The proposed change is to widen the border, punch holes in it, and then fill each hole with a blue emblem of Tyrrell/Terrell history. For example, we could use: a cornet for possible descent from royalty; a knight's helmet for that era; a plow for the farmers; ship's wheel for the sea men; scales & balance for the legal professions; staff for the medical professions; wrench for the mechanics and artisans; and possibly others if space permits. The new emblem would still consist of only 2 colors, red & blue when printed on white paper, bumper stickers, calendars, decals, matchbooks, plates, shirts, stationery, cups, etc. If printed on any other color, the field would be tainted by the original color, or a third color would be required to keep it white.

On the positive side, development of such a trademark would distinguish the TERRELL SOCIETY OF AMERICA, INC. from run-of-the-mill family organizations. Such an accomplishment would be worthy of national news coverage, especially in genealogical circles and could generate thousands, possibly millions, of dollars in free publicity for our Society. Displaying a trademark item in your home, on your car, or on your person will increase the visibility of our Society and may influence other descendants to join us. This will give us something to use for fund raising that might interest some descendants who have elected not to join our Society.

On the negative side, it will cost between \$2,000.00 & \$3,000.00 to register our Arms in England, if they find our design acceptable. The cost of registering a Trademark in the U. S. A. has not been researched. Second, it will be difficult to find vendors

MATERIALS WELCOMED

Materials pertaining to anyone who is a TERRELL or descendant via any variation of spelling are welcomed for submission to be used in TRAILS.

Possible materials include: biographies (short as in *WHO'S WHO*); obituaries; photographs (copies, not originals); news items; wills; deeds; historical court decrees; land grants; patents; old letters describing migrations, or family historical events--establishing births, marriages, deaths, etc; ad infinitum.

Word processing files should be confined to either WORDSTAR or plain ASCII.

Photographs, drawings, plats, etc. are welcomed provided they are no larger than 11 X 17 inches. Your editor can scan materials up to 11 X 14 inches directly into TRAILS. Larger materials will have to be reduced on the copy machine at the local library and may lose detail in the process.

We reserve the right to edit materials for length, grammar, spelling, and clarity. Whenever possible materials will be used as presented to preserve the atmosphere of the era.

We also reserve the right to decide which materials to use and when. We will publish as many materials as finances permit.

BEATRICE BAYLEY CLONE SURNAME NEWSLETTERS

I have warned you on several occasions about "Beatrice Bayley" type surname books that have a little general research fluff followed by the current surname mailing list from city & phone directories. Only God knows how much those promoters have skimmed off unsuspecting family genealogists who thought that they were buying some serious information about their family line.

The proliferation of the computer, combined with the release of multitudes of data by the Social Security Administration, Telephone Companies, Associated Indexing Services, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (Mormon), and others on CD ROM and other media has given birth to "Beatrice Bayley" clones in surname news letters.

Our president, Mr. **Don C. TERRILL**, has a subscription to the TERRILL version and has shared his first two issues with me.

These news letters are published by **FAMILY NEWS NETWORK, 250 Coolidge St., Midvale UT 84047, phone 801-255-**

4238. They publish 4 issues per year, rates \$12.00 per year, \$30.00 for 3 years. They will probably do a variation in any known surname.

Each of the issues examined consists of 16 pages, small format, roughly 6 x 7 1/2 inches of printed page area.

Apparently the data has been preserved in its original database format so that it can be queried, sorted, and manipulated to provide a personalized news letter for any surname in the database. The personalizing is carried further. On one page, there is a heading "Ancestors of (Name of recipient) of (city & state)." The rest of the page is a lineage form with a line for everyone from you through your great grandparents to be listed by name, birth date, & death date. The page ends with an example of how to fill out a line and the invitation to "mail it in and we'll publish it." It doesn't say where they will publish it or how many other [Surname] readers are likely to see it.

Another page is an advertisement for [SURNAME] FAMILY HERITAGE CENTER [probably a subsidiary], 1181 S. Parker Rd. #105, Denver CO 80231. Offerings include: Heirloom Plate (\$59.95 + \$3.75 S & H) with Surname & "its Coat of Arms;" [Any serious researcher knows Arms were issued to individuals, not surnames.] Surname Flag, 2 x 3 feet (\$29.95 + \$3.75 S & H) with Surname & Coat of Arms; Classic Plaque, 14 1/2 x 17 1/2 (\$49.95 + \$3.75 S & H) with full Coat of Arms of the Surname family; & Coat of Arms Research Report 8" x 11" unframed parchment tone paper (9.95 + \$1.00 S & H).

