IDENTITY THEFT SCAMS

Editor's Note: The following is excerpted from one net service provider. Yours may be different so but you are still likely to receive the same type scams. DFB

Urgent Notice read and beware this came from my email provider

Dear NetZero Member, We are writing to warn you of an Internet scam designed to trick you into revealing credit card, passwords, social security numbers and other personal information to individuals who intend to use them for fraudulent purposes.

The scam is known as "phishing" and the communications are sent to appear to look as if they come from reputable companies such as NetZero. The emails often instruct you to verify or update your account information by requesting you to reply to their e-mail with your updated information, or by providing you with a link to a website where you may enter your information.

The Federal Trade Commission has issued a warning about these identity theft scams. They suggest the following:

- □ If you get an e-mail that warns you, with little or no notice, that an account of yours will be shut down unless you reconfirm your billing information, do not reply or click on the link in the e-mail. Instead, contact the company cited in the e-mail using a telephone number or Web site address you know to be genuine. For NetZero, you should contact 866-841-1442. We take security very seriously and will work with law enforcement with the goal of preventing this type of activity.
- □ Avoid e-mailing personal and financial information.
- □ Review credit card and bank account statements as soon as you receive them to determine whether there are any unauthorized charges. If there is unauthorized activity, we strongly ur-

- geyou to contact your credit card company immediately to determine what action you should take.

Remember, when you receive e-mail from an unknown source and suspect it to be spam, avoid clicking on the unsubscribe links, replying to the spam, replying to an address in the spam message, or visiting any link contained within the e-mail. These actions confirm the validity of your e-mail address and may result in more spam.

Please remember that [reputable providers] will never send you an unsolicited e-mail asking you for your password, social security number, mother's maiden name, or driver's license number.

VOLUNTEER FIREMAN SUES MERRYVILLE, [LA] FIRE DISTRICT

The following article was in the DeRidder Beauregard Daily Paper 07/03/02. Does anyone know this person?

Volunteer fireman sues Merryville, Fire District 1 The Beauregard Parish Fire District No. 1 and the Town of Merryville are among the defendants in a June 28 lawsuit filed by **Joshua TERRELL** for damages that occurred during a debris clean-up following an October 2001 storm in Merryville.

The petition is filed with the 36th Judicial Court by Terrell, represented by **Rex D. Townsley** of the Townsley Law Firm in Lake Charles, on behalf of himself and his son **Joshua Paul TERRELL** and by Terrell's wife, **Celeste**.

In his petition for damages, Terrell contends that on or about Saturday, Oct. 13, 2001, then Merryville Mayor **Margaret Krasso** requested assistance from BPFD No. 1 fire chief **Scott Slayter** with the post-storm clean-up.

In the suit, Terrell, a volunteer fireman, states that Slayter instructed him to assist with the removal of a tree limb that had fallen across a utility wire.

According to Terrell's petition, Town of Merryville employee **Thomas Watson** instructed Terrell to

climb into the bucket of a backhoe that Watson was operating. The suit says Terrell did as instructed and subsequently was struck by a falling limb, which knocked him out of the bucket, causing him to fall to the ground.

As a result of the accident, the suit states, Terrell received injuries to his left hip, back, and legs, in addition to other serious injuries, "all to his detriment and loss."

The petition states that injuries Terrell sustained due to "the negligent acts of the defendants" have resulted in "physical pain, mental anguish, and impairment in the past and in all probability will cause him physical pain, mental anguish, psychological injuries and loss of future earning capacity."

Celeste and Joshua Paul Terrell, a minor represented by his father, claim each to have suffered "a loss of consortium, services, and society," as a result of the accident.

The petition cites the Town of Merryville as being guilty of the following "non-exclusive acts of negligence":

- Failure to properly secure the construction premises:
- Failure to use reasonable care and caution;
- Failure to instruct town employees and enforce safety measures needed in the cutting and removal of debris/trees that have fallen on utility wires; and
- Failure to provide safety equipment.

The BPFD No. 1 is similarly cited in the petition for negligence in the following:

- Failure to have proper safety equipment for the crew:
- Failure to properly train and supervise the firemen;
- Failure to warn of the dangers of the removal of debris/trees that have fallen on utility wires; and
- Failure to use reasonable care and caution.

American Alternative Insurance Corporation, liability insurance carrier for the BPFD No. 1, also is named as a defendant in the petition.

The petition asks the court that "just and reasonable" sums be awarded Terrell and his family, to include court costs and legal interest from date of judicial demand until paid.

Here is an amusing paragraph which appears on T.F.H.S. Newsletter Vol. 23, No. 2, Summer 2000 at page 30. *Don Terrill*

Note in the list of member of Thetford [England] Methodist Circuit dated August 23rd 1809: "We most earnestly request that our successors will have nothing at all to do with or to say to the weak, the wicked, the abominable and the intolerable Miss Mary Tyrell; nor her sister Ann nor Mrs. Naylor. No mortal knows the trouble they (particularly the first) have caused the preachers. Never rec. one of their hell-inspired letters into your hand and you will avoid trouble. Signed Francis West and John Tarrent."

