819; lived at Morrisville, Vermont.
- 11. **Malana**, November 27, 1824, married ___ **LEE**, of Jericho, Vermont.
- (IV) Moses, son of Timothy TERRILL, was born May 9, 1799, at Rupert, Vermont. He attended the district schools as opportunity offered, but the schools being widely scattered and of low standards, most of his education was obtained after he came of age.

He bought a tract of land near his father's farm and cleared it, built a house and in the course of time developed one of the best farms of that section. He died there in 1883.

He was a man of great energy and industry and wrung, by hard labor and shrewd management, a comfortable competence from the stubborn soil.

In politics he was a Democrat in early life but when the antislavery agitation began to affect politics he joined the Liberty party, and afterward, when it was first organized, the Republican Party. He represented the town in the state legislature. He was active and influential in local affairs, public-spirited and generous in support of church and charity.

He married (first) in October, 1825, **Matilda**, born at Cornish, New Hampshire, April 14, 1801, daughter of **Moses** and **Miriam (HARDING) WELD**. Her parents moved to Vermont when she was ten years old and there she was brought up and

educated.

Her father, Moses WELD, was son of Moses WELD, grandson of Moses WELD, great-grandson of John WELD. Joseph WELD, father of John, was son of John and grandson of Joseph WELD, the immigrant, who arrived in New England in the year 1838 among the earliest settlers from Wales, one of the most prominent pioneers of the Massachusetts Bay Colony in military and civil life. Of him, SAVAGE said: "He was the richest of the colony at the time of his death. As a recompense for his important services he received valuable estates in West Roxbury, recently known as, the Bussey farms, bequeathed to his son John. He stands third on the organized roll of the Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company and was chosen ensign at its organization at Boston, on the first Monday of June, 1638. He was captain of the Roxbury Company, and was in the regiment of which John WIN-THROP was colonel and Thomas DUDLEY was lieutenant colonel."

The family was originally from Wales, but came to New England from county Suffolk, England, and is traced back to 1352, when **William WELD** was High Sheriff of London.

The first wife of **Moses TERRILL** died April 13, 1830 and he married (second) **Minerva CALKINS**, at Hyde Park, Vermont, April 18, 1803. She died in October, 1901, aged ninety-eight years and six months.

Children of first wife

Moses Weld, mentioned below;

Newton Alonzo, a farmer in Morristown;

Other children died young.

Children of second wife:

Lester H., born January 7, 1833, died at Middletown, born He Connecticut, September 1, 1898;

Benjamin F. December 13, 1834, resides at Middlefield, Connecticut:

Burton, 1836, lived three or four months only;

Emily Matilda, May 9, 1839 married **Samuel C. TOWN**, of Morristown, where she still resides;

Carlos B., September; 1847 resides at Morristown, Vermont.

(V) Moses Weld, son of Moses TERRILL. was born in Morristown, Vermont, October 2, 1826. He attended the public schools in his native town and was a student for one Year at the academy in Johnson, Vermont, and two terms in a select school. His health and strength not being suited to the hard labor of a farmer's life, he was trained for a mercantile career, beginning as clerk in the general store of Hon. V. W. WATERMAN, at Morristown. After two years in this store he spent another two years as clerk for **Z. S. BENJAMIN**, at Wolcott. Vermont, and then, in partnership with W. G. FERRIN, bought the business of Mr. Benjamin. But after a year the firm was dissolved and the store was sold. Mr. Terrill then established a general store in Morristown and conducted it successfully for twelve years. In 1861 he became interested, with Rev. E. DICKERMAN, of Morristown, Vermont, in the manufacture of a clothes wringer which Dickerman had invented. In the same year they became associated with the late David LYMAN, of Middlefield, Connecticut, removing their business to that town, where was organized the *Metropolitan Washing Machine Company*, and later the *Metropolitan Manufacturing Company*, with Mr. Terrill as president and David Lyman as treasurer. After the death of Mr. Lyman, in 1871, Mr. Terrill became treasurer of the company. The patent was valuable and the business proved profitable. He continued to act as treasurer of the company until it was consolidated in 1891 with the *American Wringer Company*, when he retired from active business. However, in October, 1891, on the incorporation of the *Rogers Manufacturing Company* at Rockfall, Connecticut, he became a large stockholder and was elected president, though he did not take an active part in its management. He was an active, progressive and enterprising man of business, winning success and a fortune from legitimate industry. The same high standards that characterized his private life were applied to his dealings in business. His was never in question.