A third page is taken up with ads. [SURNAME] FAMILY NEWS offers a joke book personalized with your full name on the cover [and probably on the top of each subsequent page] (\$9.95 + \$1.00 S & H) & The (Official?) [SURNAME] Family Cookbook (\$14.95 + \$2.00 P & H) with a \$2.00 "SPECIAL pre publication" discount if you order by the 1st of the month! SURNAME FAMILY LABEL OFFER is personalized with the recipient's name and address; available with either Scot, Irish, or custom (black & white photo) logo. Quantities are either 270 or 500. Stock labels either Scot or Irish are \$6.95 & \$11.95 respectively. Custom design labels are \$8.90 & \$13.90 respectively.

The pages before, between, and after the ads are filled with general fluff such as: Who's the oldest [SURNAME]?, manipulated from SS death data like that being published in entirety in TRAILS; Who's the earliest? from census database going back into 1786 for Jacob TERRILL of Waterford Twp. Gloucester Co. NJ, followed by 17 others who appeared before 1800 [TRAILS published the entire index including all variations in Summer 1987, et seq, from Colonial times through 1860.]; general research information about using census records [available at any archive in the USA]; and an explanation of the 1880 & 1900 Soundex coding guide, a listing of when Federal censuses were taken and what they included, which states were indexed in 1910 & which were not [available at any Federal Archive branch].

I'll be the first to admit that I'm prejudiced because of my ten year involvement with the TERRELL SOCIETY OF AMERICA, INC. and ten years of editing TERRELL TRAILS. If the information [excluding ads] in either of the issues reviewed was converted into TRAILS type size and format, it might fill 2 pages. After comparing TRAILS and the two issues of The Terrill Family News, I'm reminded of what comedian Jerry CLOWER said about grits & grease. He said, "It's as good as butter, if you ain't had butter!"

Our President, Mr. Don TERRILL is concerned because The [Terrill/Terrell etc.] Family News intends to compete directly with TRAILS and our Society.

Heck, everyone you do business with from your grocer to your insurance agent is in direct competition with our Society. You can only spend your dollar once. Only you can decide whether to spend it with our Society. It is obvious that people do spend money on [Surname] items--news letters, plates, flags, etc. Society officers are divided on whether our Society should pursue a Coat of Arms/Trademark and offer similar merchandise to our members. I'm far more concerned by the potential number who will: try The [Surname] Family News; be turned off by its lack of substance; & pass up TRAILS and our Society because they assume we are a similar organization.

GENEALOGY? ASK DAN

Q. My direct ancestor is Major Harry TERRELL b. 1730 Hanover Co. VA., d. 1798 Pendleton Dist SC, son of Joel & Sara Elizabeth OXFORD TERRELL, who reportedly was married first to Ann DABNEY. I have never been able to verify this information. If anyone has any such proof, I would like it very much. Dale M. McKINNEY; 2002 W. Granite St; Siloam Springs AR 72761

A. Proof is an elusive term. To one the only acceptable proof might be a certified copy of the marriage bond. To another, a family Bible printed prior to the date of the event might suffice. A third person might be satisfied with a published work that listed the marriage. I.e., "proof" means different things to different persons and in different situations. Without knowing how closely you define "proof," I can answer only in generalities.

On Page 523-4 of TRAILS, a member, Mrs. Norma Thayer Reed; General Delivery; Mannford OK 74044 indicates descent from Patsy TERRELL, daughter of "Col" Harry TERRELL and his second wife Sarah DYER. She did not submit a list of sources with her chart, but she may have the document you seek.

On page 386, one Joel TERRELL and one Harry TERRELL brought Francis SMITH's receipts for 300 pounds levied for paying for the church. Original source: Augusta Parish Vestry Book; secondary source HISTORY OF AUGUSTA COUNTY VA The secondary source should be available through inter-

library loan. The original source should be available either in Augusta Co. VA and/or the VA state Archives.