The following "Special Edition" is being sent to subscribers of the Plus Edition of Eastman's Online Genealogy Newsletter:

I have written a number of times about a genealogy-related scam that operates under a variety of names, including **GenSeekers.com**, **GenealogyGiants.com and more**. In the July 7 edition of the newsletter, I identified the owner/operator of this "business" as 21-year-old **Elias Abodeely** of Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Since then, I have had conversations with several people in Iowa about this "business."

I can now report that earlier today the Cedar Rapids police department arrested **Elias Abodeely** for his activities with **GenSeekers.com** and the other **Web sites** he operates.

KWWL television in Iowa is now reporting that Cedar Rapids Police have made an arrest after a two year Internet crime investigation. The crimes involved genealogy web sites. Today police arrested Elias Abodeely II of Cedar Rapids.. He faces four charges: Ist degree theft, identity theft, money laundering, and ongoing criminal conduct. Police say they expect to file charges against more suspects.

PMSEA DATABASE REPORTS

The Personnel Missing - Southeast Asia (PMSEA) Database was originally compiled by the Defense Intelligence Agency's (DIA) POW/MIA Office as an ongoing effort that spanned the course of the War in Indochina. Working closely with the military services and other members of the Intelligence Community, efforts were made to keep the list updated as the losses occurred.

Following the end of the war, DIA continued to maintain the database, keeping it updated as progress was made in the accounting effort. When DPMO was formed in 1993, it absorbed DIA's POW/MIA Office and responsibility for the PMSEA database. From this database, DPMO has generated reports in a number of different formats that are intended to assist you with your research.

I have found the following TURLs from South America. If anyone has them on their family tree, please let me know.

Husband: **Peter TURL**; Wife: **Mary ?**; Children: **Peter TURL** born: 19 Oct 1842, Rio De Janeiro, Rio De Janeiro, Brazil

(My guess is the father (above) of this Peter TURL and maybe his mother, came to Brazil from England. I would certainly like to know where he fits in to establish a link between the TURLs in England the TURLs in Brazil)

Editor's Note: It is probable that they came from UK. They used a single surname, TURL which is common in the United Kingdom and USA.. Brazil was a Spanish colony and most residents there use a dual surname, ie., surname of the MOTHER-surname of the FATHER. I have reworked capitalization below to reflect this custom. From a genealogy book which is in the Massachusetts Genealogy Society library in Worcester MA, USA. - **Judy Caldow Ollikkala** (whose maternal grandmother was a **TERRELL**.) Listed as early settlers in America are:

Mathew TERREL who resided in Champaign County and Logan County, Ohio, I believe to be a brother of Jephthae TERREL. There is nothing to prove it - no available evidence in either county. Jephthae TERREL was a son of Matthew & Marry TERREL, so if Mathew is in fact Jephthae's brother, then he is a Matthew "Jr.".

According to the book, *Early Vital Records of Ohio*, *Champaign Col*, *Ohio*," Volumes I through VI, by the *Urbana Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution*, 1973, Mathew does have a gravestone and he is buried in the *Halterman Cemetery*, Champaign County, Ohio. They are listed in this book as follows:

Mathew TERREL, 1777-1824 Huldy TERRELL, d. March 1821

This information conflicts with data uncovered by researchers in 1990, which indicates a gravestone for Huldy, but nothing for Mathew: **Huldy TER-REL**, wife of M., 1777-1821

There is a major conflict here with the dates, and research needs to be done to resolve these conflicts.

Descendant Erma Vail, writes "The first time we find mention of the Terrells in Harrison County, (West) Virginia is in 1797. We find Matthew THERRILL and Jepthew TIRRIL!! In 1798 - Jephthah TERRILL. In 1799 - Matthew TERRIL and Jepthah TERREL. From then until 1814 - loads of TERRELLs. 1815 on - nothing!!!

From *History Of Champaign County, Ohio*, 1881: "Jeptha Terrell was born in Virginia in the year 1776. He married Miss **Sarah Barnes**, of that state, in 18__. They came to this county in 1811, and settled on Buck Creek. On March 2, 1812, they removed to Section 32 in this township, now owned by **Timothy Terrell**. Of the twelve children born to this couple, but one remains on the homestead."

When the Calland Cemetery in Champaign County was cleared, a gravestone for **Jephthae Terrell** was uncovered which read, "In memory of Jephthae, son of Matthew & Mary TERREL who died December

27, 1817 aged 48 years, 3 months + 20 days." This gravestone is now in the possession of Mrs. **Erma** (Wilson) Vail, descendant of Jephthae's son Timothy Terrell."

If the gravestone for Jephthae TERREL is correct, his date of birth was September 1, 1769, and not 1776 as the Champaign County, Ohio history indicated."

"At another time, a party of rangers stopped at the house of **Jeptha Terrell**. In the evening, the fired off their guns, simultaneously. The neighbors feared that Indians had made an attack on the Terrells, and were much alarmed. Fortunately, their worst fears were not realized, and the mystery

was explained on the succeeding day."