He was always alive to the duties of citizenship and took his part in public affairs. In politics he is a Republican. His first vote was cast in 1848 for the Free Soil candidate for president. He represented Morristown, Vermont. in the state legislature in 1855-56 and served in the general assembly of Connecticut in 1860-83. He was first selectman, assessor, justice of the peace, member of the board of relief and school visitor.

From 1861 to 1892 he lived at Middlefield, arid since then at Middletown, Connecticut. He was a prominent member of the Methodist Episcopal churches of Middlefield and Middletown and served on the boards of trustees. At the time of the erection of the new church, in 1866, at Middlefield, he was one of the leaders in giving and securing contributions to the building fund.

Moses Weld TERRILL married, at Morristown. Vermont, July 17. 1848, **Almira Ortensia**, born June 24. 1826, daughter of **John** and **Hannah** (**JACOBS**) **FERRIN**, the former a representative in the Vermont legislature. She died March 6, 1896. Children:

- John Martin, born June 3. ¹849, at Morristown, now a resident of Bridgeport, Connecticut; formerly in the livery stable business: married Theresa Maria WHETHER-ILL, of Middlefield. Connecticut; children: Edith, Alice, Whitman. Helen. John, Marjorie and Ferrin.
- 2. Airless Edward, born June 16, 1851 mentioned below.
- 3. Frederick Weld, April, 30, 1853, at Morristown, Vermont, a prominent citizen of Middlefield, Connecticut: has represented the town in the general assembly of the .state, and was a delegate to the constitutional convention held at Hartford in 1902, married Mary Ida Louise SKINNER, of Middlefield; children; Ivy Laura, Moses Weld, William Ward, Lily May, Whitman Earl, Alma Anner, Paul Ferrin, and Maria Ward TERRILL.
- 4. Lily May, January 8, 1864; married, at Middlefield, June 2, 1887 Rev. David George DOWNEY, who has been pastor at Hartford, Connecticut, Mamaronech, New York, Stamford, Connecticut, and St. John's Methodist Episcopal church of Brooklyn, and is now corresponding, secretary of the board of Sunday schools of tile Methodist Episcopal church, with headquarters at Chicago; child, Bradford DOWNEY, born at Stamford. Connecticut. October 29, 1894.

5. **May Lily**, June 10, 1868; married January 15, 1896, **Thomas Charles CHENEY**, attorney at Morristown, Vermont, state's attorney, clerk of the state legislature several years arid speaker of the house or representatives for two terms.

(VI) Willis Edward, son of Moses Weld TERRILL was born June 16, 1851, at Morristown, Vermont. He attended the public schools there and at Middlefield. Connecticut, whither he went with the family in 1862. He also took a course at the United States Business College at New Haven, and spent two years 1866-67 and the winter term, 1870-71, at Wesleyan Academy, Wilbraham, Massachusetts.

He entered tile employ of the *Metropolitan Manufacturing Company*, of which his father was president; and was shipping and stock clerk for three years.

In 1874, he left the company and engaged in business as a merchant on his own account, and for eight years conducted a general store at Middlefield. He disposed of this in 1882, and was not again actively engaged in business until 1884, when he went to *Eustis, Florida*, where he was a successful general merchant for eight years.

Mr. Terrill represented Middlefield in the Connecticut legislature two sessions, 1877-78, arid was county commissioner of Middlesex County for five years, 1879-84. He served two years in the city government of Eustis, as an alderman.

In 1891 he returned to Connecticut, and in 1892 settled in Middletown, where he now resides [1911].

On the organization of the *Rogers Manufacturing Company*, at Rock Falls, Connecticut, in October, 1891, he became a stockholder and was made secretary-treasurer and manager. In 1905, after the death of the president, **Moses Weld TERRILL**, he became president of the company, and has since continued to act as president and treasurer.

He is at present a director of the *Middlesex County National Bank*, of the *Farmers' and Mechanics' Savings Bank* of Middletown, and a member of the executive committee of the *First Ecclesiastical Society*.

For two years he was a member of the city council of Middletown. In politics he is a Republican.