I'm trying to find out who **Caroline TERRELL** was married to, who his family was, and who hers was. Our dear mother, **Caroline TERRELL**, b. 12/28/1862, d. 01/10/1922 age 59 years and 12 days. Death card says she had lived in or was born in SC. Rest of the family could be my grandfather, **William HARMON** b. 11/10/1863 in GA or SC m. **Callie Elizabeth KERBY/KIRBY** b. 10/11/1864. I know where they are buried but don't know about their parents. Also a **Henry Rufus RODGERS/ROGERS** hasn't been found. Mrs. **Ida Mae Taylor**; 3016 Broadway Ave; Las Vegas NV 89030

I am seeking info for my wife's great-great grandmother, **Mary TERRELL** of NJ who md. **James MOORE**. Their daughter, **Mary B. MOORE**, b. 07/11/1811, d. 01/21/1858, buried at Pleasant Mount PA md. **Ezra SPENCER, Jr.** Search of NJ Archives, NJ State Library, & the New England Historic Genealogical Soc. Library has failed to identify this **Mary TERRELL** with adequate certainty. The only Mary that we have not been able to eliminate is **Mary⁶ TERRELL** (**Ephraim⁵, Ephraim⁴, Ephraim³, Thomas², & Roger¹**). This line has been traced mostly through wills. **Ephraim⁵**, father of Mary, died before 05/03/1781. There is a baptismal record for one **Mary TERRELL** of Elizabeth NJ 09/28/1773 that well could be for this Mary. However, we have no information that shows that this is the Mary who md. **James MOORE**. Mr. **Charles E. Sturtevant**; P O Box 1415; Wolfeboro NH 03894

I am trying to find ancestors of **John Henry TERRELL** b. 10/22/1873, d. 1971, md. **Mary Elizabeth COX**. If there are any family histories that list him and his ancestors, could you let me know the purchase price. If not, does the Society do research? **Scott Varnarsdall**; 1307 East St; Graham TX 76450

[*Editor's Note:* It would have helped greatly to know more about **John Henry TERRELL**, probable place of birth, places of residence, place of death, etc. If you know the place of death, the 1971 death certificate is the logical starting place. The indexed portion of *TRAILS* contains 2 persons of the above name and similar time frame. (1) p. 285; **John Henry TERRELL**, son of Dr. **Thomas Waddy & Martha Everard Hamilton RAINES TERRELL**, md. **Susan WHITE** in Grimes co. TX in 1867 calling him old enough to father your **John Henry**. His children were not listed. (2) p 106, **John Henry TERRELL**, son of **Peuben & Elizabeth DETAMORE TERRELL** of Rockingham Co. VA (age 10 in 1860 census, age 21 at marriage) md. **Margaret MILLER** 10/22/1874, marriage book 1, page 100. This marriage date is exactly 1 year to the day after the birth of your **John Henry**, if both dates are correct. The Society does not have personnel to do research. **Dan Brinson** does private research at the rate of \$25.00 per hour with a 4 hour minimum He can be reached at the address on the second page of this issue. *DFB.*]

who md. 12/22/1796 in Halifax Co. VA. **Martha**, who was the daughter of **Nathaniel & Elizabeth COE SAUNDERS**, md. **Pleasant Thurman WALKER** on 01/27/1835 in Pittsylvania Co. VA. I have not been able to trace parents of either **Pleasant** or **Jemima**. I wonder if you or any of your readers can help. First daughter listed is **Jemimah**, but there is no further info about her. She was named in Timothy's will in Orange Co. VA in 1763 as "my Daughter **Jemimah**," giving no indication that she was married. He did the same for his other daughters. TERRELL/MOORE/SPENCER

Charles H. SPENCER

The state of Pennsylvania owes its high standing, among the sovereign Commonwealths that make up the United States, to the high character and dauntless spirit of the settlers who made their home within her borders during the early days. To their inspiration and work is due her wonderful progress in agriculture, manufacturing, and the arts. They opened the mines and cleared away the forests, transforming the wilderness into fertile farms; they established Churches and schools in the savage wilds, laying the foundation for the grand institutions of philanthropy and learning which are the glory of the State at the present day. Connecticut has furnished to Pennsylvania many of its worthy pioneers, and among these the Spencer family of Wayne county are deserving of honorable mention.