The Champaign County history and records mention primarily only **Jeptha Terrell** and his family; however, it is evident that at least two other Terrell families were there, and they may have been brothers or some other relation to Jeptha. We will assume here that the other two Terrells were brothers. It seems as if the Terrells moved back and forth between Champaign County and next door Logan County as records can be found for some in both places.

SETTLING IN OHIO

The Greenville Treaty Line of 1795 had set the northern boundary of the "White" settlements at the Northern edge of what became Champaign Co (in 1805). If you wish to draw the Greenville Treaty Line on a modern map, begin on the west, at Ft. Recovery, Mercer Co, follow along, SSE to Ft Loramie (Shelby Co) using the Ft Recovery-Minster Rd, then Hewer Road, which angles SSE onto Indian Trail Rd, then take line straight into town of Ft Loramie. Then, go ENE, following Meranda Road in Shelby Co, into Logan Co, crossing thru Lewistown Reservoir (now Indian Lake). In that era, Logan Co was the northernmost part of Champaign Co (until 1818). It then continues on a ENE angle into Tuscarawas Co. Refer to booklet titled Ohio Lands A Short History published by the Auditor of the State of OH, 5th Edition by Burke, 1994 for detailed information on the way OH was divided up for settlement, after the Rev. War.

The territory was dangerous & subject to Indian attack through about 1820 - the War of 1812 was over

in 1814, but bands of Native Americans did not take kindly to being rounded up & removed from their lands, and continued to make life perilous for settlers on the fringes of civilization. - **Susan Bidwell Williams** slw02@sprynet.com 10/18/99

Excerpt From The First Twenty-Five Years Of The Kansas Conference Of The Church Of The United Brethren In Christ, by Bernard L. COOK: Henry KUMLER, Hr., in an article in the Religious Telescope mentioned that he had been in Missouri and had contacted one John TERREL, living in Jasper County, Missouri. It seems that Missouri already had a United Brethren

conference in the process of formation and John TERREL was one of the preachers in it. John **TERREL** had mentioned to **Kumler** a desire "That his brother Josiah in Illinois come and see him" adding "May the Lord grant that some our brethren may come over to Missouri and help us." This article, by **Henry KUMLER**, appeared in 1852.

From History Of Huntington County (Indiana), Brant & Fuller, Chicago, 1887: Rev. John Terrell, another missionary, blazed his way through the woods from North Manchester, in Wabash County to Slusser neighborhood in Warren Township....and from there soon afterward came to Huntington and organized a church that year.

He is said to have been a brother-in-law of Lewis POWELL and also of **Wm. BUSHMAN**. The body was put in charge of an undertaker and taken to his establishment. An examination showed that his face was mashed and broken and both legs crushed. - Emporia Gazette, Feb. 16 The subject of the above sketch was for a long time one of the prosperous farmers living on Allen creek just north of the MAX-**WELL** place. He is a brother of Mrs. **J. W.** Floyd of this place and has several relative in this vicinity. His brother, Thomas, lived on Allen creek for years and a brother Dariens formerly lived there, but now resides in Oklahoma. John was well known to the old settlers Another obituary adds "about 65 years old

and very poor." There was an inquest with a coroner's jury. Engineer JONES and Conductor CAMBRIC Were present for the inquest.

Another article adds: Train No. 6, which going west as No. 5, ran over and killed John **TERRELL** Saturday, stopped yesterday fifteen minutes while his funeral crossed the track. Rev. SELDON conducted the services at the Terrell home. The pall bearers were P.L. DALE, Harvey PARKER Emery DAVIS, Jo. WORKMAN, Frank FRAZIER and Will FRAZIER.

William Connell and Ruth Terrell made their home in Champaign County, Ohio until 1838 when they moved to Lawrence County, Missouri. William was a staunch Republican and served in the War of 1812. He was engaged in several Indian uprisings in Ohio.

William and Ruth sold their land in Ohio on November 1838 for \$2,200. In the fall of 1839 they had reached Lawrence County, Missouri and purchased 1,000 acres of land. One abstract shows that part of that land was deeded by **John C. ED-WARDS**, Governor of Missouri, for \$1.25 an acre. They built a log cabin on section 16, T28, R27. This is where William died on March 15, 1857. The probate record has a bill for \$14.00 presented for lumber and labor making a casket on March 16, 1857 by **C. R. PAYTON; WHALEY & MC CHANSE**, Mt. Vernon, Missouri. Merchants presented a bill for 10 yards of bleached domestic \$3.00, 5 yards of black velvet \$4.93, 5 yards of black fringe \$1.50, pair of white gloves, pair of black shoes, nails and

tacks totaling \$14.00. Total cost of the casket was \$28.00. Burial was in the *Salem Cemetery* on March 17, 1857.