Mr. Willis Edward TERRILL married, September 5, 1872, Sarah Wilson CLAPP, born August 2, 1849, at North Killingly (now part of Putnam), Connecticut, daughter of Captain William and Mary Sophronia (WILSON) CLAPP, of Brooklyn, Connecticut. Lowell CLAPP, father of Captain William Clapp, lived at Oswego, New York; died August 2, 1820; married Lucy, daughter of John and Annis (BOWMAN) DAY, of Dayville, Connecticut.

Sarah Wilson (Clapp) Terrill, wife of Willis Edward Terrill, graduated from Wesleyan Academy, Wilbraham, Massachusetts, in the class of 1871 She is a member of the Congregational church of Middletown, and of Wadsworth Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, of that city.

Her grandmother was Mary, daughter of Ebenezer and Mary (WILLIAMS) STARR. Her mother's father was Jonas Hewes WILSON, son of John and Sarah WILSON, and [John?] was a drummer in the war of 1812.

Children of Mr. and Mrs. Willis Edward Terrill:

Richmond Britton TERRELL, a former vice president of Litton Industries, and his wife, **Channetta PERDUE Terrell**, died Tuesday in a helicopter crash in New Zealand. He was 67. She was 65.

The pilot, Jane Blair of blew Zealand, and a Florida couple traveling with the Terrells also was killed in the crash of the Hughes 530 helicopter on the shore of Lake Manapouri, near a power generating station.

Crash investigators planned to interview witnesses who said the helicopter hit power lines, according to news reports in New Zealand.

Richmond Terrell began working at Litton Industries in the mid-1960s. He left the company briefly in the late 1970s to start a marine navigation business, before returning to Litton.

The Terrells were longtime Woodland hills residents until they moved to Danville, Calif., in the early 1990s.

The Terrells are survived by their three sons, **Richmond**, **Britton**, and **Hollis**, and five grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held next week at the Terrells' former church, Prince of Peace Episcopal, Church in woodland Hills.

The **Jesse Levi EVANS** in the reunion picture is the son of **George S. EVANS** who was born in Mississippi in the 1840's.

George was in Neshoba County, Mississippi in 1870 George was in Morehouse Parish, Louisiana in 1880

Jesse Levi was back in Scott County, MS, in 1895 to marry Mary Elizabeth Mulligan (Mullican)

George's wife was back in Winn Parish, LA 1900 She was in Grant Parish, LA, in 1920.

According to my grandmother, **Eula EVANS Terrell**, Grandma Martha traveled with Jesse Levi's family to western Louisiana. (probably Allen or Beauregard Parish) when Jesse's 1st wife died in LaSalle Parish, LA about 1905.

Grandma also said that the Evans family was from Georgia and that George's wife's family was also from Georgia. Though my grandmother referred to Grandma Martha, this woman was listed in censuses prior to 1910 as **Susan Evans**. I was told that her maiden name was **WILLIS** but have found no proof of that.

In 1910 Jesse Levi EVANS married Martha Ann TERRELL and his daughter, Eula, married Martha's brother, Newton Bernard TERRELL, in 1912. The reunion picture is of both Evans families, with most of them being also TERRELLS either through Martha or Newt TERRELL.Jesse Levi's brothers Willie and George lived in Grant Parish, LA, and his sister, Ivy Posey, is buried in Beauregard Parish. I think most of his other sisters also lived in Louisiana.

GENEALOGY? ASK DAN

Editor's Note: This is from a former member in Brazil. He was unable to remain a member because the United States doe not exchange currency with Brazil and he was unable to send dues except one or two years when he had acquaintances visiting the U.S.A. He is mentioned in previous issues of Trails: 1226; WELCOME NEW MEMBER; 1249 Article, AMERICAN FAMILIES IN BRAZIL in which he listed more than a column of surnames of families from the Southern USA who moved to Brazil following the "Civil" war. We corresponded several years and this information was sent to him via e-mail. I am publishing it here for the benefit of readers who may share the same lineage. DFB

Q. February 17, 2002. I was recently in touch with some distant relatives in Sao Paulo and made a great discovery: places and years of birth and death of my great great-grand parents, as shown in an old genealogical tree: **William Hudson TERRELL** (Virginia, 1819 - Louisiana, 1861); wife: **Mary MONCRIEF** (Georgia, 1837 - Brazil, 12/18/1916).

You have already looked up on your archives (Terrell Trails, Winter 1998) about "William A. TERRELL", but at that time I was wrong about the middle name. Hudson is the correct middle name. So, I would like to ask you to refer once more to your archives for any reference about the people above.