Charles H. SPENCER was born Nov 18, 1847, on the farm in Mt. Pleasant township where he still resides. His father, **Ezra SPENCER**, now one of the oldest men living in Wayne county, being born Nov 17, 1806, is the son of **Ezra SPENCER, Sr.**, a native of Saybrooke, CT., who with his father, **Joseph SPENCER**, of English ancestry, came to Wayne county, Penn., when it was almost an unbroken wilderness, and after cutting the logs erected their dwelling in the midst of the forest. **Joseph SPENCER's** brother, **Peter**, located here about two or three years previous, being among the very first settlers of this region. **Ezra SPENCER, Sr.** married Miss **Mehitable BUSHNELL**, a native of CT, who died when quite young, leaving two children, **Ezra Jr.**, the father of our subject; and **Hettie**, wife of **John KNIGHT**. For his second wife he married Miss **Ellett CLARK** (tombstone says **Elizabeth**), and to them were born four sons, all now (1898) living: **Philo, George, Orson, & William SPENCER**. The father of these [**Ezra SPENCER, Sr.**] who was a consistent member of the Methodist Church, died at the age of eighty-four years, honored and respected by all who knew him. [Editor's Note: Someone had lined out "who with his father, **Joseph SPENCER**, of English ancestry" in the above paragraph and added the notation "see next paragraph." The next paragraph takes up with **Ezra, Jr.** Therefore, I interpret this passage to mean that **Joseph SPENCER** was: father of **Ezra Sr.** & **Peter SPENCER**; grandfather of **Ezra Jr.** and **Peter SPENCER** was great uncle to **Ezra Jr.** I also interpret this to mean that the several generations moved to PA close together. Due to the lack of information to the contrary, I assume the statement to be correct and have included it here as originally published. DFB]

Ezra SPENCER, Jr., was a lad of ten years when brought by his parents to Wayne county where he grew to manhood surrounded by scenes familiar to frontier life. When about twenty-two he bought a farm of one hundred and fifty acres in Mt. Pleasant township for \$100.00, and upon the partially improved tract, he erected a log house. Having secured a home he wished for someone to preside over it, and soon afterward wedded Miss **Mary B. MOORE**, a daughter of **James** and **Mary TERRELL**

MOORE, and a native of NJ. The eleven children born of this union are as follows: **James M.**, a resident of Wayne county; **Eliza**, deceased wife of **James PARTRIDGE**; **Juliett** who md. **William KERR** (both are now deceased); **Norman**, a soldier of the Civil War who died at Starrucca, PA; **Adeline**, deceased wife of **H. L. BUTLER** of Lake township, Wayne county; **Clark** who lives on his grandfather's old homestead; **Keziah**, wife of **Theodore LaBARRE** of Starrucca PA; **Charles H.**, the subject of this sketch; **Kate**, wife of **Matthew CLEMO** of Bethany; **Olive B.**, wife of **James WATSON** of Lake Como PA; and **Hettie M.**, deceased wife of **Frank CLOUGH** of Rushsylvania OH. The mother, who was a good, kind, and affectionate woman, died in January 1859 (1858 on tombstone); the father died Oct. 23, 1899, aged ninety-two years, eleven months, and six days. He was one of the most esteemed citizens of the community.

Charles H. SPENCER of this review obtained his education in public schools near the home farm, and as soon as old enough began to assist in the labors of the fields, soon becoming a skillful and painstaking agriculturist. Prosperity has crowned his business efforts, and he is today one of the most substantial citizens of Mt. Pleasant township. On February 21, 1882, he was united in marriage with Miss **Emily Giles DOYLE**, daughter of **David DOYLE** of Mt. Pleasant township and they became the parents of three children: **Ezra, Clarence D., & Emory G.** The greatest loss that has come to Mr. **SPENCER** was in the death of his estimable wife who passed to the world beyond in November 1894, leaving many friends to mourn with her sorrowing husband. As an ardent Democrat Mr. **SPENCER** has ever taken an active part in local politics, and has been honored with a number of positions of public trust including those of township supervisor and assessor, which he filled with credit to himself and to the entire satisfaction of all concerned.