William's estate was settled in May 1860. Some of the items mentioned were coffee, sugar, bridle \$4.00, shoes \$1.70, black silk vest \$30.00, silk scarf \$1.00, violin \$6.00, 10 yards of calico \$1.20, ear rings \$1.00, 1 bale of cotton \$1.40. Other interesting items of value were a 5th of chain \$.50, one 4 horse wagon \$35.00, one 2 horse wagon \$20.00, a bull tongue plow \$1.50, a two year old steer \$9.00, 9 hogs \$13.00, sheep \$8.00, one man's saddle \$4.00, one clay Bank horse \$62.50. William C. PENNINGTON, husband of William and Ruth's daughter Synthia, was administrator of the estate, with a bond of \$6,000, signed by Sion PENNINGTON, John CONNELL and George ALLISON.

A few years before William's death, life of the prairie took its toll on their marriage, and on October 19, 1855, **Ruth** filed for divorce in Lawrence County, Missouri. She went on to make her home with her children. In 1870 she was residing in the household of he son **John**. This is the last known record of her. It is believed that she died in Lawrence County, Missouri, and the exact date is unknown. He burial place is also unknown, and it is thought that she is buried in the Salem Cemetery along with her husband.

A story is told by Albert Austin CONNELL, great-grandson of Joshua CONNELL, that five of William and Ruth's sons (Joseph W., James, Joshua, Caleb, and Asa) formed a wagon train and moved to Hamilton County, Texas. They camped at Center Point in Hamilton County, and one of them travelled to Austin, Texas and petitioned the Governor for a league of land to be divided among the brothers. This land stayed in the CONNELL name until 1931. Script from the General Land Office gives Asa entitlement to 1,280 acres of land for his service in the Civil War. He bought land for \$3.00 per acre.

- From Portrait and Bigraphical Album of Jackson, Jefferson, and Potawatomie Counties, Kansas, 1890: Rev. Josiah TERREL. The first man to settle upon the present site of Perry (Kansas) deserves more than a passing mention; and especially so in this case, as the subject of this notice was one worthy of all respect. As a pioneer preacher of Kansas he saw much hardship and privation, being the third minister of the United Brethren denomination to settle in the State.
- He was born in Virginia Aug. 23, 1804, and when a child of seven years was taken by his parents to Champaign County, Ohio, they settling there in 1811. He was the sixth in a family of thirteen children and was reared on the frontier, obtaining his

education mostly around the evening fireside, and being fond of books, thus acquired a very good fund of general knowledge.

The subject of this notice was the son of **Enoch TERREL**, a native of Wales, who in emigrating to America was accompanied by his father, then a hale and hearty old man, whose age numbered one hundred years. He lived four years thereafter and was then gathered to his fathers. **Enoch TERREL**, locating in Virginia, followed farming there until 1811, then removed with his family to Champaign County, Ohio, settling among the Indians in the wilderness.

Editor's Note: Unless the writer of this article confused the name of Josiah's father with that of Josiah's brother, **Enoch**, we may have found a clue to the name and origin of the father of the senior **Matthew TERREL**. It is possible that the father of the original **Matthew TERREL** was **Enoch TERREL** from Wales! *DFB*

He engaged in farming and milling and became well-to-do, at the same time exerting no small influence in his community. A part of the old mill which he operated is still standing almost the only relic of a bygone age. He served as an officer in the War of 1812, and at one time while in the service was nearly frozen to death. He was for many years a leading member of the Methodist Episcopal Church and finally died in 1817, from the effects of an injury received in his mill.

Josiah TERREL assisted his father in farming and milling until his death and remained with his mother until reaching his majority. He was then married to Miss Sara PROVAULT, a native of Ohio, and of German descent. Soon afterward they removed to a farm in Indiana where Mr. TERREL was converted to religion in a singular manner while hauling a load of hay. Within three days he began exhorting and in 1834 was licensed to preach in the United Brethren Church, leaving his farm to do so. He preached at Nauvoo, Ill., in the temple after the Mormons had left and was instrumental in rousing the people against the followers of Joe SMITH, denouncing them from the pulpit. At Nauvoo his first wife died. He possessed a fine intellect and aside from being a successful public speaker, was straightforward in his dealings and conscientious in his life.

of his out-spoken doctrines. Later, in Missouri and Kansas, he became Presiding Elder. At one time his jurisdiction extended nearly over the whole State of Illinois. In the meantime he lived at Blandinsville, until 1853, and was there a second time married to Miss Mary MAYHEW. This lady was born in Ohio and was the daughter of **Laban MAYHEW**, a native of Kentucky, who moved first to Southern Ohio, then back to his native State and finally to McDonough County, Ill., where he engaged in farming until his death; he was of French descent. In the spring of 1853 we find Josiah TERREL in Missouri and for two years thereafter he was established at Carthage, officiating as a missionary sent by the Illinois Conference. Later he was County Superintendent of Jasper and Barton counties, and was also Postmaster. He secured eighty acres of land, but gave most of his attention to his clerical duties. Through him the Western Conference was organized and the first meeting thereafter held at his house was presided over by Bishop BRIGHT. He came to Kansas as a missionary and first established a church at Mound City, preaching the first sermon at Ft. Scott, also organizing a church there. He was elected Presiding Elder for eight years, then having suffered a stroke of paralysis retired from the ministry. In 1864 he purchased property in Lecompton and he had other property which he had accumulated while traveling around. His wife was an excellent manager and attended to the farm in his absence.