Only to facilitate the references, I repeat the names of William and Mary children that I have sent you before: **William TER-RELL** (USA, 02/24/1856 - Brazil, 12/06/1923); **James Ithamar TERRELL** (USA, 04/10/1861 - Brazil, 06/22/1927); **Guilford Dudley TERRELL** (USA, 18?? - Brazil, 19??).

I am still researching about the link between the Brazilian and the North American TERRELL families. Thank you for any help you can give me.

That exhausts my resources that are easily searchable. Maybe someone else has something that will help.

Dan, I think I tried to research this guy previously for another descendant from Brazil -- but without success. Nevertheless, (1) I am most eager to find his connection to known Terrell family groups, and (2) I have continued to add new information to my database since my last attempt to research him. As I recall, the **William TERRELL** who migrated to Brazil with the **Confederados** lived beyond the end of the War Between the States. This

e-mail shows him dying in Louisiana in 1861. There was a William Terrell who was an officer in a Louisiana Cavalry Regiment, and is probably the same guy. I just can't connect him to a family group (but will try again).

Here is some preliminary information: Your man appears in the 1860 census of Jesuits Bend, Plaqumines Parish, Louisiana (p. 692) as:

William H. Terrell, age 40, occupation: overseer, b. Va.

Mary Terrell, age 22, b. N.C.

William Terrell, age 5, b. La.

Gilbert Terrell, age 3, b. La.

Emily Terrell, age 2, b. La.

He will be hard to connect to a family group because he is in Plaqumines Parish solo -- not near any other Terrells. The majority of families tended to migrate in groups, making them easier to identify. Don C. Terrill

That seems to be the family, his age is right. Her age is right while her birth place is NC rather than GA which may be correct or census error

Gilbert age 3 could be either a mistake for **Guilford Dudley TERRELL** (USA, 18?? - Brazil, 19??); or could descendants be mistaken about his first name?

If this is the same family, what happened to **Emily**, b. ca1858? Did she die young? Did she marry in Brazil and have a family that has been lost to the other cousins?

James Ithamar TERRELL (USA, 04/10/1861 - Brazil, 06/22/1927) was born after the 1860 census so naturally he would not show. *DFB*

José, Here is a little more information.

I went back to the National Archives and again went through the 1850 census pages of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, to re-check my earlier work. In my previous e-mail, I told you about a W. H. Terrell (b. Louisiana) who was living there. This information was based on research on Southern Terrells that I have acquired over the past 15 years.

Well, my earlier e-mail to you was wrong. This **W. H. TER-RELL** entry should read as follows:

1850 Louisiana, Jefferson Parish, p. 79; household 1454, dwelling 1486:

W. H. TERRELL, age 35, male, white, occupation: Overseer, birthplace Virginia.

This makes it a high probability that this is **William Hudson TERRELL**. The older census records are filled with errors for many reasons. I'm not too worried about the age variance, since the name, occupation, and birthplace match. Also, you should know that Jefferson Parish and Plaquemines Parish are adjacent, so William did not have to move very far to relocate from one to the other. [It is also possible that boundaries changed and he did not move at all. *DFB*]

Here is something more, I did a further search of 1850 Jefferson Parish and found exactly one MONCRIEF family residing in the Parish, 97 households away - as follows:

I know that two of the names are strange, but the handwritten census page was difficult to read. This is surely **Mary MONCRIEF**, the future wife of **William H. TERRELL**. It doesn't take much imagination to suppose that **G. MONCRIEF** could be **Gilbert MONCRIEF**.

I'm afraid that I can go no further in finding the ancestry of **William Hudson TERRELL**. My own database has no more clues. I'll have to hope that I someday find someone else's research which provides the connection.

In May 2000 I had corresponded (by e-mail) with a **David ASPERY**

(David.Aspery@british-shipping.org) who was also researching William. I think his wife is the TERRELL descendant. Unfortunately, most of the data he sent me was lost when our LAN administrators loaded a new version of MS-Outlook and I totally lost all of my private e-mail folders. I would love to get that same information again.

I seem to recollect that his records show **William H. TERRELL** dying about 1867 rather than 1861. If that is true, it would be consistent with my next information. I would be very interested in obtaining a copy of the genealogy of your family, including Mr. Aspery's information.

At the National Archives I examined the military records of the four **W. H. TERRELLS** who served as Louisiana Confederate soldiers.