Revolutionary War to WWI

DANIEL W. TYRRELL

Daniel W. TYRRELL was born in Kalamazoo MI in 1840, a son of **Manilus** and **Esther TYRRELL**, natives of NY and VT respectively. They were married in the Empire State [NY], whence they removed to MI. The father was of Irish descent and

was a blacksmith by trade, following that pursuit for many years. He died in West Union, Fayette county, IA in 1860 while his wife, long surviving him, passed away in February 1896. Her father, **Amos LEWIS** was a soldier of the war of 1812 and died at Magnolia, WI at the age of ninety-two years.

Having acquired a common-school education, **Daniel W. TYRRELL** in 1859 learned the printer's trade at West Union IA to which his parents had removed. He was preparing for an academic course when the call to arms, resounding through the land, changed the current of his thoughts, and in September 1861, he responded to the country's call for aid, enlisting in Company F, Ninth Iowa Infantry, of which he was made fifth sergeant. The company was organized at Dubuque and was sent to St. Louis for drill while awaiting equipment. During the regiment's first winter out the command was employed in guarding railroad bridges near Pacific Junction, MO. In the spring, the command marched through Rolla to Springfield in pursuit of retreating Rebel columns that **PRICE** had gathered in MO, following them into northwestern Arkansas and camping at Cross Hollow.

After **PRICE** was reinforced the battle of Pea Ridge was fought and Company F lost a number of its men, while the captain and first lieutenant were wounded, the later mortally. Following this battle, the regiment was ordered back to MO and sent to Batesville and thence to Helena, meeting with the Texas Rangers in a number of skirmishes before reaching the objective point. Three or four months of inactivity followed, and at the end of that time, the troops started down the river under General **SHERMAN**. The Ninth Iowa was in the engagement at Chickasaw Bayou and then proceeded to Louisiana to take part in the expedition to capture Arkansas Post where a number of Company F were killed and wounded. The next move was to Greenville MS, then toward Vicksburg going to Raymond, Jackson, Champion Hills, and other points where it marched across bloody fields and left proof of its prowess. The regiment took part in the first and second assaults on Vicksburg and fought all through the long and desperate siege of forty-seven days. Subsequent to the fall of Vicksburg, the Ninth was ordered to Alabama in pursuit of Gen. **J. E. JOHNSTON**, but not being able to bring him into an engagement, returned to Black River and soon afterward to Corinth, being sent thence to check the movements of the famous Rebel general **WHEELER**, whose Calvary was active and aggressive. This pursuit was carried into AL and at one place had a severe encounter with his force, Mr. **TYRRELL** then acting as sergeant-major. Returning, they moved toward Chattanooga and Company F, under General **HOOKER**, participated in the battle of Lookout Mountain. The Ninth was then sent to AL and camped for the winter. Mr. **TYRRELL** was detailed to go to Nashville to serve in the government printing office, where he remained until Nov. 1864, then proceeded to Atlanta where he was mustered out. While at Batesville and Helena, he and others were detailed to work in the printing office of Gen. **CURTIS** and at each place issued a little paper.

During the war, the mother of Mr. **TYRRELL**, who had been widowed about two years before, did a noble service for the

soldiers, spending about two and a half years in the hospitals of St. Louis, Springfield, and Pacific Junction and while her son was on the march through MO, she went over the mountains in an ambulance to meet him. Her daughter, Mrs. **Janet [TYRRELL] Allen**, also spent several years ministering to the needs of the soldiers in southern hospitals and afterward married a soldier named **HENDERSON** whom she had nursed in a hospital at Memphis.

When the war was over, Mr. **TYRRELL** worked in the office of the *Independent* at Brodhead WI for a short time and then purchased an interest in the paper, which he afterward assisted in editing. Later he removed to Monroe WI, where, associated with a Mr. **POTTER**, he founded the *Green County Republican* and continued with it until his removal to St. Charles IL. In 1870, he engaged with the *Geneva Republican*. Later he published the *St. Charles Transcript*, of which he was afterward sole proprietor, continuing its publication until 1875. After coming to DeKalb he was engaged in the office of the *News* until 1882 when he purchased an interest in the *DeKalb Review*, with which he was connected until April 1906, covering a period of about a quarter of a century. In 1890, he received the appointment of postmaster at DeKalb and proved to be a most competent official.