Mr. TERREL's life was often threatened on account

The Lane University at Lecompton while not organize by him was established largely through the instrumentality of Mr. TERREL. He started in the drug business in that place, conducting it successfully and was also Postmaster.

In 1866 he removed to Perry and was the first man to engage in the drug business there. He also organized a United Brethren Church, throwing his own house open for religious meetings of all kinds. From 1878 he live retired from active business.

The second wife of Mr. TERREL died in Perry in December 1867, at the age of forty eight years, and he was a third time married to **Mrs. Minerva McBride**. This lady was born in New York State and is still living, making her home in California with one of her daughters. Mr. TERREL spent the

last three years with his daughter, **Josephine**, Mrs. J. R. Pendroy, and departed this life Sept. 14, 1887. His remains were laid to rest in the Perry cemetery, which he had assisted in purchasing and laying out. He passed away honored and revered and his name will be held in kindly remembrance for many years to come. Politically, Mr. TERREL was a sound Republican and preached the abolition of slavery from the pulpit. Of the first marriage of Mr. TERREL there were born seven children, viz:

Enoch, William, Rebecca, John, Josiah, Sarah, Benjamin. The boys, with the exception of the last mentioned, who died at the age of two years, all served as solders in the Union Army. Of the second marriage there were born two children only: Josephine, (Mrs. J. R. Pendroy) a sketch of whom will be found elsewhere in this volume, and Mary, (Mrs. Gilfillin) of Perry.

From *The Religious Telescope*, Dayton Ohio, November 16, 1887:

"....converted in Fulton County, Indiana, in 1841, receiving license in 1842, like a meteor blazing and burning, he swept Ohio, northern Indiana, Illinois, Missouri, and into Kansas charge with electric fire from above. His words fell upon his audiences like thunderbolts, often prostrating fifty or one hundred in the same services. In preaching Christ and him crucified he found his highest delight as long as he was able; therefore, we cheerfully adopt the following resolutions:

Resolved, 1. That in the departure of **Father Terrell** we have lost a veteran in the ministry - a man called of God to preach, and who acquitted himself well.

- 2. While we would ever keep our brother with us, yet we meekly submit to the will of Him who doeth all things well.
- 3. We will keep in our hearts and prayers the dear children and friends Father Terrell has left behind, and pray that they and we may meet him in heaven. From *Our Heroes, Or United Brethren Home Missionaries* by **W. M. WEEKLEY** and **H. H. FOUT**, United Brethren Missionary Society, U.B. Building, Dayton Ohio, 1908:

Josiah TERRELL moved to Kansas from southern Missouri in 1856, and joined himself to the handful of workers already on the ground. While preaching in Missouri he suffered many indignities at the

hands of the Church's opposers, being threatened more than once with mob violence. But, like many of his contemporaries, he had given himself to the cause of human freedom, and to the work of the Church, and proposed to carry out the program at all hazard.

His chivalry knew no fear; his zeal for the kingdom know no languor. Serving as presiding elder in Kansas for years he became well know and was loved by all the churches.

Though his support was pitifully small, and his privations manifold, he always took a hopeful view of things, and believed most implicitly in a sustaining and over-ruling Providence. One illustration will serve to show the true spirit of the man. One day, when traveling in company with missionary **CARDWELL**, his horse mired as he entered a stream, and fell in the ice-cold water. The rider, however, with rare presence of mind, kept in the saddle, and when the horse finally came to his feet again, shouted at the top of his voice, "Glory to God for salvation." After riding many miles farther in his we clothes, in the face of a cold March wind, he preached with great power to a crowded house.

It may not be out of place, in this connection to give, briefly, the history of a church bell with which this pioneer had to do. While it may have but little relation to the general purpose of this book, it will, without doubt, interest the reader, as it has in it a touch both of the romantic and the pathetic.

On his way from General Conference in 1849, he purchased a bell in Cincinnati for a certain church in Illinois, and as he could get it for half-price paid for it himself. When the bell was put up he had a note made in the quarterly conference record to the effect that the property was his, and should be so recognized, until paid for. After a while the preaching-place was dropped, the church sold, and a lawsuit instituted by certain parties to secure the bell. While the trial was in progress the real owner rode into town, and, hearing of what was going on, at once looked up the old quarterly-conference minutes, presented them to the court, and demanded the property, which was awarded him without hesitation. It 1854 he moved the bell in his wagon to Missouri, later to Mound City, Kansas, and finally to Lecompton, when he sold it to the Presbyterians for ninety dollars.

A few years passed and these people gave up their appointment here, and built in the town of Perry, north of the Kaw River, a mile and a half distant. Being in need of a bell they decided to transfer to the new church the one they had left in Lecompton, and accordingly sent for it. But the citizens of the little burg refused most positively to see it moved. They had paid for it, they said, and proposed to keep it. Nothing more was said for a time. Finally, the Fourth of July came around. The people of Lecompton were patriotic, and all went out to a grove a mile or two away to celebrate. Upon returning home in the evening they were greatly surprised to hear the clear tones of their venerable bell ringing out from the cupola of the Perry Presbyterian Church, it having been carried away in their absence, and without their knowledge.