First, I need to explain about the nature of these records. In the late 1880s the Southern states began paying pensions to disabled former Confederate soldiers and their widows. In order to verify their claim of service, it was necessary to create personnel files for each of them using surviving records.

Most of these records consisted of "muster rolls" which were created by company 1st Sergeants approximately every two months and which listed the names of all of the soldiers in the company and their current status. So each roll would contain the date, a hundred plus names, and an entry beside each name, such as: present, sick, in hospital, on detached duty, discharged, resigned, killed, deserted, captured (etc.) So, in a project that took several years, huge numbers of clerks created a separate card for each name on each muster roll.

To this pile was added all documents which were uniquely about an individual or which contained his signature, such as: letters, receipts, requisitions, directives, etc. This huge collection of paper was then sorted by military unit and then alphabetized within unit.

The result was the *Military Personnel Records* which are available for research. It is full of name-spelling variations and some contradictions. Sometimes there are very few or no records especially for militia units. Some records were destroyed in battle or fires.

It is also known that the commander of the Confederate Marine Corps destroyed most of the personnel papers at the end of the war in order to protect his men from Union reprisals.

The worst example I have encountered so far is for **Maddred TERRELL**, a Mississippi soldier. The only surviving record of

his Confederate military service is a clothing receipt signed by him

Of the four Confederate **W. H. TERRELL**s whom I listed in my previous e-mail, three of them are, in fact, the same person: **William Harrison Terrell** (b. 1821) who is known to me. He appears in the 1860 census of Louisiana in De Soto Parish. Between 1861-1865 he was in three different Louisiana units. He was a company commander, and he also managed to enlist three of his brothers in to his company (one of whom died).

The remaining one is **William H. Terrell** of Co I 1st Louisiana Cavalry. Is this **William Hudson TERRELL**?

Here is a list of all of the OTHER Terrells who appear in the 1860 census of Louisiana:

E. Baton Rouge Parish: W. J. TERRELL, age 8 months, b. Miss.

Claiborne Parish: W. M. TARRAL, age 22, b. Ga.

Jackson Parish: William TERREL [actually TERRILL], age 6. b. La.

Rapides Parish: William TERRELL [actually William Sylvester TERRELL], age 46, b. Ga.

William TERRELL [son of Wm. Sylvester Terrell], age 7, b. La.

Vermillion Parish: William TERRELL, age 30, b. La.

Winn Parish: William A. TERRAL, age 2, La.

William B. TERRAL [actually William Bridges TER-RAL], age 34, Miss.

The Winn Parish family always uses the spelling TERRAL.

Thus, it seems that **William H. Terrell**, Confederate soldier, is either **William Hudson TERRELL** or the **William TERRELL** listed in Vermillion Parish.

I tend to think the soldier is your man. My reasons is that soldier William H. TERRELL (1st La. Cav.) consistently used his middle initial in all CSA documents, and so does William Hudson TERRELL in the 1850 and 1860 census enumerations.

Soldier **William H. TERRELL** enlisted at Pointe Coupee, which is not near either Plaquemines Parish or Vermillion Parish, so the location of his enlistment does not provide us a clue. It would be interesting to know the oral history of your family. Does it say that William served in the Confederate Army throughout the war?

Anyway, here is my summary of that soldier's military record that I found in the National Archives:

National Archives of the United States, Record Group M-320 Compiled Service Records of Confederate Soldiers Who Served in Organizations from the State of Louisiana (Roll 7):

TERRELL, **William H.**, Co I, 1st Louisiana Cavalry (Capt. Ovide Lejunne's Co). Enrolled at age 30 on Oct 8 1861 as Private at Parahan, Pointe Coupee Parish, for duration of the war. Present for duty as 1st Sergeant 3 Aug 1862, present as 1st Sergeant Aug to Dec 1862. Promoted to 2nd Lieutenant 28 Jan 1863. Present Jan 28 to Feb 28 1863. Present Feb 28 to Jun 30 1863. As of 5 Jul 1863 he was present at Jackson, Tenn. Signed a requisition for forage at Chickamonga on 7 Oct 1863. Signed other requisitions on 12 Oct 1863, 14 Nov 1863, 1 Dec 1863, 15

Dec 1863 near *Dalton [GA]*. Apparently requested leave on 5 Feb 1864 while in Tenn. Present 21 Jul 1864. Present 11 Sep 1864. Signed requisition for forage on 15 Sep 1864. Apparently his unit surrendered on or about 12 May 1865, and on that date "Wm. H. Terrell" signed a parole to be released as a prisoner of war

THE TERRELLS OF DES MOINES, IOWA

Editor's Note: This article is mainly about the ancestors of Mary Putnam MC KINNEY Terrell (1827-1911) wife of to Col. William Goodson TERRELL. It will be of interest to their descendants. *DFB*

I was surfing the web and found your great site!