In 1870, in St. Charles, Mr. **TYRRELL** md. Mrs. **Sarah E. Akin**, a daughter of **Charles B. GRAY**, one of the pioneers of Kane county IL. She was born in MO and was the mother of one son, **Louis G. TYRRELL**, born December 11, 1873. She died October 19, 1904 in DeKalb.

Mr. **TYRRELL** is a charter member of Merritt Simonds post, No 283, G.A.R., in which he has filled many offices including that of commander. He also holds membership in DeKalb lodge, No. 144, A.F. & A.M. is a member of the local lodge of Elks, and has been connected with the Independent Order of Odd Fellows and the Good Templars. He is a gentleman of wide experience and good judgment and by persistent energy and business ability has made substantial progress in the field of journalism. He takes a deep interest in vital questions and is a recognized champion of many progressive public movements, the value of which time has proven. He is well known among his old army comrades and is equally popular and respected among those with whom business and social relations have brought him in contact.

Daniel W. TYRRELL died 01/10/1929 in DeKalb IL; buried St. Charles cemetery, St. Charles, IL. Indicated he was Major in the Civil War [above sketch showed no rank higher than "acting as sergeant-major."]

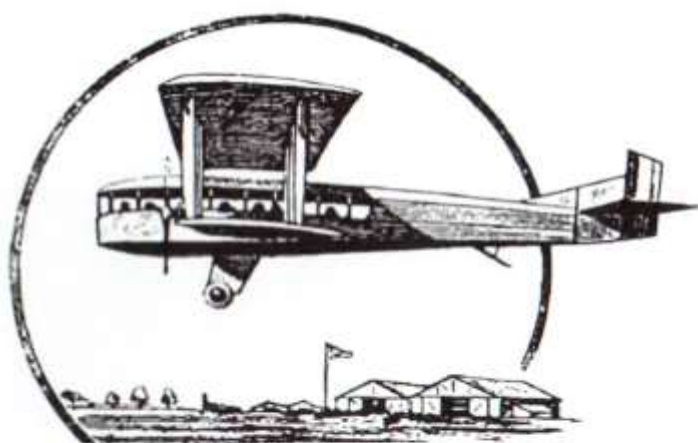

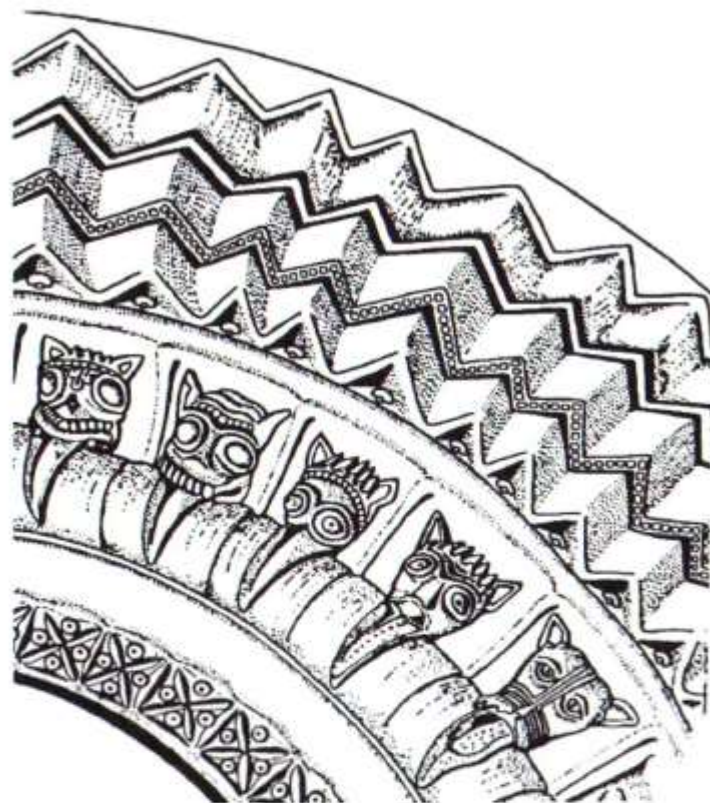