This was not all. **Father Terrell**, in his last years moved to Perry and died there; and this same bell called the people to his funeral, which was conducted by Dr. **G. M. HUFFMAN** (pastor at Lecompton) and tolled a solemn requiem as the procession started toward the place of burial.

ORGANIZATION OF THE KANSAS CONFERENCE

On the 30th of October, 1857, Bishop David Edwards organized the Kansas Conference in a sod house owned by **S. S. SNYDER**. Other helpers, who will be noticed later, had come in by this time. Five ministers besides the Bishop and two laymen were present. The church membership was about two hundred.

The following appointments were made: S. S. SNYDER, presiding elder, Tecumseh; W. H. CARDWELL; Big Springs, A. M. THORNTON; Lawrence, S. KRETZINGER; Prairie City, J. S. GINGERICH; Upper Neosho, G. PERKINS; Lower Neosho, A. Bixler; Fort Scott, J. TERRELL; Ossawotamie, W. HUFFMAN.

From *The History Of The Church Of The United Brethren In Christ, Vol. II*, by **John LAWRENCE**, Published at the United Brethren Printing Establishment, Sowers & King Publishers, Dayton, Ohio, 1861:

(A camp meeting near **Joseph TERREL's** farm, 1841) Among the persons awakened at this meeting was **Josiah TERREL**, a man of considerable note in his neighborhood. Being one of Satan's recruiting

officers; he delighted in sports of various kinds, played the violin well, and loved the dance.

Drawn to the camp-meeting by curiosity, he was awakened, went forward to the altar, invited the attention of the people, and there made a public confession of his sinful life - expressed his determination to be a Christian, and then knelt as a penitent at the mourner's bench. While he spake, every eye was filled with tears; and after he knelt, his plaintive voice, pleading for mercy, could be distinctly heard above all other voices. But he did not find peace at the meeting. He requested Bro. **LAMB**, on the evening after the meeting closed, to preach at his house, which he did.

During the meeting Mr. **TERREL** arose, confessed how he had been attached to the fiddle, and had taught his children and neighbors to dance, asked forgiveness of all, and then deliberately taking down the offending instrument of music, he cast it into the fire. Soon after he found salvation, and began to preach; and, we may add, he proved himself a chosen vessel of the Lord.

The Lord of the harvest now began more rapidly to multiply the laborers in this widening field. At a quarterly conference held on St. Joseph circuit, in 1842, William DAVIS, the presiding elder, organized a missionary movement which operated very favorably for the cause. Three men, Joseph TER-REL, Josiah TERREL, and T. J. BABCOKE, had obtained license to preach; and Mr. DAVIS informed them that he wished to employ them all as missionaries. He told them frankly that there was no missionary money to pay them - that they must depend upon the small sums given them by the people, looking for their principal reward in the world to come. They all consented, on these terms, to travel. **BABCOKE** was sent toward Middleburg, **Joseph** TERREL toward Huntington, and Josiah to the region about Leesburg. Each of these missionaries, sent out from the quarterly conference by the presiding elder, was successful in planting the church in the new fields named.

From *Kingman Atlas*, Excerpts Regarding Henry Township, Fulton County, Indiana:

"...the real history of the township begins with the advent of those who were its pioneers in the true sense - who left homes in the older States and come here to clear farms and establish homes in the heart of the wilderness.

Josiah TERRELL, Joseph TERRELL, William BIDDLE and Caleb STRADLEY, with their fami-

lies were the first who came with this end in view. They located here in February, 1836, and during the same year were joined by others who identified themselves with the township in its earliest civilization, and with the improvements of later years. These settlers engaged at once in the usual labors of the pioneer, and before long their presence was attested by many substantial improvements in the way of cleared fields and growing crops, though as yet their dwellings were the log cabins so universally characteristic of early days."

From *The Union Spy Newspaper*, Rochester, Fulton County, Indiana April 18, 1872:

Some two or three weeks ago **Joseph TERRELL**, a well-to-do-farmer, residing near Green Oaks, this County, eloped with a **Mrs. WHEEDON**, the wife of one of his farm tenants. Terrell brought his own wife to town, and giving her \$2,000, bade her a final adieu. **Mrs. Terell** is now living in the corporation, we understand. Her late spouse was something of a preacher....as to what branch of the church he belonged, we are not informed.

WHEEDON, the lawful husband of the frail woman, died since his wife's departure, and was buried last Sunday. He was a drinking, shiftless fellow, and was frequently in jail on account of his bacchanalian propensities. It is said that Terrell used to bring his tenant to town, get him drunk, and then drive home alone and console Mrs. Wheedon. (Note: Joseph was about 64 years old at the time of this article.)