I have been researching a Des Moines architect named **Norman Terrell VORSE**. As you well know, you never know where things may take you.

Norman's mother was **Augusta TERRELL Vorse** (1853-1941). His grandmother was **Mary Putnam MC KINNEY Terrell** (1827-1911). There was also a **Charles TERRELL** (1851-1915) who I assume was Augusta's brother. They are all buried here in Glendale Cemetery.

Mary Putnam Terrell lived with Augusta T. Vorse. Augusta's husband, Charles Searle VORSE died at age 36. He was rather well-heeled.

The interesting twist I just discovered was that Mary Putnam MC KINNEY Terrell was married to Col. William Goodson TERRELL. He was among other things the editor for the Cincinnati Commercial newspaper. In 1879 he published some historical papers belonging to the family of Andrew JACKSON. He had collected historical documents on several historical figures. Apparently his wife sought a divorce from him. When approached at his office by his wife's attorney, he shot him dead. It would appear that Mary was already living in Des Moines by that time.

William Goodson TERRELL died in Washington D.C. in 1900. The papers later surfaced in the 1930's.

A librarian for Drake University (James Leonardo) here in Des Moines was hired in about 1990 by Jackson descendents to investigate any Des Moines connections in an attempt to rediscover the documents. After writing an article in the Des Moines Register about architect VORSE, we were put in contact with each other.

I have been to Harrison, AR to visit **Virginia VORSE Ennis** (Norman T. Vorse's last remaining daughter). She is 87 and sharp as a tack. She didn't mention anything about her greatgrandfather, but I imagine this was a subject that was never brought up.

Below is some miscellaneous information gathered during research. Anyway, I didn't know if you had any info on any of these people, but thought I would run it past you.

Thank you for your time, and the tremendous effort you have made documenting the TERRELLs!

He was one of the first four major generals appointed by Congress, and his record shows him to have been a patriot as noble in civil life as he was brave in battle. He died in 1790.

Israel PUTNAM, **Jr**., commanded a company, and was appointed aide to his father. He served until peace was declared. "/cgi-bin/sse.dll?DB=DREV&F5=10006&ct=3463"

Zachariah and his father John are another of my (many) uncharted TERRELLs. By the way, the preponderance of Kentucky TER-RELLs/Terrills are descendants of Timothy Terrill of All Hollows, London, whose early descendants settled in Orange Co., Va., and who tend to use the spelling "Terrill."

I do not have your Zachariah TERRELL in my database. That is, I don't know his family group. He appears to be the son of John (b. 1795, Ky.). I found him in the 1850 and 1860 census. I hope this information is helpful:

Thanks so much for your information on Zachariah TER-RELL! I have authentic information on his wife Hero Caroline STEEN as follows: Drury OLIVER married Elizabeth BIRD-SONG, both natives of Virginia. They had a daughter, Mary Ann OLIVER, who married J. J. STEEN, a native of Conn. They had Alfred STEEN who was born April 21, 1825. He married Nancy Jane FRY, daughter of Benjamin and Lucinda FRY of Delta Co., TX on July 11, 1854.

Alfred Steen was instrumental in the organization and erection of Delta Co. Captain Steen has done as much for public enterprises and the building up of Cooper as any man in the place.

J. J. STEEN and **Mary Ann OLIVER** also had a daughter **Hero Caroline** b. 1824 in Tn. She married **Zachariah Richard TERRELL**. They had eight children:

Zachariah Richard "Dick" TERRELL helped build up the town of Charleston, Delta Co., TX. He owned a blacksmith shop, grocery store, was postmaster. He hauled groceries from Jefferson, Tx., by oxen.

He gave the lot on which the Christian Church was built and also the land for the Charleston Square. It was said that he sold whiskey in his store by the dipper full for twenty-five cents. It came in a barrel. I have all of this on good authority from old timers in the area who have researched him.