From *The History Of The Church Of The United Brethren In Christ*, Vol. II, By John Lawrence, Printed at the United Brethren Printing Establishment, Sowers & King Publishers, Dayton, Ohio, 1861:

In 1834 **WHEEDON**, who, with his wife, was a member of the United Brethren church, emigrated to Fulton Co., Ind. For thirty miles of the way they surveyed and cut their own road through the wilderness. In the forests of Fulton county, with little society except Indians, who were numerous, they erected a family altar. Often did they speak of the happiness of other years, and pray that a minister of their own church might come to their neighborhood. The autumn after their arrival, "we heard," writes Mr. TERREL, "that four families had camped on the creek, about a mile from where we resided. I

went to visit them; and the first person I saw was an aged lady on her knees, with both hands lifted up in prayer. With joy I hastened home to inform my wife." These persons proved to be Methodists; and soon a prayer meeting was started at Mr. T.'s house. In the fall of 1839 John TALBERT, as before stated, opened a mission in Fulton and adjoining counties. "One day," writes Mr. TERREL, "while plowing in my field, about twenty rods from the road, I saw a man riding along, who looked so much like a United Brethren minister, that I started toward him to hail him; but thinking I might be mistaken, I returned to my plow. The stranger passed on to the next house; and thinking, perhaps that the family he had passed were Brethren, made inquiry, and as a matter of course soon returned. He formed, at TERREL's, a class eight members. This was the first society planted in a region of country extending one hundred and fifty miles, north and south.

These incidents are related to show ho great, often, are the religious wants of the pioneers of the church, how much they appreciate religious society, and especially the visits of their own ministers, and how greatly the morality of the country is indebted to them for the interest which they manifest in establishing institutions of Christianity.

But to return to our narrative; in the autumn of 1840 a camp-meeting was held near **Joseph TERREL's**, during which not less than fifty conversions to God occurred. Only eight tents were erected on the ground.

In August, 1841, another camp-meeting was held, on the same ground, which was, confessedly, one of the most powerful meetings ever held in that country. The ground was surrounded with tents, and a great number of people assembled. One incident occurred which deserves special notice. (See file of Josiah TERREL)

I think I found you a match. It is not a perfect match, but it is pretty good. I found your **William James TERRELL** in the 1880 census of Water Holes, Marion Co, Miss. (p. 314D) listed as follows: **William TERREL** Self M M W 25 MS Farmer MS MSSusan TERREL Wife F M W 20 MS Keeping House MS MS

Monroe TERREL Son M S W 5 MS MS MSBlar [Blair?]TERREL Son M S W 2 MS MS MSI had previously been unable to match this William with any family group. However, I knew from a consolidated list of Mississippi marriages that Monroe TERRELL married Emma JONES in Marion Co, Miss., On 2 Sep 1897.

Now comes your information that William's full name is William James TERRELL.

In my database I have two persons named William James TERRELL. One is born in 1846, Tenn.; the other in 1846 Miss. But for the date of birth, the Mississippi TERRELL seems to match your man.

He is William James TERRELL, b. 1846, son of James Monroe TERRELL (b. 1820) and Nancy JAMISON (b. 1824). His brothers and sisters are: Mary E. TERRELL (b. 1844, Miss.), George M. TERRELL (b. 1844, Miss.), Julia E. TERRELL (b. 1849, Miss.); Angeline Clemenus TERRELL (b. 1853, Miss.); Thomas Philemon TERRELL (b. 1853, Miss.); Thomas Philemon TERRELL (b. 1853, Miss.; d. 1915, Miss.); Plummer B. TERRELL (b. 1858, Miss.), and Amelia Lisa TERRELL (b. 1864, Miss.)

James' parents are found in 1850 Marion Co, Miss. (James is in household), 1860 Harrison Co, Miss. (James is in household), 1870 Washington Parish, LA. (James is not in household), and 1880 Washington Parish, La. (James is not in household).

The persuasive linkage is:

- (a) the identical names William James TERRELL
- (b) carrying forward the name *Monore*
- (c) location: James apparently still had ties to Marion Co, Miss.

I believe that the birth date for my cataloged James (1846) is correct, since "William James TERRELL" clearly appears in the 1850 census. The question to be resolved is: *is the 1855 birth date shown in the 1880 census correct*? Is it supported by other evidence or other census records? Census ages are full of errors.

If this man is a match, I have the ancestry of James Monroe TERRELL back many generations.

Don,

I think you have found my William TERRELL. I know that you are right about the census ages, I have found several errors myself. I have the same census information that you have from Marion Co.,MS. plus a little more.

William James TERRELL is also listed in the 1900 census with 5 children in 1900 in Marion Co. William James TERRELL m. Susan STRA-HANTheir children are Monroe TERRELL b. April 1876, Dolphus Blair TERRELL b. 1878,

Gerramiah TERRELL b. unknown, Mary TERRELL b. July 1888, Plummer TERRELL b. 1891, Zander TERRELL b. 1894 and Julie TERRELL b. unknown. I received this information between my family members and Susan Strahan's g-grand-daughter.

As you know, Monroe married Emma JONES in 1897. They had three children that I know of. **Edna** TERRELL b. unknown, Wyley TERRELL b. May 1898 and Mary Lee TERRELL b. April 24, 1901, my mothers name sake. Emma did remarry after Monroe died and his name was JEN-KINS.Mary Lee TERRELL married Daniel Marion SMITH on September 28, 1913. Mary Lee d. July 12, 1987. I only remember visiting her a few times in my childhood. She is buried in Pleasant Home Cemetery in Lamar Co., MS. You'll not find this information on the net anywhere but I know this because she is buried in the same cemetery as much of my family. In fact, in March my mothers mother passed away and I visited her grave and placed flowers there...so I know this is correct. The reason I say this is because my great-grandfather Daniel SMITH is buried in the Allen Cemetery in Harrison Co., MS. they had an estranged marriage for many years. In fact, I have yet to be able to find out for sure if they ever divorced but they lived the last half of their lives apart.

Anyhow, they had 10 children. Unfortunately most of them had passed away when I started this search and much of the dates are lost, for now. There children were Luther Allen SMITH (my grand father) b. March 4, 1914, d. March 20, 1993 and is buried in Woodland Baptist Cemetery in Springfield, LA. I only have one other date but the rest are as follows, my grand father was the oldest child. Stella SMITH, Ruby SMITH, Velma SMITH, Howard SMITH, Catheline SMITH, Virgil SMITH, H.L. SMITH, Recy SMITH b. February 11, 1937, and Thomas SMITH. I am so excited to be able to get any information on Williams ancestors and yes you are right, its amazing how the "family name" like Monroe will come down through generations.

Thank you again so much for help in closing some of the gaps I have found. I will be very thankful for anything you can send me.

Marilyn, The information you found in the 1900 census regarding William TERRELL of Marion Co, Miss., confirms that this is the same man as I list in my database. The connection becomes extremely probable because he named his own child Plummer TERRELL (b. 1891). This would be the namesake of his brother younger Plummer B. TERRELL (b. 1858) (still living with his parents in 1880). I have linked a database of more that 40,000 TERRELLs/Terrills and their descendants (by various surnames). Among the TERRELL/Terrill surnames, "Plummer" is unique to Plummer B. TERRELL (b. 1858). This makes the link a near-certainty.

I have the ancestry of **William James TERRELL** back a few generations. If you would like a printout of this information, please provide me a postal address. There is no cost, this is my hobby.

If there is any additional information or detail on the descendants of William James TERRELL that you would like to share, I would be happy to add it to my database.

Frankly, I could not identify **William Washington TERRELL** in the 1850 census (unless his age is mistakenly listed as 22 [b. 1828], nor in 1860 or 1870. I found **James William TERRELL** (I think) in 1880 married to **Alice** __, but could not find his father **William**. (1880 Ind., Greene Co, Richland, p. 140C).

Other researchers have concluded that **John senior** was married to **Margaret WORKMAN**. I have never been able to link him with any degree of certainty to the Terrells in my 40,000-person linked database of families.

You think that he may have been the son of **Edmund TERRELL**. I have 12 Edmund Terrells (descended from Richmond TERRELL), and none of them qualify (by life span) to be the father of John. On the other hand I have 20 Edmund TERRILL s (descended from **Timothy TERRILL**), and one of them may qualify (as reported by Dicken in her 1952 book, p. 48): **Edmund TERRILL** (b. ca. 1756; d. Ky.) Son of **John TERRILL** and **Elizabeth Ann TOWLES**. Edmund is known to have had a son named John, of whom nothing is known. There is a nice casual relationship suggested by this limited information, but the proof (if it exists) must be found by someone searching Kentucky and Greene Co, Ind., county records.

Meanwhile, I can provide you with names and last-known addresses of three other researchers who are tracing various components of this family:

I have just been reading Rootsweb forum and you seem to have your hands on a fact or four. Could I ask you a bit of a query. My line goes up through George Hicks TERRILL b: Nov 22,1830 Redruth CON. His father was Thomas TERRILL b: Feb 28, 1808 Redruth CON, sp: Mary WILLIAMS. Now I do not have much in the way of support data for Thos & Mary. I have mobs of IGI gear which has a number of doubtful links. But in particular I am interested here in Thomas's son James b: Feb 26, 1833, and James Hicks TERRILL b: Jul 4 1835. Another sibling George Hicks TERRILL married and left for here Australia Aug 2, 1854, then supposedly Thomas and spouse and James ?? went to the States, James maybe died while swimming in the Ohio river?. I can only be vague about the happenings in the States as it only reaches me per mouth.

Don, can you fill in some of the cracks please. It seems that to trace a family line there in the States is assured of plenty of databases being available, but here in Aus or it seems in Cornwall for that matter, well things are a lot different. I have assembled a transcript of the U.S. census records of every Terrell/Terrill (etc.) who appears in the Southern states, plus Ohio and Indiana, for the years 1790 through 1880. I am presently working on 1900. (1890 was lost in a Washington DC fire in the 1920s.)
